THE PARAGUAYAN WAIL.—The news from Paraguay received about two weeks ago represented President Lopez as utter ly crushed and the war as terminated. At the capture of the fortress of Angostura, in the last days of December, about 1,500 Paraguayans had fallen as prisoners into the hands of the Allies, and it was supposed that but a small force was now left to Lopez, and that the complete exhaustion of the country would make the raising of another army impossible. According to the later accounts from the seat of war, Lopez still has an army with him and is fortifying in the interior. 
