LONDON DOCTOR IS OPPOSED TO TORONTO VARSITY CONTROL

Dr. Campbell Says Medical Affairs of the Province Are Much Safer in Control of the Council—Comment on Medical Journal—Dr. Waugh's Opinion.

"Control of the medical affairs of the province by the Ontario Medical Council is very much preferable to control by Toronto University," said Dr. J. B. Campbell to The Advertiser when questioned as to his opinion of the move proposed by a journal of the medical association to lessen the powers of the council...

Dr. Waugh's Opinion. Dr. Waugh thought that the homoeopaths should have some representation although it might be that at present they are over-represented. He was in favor of abolishing the primary and intermediate examinations before the council, and of holding only the final examination before that body, and also in favor of cutting off the representation of Victoria, Trinity, and the Royal College, Kingston, inasmuch as they no longer teach medicine.

"The universities that have ceased to teach medicine should certainly have their representation cut off," Dr. Campbell was asked. "They have only been represented as a matter of courtesy for so long. No one ever thinks of being a homoeopathist now. The science of homoeopathy died with the founder."

OVERDRAFT IS ABOUT \$3,800

Victoria Hospital Accounts Show a Balance on the Wrong Side.

"The company knows just as well as London people do," continued Mr. Gillen, "that London needs a new station, and when the time comes it will be built. We want to make a clean sweep of the work that is to be done here when we start. We cannot touch any work in London until we get through the improvements in Toronto, where we are spending about \$5,000,000."

WIRE NAIL CO. WILL HAVE A \$250,000 PLANT

Company Will Greatly Enlarge Its Works in This City.

DIRECTORS HAVE DECIDED MATTER

Company Has Secured Temporary Quarters on York St. Along the G. T. R.

Negotiations are under way by which London will have an immense factory plant, the buildings of which will cost fully \$250,000, in the very near future.

The directors of the Western Wire and Nail Company held a meeting in this city a few days ago, and decided to at once enlarge their plant, and at the present time are seeking a site for their new works.

Owing to very extensive improvements that the Hobbs Manufacturing Company are planning the Western Wire and Nail Company will be crowded out of their present factory on Ridout street.

"We will build a new factory that with the machinery will cost fully \$250,000," said a gentleman in close touch with the matter to The Advertiser this afternoon. "The directors met here a couple of days ago and looked over a site for a new plant in the East End. A couple of other sites are being surveyed, and a selection will be made as soon as possible."

"The new factory will be very extensive, and one of the largest of its kind in America. The work will be rushed as soon as a site can be decided upon. The Waigoner Ladder Company's factory will only be used as temporary headquarters, so that the work of making the big improvements to the Hobbs Manufacturing plant can be kept on with."

CLOSE THE BARS EARLIER IN CITIES

Temperance Meeting in London Passed Strong Resolution Last Night.

CURTAIN LIQUOR SALE

Under the Three-Fifths Law There is No Chance to Secure Local Option in the Centres of Population.

"Whereas, the temperance people of the cities of Ontario have in most cases used the provisions of the licensing act for the evils of the liquor traffic as far as it is practical, and feel that the act is not adequate to their further needs, and that the three-fifths disability makes local option impossible;

"Whereas, the greater part of the evil of the barroom business results from the late hours of sale;

"Therefore, be it resolved, that this meeting of the workers memorialize the Provincial Government to amend the Ontario License act, so to provide that the sale of liquor for retail sale and delivery shall not be more than 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., from Monday to Saturday, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., on Saturday. This resolution to take effect on the 1st day of May following any municipal election at which a majority of the electors voting upon the question declare in favor of shorter hours, and that such vote of the people shall be submitted to the municipal council upon the presentation of a petition containing 10 per cent of the names of the qualified electors of the municipality."

The above resolution was unanimously carried by a vote of several hundred temperance workers in the lecture room of Dundas Central Methodist Church last night, following an address by Mr. McCarthy of Toronto.

"I have come to the conclusion," said Mr. McCarthy in his opening address, "that the liquor traffic is a part of municipal government, and the municipality must deal with it. Those who are voting upon the question in Ontario are not voting upon the question of local option, but upon the question of the hours of sale."

RECIPROCITY TOO GOOD FOR CANADA

ANOTHER VICTIM OF BLACKHAND

Chicago Italian Laborer Who Wouldn't Disgorge Shot Dead.

Chicago, March 13.—Pasquale Marsaluce, once a resident of Palermo, Sicily, quarrelled with members of the Chicago police, leaving there four years ago, the police say. For two years he has met with no members of the Black Hand, and he thought he was safe. Last night he abandoned his walled caution.

JUDGE LECTURES PRIEST

Tells Him What He Thinks of His Line of Action.

Montreal, March 12.—The unusual spectacle of a French-speaking judge severely censuring a priest for his conduct, was presented in the court of King's bench yesterday afternoon during the hearing of a perjury case.

The orthodox and conservative Father Desrosier, the parish priest of St. Pierre aux Lacs, and a well-known temperance advocate, were most dramatically denounced by Justice Lavergne.

The case was that a priest, who was charged with perjury in connection with a former house law infringement action, Justice Lavergne had made a case against a storekeeper in St. Pierre, named Guaron, and a charge of selling liquor without a license was pressed by the Anti-Alcoholic League. Justice Lavergne had sworn that Guaron sold him liquor, but the latter proved an alibi.

Yesterday Father Desrosier entered the witness box and swore that he would not believe Guaron on oath, thereby bringing down on his head the wrath of the judge.

"The two men, in spite of the fact that they have the indorsement of their parish priest, were not only spies, but provocateurs of crime. As for Father Desrosier, the reasons he gives for going into the witness box and declaring he could not believe Guaron on oath, thereby bringing down on his head the wrath of the judge."
