



Jones and two policemen hearing this ran to the house, and, after some trouble, succeeded in extinguishing the flames with water carried in path from the back yard. Meantime the family were awakened and the women ran out in their night-gowns, and the children were put out through the windows, as the smoke and flame filled the hall After putting out the fire Mr. Davison was carried out insensible, but recovered soon after. The fire caught from a lamp, which was left burning near his bed, being upset in some way. Mr. Davison is a very old and feeble man, and has been confined to his bed for some time.
