Gen. Kuropatkin Reports Progress

Official Account of Movements of the Armies in the Field.

Continued Landing of Men and Stores by the Japanese Emphasized.

St. Petersburg, May 27.—General Kuropatkin, under date of May 26th, telegraphs the Emperor as follows: "Re-commissioned on May 25th in the direction of Pungwahung showed that a detachment of the Japanese vanguard was occupying Komenda pass, near the village of Sialandun, on the Lao-yang main road. Small detachments were sent to occupy positions on the Lao-yang road, between Koumshing and Sialandun. The Japanese line pass has been fortified and a strong force of Japanese had been found near the Komenda pass. Since May 16th small detachments of Japanese have been moving towards Komenda. These detachments, concentrated in the Sialandun district, ten miles from Dalandandun, Sialandun pass is reported to be occupied by the Japanese. On May 24th, the Japanese vanguard, 20 on the Haicheng road with one of the enemy's advance posts. One Cosack was captured on May 24.
