THE BISHOP'S RETURN.

The principal local event of the past month has been the return of the Bishop and Mrs. Sweatman, with their daughters, from England. It was a great disappointment to find that the Bishop, though fully recovered from the dangerous illness from which he suffered in the Spring, had been unwell during much of the time of his intended holiday, but we are pleased to observe an evident improvement since his arrival home, and look for his restoration in a short time to his usual health. For the present, however, Archdeacon Sweeny continues to act as Commissary.

In the week of the Bishop's arrival home, the ladies of St. Alban's, under the direction chiefly of Mrs. Arthurs, arranged a reception of welcome to his Lordship, a very large marquee being erected on the lawn west of the Cathedral, brilliantly lighted with especially arranged electric lights (for which we have to thank Col. Pellatt), and tastefully decorated with flags, festoons of flowers, etc. A stage was erected, from which short addresses of welcome were given, to which his Lordship replied. A piano enabled vocal and instrumental music to enliven the evening, and several refreshment booths supplied the want which is usually felt on such occasions. marquee was said to be capable of accommodating a thousand persons, and was quite filled throughout the evening, so that the entertainment was successful in the matter of numbers, as well as in other respects.

NEW ARTHDEACONS.

His Lordship the Bishop has appointed the Rev. John Langtry, D.D., to be Archdeacon of York, vacant by the death of the late Archdeacon Boddy.

His Lordship the Bishop has created a new Archdeaconry, to be known as that of Simcoe, and has appointed to it the Rev. Canon James Fielding Sweeny, M.A., D.D.

Dr. Langtry has long held so prominent a place among the Clergy of the Diocese that his selection for the vacant office is no more than what might have been expected. His appointment must also be regarded as a fitting recognition of his services to the Church as a writer and controversialist. His accession to the Cathedral Chapter will be welcomed by that body.

Archdeacon Sweeny has long been an Honorary Canon, and it gives us much pleasure to announce his advancement to the higher office. He has been acting as the Bishop's Commissary during his Lordship's illness.

In connection with the proposed plans for extension, though not accomplishing much towards that end, a very useful piece of work has been done, by enclosing the beiler house with a brick wall in 'ead of the unsightly and insufficient wooden wall which has hitherto existed. This small beginning may be claimed to be in accordance with the views of those who think it better to execute work of a permanent character only, as well as those who favour temporary work, because the greater part of the wall which has been built is really permanent, as it will be available as a support for the future floor of the transept.

Arrangements are being made for a small auxiliary hot air furnace, which may be used when the weather is too chilly for comfort, and not cold enough to warrant the full heating to be used.

The School has reassembled after the holidays, with an increase in numbers, and an important increase in equipment, a convenient Residence, No. 101 Howland Avenue, opposite the See House, having been secured, with accommodation for three or four masters and thirty boys. The want of such a Residence had been felt to be a great drawback. Arrangements have been made in the Residence for a room for Miss Playter's School, which has until now been very inadequately provided for.

The various organizations connected with the Congregational work of the Cathedral are now electing officers, and otherwise getting to work for the coming season. We are not able as yet to make any announcements of changes, and must defer doing so until next month.
