COMMUNIST PLOT AIMED AT FRANCE

Documents Seized Show It Was Intended to Overthrow Others Also.

Paris, Feb. 14.—The overthrow of the bourgeois governments of Spain, Italy and France is outlined in documents seized after a three-day search.

Discoveries made by the police of Barcelona and Milan show that the plot included the three European Latin countries.

Soviets have been organized throughout France with Brest as headquarters, according to police, ready to take over the railroads, banks and transportation.

The discovery of documents emanating from Berlin and paid thru a United States transportation company appears to have caused a revision of feeling in French political and official circles.

L'Humanite, the official organ of the French Communists, appears to be especially upset by the arrest of the city editor, M. Danon, a cancelled cheque for twenty thousand francs issued in whose name at Berlin the police hold.

The consensus of opinion in the chamber lobbies, where the probable arrest of the two Communist deputies has been freely commented upon, is that the government has struck a knockout blow against the Communist propaganda, and that when the minister of the interior requests the lifting of the parliamentary immunity in the case of the two compromised deputies, his request will be granted by a large majority, and finally that the plot is doomed to failure.

CONSERVATIVE LEADER RUSHES TO DEFENCE OF BIG NICKEL TRUST

Will the Drury government agree to the institution of proceedings against the International Nickel Co. An official announcement as to its position was expected yesterday, but did not materialize.

Long Standing Question. The whole question, Mr. Dewart said, had been frequently brought to the attention of the house, but had been done. He proposed to again demand action.

Declared at Dail Eireann Meeting That Dublin Castle Accepted Formula, But Later Lloyd George Added Impossible Conditions and Negotiations Fell Thru.

Dublin, Feb. 14.—The Irish Bulletin, issued tonight, summarizes the report of the Dail Eireann, held in the last week of January, at which there was a full attendance of available members, including the president.

Quoting from the speech of Eamonn De Valera, which dealt largely with the peace negotiations of December, an outline of which was printed some time ago, The Bulletin says:

"Perturbed at the effect on world opinion of his unrestricted black and tan warfare upon the Irish people, the British prime minister, commencing the archbishop of Perth to come to Ireland as an official intermediary to arrange a truce."

SHORT AND LONG LOANS TO FARMERS

Provincial Measures to Aid
Agriculturists Are Brought
Down.

MANITOBA FOLLOWED
Board of Seven Will Pass
Upon All Applications
for Advances.

Hon. M. Doherty introduced a number of bills designed to further agricultural interests in the legislature yesterday.

An act respecting short term farm loans provides that farm loan associations may be formed in any township, incorporated village or unorganized territory in Ontario. The system laid down for organization and the carrying on of business follows the lines of the Manitoba system of rural credit societies, but differs on some points.

The rate of interest charged by any association is not to exceed seven per cent, and it is anticipated that the association will secure money at four per cent, and the difference of one per cent will be used to finance the small expenditures of the association.

Long Term Loans.
An act respecting long term loans for agricultural development provides for the incorporation of three persons as the agricultural development board, which is to be a body corporate with power to issue bonds and debentures.

Finance Development.
An act respecting the raising of money to finance agricultural development authorizes the treasurer of Ontario to borrow money by means of deposits in any amounts or from any sources or corporations, and to open offices for this purpose at such points in the province as he may find necessary.

Suggest Lacrosse Ground
As Public School Site

A suggestion has been made by Mayor Church and his council endorsed by the residents of Rosedale and by the school board, for the board of education to take over the old Rosedale lacrosse grounds and erect thereon a public school for the North Rosedale district.

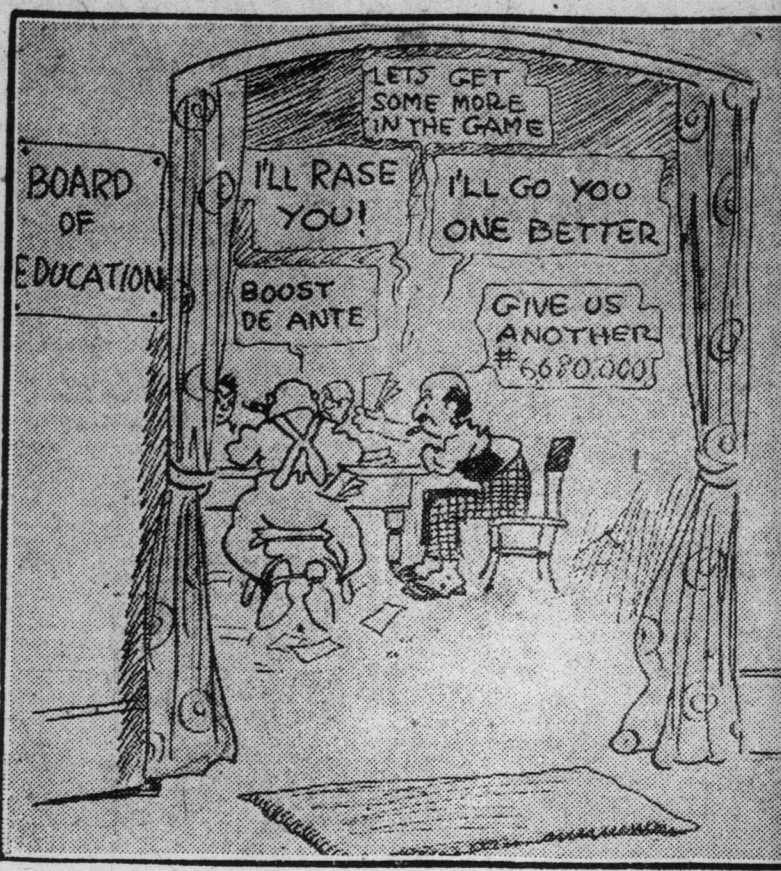
