
Sectional View of Miller's "New Model" Vibrating Thresher

An Interesting Test.
The Joseph Hall Manufacturing Company, Oshawa, Ont., have introduced a new threshing machine called the "New Model" Vibrator. This machine was invented by Mr. Jacob Miller, of Canton, Ohio, who has for forty years been engaged in manufacturing threshing machines. The "New Model" was first offered to the public in 1879. For 1883 more than one thousand were sold in the United States. The Hall Company have been making some very interesting tests to ascertain the real merits of the machine as a grain saver. A plot was built at the rear of the machine with a slatted bottom, so that all the grain fell upon the slats. It was arranged so that one man could stand on either side of the platform and shake the grain out of the straw, so as to allow it to fall through the slats, through the straw over the platform, and under the hopper a fanning mill was placed. Then fifty bushels of grain was threshed, beginning at the rate of sixty bushels per hour, and working up to one hundred and twenty bushels per hour. After threshing fifty bushels at each of the various speeds, the grain in the fanning mill was cleaned up and weighed. It can readily be seen that in this way a test can be made which would exactly represent the quantity of grain which would be lost in the straw stack. Ten tests were made only a short time ago, and the worst result was the loss of five ounces of wheat in threshing ten bushels, which was equal to a waste of one bushel in nineteen bushels of grain. This is a truly wonderful result, and is valuable because the test has been made in a thorough and systematic manner. All kinds of grain have been threshed and the result was equally satisfactory.
