New York Bank Statement. The associated bank statement was fa-vorable, inasmuch as it assures cheap money for some time to come. Loans in-creased \$12.477.500 during the week, specie increased \$2,008,600, legal tenders increas-ed \$9,012,800, deposits increased \$422,859.-900, and circulation decreased \$427,000. The result is an increase in cash reserves of \$5,306,425, and the surplus is now \$31,-275,200, as compared with \$57,067,578 a year ago and \$37,678,500 two years ago.

The local money market is unchanged, with call loans quoted at 4 to 4½ per cent. In New York the rates are unchanged at 1½ to 2 per cent, and in London 1¼ to 1½. per cent. Bank of England discount rate is unchanged at 3, and the open market rate 2½ to 2¼ per cent.


