The modern sewer is looked upon as the salvation of the household, carrying away from its walls and premises all such matters as would contaminate the air, food and water of its inhabitants. The modern engineer provides at frequent intervals for proper ventilation of these pipe lines at points where the escaping gas will not contaminate the air around residences and other houses, of men. In residences and other haunts of men. In modern sewer construction, the scaling of all traps is carefully attended to, likewise the venting thereof, and provision is made for traps of suitable size and d-op outside the walls, so as to prevent any heavy gas pressures from forcing the seals, and no modern engineer would permit a st wer to enter a house without having previously trapped it outside of the walls. Observation leads me to think that these necessary requisites are frequently neglected by the trade, and that in order to save the additional expense of proper trade, and to compete with others in the trade, the procompete with others in the trade, the pro-tections to health are entirely left out of the figures and the gas permitted to enter the premises, rising in pipes to the upper floors, where the pressure is frequently so great as to force the small traps of the lavatories and other connections. 


