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

# Gulielmi III. Regis.

An Act to Incourage the Trade to Newfoundland.



Mereas the Trade of and Fishing at Newfoundland is a Weneficial Trade to this Kingdom, not only in the Imploying great Numbers of Seamen and Ships, and Export= ing and Confumina great Duantities

Provisions and Panufactures of Realm, whereby many Tradesmen and Por Artificers are kept at Work, but also in bringing into this Nation, Returns of the Effects of the laid Fisherp from other Countreys, great Quantities of Wine, Oyl, Plate, Iron, Woll and fundry other Afeful Comodities, to the Increase of his Pajesties Revenue, and Kkkkk 2

the Encouragement of Trade and Navination: Be it Enacted by the Kings most Excellent Bajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament Assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from hence= forth it hall and may be lawful for all Dis Wajelties Subjects Reliding within this His Realm of England, or the Dominions thereunto belonging, Trading or that shall Trade to Newfoundland, and the Seas. Rivers, Lakes, Creeks, Harbours in 02 about Newfoundland, or any of the Mands adjoyning or adjacent thereunto, to have use and enjoy the free Trade and Traffick, and Art of Merchandize and fishery. to and from Newfoundland, and Peaceably to have, use and enjoy, the freedom of taking Bait and Filhing in any of the Rivers, Lakes, Creeks, Harbours 192 Rodes in or about Newfoundland, and the faid Seas, or any of the Islands adjacent thereunto, and Liberty to go on Shoze on any part of Newfoundland, oz any of the faid Islands, for the Curing, Salting. Diving and Husbanding of their Fiff. and for making of Oyl, and to Cut down Mod and Trees there for Building and Making or Repairing of Stages, Shiproms, Trainfats, Hurdles, Ships Boats. and other Petellaries for themselves and their Servants, Seamen and Fishermen. and all other Things Which may be Afeful or Advantagious to their Fishing Trade,

Trade, as fully and freily as at any time heretofoze hath been used or enjoy= ed there by any of the Subjects of his Majesties Royal Predecessors, Without any Hindrance, Interruption, Denial 02 Disturbance of or from any Person or Persons Whatsoever: And that no Alien or Stranger Whatsoever (not Reliding Within the Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales of Lown of Berwick upon T need ) shall at any time hereafter take any Bait, or use any sort of Trade or fishing whatsoever in Newfoundland, or in any of the laid Illands 02Blaces above mentioned.

And for the Preserving the said Har= bours from all Annopances. Be it fur= ther Enacted by the Authority aforesaid. That from and after the Twenty fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hun= died now next coming, no Ballast, Diest Stones, or any thing else hurtful to or annoping any of the harbours there. thall be thrown out of any Ship or otherwife, by any Person or Persons what= soever to the Prejudice of any of the said Darbours, but that all fuch Ballast and other Things shall be carried on Shore. and be laid where they may do no An= novance.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That no Person or Versons whatsoever shall (at his Departure out of the said Countrey, or at any other time) Destroy, Deface or do any Detriment to any such Stage 02

02 Cok-Rom, 02 to the Flakes, Spikes. Nails or any other Thing whatfoever thereto belonging, as he or they shall fall into at his or their coming into the faid Countrey, but that he of they shall ( during his or their stay there) content him and themselves with such Stage or Stages only as are nædful for him or them, and shall also (at his or their Devarture thence) leave all fuch his or their Stage or Stages, Without doing oz causing to be done any Wilful Damage to any of them; And that for the Repairing of fuch Stage of Stages as he de they shall so take, during his or their Abode there, the same shall be done with Limber fetcht out of the Woods there. and not by the Ruining, Breaking down, Demolishing, Presudicing or any wise Injuring the Stage of Stages of any other Berson or Bersons Whatsoever.

And be it further Enacted by the Authozity afozelaid, That (according to the Ancient Custom there used) every fuch fishing Ship from England, Wales 02 Berwick, or such Fishermen as shall from and after the said Twenty fifth Day of March, first enter any Harbour of Creek in Newfoundland, in behalf of his Ship. shall be Admiral of the said Harbour of Creek during that Jishing Season, and for that time shall reserve to himself on= ip so much Beech or flakes, or both, as are nædful for the Number of fuch Woats as he wall there use, with an Overplus only for the use of one Boat 111028 more than he needs, as a Priviled for his first coming thither; And this the Waster of every such Second filling Ship as shall enter any such hair bour 02 Creek, shall be Usce-Admirat of fuch harbour or Creek during that Killing Season; And that the Patter of every such Fishing Ship next coming. as Mall enter any such Harbour or Erek. mall be Rear-Admiral of fuch barbout or Creak during that fishing Seafon: And that the Walter of every fishing Ship there, chall content himself with fuch Becho: Flakes as he hall have he cessary use foz, without keeping oz de= taining any more Beech or Flakes, to the prejudice of any such other Ship or Welfel as shall arrive there; And that such Person or Persons as are possessed of leveral places in several Harbours or Creks there, that make his or their Etection of fuch Place as he or they thall chose to abide in; And shall also Within Eight and fourty hours after any After-comer 02 After=comers into such Place or Pla= ces, thall demand such his or their Refolution touching such his or their Eletion (if the Weather will fo fon permit, or so son after as the Weather Will permit) give or send his or their Refoiution to luch After-comer, or After-comers, touching such his or their Election of such Place as he or they Matt so Chose to abide in for the Kilhing Season, to the end that such After-comer or After= comers

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comers may like Wife Choose his or their Place or Places of his or their above there; And in Case any Difference shall arise touching the said Patters, the Admirals of the respective Harbours where such Differences shall arise, or any Two of them, shall proportion the Place to the several Ships, in the several Harbours they fish in, according to the Number of Boats which each of the said

Ships shall kep.

And whereas leveral Juhabitants in Newfoundland, and other Persons, have, lince the Pear of our Lord. One thoufand ür hundzed eighty fibe, Ingrossed and Detained in their own hands, and for their own private Benefit, several Stages, Cok-Roms, Beches and other Places in the said Parbours and Creeks (which before that time belonged to fishing Ships) for taking of Bait. and Fishing and Euring their Fish, to the great prejudice of the fishing Ships that arive there in the fishing Season, and sometimes to the overthrow of some of their Moyages, and to the great difcouragement of the Traders there: Be it further Enacted by the Authority afore= faid, That all and every such Person and Persons, as since the said Pear of our Lozd, One thousand fir hundzed eighty five. have or hath Taken, Seized or Detained, any such Stage, Cok= Rom, Bech or other Place, for taking Wait, or Fishing, or for the Drying, Curina

Curing of Husbanding of Fish, Mall on vefore the laid Ewenty fith day of March, Krimquish, Liuit and Leave, to the publish use of the Filhing Ships Afriving there, all and every the said Stages, Eva-Roms, Bethes and of the Places, for taking Bait and fishing, and for the Drying, Curing and Hul-

vanding of fiff.

And for the Preventing the Ingralling and Detaining of all luck Stages. Cok-Roms, Breches, and other Places, by any person or Persons sor the time to come, We it Enaced by the Authority aforelaid, That no Filherman of Inhabitant in Newfoundland, or any other Person or Persons Whatsoever, Mall, at any time after the laid Twenty lifth Day of March. Seize, Take up or Polfels any of the Stages, Codk-Roms, Weethes, or other Places Which, at a ny time lince the faid year of our Loed, One thousand sir hundred eighty sibe. did (oz at any time hereafter shall belong to any Fishing Ship or Ships) for taking Baitor Filling, or for Drying, Euring or Husbanding of Fish, before the Arrival of the Filhing Ships out of England, Wales and Berwick, and until all such Ships hall be Provided With Stages, Cook-Rooms, Beeches, and other Places, for taking Bair and fishing. and for Drying, Curing and Husband ing of Filli.

Provided always, That all such Persons as since the Twenty sith Day of March, One thousand six hundred eighty sive, have Built, Cut out or Pade (or at any time hereafter shall Build, Cut out or Pake) any Poules, Stages, Cook-Rooms, Train-Fats, or other Conveniencies for fishing there, that did not bestong to fishing Ships since the said year, One-thousand six hundred eighty sive, shall and may peaceably and quietly Injoy the same to his or their own Use, without any Disturbance of or from any Person or Persons Whatsoever.

And be it further Enacted by the Austhority aforesaid, That all and every Person or Persons Whatsoever, that shall go over with their Servants to Newfoundland, to keep Boats on a fishing Aoyage, commonly called By-Boat-Reepers, shall not Pretend to or Meddle with any House, Stage, Cook-Room, Train-fat, or other Conveniency, that did belong to fishing Ships, since the year One thousand six hundred eighty sive, or shall be Cut out or Made by Ships, from and after the said Twenty sifth day of March,

Dne thousand seben hundzed.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority atoresaid, That every Master of a By-Boat, or By-Boats, shall Carry with him at least Two Fresh Men in sir (viz.) one Man that hath made no more than one Coyage, and one Man who hath never been at Sea before; And that every

every Inhabitant thall be obliged to Imploy Two such fresh Weil as the By= Boat-kervers are obliged for every Boat kept by them; And further. That all Malters of Filhing Ships hall Carry with them in their Spips Company, at least one such fresh Wan that never was at Sea before, in every Five Den they Earry; And that the Walter of each fuch By-Boat, and each such Fishing Ship, skall make Dath before the Collector : 02 other Principal Officer of the Customs of the Port or Ports from Whence Luch Ship intends to Sail, That each Ship and Br-Boats Company, have fuch Fresh Men therein as this Ac Directs: And that the said Officer or Officersis and are hereby Impoweed and Required to Administer the aforesaid Dath to the faid Masters of Ships and By-Boats, and give a Certificate thereof under his hand, Without any Fie, Gratuity or Re= ward for so doing.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforelaid, That every Waster or Owner of any Fishing Ship, going to Newfoundland (after the said Twenty fifth Day of March) shall have in his Ships Company every Fifth Wan a Green-man (that is to say) not a Seaman, or has

bing bein eber at Sea befoze.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That no Person or Persons whatsoever, shall at any time after the said Twenty afth Day of March, Obeliterate

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literate, Expunge, Cut out, Deface, or any wife alter or Change the Wark or Marks of any Boat of Boats, Train= fat or Trainfats, belonging to any o ther Person or Persons, Whereby to De= fraud or Prejudice the right Owner or Owners thereof, nor convert to his or their own use any Boat or Boats, Train fat or Trainfats, belonging to any other Person or Persons, Without his or their Confent and Approbation, nor remove nor take away any such Boat or Trainfac, from the Place or Places Where they thatt be left by the Divner or Owners thereof, except in Cale of necellity, and atto upon giving Potice thereof to the Admiral of the Varbour or Place Where fuch Boat or Trainfat shall be left by the Owner or Owners, to the end that the right Owners thereof may know what is become of them.

And be it Enacted by the Authority as forelaid, That no Person or Persons whatsoever, shall at any time after the said Twenty lifth Day of March, Rind any of the Trees there Standing or Grow-ing upon any occasion Whatsoever, nor shall by any ways or means whatsoever, set on Fire any of the Mods of the said Countrey, or do or cause to be done, any Damage, Detriment or Destruction to the same, for any Use or Uses whatsoever, except only for necessary fuell for the Ships and Inhabitants, and for the Building and necessary Repairs of House

les, Ships, Boats and Trainfats, and of the Stages, Cok-roms, Beeches and other Places, for taking Bait and Fishing, and for Drying, Euring and Husbanding filly there; And also that no Person or Persons whatsoever, shall at any time after the said Twenty fifth Day of March, Cast Anchor, or do any other Matter of Thing, to the Annoyance of Hindring of the Haling of Sayns in the Accustomary Baiting Places, or Shoot his or their Sayn or Sayns Within or upon the Sayn or Sayns of any other Person or Persons whatsoever: And alfo that no Person or Persons whatsoever, hall at any time after the said Ewenty fifth Day of March, Steal, Purloin, or take out of the Net or Nets of any other Person or Persons whatsoever, lying a drift, or Drover for Bait by night, nor Steal, Purloin or take away any Bait out of any fishing-Boat or Boats, or anp Net or Nets belonging to any other Person or Persons.

And whereas several Persons that have been Guilty of Thefts, Roberies, Purders and other Felonies, upon the And in Newsoundland, and the Islands thereunto adjacent, have many times Escaped Unpunished, because the Tryal of such Offenders hath heretofoze been Deved and Adjudged in no other Court of Justice, but before the Lord High Constable, and Earl Parshal of England: For R n n n n

And be it further Enaced by the Authority aforesaid, That the Admirals of and in every Port and Harbour in Newfoundland, for the time being, be and are hereby Authorized and Required, (in order to Preserve Peace and good Government amongst the Seamen and Fishermen, as well in their respective Harbours as on the Shore) to see the Rules and Orders in this present Accountained, concerning the Regulation of the Fishery there duly put in Execution; And that each of

the

the laid Admirals do Péarly keep a Jouinal of the number of all Ships, Boats, Stages and Trainfats, and of all the Seamen belonging to and Imployed in each of their respective Harbours, and shall also (at their Return to England) deliber a true Copy thereof under their Hands, to his Majesties most Honoura-

ble Privy Council.

And be it further Enacted by the Authoris ty aforesaid, That in case any difference or controversie shall arise in Newfoundland, 02 the Jaands thereunto adjoyning, between the Pasters of Fishing-Ships and the Inhabitants there, or any By-Boat-Keeper, for 92 concerning the Right and Property of Fishing-Roms, Stages. Flakes of any other Building of Conveniency for Fishing or Curing of Fish, in the feveral parbours of Coves, the faid . Differences, Disputes and Controber-lies, that he Judged and Determined by the Fishing Admirals, in the seberal Harbours and Coves; And in Case any of the faid Walters of Fishing Ships. By-boat-keepers of Inhabitants, hall think themselves Agrieved by such Judg= ment or Determination, and shall Appeal to the Commanders of any of His Majesties Ships of War, appointed as Convoys for Newfoundland, the faid Commander is hereby Authorized and Impoweed to Determine the same, pursuant to the Regulation in this Act. And

And to the end, that the Inhabitants, Filhermen, Seamen, and all and every of ther Person and Persons reliding or being at Newfoundland, or any the said Fland. of other Places, may with all Devotion joyn in their solemn Prayers and Ad= diestes to Almighty God, for the obtaining of his Bleffing upon their Perfons and Endeavours, Be it hereby En= acted. That all and every the Inhabitants of Newfoundland, or the said Illands or Places adjacent near thereto. shall strictly and decently observe every Lords day, commonly called Sunday; and that none of the faid Inhabitants (who keep any Tavern, Alehouse or other pub= lick House for Entertainment) shall En= tertain or Sell, Aend, Atter or Dispose of to any Filherman, Seaman oz other • Person whatsoever, upon any Loids day or Sunday, any Mine, Beer, Ale, Cyder, Strong Waters, or Tobacco, or any other Liquor or Liquors whatfoever.

And whereas by an Act of Parliament made in the Eighth and Ninth Pears of His Majesties Reign, Intitueted, An Act for Granting to His Majesty, a further Subsidy of Tunnage and Poundage upon Merchandizes Imported, for the Term of Two Years and Three Quarters, and an Additional Land Tax for One Year, for Carrying on the War against France; And by another Act made in the Ninth and Tenth Pears of His

Regis. his Maulties Reign, Intituled, An Act for Granting to His Majesty, a further Subsidy of Tünnage and Poundage, towards the Railing a Yearly Suin of Seven hundred thousand Pounds, for the Service of His Majesties Houshold, and other uses therein mentioned, during His Majesties Life, an Additional Durty of Twelve Pence on every Twenty Shillings. Ita= iue of all Gods and Werchandizes Im= ported (all manner of Kith English taken Excepted) is Granted to His Wajesty. His Heirs and Successors: And Whereas some Doubt hath arisen, whether Dyl, Blubber and Fins Taken and Import ed by the Company of Merchants of London, Trading to Greenland, are not liable to the faid Duty; We it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That all Whale-Fins, Dyl and Blub= ber, Taken and Imported by the Ships of the Company of Merchants of London, Trading to Greenland, Were not. nor are intended to be Charaed. made liable to the Duty of Twelve Pence for every Twenty Shillings Ualue of Gods Imported, Charged in the aforesaid Ans, but that the Whale-Kins, Dyl and Blubber, Taken and Imported, as aforesaid, and also all Thale-Fins, Dyl and Blubber of English Fishing, Taken in the Seas of Newfoundland, or any of the Seas belonging to any of His Wafe= sties Plantations of Colonies, and Im-20000 posted

ported into this Kingdom by any of his Wajesties Subjects in English Shipping, were, and are hereby declared to be free of the said Duties, as all fish of English taking; The aforesaid Acts, or any thing therein contained to the contrary in any wise notwithstand-

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ing.
