CLERGY RESERVES.

"Regulations for the Appropriation of the Share of the Clergy Reserves Fund, in the Diocese of Toronto, for the support and maintenance of public worship, and the propagation of religious knowledge, under the authority of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, pursuant to the Act 3 & 4 Vic. c. 78.

"I. That a sum of £1,200 per annum currency be appropriated towards the maintenance of a Theological Institution for the Diocese of Toronto.

"II. That annual payments of £60 currency be made to travelling Missionaries, to meet an equal amount raised within the Diocese, but that the Bishop be authorised to charge the whole stipend (namely £120 currency per annum) of such travelling Missionaries as he may find it necessary to send to new and destitute settlements where contributions cannot be raised, provided that the number of travelling Missionaries to be paid exclusively from the Clergy Reserves Fund do not at any time exceed ten.

"III. That the Bishop be authorized to draw upon the treasurers of the Clergy Reserves Fund to an amount not exceeding £120 currency in any one year, for the purpose of enabling travelling Missionaries to provide themselves with a horse, or necessary outfit, on first entering upon their duties.

"IV. That there be allowed to the Missionary of each settled Mission or Parish a sum equal in amount to that which shall be derived from glebes or other endowments belonging to the said Mission or Parish, or from contributions by the congregation or congregations towards the salary of their Clergyman, or from any Association within the Diocese, or from any portion of the pew rents which may be legitimately appropriated to that purpose, excluding surplice fees and every other source of income not above enumerated, provided that the total amount to be so allowed from the Clergy Reserves Fund do not in any case exceed £100 currency for the year: and that no stipend from the fund be allowed to any Clergyman settled in a Parish or Mission until a house has been provided and a contribution of at least £50. currency per annum has been guaranteed by the congregation or congregations within the same Mission or Parish.

"V. That the allowance made under the preceding Regulations be paid half-yearly, namely, on the 1st of January and the 1st of July, upon such certificate of conformity with the terms specified as shall be from time to time prescribed by the Society.

"VI. That no Missionary be placed on the fund without a written recommendation from the Bishop; and that with this limitation, all Missionaries at present on the List of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel be allowed to take advantage of the above arrangements, if they should desire to do so; in which case their income or other allowance from the Provincial Government, or the general funds of the Society, will be discontinued,

"VII. That the continuance of the Clergyman's services in any particular Mission be understood to depend on the fulfilment by the people of the conditions on which he was sent to reside among them.

" VIII. That the foregoing Regulations, as well as any others which have been or may be made for the appropriation of the Clergy Reserves Fund be understood to be subject to such alterations from time to time, as the Society may see fit to order."

ABSTRACT OF THE ACT to make provisions for the management of the Temporalities of the United Church of England and Ireland, in this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

[Royal Assent promulgated 3rd December, 1841.]

SECTION. I. Enacts that from and after the passing of the Act, the freehold of all churches, churchyards and burial grounds shall be in the incumbent and the possession thereof in the incumbent and Churchwardens, by whatever title the same may now be held. *Proviso*: This Act not to interfere with the rights of any other body of Christians.

SEC. II. The Pewholders and Seatholders to form a Vestry.

SEC. III. A Meeting of the Vestry to be held annually on Easter Monday, notice having been given at Morning Service on the previous Sunday, to appoint Churchwardens for the ensuing year; one to be appointed by the Incumbent and one by the vestry. *Proviso*: In case the Incumbent neglect to nominate, then both to be elected by the Vestry; and in case the Vestry neglect to elect, then both to be nominated by the Incumbent. In case no meeting takes place, a subsequent meeting may be called for such purpose.

SEC. IV. No person shall be eligible to the office of Churchwarden, except members of the said Church, of the full age of twenty-one years, and who shall also be members of such Vestry.

SEC. V. Churchwardens to hold office until the appointment of their successors

SEC. VI. Churchwardens, during term of office, to be a corporation to represent the interests of such Church and the members thereof, and may sue and be sued, &c., in matters appertaining thereto; and may in conjunction with Incumbent execute conveyances or leases to pewholders, and grant certificates to renters of sittings; charges for such conveyances to be paid by the person applying for same. It shall be the duty of such Churchwardens from time to time, to sell, lease and rent pews and sittings, on such terms as may be agreed at a Vestry meeting held for such purpose.

SEC. VII. The absolute purchase of a pew to be considered a freehold of inheritance, not to be forfeited by change of residence or discontinuing to frequent the same; such purchaser may sell the same to any member of the Church, who may hold the same, subject to the same duties and charges only as the original purchaser.

SEC. VIII. Any holder of pew or sitting shall have a right of action against any person injuring the same, or disturbing his possession.

SEC. IX. The Churchwardens shall every year, within fourteen days after other Churchwardens shall be appointed to succeed them, deliver a true account in writing in a book or books kept for such purpose, and signed by such Churchwardens, of all sums of money received and paid

by them, and of all sums rated or assessed and not received, and also of all goods, chattels, and other property in their hands; and also deliver over all sums of money, goods, chattels, or other things in their hands as such Churchwardens to the succeeding Churchwardens, all such books to be open for inspection to any member of the Vestry on payment of one shilling. In default of such account being rendered, or such money, goods, &c., being delivered over, by such Churchwardens, the succeeding Churchwardens may proceed against them by law for relief. In case of the re-appointment of same Churchwardens, such account to be rendered before the Vestry within fourteen days.

SEC. X. Incumbent or Churchwardens are empowered to call meetings of the Vestry, whenever they may think proper, and they shall do so on the requisition of at least six members of said Vestry. In case of refusal of Incumbent and Churchwardens to call such meetings, then six Vestrymen may, one week after such demand made, call a meeting by notice on the door of Church, at least one week previous to the intended meeting.

SEC. XI. The Incumbent to preside at all Vestry meetings, or, in his absence, a chairman elected by the majority present at such meeting. The Vestry Clerk, or if none, or in his absence, such person as the chairman shall name, is required to enter the proceedings of the meeting in a book to be kept for that purpose, and left in the custody of the Churchwardens.

SEC. XII. Rent charge and rents for pews and sittings to be regulated at such Vestry meetings; and also all charges to be made in respect of all conveyances, leases, and certificates: but no alteration to be made therein save at a special Vestry meeting, called for that purpose.

SEC. XIII. Clerk, organist, sexton, and other subordinate officers, to be appointed by the Churchwardens, and their salaries brought to the general account.

SEC. XVI. All fees on the services of the Church, and the charges payable on breaking the ground in the cemeteries or churchyards and in the said Churches for burying the dead, to be regulated by the Ordinary, or, if none, by the Bishop of the Diocese.

SEC. XV. By-laws can be made at Vestry meetings for the regulation of the matters of the Church or parish to which they belong, provided they be not repugnant to this Act, nor contrary to the canons of the Church.

SEC. XVI. Grants of land for all general or particular Church purposes may be made to the Bishop of the Diocese and his successors, or to the Incumbent of any Church for the endowment of such church or purposes appurtenant thereto, notwithstanding the statutes of mortmain, &c., provided such grant be made at least six months before the death of the grantor, and be registered within six months after his decease.

SEC. XVII. The Bishop may give a license to any person or body corporate or politic, to erect and endow any Church or Churches; the right of presentation to be vested in the founder or founders, being members of the Church of England, and such endowment being sufficient for the maintenance of such church and the incumbent thereof.

SEC. XVIII. No spiritual jurisdiction conferred by this Act.

On the 30th of April, 1851, the corner-stone of this Institution was laid by the Right Reverend John Strachan, DD, Lord Bishop of Toronto, in the presence of thousands, who rejoiced in the auspicious commencement of the undertaking, begun by our Venerable Diocesan in the face of many difficulties, and much hostility and discouragement. A full account of this interesting ceremony will shortly be published, when the building is opened. An Act of Incorporation has been passed by the legislature, but it does not convey any important privileges—it is to be hoped that the next Parliament will be more liberal.
