



"Therefore, be it resolved, that this meeting of temperance workers memorialize the Provincial Government to so amend the Ontario license act, as to provide that in shops and hotels the hours of sale and delivery shall not be more than 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., from Monday to Friday, and from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday. This restriction to take effect on the 1st day of May following any municipal election at which a majority of the electors voting upon the question declare in favor of shorter hours, and that such vote of the people must be submitted by the municipal council upon the presentation of a petition containing 10 per cent of the names of the qualified electors of the municipality."
