FOR PLAYING GOLF ON SUNDAY.

Four Members of the Toronto Golf Club Found Guilty of Violating the Lord's Day Act.

A York County Justice of the peace has found four members of the Toronto Golf Club guilty of breaking the Lord's Day Observance Act by playing golf on their own grounds on Sunday. On Saturday night the case of Messrs. J. F. Edgar, O. W. Smith, R. Cronin and W. Gordon was heard by Mr. John Richardson, J.P., at the Court House, Yorkville. Mr. Edgar, J.P., appeared for the accused. County Constable Tidbury gave evidence that he found the four gentlemen in question playing golf on Sunday, May 26. This statement of fact was admitted by the defence, and the J.P. said that he would convict the accused without hearing further evidence. Mr. Aylesworth testified that he had been asked to act as a witness for the defence, and that the clause of the act under which the information was laid was as follows: "It is not lawful for any person on that day to play golf, ball, football, croquet, or any other outdoor game," and the defence contended that golf was not a game of ball or a noisy game.

Golf Not a Game of Ball.

In support of this contention Mr. Walter Casella, Q.C., president of the Golf Club, testified that golf was not a game of ball, and was by rule a custom a most quiet game. AMENDING THE SEALING LAW.

Washington, June 2.—The bill which passed the British Parliament last year to amend the Sealing Law, has never been considered wholly satisfactory to the Dominion of Canada. There has been considerable correspondence between the Ottawa Government and the London Foreign Office regarding the measure. The Canadian contentions have been that it ought to be corrected in a number of minor particulars. The bill, as amended, does not deny the allegation, but the excuse given is that it was hastily introduced through Parliament in order that no night issue in putting the regulations into effect. The statement made by Sir Edward Grey in Parliament Friday would introduce a bill on the 10th inst., having reference to sealing in Behring Sea, is the outgrowth of the Canadian contentions, and it is simply that the proposed bill will amend certain parts of the original bill, but without changing the spirit of that act. In other words, the regulations now in force cannot be changed except with the consent of both countries, but the British Parliament may make their own act somewhat more symmetrical by amending certain of the articles, and this will be done in the measure which Sir Edward Grey will bring forward on Monday week.
