GUY G. GOWELL TAKES HIS SON FROM HIS MOTHER.

Guy G. Cowell, originally of Portland, Me., formerly of San Francisco, Cal., and more recently of Boston, this morning kidnapped his 3-year-old son yesterday. He went after him in Maplewood, and he got him.

In so doing, however, he made quite a little stir. He drove like mad, and was chased almost as far by a Maplewood business man driving nearly as fast. He rounded the police of three cities—Maplewood, Boston, and Montreal—and during the afternoon 20 officers were searching for him.

Mrs. Guy G. Cowell, her mother and two children have lived in a double house on Queen street, Maplewood, for about twenty years, having resided there since the death of her husband, who was killed by a steam train near St. John's station.

About 11 A. M. yesterday a fine looking white horse, harnessed to a new looking top buggy, drove up to the house occupied by Mrs. Cowell. The driver, a well dressed man about 30 years of age, wearing a dark suit and a top hat, alighted and entered the house.

He was shown to a room on the second floor, and there entered a conversation with Mrs. Cowell. He asked for one of the children. Again he asked for one of the children. Finally he asked his mother-in-law to leave the room and have him alone for a time with his wife and children.
