





The value of our forest products at the present reaches the magnificent sum of \$12,000,000 and yields in revenue to the province over \$50,000 an nually. Lumbering therefore ranks next to agriculture as our most amportant industry, giving directly or indirectly employment to a large portion of our population and paying in wages alone to the men directly or indirectly employed in logging and the manufacture of wood products over \$6,000,000. It provides a ready market to the farmer for his products giving him in return nearly \$2,000,000 in ready money.
