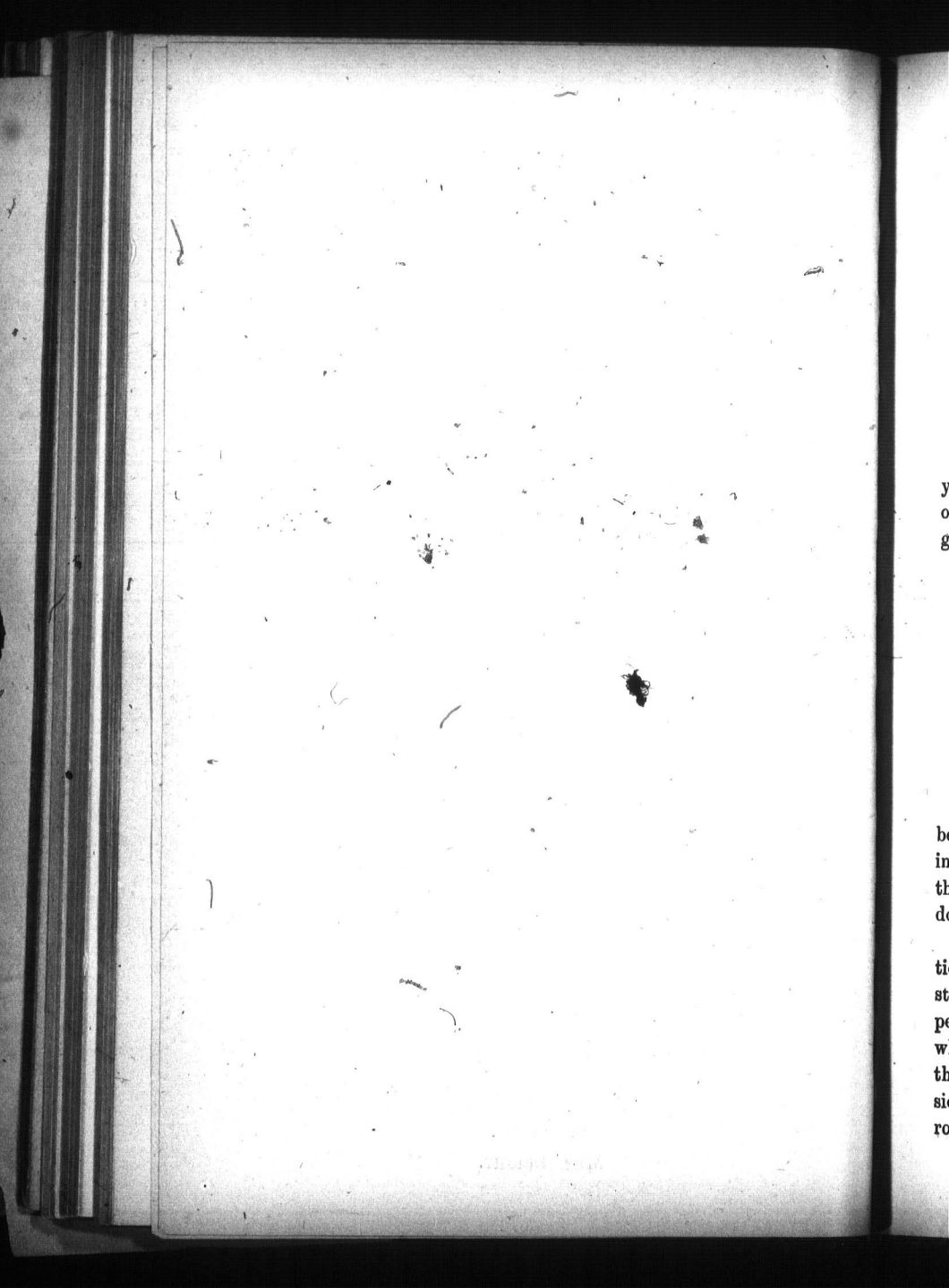

THE GIRLS' HOME.

THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT.

WITH the opening of another year, we are again glad to welcome you here as friends and subscribers, and to give you a brief account of the work that has been accomplished since our last annual gathering.

At that time there were—

97 children in the Home, and
53 have been since admitted, making a total of 150; of these
22 were placed under indenture,
39 taken by relatives or friends,
1 was sent to the asylum, where she has since died,
1 ran away and has thus far eluded our search, and
87 are still being cared for.

The new wing which was in contemplation a year ago, has now been satisfactorily completed, (and we are grateful for the assistance in this regard kindly rendered by Messrs. Withrow and Fletcher), so that we now have, beside two large airy school-rooms, two additional dormitories, and better facilities for storage.

Miss McKee continues to direct the school, and has won the affection of the children, while leading them steadily forward in their studies. With the additional accommodation we are able to have a permanent assistant, and this position is filled by Miss McMaster who, though but recently appointed, seems to be well adapted for the work. The School Board have been in every respect most considerate and obliging, and we now have as good and as well equipped rooms as any other of the city public schools.

The possibility of fire in the Institution has been reduced to a minimum, as gas fixtures have been put in throughout the building ; thus doing away with the necessity for coal oil. Should such a catastrophe occur, however, there would be little danger of loss of life, as two broad and substantial fire-escapes have been erected, one at each end of the building, which will afford easy exit. These two precautions have of course increased the expenses, but the benefits therefrom more than compensate for the outlay.

On the recommendation of our attending physician, Dr. Wishart, Dr. Susanna P. Boyle has been appointed here as his assistant, her chief duty being to examine applicants for admission. This is thought judicious, for the examination requires to be very thorough in order to prevent contagious and other diseases, and in the case of young girls a lady practitioner is better adapted for the work. Both Dr. Boyle and Dr. Wishart have been most attentive, and it is to their assiduity that we are largely indebted for the excellent health of the children. During a period when sickness is surrounding us on every side, we have indeed cause for gratitude that no death has occurred within the Home.

Though there have been a number of changes in the Board of Management, and several efficient members have for various reasons felt obliged to withdraw, we have here only one death to record, that of Mrs. Blain, ever a generous friend to the Home, who retired from active work some years ago, allowing her name to be retained as honorary member.

The Sunday-school is still superintended by Mrs. McGee, who, with her assistants, has been most faithful and painstaking. Miss Laura Geikie, for several years a constant-helper in this department, and also a good collector, will be missed both by the managers and the children, as she has lately left the city to take up her residence in Detroit.

We feel that Mrs. Bright, our matron, deserves more than a passing word of appreciation, as it is in large measure owing to her fine

discipline and careful oversight that the Home is what you see it to-day; and a closer inspection will not in any way alter the first impression.

Mr. J. K. Kerr, for many years our legal adviser, has not, on account of his large practice, been able to give that attention to the Home which he would otherwise have been glad to render, and he has therefore given place to Mr. George Douglas, and now occupies the position of consulting solicitor. Mr. Douglas has, in several instances, proved of very great assistance to the corresponding secretary, in guarding the rights of the girls placed out under indenture. Letters from a few of these children, and from parties to whom some of them have been indentured, will be found at the close of this Report.

The children were very kindly remembered at Christmas; the gifts sent in being sufficient to deck their Christmas tree; and this festive time was made additionally interesting by Mr. Whittemore's Magic Lantern Entertainment. Throughout the year they have had several very pleasant drives, as well as excursions by water, which they enjoyed, and will long remember. The Lakeside Home opened its doors during the summer to several who needed and were greatly benefited by a change of air.

Friends have been most generous in sending donations, and though it will be impossible to here enumerate those who have thus seconded the efforts of the Board of Management, the names will appear in the published Report, and we thank them most heartily for this very pleasant manifestation of sympathy.

It is with a deep sense of gratitude for the large measure of success that has attended our efforts during the past twelve months that we enter a new year of activity, trustful and earnest, hoping that with the increased accommodation, we may, under Divine guidance, be enabled to accomplish nobler and more helpful work than we have ever done before.

PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

The calendar for the past year has been a remarkably light one.

Early in the year a case of typhoid developed in Nina Graham, who recovered after a period in the General Hospital. This was followed by several cases of low fever. Fearing lest the drains were faulty, an investigation was made, serious defects found, and a large sum spent in putting the drainage of the Home into a state of thorough efficiency, with the result that no further cases of a similar nature appeared.

In the latter part of December Lizzie Neville developed acute insanity, and was removed to the asylum for better care and treatment.

Apart from the above, no serious cases of illness have occurred, and the general health of the children has been much above the average. Since the outbreak of diphtheria and influenza, no visitors to the children have been allowed, and we are extremely thankful to Providence that the Home has yet been spared any outbreak of these diseases, which have been so rife in our city.

From March 1890 to December, 1891, no inmate of the Home has died, another great cause for gratitude.

The work of examining the applicants for admission has now been committed to a lady physician, this change will prove acceptable to many, and more certainly provide against the admission of contagious disease.

The health of the younger inmates has been improved, by their removal to a larger ward, and all the children will benefit by the increased school accommodation, as the crowded conditions of the former apartments militated greatly against them during the close confinement of school hours.

CONSTITUTION OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

1. This Institution shall be called the "GIRLS' HOME," and have for its object the rescue from vice of young girls, and the bestowal of careful attention to their religious, moral, and temporal welfare ; also the maintenance and support of girls from two to fourteen years of age.
 2. Children are given out to parties furnishing suitable references, on payment of five dollars per annum, till the child is fifteen then, ten, fifteen, and twenty dollars for the next three years respectively these sums, except the first, to be invested for the said child's benefit and given to her at the expiration of her term of service.
 3. The management shall be entrusted to a Committee, of not more than forty-five ladies, chosen at the Annual Meeting, out of which shall be elected by ballot the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Directresses, Treasurer, Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary. All vacancies shall be filled by ballot, and a majority vote at a Monthly Meeting after at least one week's notice. Should it happen at any meeting that no Directress be present, then the ladies in attendance, if sufficient to form a quorum, may elect some one of their number to take the chair, the lady so appointed to have, for the time being, the same authority in all respects as a Directress.
 4. No alteration shall be made in this Constitution, except at the Annual Meeting ; and notice of any proposed alteration must always be given to the Board, at least one month previous to such Annual Meeting.
-

RULES FOR THE
BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

1. Regular meetings of the Board of Managers shall be held every Tuesday, at 10.30 a.m., the first Tuesday in the month being the day of the Monthly Meeting, for which all important business shall be deferred. Special meetings may be called by the Secretary, upon an order from the 1st Directress, or, in her absence, at the request of any three members.

2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer, and be opened as soon after the appointed hour as a quorum shall be present, which shall consist of five members at a Monthly and three at a Weekly Meeting, being conducted in the following order :

1st. The Secretary shall read the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall be signed, or in case of a Monthly Meeting all the meetings during the past month ; inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place and read the general Reports of the condition of the Institution.

2nd. The presiding lady shall place all resolutions before the meeting, declare the decision to the Secretary, and if an equality of votes occur, give the casting one, in addition to her vote as member of the Board.

3. As soon as the meeting is opened (when a quorum is formed) all conversation, not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

4. Any lady allowing three months to pass without being present, or notifying her inability to attend, to the Secretary, shall have her name struck off the list of the Managing Committee.

5. The Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as well as the children's fees, keeping account of the same. All accounts shall be brought by her before the meeting of the Managers every month.

6. The Corresponding Secretary shall keep account of all children given out from the Home, and correspond with them at least once a year, and shall keep account of and read all correspondence respecting them, at the Board Meetings.

7. The Secretary shall direct all the correspondence, keep account, as far as practicable, of all the children in the Institution—giving a general report thereof at the Monthly Meeting, at which she shall regularly attend, but never be called upon to preside, minute the proceedings, and take the names of the ladies present.

8. Two members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Secretary to visit the Home daily each week, ascertain from the Matron the behaviour of the children, as well as whatever may be requisite for them and for the house, and report the same at the Regular Weekly Meetings. The 1st Directress, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and Secretary shall not be of the number of Daily Visitors.

9. Any three Managers, including a Directress, may admit applicants up to the age of fourteen, with the doctor's certificate insuring them to be free from disease.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE
MATRON AND CHILDREN OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

1. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the children, as well as to conduct the household affairs generally, and also to instruct the girls between the ages of five and fourteen, in sewing, knitting, and household work.

2. She shall admit any applicant not younger than two years, or older than fourteen, upon the doctor's certificate; subject always to the approval of the Board.

3. The charge for each child of such parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$5 per month, unless an exceptional case should occur. If more than one child of the same parent or friend gain admittance, a reduction may be made as approved by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

4. The Matron shall daily inspect the cleanliness of the children, see that they attend the day-school punctually and regularly; and every morning and evening conduct family prayers.

5. The children shall rise at 6 a.m. from May 1st to October 31st, and at 7 a.m. from November 1st to April 30th. The time for going to rest to be from 5 to 8 p.m.

Children under fourteen are not allowed to wash or scrub more than three hours a day.

6. Meals to be at regular hours. Breakfast at 8 a.m.; dinner at 12; tea at 5 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by the elder children. The Matron and one servant to be present.

7. All children of age to do so, shall regularly attend Sunday School, and also Divine Service once every Sunday, in charge of the Matron, or some other competent person, and in the afternoon attend the Sunday School in the Institution.

8. Parents or friends of the children shall be admitted to visit them on Wednesday and Friday afternoons, from 3 until 5 o'clock. Persons wishing to come at other hours must obtain a permit from the Board.

9. The Home shall be open to the public any afternoon during the week,
