Matriculation.

Candidates for matriculation will be required to pass a satisfactory examination on the following subjects :

Arithmetic, English Grammar, Geography, Collier's English History; Roman, and Grecian History, as contained in Smith's smaller editions; Algebra, through simple equations; the first four books of Davies' Legendre*; Latin and Greek Grammars; two books of Cæsar; one book of Virgil's Æneid; two Orations of Cicero; two books of Xenophon's Anabasis; and the first book of Homer.

These examinations are held twice in each College year—near the close of the last term, and shortly before the opening of the first term—at either of which times Candidates may present themselves.

No Candidate will be admitted unless he has completed his fifteenth year.

Candidates may enter advanced Classes after undergoing satisfactory examination in the previous studies of the Course.

* The first, second, third, and fifth Books of Euclid will be accepted as an equivalent.

Persons desirous of attending recitations in either department, are allowed to do so, provided they have the requisite preparations for the studies of the department, and become subject to the laws of the College, so far as required by the Faculty.

Department of Theology.

The Course of Instruction embraces the following studies:—

- 1.—The Hebrew Language and Literature.
- 2.—The principles of Biblical Criticism and Interpretation, illustrated and applied in exegetical exercises on portions of the Hebrew and Greek Scriptures.
- 3.—Theology in its various branches.
- 4.—Ecclesiastical History, with special regard to the Christianity of the first five centuries, the Reformation from Popery, and the rise and progress of the Baptist Denomination.
- 5.—Ministerial and Pastoral Duties and other subjects, in courses of Lectures.
- 6.—The composition of Sermons. Students in the Theological Department are required to furnish written sermons or skeletons of sermons, and Essays on theological subjects, during the whole course.

Candidates for the ministry, who are not members of the College, may enter the Theological Department, with this proviso, that they will be subject to all the regulations of government and discipline which may be in force in the College at the time.

It is desirable that students in the Theological Department be recognised by the Churches to which they belong as suitable candidates for the ministerial office.

DAILY RECORD.

The value of each student's recitation in class is regularly recorded by the Professors. For a perfect recitation the number is 10; for a less perfect one, a smaller number; for a failure, 0. If the failure is not satisfactorily explained, a mark of *demerit* is affixed to the name.

Unexcused absence from morning or evening prayer, or from class, incurs a demerit of from 2 to 10.

Should the demerits of a student, during any Term, amount to 50, a communication to that effect will be made to his parent or guardian, or to the owner of the Scholarship under which he studies.

Should they amount to 100, expulsion from College will be incurred.

At the close of each Term a general average is drawn, and the Students are divided into two classes. Those whose averages are 7.5 and upwards constitute Class 1;—those whose averages amount to 5, but are less than 7.5, constitute Class 2;—if the averages of any are below 5, they may lose the Term, or be required to leave the College.

At the close of every Term, the standing of each student is ascertained, and a report of the same, together with a statement of the number of absences from prayers, or recitation, is sent to his parent or guardian, and to the owner of the scholarship, the benefit of which he enjoys.

DISCIPLINE.

Extracts from the "Laws and Regulations for Students":—

The Students shall occupy such rooms as shall be approved by the Faculty. Room-rent, tuition, fuel and library fees, must be paid in advance at the commencement of each Term.

If any Student joins a Class after the commencement of a Term, he must undergo examination in the previous studies of the Class during that Term.

Inattention to study, and misbehaviour of any kind, will subject the offender to private or public reproof, a record of demerit in the weekly report, the loss of a Term, or suspension, at the discretion of the Faculty.

All the students are required to be present at Morning and Evening Prayer, and to attend some place of worship, in the village or its vicinity, every Lord's day.

No Student is allowed to be absent from the College for a night, during Term, (residents in the village excepted) without the permission of the President, or, in his absence, of the senior Professor.

The use of intoxicating liquors is absolutely prohibited.

No person is allowed to use gunpowder on the College premises.

LIBRARY.

The Library of the College is accessible under proper regulations to members of the College and Academy.

The College is provided with Apparatus for Experiments in Natural Philosophy, Chemistry, Surveying, &c. Also a commodious Cabinet well furnished with contributions from various parts of the world, illustrative of the departments of Geology and Mineralogy, in which the rich deposits of Nova Scotia hold a conspicuous place.

EXAMINATIONS.

FIRST,—Of all the Classes, at the end of each Term, on the studies of the Term.

SECONDLY,—Of Candidates for the degree of A. B., on such studies of the course as the Faculty may from time to time select.

ANNIVERSARY.

A public anniversary is held in the month of June in every year, when Candidates for Degrees deliver public exercises;

addresses or essays may be given by persons connected with the College, or otherwise selected for this purpose; a meeting of the Governors takes place; and Degrees are conferred.

Exhibition of original compositions are also given publicly at the close of the first term.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES.

Honor Certificates will be given to those Students who sustain satisfactory examination on the studies of the Honor Course. That course is open to all advanced Students, after the first Term of the Freshman year.

The Degree of Bachelor of Arts is granted to those Students who sustain a satisfactory examination on all the studies of the Course.

The Degree of Master of Arts may be received at the expiration of three years after the bestowment of the first Degree—subject to such regulations as the Faculty, with the approval of the Governors, may from time to time establish. Applications for this Degree must be sent to the Secretary six months before the Anniversary.

Certificates of standing and attainments will be given to such students as may leave the College during any part of the Course, and are entitled to honorable dismissal.

The fee for the Degree of A. B. in course, including Diploma, is four dollars, payable in advance; for the Degree of A. M., six dollars.

TERMS.

The First Term commences on the 1st of September in each year, and ends on the 20th of December.

The Second Term commences on the 6th of January, and ends on the 24th of March.

The Third Term commences on the 28th of March, and ends on the 6th of June.

VACATIONS.

First, from 20th December to 6th January. Second, from the 6th June to the first of September.

EXPENSES.

Board may be obtained on reasonable terms; but no arrangement for boarding must be made without first consulting the President.

ROOMS.

Apartments for a limited number of Students are provided by the College, for which a rent is paid by each occupant towards a fund for the general repairs of the College buildings.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

There is no charge for tuition to students entered on the foundation of a scholarship in the Endowment fund.

In other cases, the tuition fee is £6 per annum, or at that rate per term.

MORAL AND RELIGIOUS GUARDIANSHIP.

The utmost care is designed to be taken in the education of the Students, to promote their moral and religious, as well as intellectual culture,

All members of the College are expected to attend public worship regularly on the Sabbath; and parents and guardians are requested to give instruction as to the place of worship they wish the Students under their care to attend.

This Association is designed to be an auxiliary to the College. Composed chiefly of graduates, it aims to bind them together in friendship, to renew and render permanent their old attachment to the College, to insure the life-long devotion of its members to the interests of the College, and through her to the cause of Education throughout the Province. The Association meets annually in June at Wolfville, where they provide for an Annual oration and a dinner. The funds accruing from a membership fee of two dollars per annum are expended in the bestowment of prizes to Students, and in such other useful ways as the Annual Meeting determines. Through the instrumentality of this Society over two hundred dollars annually are offered as prizes to the Students of the College. The Society does not aim so much to afford pecuniary assistance as to unite the Alumni together and to the College. It is not difficult to foresee, however, that in so far as the Association is successful in this latter object, they will assist very materially in at length placing the College upon a solid pecuniary basis.

Prizes.

The following is a list of the "Annual Prizes for the better encouragement of Education in connection with Acadia College," offered by the Alumni Association:

I. MATRICULATION PRIZES.

FIRST PRIZE, (Donor's name withheld,) \$20 00. To the Matriculate who shall pass the best examination.

SECOND PRIZE, (The B. H. Eaton Prize.) \$10.00.

Open to Candidates from all Schools and Academies. Prizes to be awarded by the Examiners, and publicly distributed at the opening exercises of the College in September of each year. Prizes to be awarded to such matriculates only as shall declare their intention of taking the full College Course.

In case there shall be less than ten matriculates in any year, the money offered as a second prize shall be expended by the Faculty to procure gowns, caps, and hoods, for the occasional use of non-resident Alumni.

II. SCHOLARSHIP PRIZES.

FRESHMEN CLASS. Prize \$20.

SOPHOMORE CLASS. (Donor's name withheld.) Prize \$20.

JUNIOR CLASS. (Donor's name withheld.) Prize \$20.

SENIOR CLASS. (Donor's name withheld.) Prize \$20.

For the best Scholarship; by which shall be understood the most intelligent mastery of the Subjects embraced in the Course, rather than the most familiar acquaintance, by rote, with the text-books used.

In this competition such students only shall be held to be members of their respective classes as shall have been in attendance at least two Terms during the year, one of which shall be the third Term.

Each class of ten or more members to award, at the close of the Scholastic year, its own prize.

If there shall be less than ten members in any class, the Faculty shall award a prize, if they deem any member fairly entitled to it; otherwise they shall appropriate the money to the College Library.

Prizes to be publicly presented, through the Alumni Association, at the Anniversary Exercises of the College.

III. ELOCUTION PRIZE.—(Reading and Speaking.)

THE AYARD LONGLEY PRIZE, \$20. To the best Elocutionist.

Open to all Undergraduates who have been in attendance two Terms during the year, one of which shall be the Third Term.

Prize to be adjudged by the Faculty, and publicly presented, through the Alumni Association, at the College Anniversary.

IV. MONTHLY ESSAY PRIZE.

THE H. N. PAINT PRIZE, \$25. For the best series of Monthly Essays during the College year.

Open to all Undergraduates. Prize to be awarded by the Faculty, and presented at the Anniversary of the College. The list of subjects to be read at the same time. No Student shall be eligible whose Essays contain five mis-spelled words, or five errors in diction.

V. ALUMNI PRIZE.

ALUMNI SOCIETY PRIZE, \$40. For the best Original Essay.

Open to all Undergraduates. Subject to be chosen by the Executive Committee of the Association, and announced by Christmas of each year. No exact limits are prescribed as to the length

of Essays, but it is desired that no Essay shall be of a length to exceed 35 minutes in delivery. Competitors to forward their papers to the Secretary, by the first of May. Essays to be distinguished by mottoes, accompanied by letters bearing the same mottoes, and enclosing the writers' names.

Papers bearing evidence of plagiarism shall be rejected. Prize to be awarded by Examiners appointed by the Executive Committee, and publicly presented during the Anniversary of the College.

Prize Essay to be the property of the Association, and to be read by the writer if requested.

VI. CRICKET PRIZES.

1. THE LEWIS PAYZANT PRIZE, \$20.

Open to members of Horton Academy and Acadia College Cricket Clubs.

One Match between the clubs to be played at the close of the cricket season in the Autumn of each year; and another during the Anniversary Exercises of the College. Umpires to be approved by the Faculty. Prize to be taken by the member of the winning club making the highest aggregate score in the two matches; but any member not attending at least three-fourths of the regular practice of his club shall be ineligible for the prize.

In case of a tie, prize to be awarded to the one who has attended play most regularly. In case of a tie between the Clubs, an over of *four balls* shall decide.

The time for playing the final match shall be decided by the Faculty.

Prize to be adjudged by the Umpires and publicly presented, through the Alumni Association, at the College Anniversary.

If in the judgment of the Umpires, the playing is below what might reasonably be expected, the prize shall not be awarded.

2. CONSOLATION PRIZE, (Donor's name withheld.) \$10.

To the best player on the losing side, provided his aggregate score is higher than that of any player on the winning side.

Ungentlemanly conduct shall render any student ineligible for a prize.
