

BANK AGT PASSED

vote of 83 to 10, on non-party lines endorsed the motion of the minister of finance to concur in the amend ments made by the senate. The bill was finally passed substantially the same as it was when first introduced ih the house early in the session. There is no radical departure in principle from the original act passed in 1871.

The final comparatively brief but somewhat vigorous discusion today gave opportunity for a litt e gallery play. It was charged that there had been too much lobbying on the part of interests representing the bankers both in the commons and the senate a charge, however, which indignantly denied on both sides of the house.
