GUILTY OR NOT GUILTY.

TRIAL OF THE AVENGER O'DONNELL AT THE OLD BILEY.

Evidence for the Prosecution—The Bearing of the Prisoner—Some Rather Damaging Testimony—A Defective Plan.

LONDON, Nov. 30.—The trial of O'Donnell, the avenger of Carey, began this morning before Mr. Justice Denham at the Old Biley.

Several ladies were among the large audience that crowded the place. No person was admitted without a ticket.

Chas. Russell, M. P., A. M. Sullivan, Solicitor-General, and Gen. Roger A. Pryor were present on behalf of the prisoner.

Sir Henry James the attorney-general, and Messrs. Polard and Wright appeared for the government.

O'Donnell seemed unconcerned, and stood upright and erect at the witness box.

After the charge was read O'Donnell took a seat and whispered to Gay a few moments.

The jury is a very intelligent one, being composed of men of middle and mature age.

There was an excitement outside of the court house. A large police force guarded the court.

Russell of O'Donnell's conduct demanded that witnesses should be excluded from the court room.

The request was granted. Upon the jury being called, the clerk asked O'Donnell if he had any objections to any of them.

O'Donnell replied, "I trust to my solicitor for that." While the jury was being completed O'Donnell seemed amused, and exchanged glances with Pryor.

None of the jurymen were challenged.

Henry James opened for the government. He described Carey's departure from England, his voyage to Capetown, and said here was no evidence to prove that the prisoner was the man who shot Carey.

He then produced the Melrose Castle to kill Carey, but a new witness, Cubitt, would testify that at Capetown he gave the prisoner a letter which was found in the pocket of Carey, and the prisoner remarked on receiving it, "I'll shoot him."

The attorney general presented the details of the murder and declared the act was not committed in self defence, but was willful, premeditated murder.

He enjoined the jury not to allow any feeling against Carey to influence their verdict.

O'Donnell listened closely to the address. He has been allowed the use of tobacco, which he chews frequently.

Parish, steward of the steamer Melrose Castle, repeated the evidence he gave at the preliminary examination.

Two plans of the cabin of the Melrose Castle were prepared by the prosecution and the other by the defence, who were shown the witness, who declared the witness had been in the cabin at the time of the murder.

Mr. Justice Denham examined the latter plan and rejected it.

Mr. Russell cross-examined the witness. He asked Carey if he was sitting down when he fired the shots at Carey, who stood leaning against the corner of the cabin two yards away.

Carry might have been shot by O'Donnell, but he made no gesture to size him. Witness saw no other pistol than O'Donnell's.

He did not see Carey go to his baggage, which he only knew by hearsay that his brother's pistol was found upon the boy.

There was much discussion concerning the correctness of the plans of the cabin of the Melrose Castle, all of which the judge declared faulty.

The judge then explained the position of the tables and seats. Witness said all the plans were incorrect.

O'Donnell appeared greatly interested in the evidence. He asked the judge to caution the jury to be careful in giving his replies, especially regarding his position when the shots were fired.

He released the testimony he gave at the examination. He was almost sure, but refused to swear that O'Donnell fired the shot, "I did not do it."

The judge examined O'Donnell's revolver and placed it by his side on the dock.

There was a motion in evidence in the court when Thomas Carey, son of James Carey, stepped into the box. He gave his evidence promptly and coolly.

Occasionally he would consider the question well before replying. When he failed to do so, the judge would shake his head.

The judge questioned him regarding his father's position when he fired the shot. He said he was sitting on the table.

When the bag and revolver of James Carey were placed in the hands of witness they were weighed. O'Donnell scrutinized Carey narrowly.

When he said he was not positive whether O'Donnell fired the shot, "I don't know," he said, "I don't know."

He further testified "I went for my revolver and kept it in my pocket because father was unable to use it."

Carry was ordered to remain in the court room, and the crowd outside was mingling and many of the rowdier class were mingling with it.
