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

The Laying up of the Old Colours
of the
60th Princess Louise Fusiliers

Sunday, 13th September, 1903
11 a.m.

ORDER OF SERVICE.

Upon the arrival of the Regiment, the Band and drums take up position while the Escort to the Colours stand with fixed bayonets, the Colours being halted on the Church steps.

The Adjutant knocks with his sword for admission which, being granted, the doors are opened by the Church wardens.

The Adjutant shall then say:-

"Reverend Sir: I have been directed by Lt.-Colonel Menger commanding the 66th Princess Louise Fusiliers, to inform you, that he desires admission for the purpose of requesting that the old Colours of the Regiment may be deposited in this Church."

Permission having been given, the following order will be observed:—

The Clergy.

The officer in Command with the Majors.

The Colours and the Escort.

The Regiment.

HYMN.

Fight the good fight with all thy might, CHRIST is thy Strength, and CHRIST thy Right; Lay hold on life, and it shall be Thy joy and crown eternally. Run the straight race through God's good grace, Lift up thine eyes, and seek His Face; Life with its way before us lies, Christ is the path, and Christ the prize.

Cast care aside, lean on thy Guide; His boundless mercy will provide; Trust, and thy trusting soul shall prove Christ is its life and Christ its love.

Faint not nor fear, His Arms are near, He changeth not, and thou art dear; Only believe, and thou shalt see That Christ is all in all to thee. Amen.

The Rector stands at the Chancel steps with the Church Wardens.

The Clergy stand within the Chancel.

The Officer in command addresses the Rector.

The Rector replies, ending thus:

"In the name of the blessed Trinity, and acting on behalf of this congregation, I accept these colours and will assign them to a permanent resting place within the walls of this ancient Church."

The Lieutenants bearing the Colours will then turn and face the Escort, who will then present arms, while the band plays "God Save the King."

The Colours are then handed to the Majors and by them to the Churchwardens, who hand them separately to the Rector, and by him they are borne and humbly presented and placed upon the Lord's Table, the organist meanwhile playing "Home Sweet Home."

Then shall follow:-

PSALM XX.

- 1. The Lord hear thee in the day of trouble; the Name of the God of Jacob defend thee;
- 2, Send thee help from the sanctuary: and strengthen thee out of Sion;
- 3. Remember all thy offerings: and accept thy burnt-sacrifice;
- 4. Grant thee thy heart's desire: and fulfill all thy mind.
- 5. We will rejoice in thy salvation, and triumph in the Name of the Lord our God: the Lord perform all thy petitions.
- 6. Now know I, that the Lord helpeth His Anointed, and will hear him from his holy heaven: even with the wholesome strength of his right hand.
- 7. Some put their trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the Name of the Lord our God.
- 8. They are brought down, and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright.
- 9. Save, Lord, and hear us, O King of heaven: when we call upon thee.
