London, May 9.—Twenty-four British merchant vessels, of more than 1,600 tons each, were sunk during the last week, it is announced officially. Twenty-two vessels of less than 1,600 tons, and 16 fishing vessels also were sunk. The adimraity announces the sinking of a British mine-sweeper by a torpedo on May 5, with the loss of two officers and twenty men.
