SEIZURE OF THE CHIEF JUSTICE. We are sorry to learn that the Steamer Chief Justice Robinson is still detained by the United States Authorities. The cause of her seizure forbids the thought of her long detention. An American gentleman purchases for his own use six gallons of Scotch whiskey, and some wine and brandy in bottles, and one of the stores in Toronto, and commits them to the care of one of the officers of the Chief Justice; the latter gives into the hands of one of the Custom-house officers a correct statement of this part of his cargo, affecting no concealment, and entertaining no fear. This surely was a case not calling for the severe measures adopted. It might have been necessary to forbid the landing of these goods, and to remind the parties of the existence of laws prohibiting the importation of these articles in such small quantities; but the seizure of the vessel does seem an extreme measure.
