Many suggestions have been gratefully received for the amendment and improvement of this edition, which have been acted upon so far as possible, and we believe, as a result, that the "Year Book" of 1890 will be found more satisfactory because fuller and more reliable than any previous edition. We regret that the publication has been delayed, but it was unavoidably so. A desire to publish the result of the General Election of November, 1889, was one of the reasons for the delay. We have been unable to note, in their proper place, the changes in departmental offices caused by the recent change of Government, we beg to direct the public to the *Appendix* for this and other late information. Some slight addition has been made to the Table of Contents, notably, the Board of Agriculture, the Fisheries' Commission, the Outport Boards of Health, all of which are newly constituted. A Representative Assembly was first granted to this Colony in 1832, under the Governorship of Sir THOMAS COCHRANE. By the Constitution nine Districts were established, returning fifteen members, who were to hold their seats during His Majesty's pleasure. In 1836 the members of the Assembly were elected for four years, and this term has been adhered to since that date.

In 1854, upon the granting of Responsible Government, the number of the members was increased, at the instance of the Imperial Government, to thirty. In 1874 the membership was further increased to thirty-one, by the addition of one member to the number of those representing the District of Twillingate and Fogo.

In 1882 the number of members was increased to thirty-three, by the erection of St. George and St. Barbe into Districts, with one member each. In 1885, after the publication of the Census of 1884, a partial re-distribution took place. The District of Twillingate and Fogo was divided, Twillingate retaining three members, Fogo was given one. Bay-de-Verds, which was made to include a part of Trinity District, was allowed an additional member, as was also Harbor Grace. These alterations increased the number of members to thirty-six.

A Blue Pennant and Blue Burgee, when hoisted together, show that a Sail has passed the Narrows, going either North or South.

When a Merchant's House-flag is hoisted on the South pole, it denotes that a vessel belonging to said Merchant is South of Cape Spear; and when hoisted on the North pole, it shows that said Vessel is in sight of the Block House.

When a Square White flag with a Red Ball in the centre is hoisted either on the South or Centre pole, it denotes that a Steam-tug is required.

The International Code of Signals are also in use at the Block House, and the recognized House Signals of the different Merchants.

St. Pierre Lights.

A *White flash light*, 210 feet above the level of the sea, is situated on Gallantry Head. Distance visible 18 miles. The light is hidden at the Northward by the high land of St. Pierre. Lat. $46^{\circ} 45' 30''$; Long. $56^{\circ} 9' 9''$. Tower square, 36 feet high, painted White.

The *South Channel* entrance to St. Pierre Harbor is marked by two small fixed lights. One is white, illuminating three-fourths of the horizon; it is placed on the battery. The other is red and is placed on the plain at the north of the town. The White light is 34 feet above the sea level and is visible 6 miles. The Red light is 62 feet above the sea level and is visible 3 miles. The line connecting these two lights marks the middle Channel. The Red light is so placed that as soon as it is seen on the left of Cape Aigle, vessels coming from Colombier, in beating into the N. E. entrance, will be clear of the Cape Rodrigue Shoals.

Pointe à Leconte Light, situate on the Southwest Point of the Island of Dogs, 62 feet above the level of the sea, visible 7 miles. The light shows white between the bearings (from the tower) of S. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. and S. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. This white sector of the light marks the South East passage, so as to permit vessels which keep within this cove to avoid the Bataille shoal on the right and Cape Noir and Bertrand Rocks on the left. It shows red from S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., Westward, to N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., and should be avoided by vessels entering by the S. E. passage. It will enable them when they have quitted the white cove to come to an anchor in the Roadstead or in the Barachois, by following the line of white light from Pointe aux Canons, and of the Red light from the interior of the town.

MONEY ORDER OFFICE.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit it by Money Order, if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered. No half pence to be introduced into Orders. Money Orders issued and paid from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m.

Commission on Money Orders.

On Money Orders drawn by any Money Order Office in Newfoundland on any other Money Order Office in the Colony, is as follows :—

No single Money Order, payable in Newfoundland, can be issued for more than \$50; but as many of \$50 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Rates of Commission on Orders to countries or places not mentioned, can be obtained upon application at the Money Order Office.

General Suggestions to the Public respecting Money Orders.

The Office will not be liable for any Order after payment.

State correctly the Christian name and Surname of person to whom the order is payable.

State correctly the Name and Surname of the person taking out an Order.

Should any alteration be made in the name of the person in whose favor an Order is drawn, a new Order will have to be issued and commission be paid thereon.

Unpaid Money Orders are legally void at the end of one year; nevertheless, if any valid reason is adduced for delay in presentation, payment will be made, upon application, subject to certain deductions.

To Postmasters.

Obtain from the presenter of a Money Order, (whether he or she be the right owner or not), satisfactory information as to Christian name, Surname, and address of persons by whom it was drawn. In the case of a firm, the name of the firm and address will suffice. When an Order is presented through a Bank, the Order, being properly signed, must also be crossed with the Banker's name.

PARCEL POST.

United Kingdom—Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid as follows:—On every Parcel, not exceeding 2 lbs. in weight, 36 cents; this being the minimum charge; postage over 2 lbs., 18 cents per lb., or fraction thereof, maximum weight 11 lbs. Parcels to the United Kingdom must not exceed 3 feet 6 inches in length, or in length and girth measured together, 6 feet, the girth being measured round the thickest part of the Parcel. A Customs' declaration of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender.

Dominion of Canada—Parcels for the Dominion of Canada must be prepaid at the rate of 25 cents per pound. No parcel can be forwarded if over 4 lbs. in weight, or if measures more than 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. A Customs' declaration of the contents and value of each parcel must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender.

Inland—Parcels are forwarded by post within the Colony and should be plainly addressed and marked "By Parcel Post." The sender's name should be written on the lower left hand corner. A Parcel must not contain a letter or any correspondence; postage 1 cent per 2 ozs., or fraction thereof; limit of weight, 5 lbs. Parcels may be registered—fee 3 cents.

General—No Parcels should be posted in a Letter Box but must in all cases be taken into the Post Office and presented at the wicket where forms can be supplied and information obtained. Parcels can be registered.

General Directions to the Public.**LETTERS.**

Register all valuable letters.

Always communicate to the Postmaster the loss or delay of letters, &c.

In addressing letters add the name of the District in which the Post Office addressed is situated.

Letters for Canada should be addressed to the Province as well as the Post Office.

Letters for the United States should be addressed to the State as well as the Post Office.

Address letters, &c., legibly, and be careful to discriminate between places of same name.

A letter once posted becomes the property of the person to whom addressed, and must be forwarded according to its direction. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer or to any other person.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duties, cannot be forwarded by Post beyond the Colony.

In the Colony they *must* be Registered. Always seal letters containing anything of value.

Letters addressed to mere initials will not be delivered unless addressed in care of a resident or to some box in the Post Office.

Letters bearing mutilated stamps, or stamps so soiled and defaced as to make it impossible for the sorting clerks to decide whether they have been used before or not, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office for adjudication.

Unpaid and insufficiently paid letters, both local and foreign, will be charged, on delivery, with double the amount of postage unpaid.

RE-DIRECTED LETTERS.

Letters re-directed to places in Newfoundland, Great Britain, Canada, and the United States, without being taken out of the Post Office, are not liable to any additional postage.

REQUEST LETTERS.

Letters addressed to persons in Newfoundland when sent in envelopes having written or printed thereon a request from the sender, that the letter if not delivered at the office addressed within a certain time specified in the request, may be returned to his address as requested, will be returned to the sender at the expiration of the time specified.

NEWSPAPERS.

Always fully pre-pay newspapers, or both papers and stamps are lost.

A newspaper must have no cover, or a cover open at both ends, which can easily be withdrawn. It must contain no enclosure. It must have no writing thereon but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent.

Newspapers over four ounces are charged as books.

BOOKS AND CIRCULARS.

A book packet must be left open for inspection, it must not contain any inclosure, nor must it exceed 24 inches in length, nor 12 inches in breadth or depth. The limit of weight of a book packet addressed to any place within the Colony, Great Britain, Canada, or the United States, is 3 lbs. Unpaid book packets will not be forwarded. Circulars, 1 cent.

REGISTRATION.

Every letter and packet intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. On no account should it be dropped into the letter box. The registration fee must be pre-paid on registered letters addressed to the Government Departments in St. John's, and also on registers sent by Government Offices to the Outports. The registration fee on letters and parcels to places in Newfoundland is three cents, including official registrations; to Great Britain, four cents; to Canada and the United States, 5 cents.

MATTER WHICH CANNOT BE FORWARDED BY POST.

Any explosive, dangerous, or destructive substance, liquids, or anything likely to injure the mails, or the person of any officer or servant of the Post office. A glass bottle, or glass in any form, (except eye-glasses, microscopic slides and spectacles, when properly put up), matches, leeches, or fruit.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duty (except in Newfoundland.)

EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

Examinations will be held on any day previous to Friday, providing that the Candidate produces the requisite certificates of character and time, and passes the Color test.

Application must be made to the Examiner on Form Exn. 2, and all previous certificates and testimonials deposited at least two days previous to the examination. Testimonials of character and sobriety must be produced for twelve months immediately preceding the application.

All services must be verified by a Certificate of Discharge, excepting from the Outharbors, and in these cases the Master's certificate and the certified copy of the seaman's time will be accepted as sufficient.

An only or First Mate must have served five years at sea, of which one year must have been in a square-rigged vessel

A First Mate must have served one year as second or only Mate.

A Master must be 21 years of age, and have served six years at sea, of which one year must have been as First or Only Mate, and one year as Second or Only Mate, in a square-rigged vessel.

These fees admit of two examinations. After the second examination another fee will be required.

Candidates for Mates' Certificate will be allowed 12½ hours to complete the whole of their examination in Navigation, including Sumner's method, Chart, Sextant and Cyclones; but the Nautical problems Exn. 4, 5, and 6, must be completed in six hours, without the Candidate leaving the premises.

Candidates for Master's Certificate will be allowed 15 hours to complete the whole of their examination in Navigation, including the papers on Compass Deviation, Chart, Sextant, Sumner and Cyclones; but the Nautical problems must be completed in six hours without the Candidate leaving the premises.

The examination commences punctually at 10 a. m., and closes at 4 p. m., when all papers will be called up, and if not completed the Candidate will be declared to have failed.

In all cases of failure the Candidate will be examined *de novo*.

If failed in Seamanship, he will not be examined for six months.

If failed three times in Navigation, he will not be re-examined for three months.

RULES.

No books, papers, or memoranda are allowed in the Examination room.

In the event of any Candidate being discovered copying from another, or referring to any book or memoranda, he will not be examined for six months.

Navigation is taught at Carbonear, Harbor Grace, Bay Roberts, and St. John's.

NOTE.—Sec. 1. Chapter 54, Title 15, of the Consolidated Statutes, provides that Letters Patent can be issued by the Governor in Council for a term not exceeding fourteen years, with the proviso that they may be extended for a further term of seven years. Patents granted to non-residents which have not been brought into use in Newfoundland within two years from the date of the Patent are no longer valid.

Sec 3 of the same Chapter provides that any person may obtain from the Colonial Secretary a copy of any such Letters patent or drawing relating to the same, also the Petition whereon the said Letters Patent were issued on payment of the usual fees charged for copies of other documents.

Synopsis of Legislation, 1889.

ACTS PASSED 1ST JUNE, 1889.

1. **Seal Fishery Amendment Act.**—Repeals the first section of the Act of 1887.
2. **Revenue Act.**—Continues, with but slight alteration, the Act of last year.
3. **Road Act.**—Usual grants for repairs of Roads and Bridges.

4. **Hall's Bay Railway Act.**—Authorizes the raising of a sum of money, not to exceed four and a half million dollars, to be spent at the rate of \$425,000.00 annually for ten years, in the construction, equipment and maintenance of a line of Railway to Hall's Bay.

5. **Loan Act.**—Provides for raising \$410,000.00, at 4 per cent. interest, to pay off the floating debt of the Colony and for construction of certain public works.

[The loan was raised in London at an average premium of $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.]

6. **Bait Act.**—Consolidation and amendment of previous Acts.

7. **Fisheries' Commission Act.**—Authorises the appointment of a Board of Fishery Commissioners, whose duty it shall be to enquire into all matters pertaining to the preservation and development of our fisheries, and to the fishery trade and interests of the Colony: to take steps for the collection, preservation and dissemination of useful information upon these subjects: to make Rules (subject to Legislative sanction) for the regulation of the conduct of the fisheries, the appliances to be used in their prosecution, and the establishment of close seasons. Also provides for the appointment of an Inspector of Fisheries.

8. **Agricultural Act.**—Grants \$4000.00 per annum out of the general Revenue for the purpose of agriculture. Authorises the appointment of a Board of Commissioners of Agriculture, whose duty it shall be to take measure for the formation of Societies for the Encouragement of Agriculture: to obtain animals of improved breeds, and to distribute new varieties of seeds, etc.: to establish a model farm, and to hold an agricultural and horticultural exhibition once a year. An Agricultural Society may be formed, under this Act, in any locality where twenty-five residents shall bind themselves to become members thereof, and to subscribe each not less than \$1 annually towards its funds. Such Society shall be entitled to draw from the general funds under the control of the Board, a sum equal to the amount of the subscription of its members.

9. **Sheep Preservation (Amendment) Act.**—From the proceeds of the dog licenses issued in the St. John's District, compensation shall be awarded to persons in the District whose sheep or cattle have been injured by dogs, and who have received no other compensation for their loss. The balance, if any, shall be spent upon public works in the St. John's District.

10. **Prevention of Cruelty to Animals' Act.**—Provides that any person convicted of ill-treating a domestic animal shall pay a penalty not exceeding \$25. If the offender be not the owner of the animal ill-treated, he shall pay the owner thereof a sum of money not exceeding \$25 as compensation, and this in addition to any punishment that may be inflicted for ill-treatment. Every vehicle used for draft purposes shall be provided with a pritchet which must be used when the vehicle is laden and stationary. Penalty not exceeding \$10. In all cases under Act, if penalty is not paid at once, the Justice may levy for the amount upon the offender's goods, or commit him to prison for one month.

11. **Deer Preservation Act.**—No caribou shall be killed between the 15th of February and the 1st of October in any year, nor shall any person expose for sale or have in his possession any venison before the 1st of October or after the 11th of March. No person, except poor settlers, shall, without license, kill any caribou. License for persons not resident in Newfoundland, \$50; for persons resident in Newfoundland, \$10. Persons carry-

ing license not allowed, under penalty of \$400, to kill more than five stags and three does in any one season. No venison allowed to be exported as an article of commerce. Any caribou, or any skin, or antlers thereof, taken out of the Colony for the private use of the exporter, to be cleared at the Customs. Dogs and pitfalls not to be used to kill caribou. Poor settlers may kill caribou for their own use, or for sale, without paying license fee.

12. Local Option (Amendment) Act.—Is an amendment on the various Acts in force relating to the sale of intoxicating liquors. On receipt of a petition, signed by one-fifth of the electors of any particular locality, asking for a poll to be taken to ascertain if the sale of liquor shall be prohibited in such locality, the Governor shall issue a notice appointing a day, in one of the following months, viz.: October, November, December, January, February, for the taking of such poll. If it does not take place in one of the above-mentioned months immediately succeeding the receipt of the petition, the petition shall be void. Voting to be by ballot. If two-thirds of the electors vote in favor of local option, the Governor shall issue a Proclamation forbidding the sale of intoxicating liquors within the limits mentioned in the petition. Proclamation to be in force for three years. If a new poll is required, three months' notice, prior to the expiration of the Proclamation, must be given, otherwise local option shall remain in force for three years more. Petition for a new poll to be signed by one-fifth of the electors, and a majority vote required to repeal the Proclamation. All expenses to be paid by the inhabitants of the locality petitioning, and to be secured to the Magistrate before the petition is sent to the Governor. Penalty for selling liquor in a proclaimed district or locality, \$400 or three months.

13. Quarantine and Boards of Health Act.—Consolidates and amends previous Acts. In addition to those portions of the old Acts which are retained, it provides for the appointment of Boards of Health, and vests in them all the authority heretofore vested in Health Wardens, and gives them increased powers. Their duties may be summed up as follows: To prevent the spread of disease by means of isolation, quarantine and disinfection, and such other measures as may be deemed necessary. These powers have been so prominently brought before the public, in connection with the epidemic of diphtheria in St. John's, that they need no further notice. This Act further provides for the levy of heavy fines against persons guilty of the following offences:—Concealment by householder of the presence in his house of any contagious disease; (fine \$50 or under). Encouraging the spreading of the disease by appearing, when ill, in any public place, selling or otherwise disposing of any infected clothing; (fine \$100 or three months). Preventing (when the patient is not attended by any medical practitioner) the visit of the Board's medical attendant to any person suspected to be ill with some contagious disease; (fine, \$50 or under). Refusing to obey any order of the Board of Health. In the absence of a Board any J. P. may exercise all the powers of one. Government may make compensation to persons suffering loss of property from the lawful enforcement of this Act.

14. & 15. Registration of Voters and Qualification of Election Acts.—These Acts are covered by the "Election Act, 1889."

16. Representation Act.—Includes new settlements on line of Railway in District of Trinity.

17. Legislative Assembly Act.—Defines the limits of Electoral Districts. Empowers the Assembly to establish rules for its guidance, and

protects the members and servants of the House, during Session, from assault, obstruction and bribery; subjects members accepting bribes, and officers refusing to obey orders of House, to pains and penalties. Gives the Assembly power to conduct inquiries into any matter affecting its privileges, and protects from damages or punishment all persons acting under its authority. Further declares that no member shall be liable to punishment of any sort, by reason of any matter or thing brought or said by him before the House.

18. Pilotage Act (St. John's).—This Act repeals all former Acts relating to pilotage at the port of St. John's. It appoints five honorary Commissioners of Pilots for the said port. These Commissioners shall have power to grant or withdraw certificate to licensed pilots, and to settle all disputes, etc., relative to pilotage, and (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) to enact Bye-Laws for the regulation of all matters pertaining to pilotage. No pilot to be licensed until the present number (11) is reduced to nine, which number is at no time to be exceeded. Cost of certificate, \$4. In case of loss or defacement of certificate, a new one can be obtained for \$2. Penalty for transfer of certificate, first offence, \$20 fine; for second offence, the offender shall lose his certificate, and shall not be again licensed. Every licensed Pilot shall carry a flag and shall have his boat rigged and numbered as directed by the Commissioners. Licensed Pilots to pay \$8 each per annum to Pilots' Fund. Superannuated or infirm Pilots, or their wives, widows or children, are entitled to receive, subject to regulations of Commissioners, a sum not more than \$200 per annum, for each family, from said Fund.

NOTE.—For rules, rates, &c., see "Pilots and Pilot rates," in this Almanac.

19. Encouragement of Ship-building Act, 1889.—This Act, the passing of which was rendered necessary by the expiration of that of 1888, provides a bounty of \$4 per ton on all vessels newly and entirely built, equipped and registered in the Colony, imported material used in construction being *bona fide* duty paid. Thickness of plank and ceiling, fastening, &c., same as in the Schedule to Act of 1888. It also authorizes the Governor in Council to employ a Lloyd's Surveyor. Towards raising the funds required for his salary a fee of \$4 shall be paid by the owner of every vessel surveyed by him.

20. Education (Amendment) Act.—Amends the Act of 1887 in some matters of detail.

21. Lobster Fishery Act, 1889.—Repeals Act 51st Vic., Cap. 10, which prohibited the taking of Lobsters measuring less than 10½ inches in length, and which also established a close time from August 31st in any year to February 1st in the next year.

22. Law Society Act.—A private Act.

23. Penitentiary Act.—Places the Penitentiary under the official supervision of the Attorney General.

24. Consolidated Statutes Act.—Provides for the publication of "The Consolidated Statutes, New Series."

25. Quarter Sessions Act.—Abolishes Courts of Quarter Sessions and declares that the jurisdiction of said Courts shall in future be vested in a Stipendiary Magistrate or in two or more Justices of the Peace, except in cases where those Courts had power to try by jury, in which case their power is vested in the Supreme Court. It also defines and limits the jurisdiction of Stipendiary Magistrates and Justices of the Peace.

26, 27 and 28.—The usual Supply, Indemnity and Contingencies Acts.

Close Time for Fish and Game.

For Willow Grouse, (commonly called Partridge), other Grouse, and all wild or migratory birds (except Wild Geese), or for eggs of the same, Jan. 12th to Sept. 15th, in each year.

For Black Game, Capercaillie, or other Game Birds to be introduced, or their eggs or progeny, for five years, from 1st January, 1886.

For Caribou, 15th of February to 1st October, in any year.

For Caribou, (sale or possession), 12th March to 1st October in any year.

For Moose or Elk, now or hereafter to be introduced, for ten years from 1st January, 1886.

For Herring—Seining—from 20th October to 18th April next following.

For Herring—Netting—when Nets are less than 2½ inches, from 20th December to 1st of April next following.

For Salmon—From 11th September to 30th April, both inclusive.

For Trout, Land-locked Salmon, or any Freshwater Fish, in any lake, river or stream, 15th of September to 1st December in each year.

- Donations of Clothing, specially imported for gratuitous distribution by any Charitable Society; Dye Stuffs.
- Fish of British catch and cure, and Oil, the produce of such fish; Fruit, not being canned, bottled or preserved, and not otherwise enumerated.
- Gas Engines when protected by Patent.
- Hemp, Hemp Yarn, Coir Yarn, Sisal Manilla, Flax and Tow; Hides, or pieces of Hides, not tanned, curried or dressed; Household furniture, working tools and implements, used and in the use of persons arriving in this Colony.

SHEEP PRESERVATION.

The following Sections of the Acts 47th Vic. Cap. VII., and 50th Vic., Cap. IX., for the Preservation of Sheep, are published in Consolidated form for the information of the Public:—

I.—It shall be lawful for the duly qualified Electors, resident within an area or District within this Colony, to present to the Governor in Council a Petition or Requisition in the form prescribed by the Schedule to this Act, or as near thereto as may be, setting forth the limits or boundaries within which such area or District is comprised, and the names of the Towns, Harbors or Settlements included therein, and praying for a Proclamation prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

II.—Such Petition or Requisition shall be sent to the nearest resident Stipendiary Magistrate, and shall be by him (after examination and certificate as hereinafter provided) furnished to the Governor in Council.

III.—Upon receipt of any such Petition or Requisition containing the signatures of not less than one-third of the Electors, resident within any such area or District, certified as aforesaid, the Governor in Council shall issue a Proclamation or Public Notice prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

IV.—From and after the day prescribed in and by such Proclamation of Notice, it shall not be lawful for any person resident within such area or District to keep, or to have in his possession, or under his control, any Dog within the area or District to which such Proclamation or Notice shall relate, under a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three Months. This prohibition shall not apply to any person or persons travelling or passing through such areas or Districts and having a Licensed Dog or Dogs in his or their possession, charge or control, and not at large.

V.—It shall be the duty of all Police Constables to kill all Dogs found by them in any area or District in which the keeping of dogs is prohibited under this Act, except Shepherd Dogs or Collies, and those excepted under the next preceding Section, and all such Dogs not so excepted may be killed by any person whomsoever. And it shall be lawful for any person to destroy any dog kept in contravention of the provisions of this Act.

All penalties under this Act may be sued for and recovered in a summary manner before a Stipendiary Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, and all fines shall be paid to the person who shall give information of the offence and prosecute the offender to conviction.
