Webster the Man For Leeds.

The convention of the Liberals of South Leeds, held at Delta on Saturday last, was the largest and most enthusiastic held for years.

The meeting had been postponed from the previous Tuesday on account of the blocked condition of the roads, and at noon on Saturday the roads were almost in an impassable condition.

The minutes of last meeting of the association were read and approved, after which the secretary read the resignation of Mr. O. A. Wood, director of the association from Kitley.

Mr. W. J. Webster and Chas. E. Britton moved the following resolution: That this convention assembled in the Province of Ontario, and in the presence of the Premier of the Province, Hon. A. S. Hardy.

Mr. Webster spoke in support of the resolution, paying a high tribute to the ability of the present Premier of Ontario. He asked the support of all honest electors, without regard to party, to help retain in power the best government of all the provinces of the Dominion as well as to support the candidate of the party who he might be.

Mr. Britton was opposed from principle to the passing of mere government resolutions, but as these resolutions were the only means of giving effect to the feelings of the supporters, he heartily seconded the resolution.
