OF THE

Nova Scotia Annual Conference,

Taken at Halifax, from 16th to 22nd June, 1875.

The second session of the Nova Scotia Annual Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada, began in the Grafton Street Church, Halifax South, on Wednesday, June 16th, 1875.

The Rev. John McMurray, President of the Conference, took the chair at 9 o'clock, A. M.

After singing and the reading of the Scriptures, prayer was offered by the Rev. Thomas H. Davies and the Rev. Jos. F. Bent.

The Conference proceeded to elect by ballot its chief officers, when the Rev. Alexander W. Nicolson was elected President, and the Rev. R. Alder Temple, Secretary.

The Rev. Stephen F. Huestis was re-elected Journal Secretary.

The Revs. Cranswick Jost, A. M., Arthur D. Morton, A. M., and Ralph Brecken, A. M., were appointed Assistant Secretaries; and the Rev. Jno. M. Pike, Assistant Journal Secretary.

QUESTION VII.

Who have died since last Conference ?

ANSWER.

Charles DeWolfe, D.D., who was born in Wolfville on May 30th, 1815, and departed this life in his native village, on the 9th of June, 1875.

At an early age he evidenced great fondness for study, and was privileged in securing a liberal education. The profession of law was decided upon, his father and brothers being very desirous that he should qualify himself for legal duties. He went to Halifax and entered the law office of the Attorney General, having, as his fellow student, the present Lt. Governor of Nova Scotia. At this time he was moral and upright in his conduct, but manifested no especial interest in divine truths. About one year after this a marked change in his life occurred. The christian counsels of an intimate friend, and a powerful sermon from Rev. Dr. Crawley, then Baptist minister at Halifax, from the text "Why stand ye here all the day idle?" were blessed by the Divine Spirit in his conversion to God. Shortly after his conversion, and as the result of prayerful consideration, finding that the doctrines and polity of the Wesleysans fully harmonized with his views he identified himself with the Methodist Church, being baptized with water and received into our communion by the Rev. Dr. Knight.

Feeling strongly convinced that he should preach the gospel he relinquished his prospects in the legal profession, and offered himself as a candidate for our ministry. Early in 1837 he left Halifax for England, having been recommended by the Nova Scotia District to the British Conference. His sojourn in that land marks another important period in his life. The advantages of the Theological Institution at Hoton,—the benefits of association in student life with such men as William Arthur and John Hunt,—the privilege of sitting under the ministry of princes of our church, as Hannah, Bunting, Jackson, Beaumont, Newton and Beecham, combined with opportunities of intercourse with, and study of British Methodism had a most salutary effect in moulding his character and preparing Charles DeWolfe for future usefulness. In City Road chapel, Sept. 14th, 1838, he was solemnly ordained to the work of the ministry, and in less than a fortnight embarked with the Rev. G.*M. Barratt for St. John, New Brunswick. His first appointment was Yarmouth. On that circuit, as well as on others where he ministered in holy things— at Halifax, Windsor, Charlottetown, Montreal, Three Rivers, Petite Riviere, Shelburne, and Sackville—he commended himself as an eloquent and successful minister of the Lord Jesus Christ. In 1861 at the inauguration of our Theological Institution, he was appointed the first Theological Professor, and at the same time the degree of D.D. was conferred upon him by Acadia College. In 1863 he was chosen President of the Conference of E. B. America, and discharged the duties of that important position in such a way as to secure the unanimous approval of his brethren. When compelled by physical weakness to take a Supernumerary relationship, he continued, as strength permitted, to preach Christ, and the influence of his life and labours is blessedly felt in Wolfville.

Dr. DeWolfe possessed a highly cultured mind, had all the characteristics of a christian gentleman. His refinement and pleasing address gave him ready access to all classes of persons. His catholicity secured for him a place in the affections of men of different denominations. His ministry was prized because of its spirituality, and the attractive presentation of truth. The poor shared in his sympathy and care. The young were the especial objects of his regard, and the sick and suffering found in him a friend.

In his last sickness a complication of diseases produced intense pain. But he was a patient sufferer. No complaint escaped his lips. When informed that his physicians had little hope of his recovery he expressed himself confidently as enjoying the Saviour's love, and exulted in the prospect of heaven. When the sacrament was administered to him a few days before his death, he remarked, "I am commemorating the Saviour's death every hour in my sick chamber." On another occasion he said, "I desire to depart and to be with Christ, which is far better."

His body was committed to the ground, "in sure and certain hope" of a glorious resurrection; and his sanctified spirit has passed to join the glorified host who cast their crowns before the throne of God.

MODE OF EXAMINATION.

Papers prepared by the Examiners upon the books, &c., assigned to them are to be sent to the Secretary of the Examining Board by the first of January.

Each Chairman and Financial Secretary shall meet the Candidates and Probationers in their Districts on the last Wednesday in April, at some place appointed by the Chairman; lay the printed questions before them, and transmit their written answers to the respective Examiners, who shall immediately report the result to the Secretary of the Examining Board. The Secretary shall issue the certificates and transmit them to each Chairman prior to the District Meeting.

The Superintendent of the Circuit which recommends a Candidate to be received on trial is required to give a written statement of his religious character, talents, and usefulness; educational advantages, acquirements, and other particulars, as required by our Discipline; which

statement shall be signed by him, and recorded in the District Book.

No Probationer shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are satisfactorily completed.

The Conference requires candidates for our ministry to preach a trial sermon before the District Meeting by which they are recommended, or before a Committee appointed by the District Meeting, who shall report their opinion on the sermon and embody it in the recommendation of such candidate to the Conference.

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS.

Rev. John McMurray.

On motion of Rev. R. Alder Temple—

1.—*Resolved*, That the thanks of the Conference are due to the Rev. John McMurray, Ex-President, for the highly efficient and satisfactory manner in which he has discharged the duties of his office during his Presidential year.

2.—That the Conference contemplates with the deepest sympathy the necessity which has led to the retirement of Bro. McMurray from the active work of the ministry. he will carry with him the warmest affections and unabated confidence of his brethren, and their earnest prayers for his continued prosperity and usefulness.

Rev. Egerton Ryerson, D.D., LL.D.

Resolved, That the Conference desires to express its high appreciation of the distinguished services rendered to us by the venerable Egerton Ryerson, D.D., LL.D., whom we have been permitted to welcome among us. The encouraging statements made by him concerning the work of God throughout the bounds of our united Church, and his ministration, in our pulpits of the everlasting gospel, presented in all simplicity, and accompanied by the unction of the Holy Spirit, have been listened to by us with profit and gratitude ; and we earnestly pray that this honoured servant of God may be long spared to bless the Church by his eminently wise counsels, and that he may be abundantly strengthened for his laborious and responsible duties.

Joseph Lawrence, Esq.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Conference are tendered to Joseph Lawrence, Esq., of Weatherby, Leeds, England, for his kindly interest in the advancement of Methodism in Nova Scotia, and especially for his aid in securing candidates for the ministry among us.

Hon. S. L. Shannon.

On motion of Rev. J. McMurray.

Resolved, That the respectful thanks of the Conference are due, and are hereby presented to the Hon. S. L. Shannon for the pains taken by that gentleman in preparing the Act of the Legislature of Nova Scotia

passed at the last Session of that body, and also the model deed for our Connexional property as rendered necessary by our altered circumstances as a Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada.

D. Henry Starr, Esq.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Conference be presented to D. Henry Starr, Esq., for his kind attention to the young brethren from England, on their arrival in Halifax; and also for the valuable services he has rendered the Conference during the present Session.

Resolved, Further—

1.—That the thanks of the Conference are due to the Superintendents of the Halifax Circuits for the satisfactory arrangements made by them for the comfortable accommodation of the ministers attending this Conference.

2.—That the Ministers of the Halifax Circuits be requested to express from their pulpits next Lord's day, the thanks of the Conference to the members of our Church and other persons, for their kindness and Christian hospitality in entertaining the ministers who have attended the present Conference.

3.—That the thanks of the Conference are due to proprietors of railways, coaches, &c., for the special advantages afforded by them to the ministers in journeying to and from this Conference.

FINANCIAL ECONOMY.

The Conference recommends to the Quarterly Meetings of the several Circuits the following plan, by which it is hoped they may the more effectually raise the amount necessary to meet the allowance of the ministers and preachers, and which will make the collection of class and ticket money hereafter unnecessary.

1. Let the Quarterly Boards at the beginning of each financial year estimate the amount needed for the year.
2. Then ascertain from each member of the church, and, as far as practicable, from each attendant of the Association, what each proposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.
3. Let these sums be entered by a steward appointed for that purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.
4. If the total amount of these sums does not equal the amount needed, then let the stewards apportion the deficiency among such as are willing, for Christ's sake, to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.
5. Let the stewards then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month, by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly or of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the quarterly meeting. The said steward shall keep an individual account of all these pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the quarterly meeting, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That quarterly meetings adopting the envelope system be recommended not to include in their estimates the claims of Foreign and Home Missions, but to provide for these funds as in time passed by special collections and subscriptions.

STANDING ORDERS.

I.—FINANCIAL DISTRICT MEETINGS.

1. The attention of the Chairmen of Districts is called to Sec. VI., p. 49, and Sec. I., p. 113, of the Discipline. The Conference directs that the greatest care shall be exercised in preparing the estimates of Receipts and Expenditure on the dependent Circuits. The expenditure shall in no case exceed \$750, exclusive of the Children's Fund claims and house rent. These estimates, together with a detailed statement of the removal expenses of ministers, shall be forwarded to the Rev. S. F. Huestis, Secretary of the Missionary Committee, who will transmit them to the Central Missionary Board.

II.—CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

2. *Missionary and Educational Societies.*—Each Superintendent is required to present at the District Meeting, in a form for publication, lists of the benefactors and subscribers to these Societies of one dollar and upwards, all amounts under one dollar to be entered under small sums, with an account of their respective contributions, and all other monies received during the year; and the Chairman of the District shall forward such lists to the Treasurers of the respective Funds.

3. *Contingent and Supernumerary Ministers' Funds.*—Superintendents are requested to see that the annual public collections are taken for these Funds at the times appointed. For the latter fund subscriptions and donations shall also be taken in the Classes and among the lay friends of the Church, and the names of all annual subscribers of five dollars or more shall be forwarded to the Treasurer for publication in the Minutes of Conference.—(*Dis.* p. 115.)

4. *Children's Fund.*—The Financial Secretaries of the several districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meeting, the names of all ministers in their respective districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed; and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

III.—SABBATH SCHOOL REPORTS.

5. Each Superintendent is directed to see that an Annual Report of the state of the Sabbath Schools in his Circuit, is prepared, in tabular form (*Schedules Nos. 1 & 2*, issued by the Board of management), and presented to the Quarterly Official, and District meetings.—(*Dis.*, pp. 79 & 98.)

IV.—REPORTS OF RELIGIOUS STATE.

6. Each Superintendent is required to prepare a Report of the religious state of his Circuit or Mission, to be read at the Annual District Meeting; at which meeting a Summary of such Reports shall be prepared and entered in the District Minutes for the information of the Conference. The condensed Reports of Missions shall also be prepared in a form to be transmitted to the General Secretaries.

V.—BOOK-ROOM ACCOUNTS.

7. Every Minister and Teacher is peremptorily required to settle his book account for the preceding year at each Annual Conference, and also regularly to transmit the money in his hands, without any reservation or deduction whatever, to the Book Steward, whenever it shall amount to ten dollars. (*Jour. Gen. Conf. p. 168.*)

VI.—PROVINCIAL WESLEYAN.

8. Chairmen of Districts are directed to institute enquiry at the Annual District as to the diligence and fidelity of each Minister and Preacher responsible for the collection of subscriptions due for the *Provincial Wesleyan*.

VII.—DISTRICT MINUTES.

9.—Chairmen of Districts are required to take to Conference *three* complete copies of the Minutes of the Annual and Financial District Meetings, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary;—one copy, inserted in the District Book, for his own use; one for the Secretary of the Conference; and one for the members of the District and of the Conference.—(*Dis. p. 49.*)

VIII.—SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

10. Sermons on the Obligations of the Sabbath shall be annually preached on all the Circuits on the third Sabbath in the month of January.—(*Jour. Gen. Conf. p. 192.*)

APPENDIX.

**Report of the Auxiliary Missionary Society for the
Nova Scotia Conference.**

During the past year important changes have been made in our Church relations. The Wesleyan Methodist Conference of these Maritime Provinces has been united with that of Ontario and Quebec, and these, together with the Methodist New Connexion, now constitute an independent connexion, known as the "Methodist Church of Canada." In consequence of this change the Foreign Missionary Society, (an auxiliary of the Wesleyan Missionary Society of the British Conference), and the Home Missionary Society of the late Conference of E. B. A., have become incorporated with the Missionary Society of the United Church. In this report we take leave of the parent Society, and also introduce to our friends and subscribers the new organization.

The Committee in bidding farewell to the parent Society would again express its grateful acknowledgement of the fostering care which for so many years it has exercised over our Missions. The sorrow of separation is in some degree relieved in knowing that we part with the best wishes, and followed by the earnest prayers, of that truly noble institution.

In the formation of the new Missionary Society the Methodist Church of Canada proves herself true to the spirit and traditions of Methodism.

The Constitution of the Society, the extent of its operations, the broad and varied field of labour already occupied, the number and character of its agencies, and its large annual income, are pledges that our Church is determined to maintain its Missionary character.

Our Mission field embraces the Dominion of Canada, also Newfoundland, the Bermudas, the French Island of St Pierre, and far distant Japan. The Missions already established throughout this widely extended territory may be classified as follows, viz :—

I.—DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

Among these are included the Home Missions and dependent Circuits of our own Conference, and a similar class of Circuits belonging to the different Conferences of the United Church. There are also 14 Missions among the settlers of Manitoba and British Columbia.

II.—INDIAN MISSIONS.

These are established among the Indian tribes of the Saskatchewan, Hudson Bay Territory, British Columbia, and the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Of them the Editor of the Canadian Methodist Magazine thus writes :—Her Indian Missions have been one of the chief glories of Canadian Methodism, and of all the Protestant agencies among the native races hers have been the most successful. “She has now forty Missions, employing twenty-nine Missionaries, seventeen interpreters, nineteen teachers, and twelve local assistants, or a total paid agency of seventy-seven. There are no more difficult Mission fields in the world than those of the “Great Lone Land” of the North West. The devoted servant of the Cross, unlike the Missionary to India, China, or Japan, goes forth to a region beyond the pale of civilization. He is surrounded by savage

and often hostile tribes, cut off from human sympathy, and from intelligent and congenial companionship. His social isolation is sometimes almost appalling. The unvarnished tales of some of our own Missionaries lack no feature of heroic daring and of apostolic zeal. The influence of our Missions has largely been felt in the improved social and moral condition of the Indian tribes, among whom have been won some of the most remarkable trophies of Divine Grace. Many Pagan savages have been reclaimed from lives of sin to become the disciples of Jesus, and have adorned by their consistent walk the doctrines of the Gospel." In the April number of the Missionary Notices appears a report of a visit made by the Rev. George Young of Winnipeg, Chairman of the Red River District, to some of the Missions under his supervision. We give a few extracts. "The journey extended to a distance of well nigh one thousand two hundred miles, occupied twenty-eight travelling days, and was performed by some walking, and a good deal of riding in dog sleds :

"The different stages in my journey were, from Winnipeg to Beren's River, about five days ; thence to Norway House, four days ; thence to Oxford House, five days ; the return trip occupying about the same time. During these twenty-eight days I camped out some twenty-three or twenty-four nights, some of which were colder than any I had ever before experienced.

"THE MISSIONS I visited belong to the Methodist Church ; no other denomination has ever occupied this ground.

"The *Rossville Mission* is very pleasantly situated on the shore of a beautiful little lake, within two miles of Norway House Post, and is the oldest and by far the strongest of our Indian missions in the North-west. It was established in 1840 by the Rev. Mr. Rundle, Wesleyan Missionary from London. In looking over the register of baptisms and marriages, which has been

carefully kept from the first, I found the first baptism recorded on the 28th of May, 1840, by Mr. Rundle, and the last on the 3rd January, 1875, by myself; between these dates one thousand five hundred and sixty baptisms were registered. Mr. Rundle was succeeded by the late Rev. James Evans, who, in labours and travels and successes, was 'more abundant,' whose name is ever mentioned by these Christian Indians with profoundest respect and gratitude. Probably one thousand Indians or more consider this place, and neighbourhoods adjacent, their home. The mission itself embraces a large number of families who live in very comfortable and clean-looking little houses, not far from the church and school and mission house. The church, which has been enlarged once, was built by Mr. Evans, and is at present about 60 ft. by 30 ft., and as it is closely seated, I suppose contains occasionally some four hundred, little and big, of a congregation. At present there is a membership of three hundred and eighty-one, of whom forty-seven are on trial, making a nett increase this year of sixty-four. There are eighteen classes with leaders and assistant leaders, one day-school and one Sabbath school at 'Crooked Turn,' about eight miles away; in these schools there are about one hundred and fifty scholars.

"At the lovefeast there were present about three hundred people, while nearly two hundred came to the Lord's table, among whom one was over one hundred years of age, and one came one hundred miles to attend the services."

The *Nelson River Mission* is situated about two hundred miles north from Norway House, and is the most northerly point of our mission field. The work of instructing these poor pagans was commenced by Rev. E. R. Young during his occupancy of Rossville, and by him a large number were baptized. Through his representations and influence mainly, the authorities of the

Church were led to open a mission there, and to appoint the Rev. J. Semmens as their first missionary. During the last few months he has baptized fifty-five persons, and conducted services regularly on the Sabbath, with congregations not very large but attentive, some seven of whom have become communicants.

Mr. Semmens reckons about five hundred Indians as placed under his pastoral care. According to the judgment of chief Factor Ross, as well as Rev. E. R. Young, this field is a central and very important one, which should be worked with energy and true faith.

Mr. Semmens writing from this Mission says:— Physically, I have not been idle. Though alone, I have with my own hands cleared a spot for a Mission House, and I now await your word of command to begin operations forthwith.

The spot selected is beautiful for situation, within a hundred yards of good fishing, both in summer and winter, and near to both wood and hay. It is the spot where the Indians spend their summers. It is the place where, for generations past, the poor pagans have worshipped blocks and bones, birds and beasts, images and creeping things. Many a feast, and dances without number, have been held here in honor of gods that were made with hands. Many a heathen sacrifice has been consumed on this hill. Many a midnight has been made horrible by the monotonous thumping of the conjurer's drum; and morning has a thousand times dawned upon idolatrous suppliants for help divine, still lingering in the place of prayer.

Here and there, among the tribes, still abound the cared gods of Nelson River, and over those, suspended on poles, still hang the freewill offerings dedicated to senseless objects by these deluded people. Knives, combs, rings, awls, twine, printed cotton and tobacco, all hang loosely in the wind, unnoticed and unappropriated by the lifeless statues to whom they have been reverently presented.

Such is the spot where it seems fit that a temple should be built to Jehovah. One would like to see idolatry overturned, and Christianity built upon its ruins.

At Fort Simpson, in British Columbia, a mission has been lately established. It is upwards of 500 miles from Victoria and not far from the borders of Alaska. The Rev. Thos. Crosby, writing from this remote region under date June 20, 1875, reports a good degree of prosperity. A mission house has been built, and a church commenced. The Indians are ready to do all they can in erecting these buildings and have already given over \$600 for that purpose.

Our Sabbath services have been well attended all the time; indeed, not many more could get into the house. This makes us long for the church, so that when strangers visit the village they may be welcome to a seat with us, and where they may hear words whereby they may be saved. Many attend the prayer meeting at daylight on Sunday morning, which is a season of grace and sweet delight. But the Sabbath-school services are the most interesting, when they crowd the house. Four classes are being taught to read the Bible and all the lessons. Perhaps four or five hundred listen with the greatest attention to the lesson explained from the illustrated paper before them. I hope you will send us a fresh supply out soon. If I could give you but a faint idea of the way Christmas was spent out here in contrast with the former years of heathen feasts, dances and whiskey drinking and quarrelling. You would have been delighted to have been at the tea on Christmas eve, provided by myself and Mr. Morrison, at which, I suppose, seven hundred sat down, and about forty at home, old and sick, were remembered. We had Christmas carols also; about forty young men and boys, who had been practising for some time, were led by Peter Quintell, Mrs. Morrison's brother. The whole village was lit

up with lamps and torches, and decorated with evergreens and flags. This was to show the great joy they felt at the birth of Jesus, and the fact that they had changed, as they often express it, from the old way to walk in the new. Early in the morning they commenced to visit the mission house, as also each other's houses, to shake hands. I suppose that not less than four hundred visited our house, old and young alike. Then I preached to them at half past ten, and in the evening at six.

The Indians wishing to send their words to their Christian friends in Ontario and Quebec, a public meeting was held, and some of the principal men spoke as follows:—

CLAH—"God knows my heart. About three years ago I heard about God; then I travelled about five hundred miles to find Jesus. Another year I went north again, and when I came back I found just what I wished. It was as when the snow comes down from heaven; I saw a track and did not know what it was—now I find it was Jesus. I say now, to all my friends, 'Come.' If I am in a great storm I know it cannot hurt me. And now I do thank God that He has sent the Missionary, and I thank the good people of Canada for their help. I pray much that I may see the house of God put up. Long ago I was blind, and now God has opened my eyes. I hope the good people of Canada will still pray for us, for we are very dark; and I send my love to Dr. Wood, the chief who looks after the missions."

MOSES NEAS-NOW-AH, (Chief.)—"I wish to tell the people how happy I am—how I thank God for the light that has come to Fort Simpson. It looks like this to me—there are two mountains, one little one and one big one—not much sun on the little one, for it is hidden from the snow by the big one, but not much snow on the big one, for the sun takes it all away. That seems

like us ; a long time ago it was very dark and cold, but now see what God has done ; it seems to me all light now, and all the frost and darkness are going. Now, I do thank God that he has sent us a good Missionary here ; for you see a little tree, it always bends with the wind, but he is like a great tree, he never bends, he never changes. I send my warm heart to all my friends in the East."

NISH-VI-WOO-NATE.—"I am glad that Jesus is going to be Chief at Fort Simpson. I know Jesus is the great power. We want to be like so many sea-gulls ; when they see small fish they all crowd around. We want to do just the same when we are invited to come to Jesus."

KA-HANT.—"See how God has had pity on us ! About two years we have prayed for a Missionary, and now, see, God has heard us, and we are happy, and now we do not wish any one to come and stir up trouble among us."

ABRAHAM.—"I thank the dear friends in Canada for sending us a Missionary. God has heard our cry. I should like to see all the good people, but I cannot ; I shake hands with you in my heart. You love Jesus and have the light—do help us : we want a very large church here, for we hope people will come from other places. Please send us your words back to let us know what you think."

Adam, Patrick, Neash-out, Paul, William Kinon and others spoke in a similar strain.

III.—FRENCH AND GERMAN MISSIONS.

These are located in Quebec and Ontario. Of the former there are eight Missions and six Missionaries, and of the latter six Missions and six Missionaries—A German paper has for some time been published, and proved a valuable auxiliary to the Missionaries, in dis-

seminating the principles of our holy religion, and in checking those infidel and rationalistic views which so largely prevail among the German people.

The difficult work of evangelising the French Roman Catholic population of Quebec is prosecuted with vigor, and not without success. The establishment of an Educational institution to aid these Missions has been recommended by the General Conference, and efforts are now being made to carry out this project.

IV.—JAPAN MISSION.

In this remote and most interesting country Canadian Methodism is worthily represented by two of her best men—Although but a short time there much has been accomplished through their agency. God has wonderfully opened their way and greatly honoured His servants. Several of the Japanese have professed faith in Christ, have received Christian baptism, and are now in fellowship with the Church. Additional laborers are required. The future of these Missions is highly promising. Upon the Missions scattered throughout the field we have surveyed, the Society has 31 Day Schools and 31 Teachers, 25 Interpreters, 5 Ministers on circuits supplying small bands of Indians, making a paid agency in this department of Church work amounting to 320. This is exclusive of those employed on Domestic Missions in the Eastern Conference, and in the late Methodist New Connectional Conference.

The Financial operations of the Society may now be glanced at. The total income of the past year is* of this large amount the auxiliary of the Nova Scotia Conference contributed, viz. :

It was feared that by uniting the two objects, Home and Foreign, and holding but one Anniversary Meeting in each of our churches, the income of the Society would be greatly diminished. The result shows that such fears were groundless. This gratifying fact is largely owing to the visit and effective addresses of the honored deputation of the Missionary Board with which we were favored last autumn. This deputation was composed of the Rev. A. Sutherland, Sec., Treas., John McDonald, Esq., M. P., Lay Treas. of the Society, and the Veteran Missionary among the Indians of Saskatchewan, the Rev. George McDougall of Fort Edmonton.

The visit of these distinguished brethren, the valuable information they gave, the spirit, zeal, and fervor which characterized their addresses and sermons have greatly strengthened the ties that unite us to our brethren in the west, and have enlisted the sympathy of our people in the Mission work of the United Church. The Committee express the hope that such visits may be frequent. The Central Board of Missions granted to this Conference \$11,250, to aid in sustaining our Home Missions and dependant circuits. This amount has been appropriated to the Districts as follows :

The Committee regret that so large a number of our circuits are dependent, to some extent, upon the Mission fund. They think it quite time that some of those circuits should become self-supporting. It is due to themselves, and to the spiritually destitute of our country, that our members in many places should put forth a little more effort and raise their circuits to an independent position.

CONCLUSION.

This brief survey of our Mission field and review of the Society's operations during the past, should inspire feelings of gratitude to God, and stimulate us to greater efforts in the future. The Society has certainly the strongest claim upon the sympathies, and is well deserving the prayers and liberal contributions of Methodists everywhere. A great responsibility now rests upon the Protestant Churches of this Dominion. The future prosperity and influence of this growing country is intimately connected with, and largely dependent upon its religious institutions. PASTORAL ADDRESS

OF THE

Nova Scotia Conference of the Methodist Church of Canada, to the members of the Churches under its care.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,

We cannot allow this the second annual session of the Nova Scotia Conference to close, without addressing you as usual in our capacity as the united pastorate of the Church. We have not forgotten to plead for you at the throne of grace. We may therefore the more freely speak to you upon topics connected with personal growth in grace, and with the progress of that branch of the church, over which the Holy Ghost hath made us overseers.

A year since, we addressed you at length upon the intended union of the Eastern British American Conference with that of the Upper Provinces. Since that time, these conferences, with the New Connection Conference of Canada, have been formed into the Methodist Church of Canada, extending from Newfoundland to Vancouver's Island. We now bear the name that our founder himself gave, "the people called Methodists." For the union so peacefully consummated we render thanks to the Great Head of the Church. The tokens of divine favour conferred upon us during the year, lead us to believe that we have acted in accordance with the divine will.

The presence with our ministerial delegates to the General Conference of laymen chosen by yourselves, marks more emphatically this new era in our history. We have learned with great satisfaction of the deep

interest manifested by these brethren, and of their cheerful participations in the business of the Conference. Now as never before, we are "workers together." We earnestly ask in every part of our work for your cheerful co-operation.

We are not forgetful brethren of your steadfastness in the past, your love of our doctrines and discipline, your reverence for the Bible and the Sabbath, your continued witness for a strict morality, your liberality in the support of the Church, and your faith in God. We urge you to guard well the old doctrines of repentance towards God, and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. The antinomian doctrines against which our fathers battled with the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God, re-affirmed in many quarters to-day, are calculated to weaken christian principles, and render unfruitful the christian life. Do not rest satisfied without a present assurance of divine favour.

We are grateful to be able to record for the past year an increase of three hundred and fifty-five in the membership of our church, with eight hundred and fifty-nine on trial; but we are not content to rest satisfied with the successes of the present or past—we are looking for greater things. As a Church we need more than ever the cleansing power of God's Holy Spirit, and we are grateful to note the earnest yearning for entire sanctification on the part of many of our ministers and people. Let us remember that power to do good is power from on high—Be holy, seek for purity of heart, be much in closet prayer, and you will have grace given you to adorn your profession.

The review of the year causes sadness as well as rejoicing. We are again reminded of our mortality by the removal of one of our most dearly beloved and talented ministers. The Rev. Charles DeWolf, D.D. after a ministry of great usefulness and power, has entered the eternal rest. God buries his workmen but

carries on his work. Three young men, who have honourably completed their probation, have been ordained to the full work of the ministry, and eight others have been received on trial. We enjoin upon you the duty of prayer, that the great Head of the Church may still raise up faithful men to preach the Gospel, and we hope that by a thorough consecration, you may devote your children to God's use in the Church. It is one of our rules, that every member shall attend the means of grace when able to do so. It is not the talent or fancied want of talent in the pulpit which should control your attendance at the house of God. Let congregational singing and a devout attitude at prayer be everywhere encouraged. We wish you to remember that attendance at class is indispensable to membership in our church. The class meeting is among the most useful and cherished means of grace, and we exhort you to prize it. "Then they that feared the Lord, spake often one to another."

We are gratified to note an increase during the past year in all the funds of our Church, indicative of your spirit of self-sacrifice, under the severe financial pressure of the times.

We cannot too earnestly press upon you the great need of continual labour in Sabbath School work. The young are committed by God to the church, that under the influence of her guardianship they may be trained for His service. Let every member of the church, by prayer and work, support the Sabbath School, and let your efforts be constantly directed to the salvation of the young.

We again commend to your sympathy and prayer our Educational Institutions at Sackville. During the past year they have been unusually prosperous, so that extensive additions in both the male and female departments have become necessary. We ask your patronage for these establishments, and your prayers for those

godly men who work for God in connection with them.

We are pleased to report the continued prosperity of our Book Room and Provincial Wesleyan Office. We hope the day is not far distant when every Methodist family in these lower provinces will be in possession of a copy of our paper, and when our members, especially superintendants of Sabbath Schools, in selecting books, will give the preference to those found at our own Book Room.

The question of temperance has demanded much of our attention in the past, and we more earnestly than ever press its claims upon you. You are aware, that, according to the rules of our church, no one can be admitted to membership, or retain his membership among us, who is engaged in the liquor traffic. Throw all your influence in the scale of total abstinence, and prayerfully use every means to rid our country of the stain of intemperance. Permit us to remind you that the article on page 88 of our discipline, which refers to the question of intemperance, also calls your attention in the plainest possible terms, to games of chance, dancing, and all those amusements which are of a questionable tendency. Let us not be behind our fathers in strict adherence to the spirit and letter of those rules, the wisdom of which has never been questioned. Especially do we urge upon you the comprehensive New Testament rule of conduct, "whether therefore ye eat or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." Guard well the sanctity of the Sabbath. Make it not a day of lounging or visiting from house to house, but keep it as a day holy to the Lord.

We have welcomed to our annual session the Rev. Egerton Ryerson, D. D., LL. D., the President of the General Conference, by whose wise and judicious counsels we have been much aided in our deliberations.

And now brethren we commend you to God, and to the word of His grace, praying always for your prospe-

riety. And may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.

* REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE STATE OF THE
WORK OF GOD.

In presenting this Report the Committee on the state of the work of God gratefully recognise the Divine presence in our midst, and rejoice in heaven's rich blessing. The proverb declares, "in all labour there is profit." How true this is of christian work! When Paul plants and Apollos waters God gives the increase. Many and great discouragements have opposed Christ's servants, but the constraining power of "a Saviour's love" has moved them to patient endurance and fidelity of action, enabling them to triumph over difficulties and to cultivate the moral wastes, which has become as the garden of the Lord. Jehovah has crowned holy toil with numerical, financial and spiritual success.

HALIFAX DISTRICT.

God's grace has been poured on several Circuits during the year, the guilty have been pardoned, and the impure "washed in the blood of the Lamb." Mission work has been extended and congregations have increased.

TRURO DISTRICT.

The prosperity realized on Truro, Pictou and River John Circuits, calls forth devout thankfulness to the

GUYSBORO' & C. B. DISTRICT.

Much has been done on the part of Christ's vineyard to ensure the best and highest results, and while the success may not be equal to that of the most productive spheres of toil, yet there is cause for deep gratitude to Almighty God.

ANNAPOLIS DISTRICT.

During the past year showers of grace have descended on this District, causing the seed to bring forth fruit. Annapolis church has been quickened to greater activity; souls have been saved and the congregations increased. Wilmot Circuit has experienced a glorious work. On the Granville, Bridgetown, Berwick, Hillsburg, Aylesford, and other Circuits, sheaves have been gathered for Christ.

LIVERPOOL DISTRICT.

The spiritual life of this District is vigorous, God has graciously visited many churches, so that both ministers and people have sought more earnestly to be baptized with the Holy Ghost, nor have they sought in vain. When God's priests are clothed with salvation; and the people filled with the Spirit Zion prospers. The Liverpool congregations have been highly encouraging. In

Yarmouth North the classes and prayer meetings have been well attended and souls saved. Yarmouth South has had a gracious year in the conversion of sinners, new classes have been formed and the membership largely increased. Yarmouth East has held special meetings for the promotion of holiness, which have been remarkably blessed of God. Yarmouth West (Hebron mission) has witnessed a good share of success. Many young people have been brought to Jesus, baptized and received into the church. Many have turned to the Lord on the Lunenburg, Barrington, Port La Tour and other Circuits. Our prayer is that both ministers and members of our churches, may be filled with the Holy Spirit and experience a year of great prosperity.

SUGGESTIONS.

The following suggestions are submitted:

1. That all our ministers and preachers be urged to a full consecration of spirit, soul and body to God, this being essential to success.
2. That they be requested to preach the doctrine of Christian holiness frequently, and bring the same before the members of the church when visiting them, that they may be stimulated to seek after the full baptism of the Holy Ghost.
3. That social meetings of the society be held to bring the subject of holiness fully before its members.
4. That each member of the various societies be urged as far as practicable to make some individual the object of special religious solicitude and prayer, and if possible bring such persons into society during the quarter, and report thereof to the class leader. Let this be repeated every quarter.

STATEMENT

OF THE FINANCIAL CONDITION OF THE BOOK ROOM AND
WESLEYAN OFFICE, HALIFAX.

The sales in the Book Room for eleven months have been in cash \$4776.40, an increase on the previous year of \$1982.56, and in credit \$8802.47, being an increase of \$3384.42. The total increase of eleven months ending March 31st, as compared with last year, has been \$5366.98.

The profits realized on the current business of eleven months has been \$3006.67.

The expenditure, however, for the same period includes in interest, Book Room bonds, and fitting up premises, extraordinary items to the amount of \$2106.16 leaving the sum of \$1674.15 towards the further payment of Book Room bonds.

The Book Steward having expressed an opinion that the vacant rooms on the premises at Granville Street might be utilized in the establishment of an office for the employment of compositors in putting in type the *Provincial Wesleyan*, and the execution of job work; that such branch of business would be quite in their way, and might be reasonably expected to prove remunerative; that for the oversight of this work a responsible and experienced foreman could be at once obtained; that, inasmuch as new arrangements for printing the paper must be shortly made, the present time for the commencement of such a branch being opportune, it was determined to authorize the Book Steward to establish a printing office in connection with the Book Room, and that for the purpose of procuring type and necessary hand presses for job work, he be allowed to borrow the sum of *one thousand dollars*, and that the entire liability on this account should not exceed *two thousand dollars*.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

After the Chairman has opened the meeting with the usual devotional exercises, a Secretary shall be elected by ballot, who shall keep a record of the proceedings according to the following order, viz. :—

Ministerial Affairs.

QUESTION I.—What members are now present?

II.—Are the Ministers and Preachers blameless in life, conversation, and doctrine?

The following questions to be asked, *distinctively* and *successively*, concerning every brother :

1. Is there any objection to his moral and religious character?
2. Does he believe and preach our doctrines?
3. Has he duly observed and enforced our discipline?
4. Has he been punctual in attending all his appointments?
5. Has he competent abilities for our itinerant work?

III.—Are the young men on trial acquainted with the prescribed course of study? And what books have they read?

The Reports of Examining Boards are to be presented to the District Meetings for consideration, and to be recorded in the Minutes of the District to be read at the Conference. Every preacher on trial is required to deliver to the Chairman a list of the books he has read during the year, and shall be examined as to his acquaintance with those recommended. He shall be further questioned according to the Discipline, (pp. 38-40), the entry in the Minutes to be, "The usual questions were put to the young man on trial, and satisfactorily answered;" or, if otherwise, the case to be stated.

IV.—Who have travelled four years and are now

recommended to the Conference to be received into full connexion, and to be ordained?

v.—What Preachers are recommended to be continued on trial?

1. Who have travelled *three* years?
2. Who have travelled *two* years?
3. Who have travelled *one* year?

vi.—What Preachers are on the List of Reserve?

vii.—What Preachers are recommended to be received on trial?

Every Superintendent who proposes a Candidate shall prepare a written statement of such particulars as are required by the Discipline, (p. 41), to be recorded in the District Book. The Candidate is required to have passed a satisfactory examination in the preliminary course of study, (*Dis. p. 190*), and shall be further questioned before the District Meeting according to the Discipline, (*p. 41, Ans. 3*). He shall also preach before the District Meeting, or a Committee appointed thereby, and the opinion of the District Meeting respecting the sermon and examination shall be reported in the Minutes.

viii.—What Candidates for our Ministry are recommended to attend the Institution during the year?

Probationers are eligible at the end of the first year of their probation. Before any Candidate shall be sent to the Institution, with recommendation of a grant from the Theological Fund, his circumstances shall be enquired into by the District Meeting, and the Minute of the District in his case shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of the Educational Committee.

ix.—What Ministers or Preachers have died?

x.—Who are recommended as Supernumerary Ministers?

xi.—What Supernumeraries return to the full work of the Ministry?

Have all such Marriages solemnized during the year been duly recorded, and the returns made according to law?

xv.—Can any measures be adopted for increasing the efficiency of our ministerial labors, and the promotion of the work of God?

1. Are all the means possible used to visit all the towns and settlements within the boundaries of each Circuit or Mission?

2. Are there earnest attempts made in every place where there are services to form classes?

3. Is sufficient time allowed in the arrangements of the quarterly visitation of the classes for the Minister or Preacher to acquaint himself with the state of each member, and to give suitable advice to each?

4. Have the Rules of Society been read during the year, and have they been given to the members on trial, according to the Discipline?

5. Do the brethren pay sufficient attention to pastoral visitation, and to catechising the children of our members and friends?
