

THE PRESBYFERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA,
HELD IN LONDON,

APRIL 30TH, MAY 1ST AND 2ND, 1888.

At London, and within St. Andrew's Church there, the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eighth years, at half past seven o'clock p.m., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Presbyterian Church in Ganada met, and after sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. W. S. Ball, of English Settlement, from Exodus Chap. 14. v. 15-25; was duly constituted by prayer.

2. That the Presbytery Clerks be instructed to report at next meeting of Synod all the vacancies within their bounds during the year, with the dates at which each vacancy began, the date of call or calls given in each case if any, the date of settlement where a settlement has been effected, and the way in which supply was

secured in every case.

REFERENCE FROM STRATFORD PRESBYTERY.

REPORT ON STATE OF RELIGION.

The recommendations of the Committee on the state of religion as follows, were then adopted.

1. That our Christian peop'e, especially in towns and cities, be exhorted to give all possible encouragement and help to those who in a legitimate way by the early closing movement, are seeking the relief of both merchants and their clerks, from the grievous bondage of late shopping, especially on Saturday nights.

 That Presbyteries be urged to make a more vigorous effort to secure full replies to the questions on state of religion, from all the sessions within their respective bounds.

3. That Presbyteries be recommended, by visitation or otherwise, to institute inquiry into the financial system and general business management of such congregations especially, as are apparently behind in the grace of liberality.

4. That the importance of family worship, and their prime responsibility in the matter of home religious instruction, be earnestly impressed on parents, and that this be made matter of pulpit discourse on one or more Sabbaths during the year.

On motion of Mr. D. H. Fletcher, seconded by Mr. Gustavus Munro, the report as a whole was then adopted, and thanks given to the Committee and especially to the Convener, for their excellent report.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

The recommendations of the Committee on Sabbath School work were also adopted, and are as follows:—

1. That Superintendents be urged to use great diligence in recording the statistics of their schools, and in making reports through the session to the Presbytery.

* 3. That congregations be requested to defray, if not all, at least the larger proportion of the expenses of their schools, thus leaving the scholars' offerings to be mainly devoted to the missionary schemes of the church.

4. That a summary of this report be printed for distribution to pastors and superintendents.

On motion of Dr. Thomson, seconded by Mr. Chrystal, the report was adopted as a whole, and thanks given to the Committee, and especially to the Convener, for their suggestive and exhaustive report.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE REPORT.

The recommendations of the Committee on Sabbath Observance were then adopted as follows:—

1. That it would be well for the Assembly's Committee to follow the san e system of securing information and reports in regard to this subject, that is followed by the other committees of the church, in regard to the subjects with which they are entrusted.

2. That all possible prominence be given to this subject in the pulpits within our bounds.

3. That our ministers and people be encouraged to co operate with those of other denominations, in seeking the removal of whatever form of Sabbath desecration may exist among them.

2. That members of our churches and others who deplore the injustice that is done them in being deprived of the rest and worship of the Lord's day, be advised to hail as a gracious manifestation of God's providence any opening which is afforded in which these are restored to them, and so to instruct and influence their children, as that they shall be led to follow some vocation in life in which God is honored and the rights of his people secured.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Tully, the report was adopted as a whole, and the thanks of the Synod tendered the Committee, and especially the Convener, for their labors during the year and the valuable report presented.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again to morrow morning at 9 o'clock, the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

Mr. Adair was heard in continuation of his address, which was interrupted by the hour of adjournment. He was followed by Mr. J. P. McDonald and Mr. W. W. Fortune. Mr. McPherson was then heard in reply.

After questions had been put and answered, parties were removed from the bar, and the Synod proceeded to deliberate.

The tollowing motion, made by Dr. Proudfoot, and seconded by Dr. Laidlaw, was unanimously adopted:—That a small committee be appointed to meet Mr. McPherson and the delegates from Stratford, with the view of effecting a reconciliation between them, and of arriving at a satisfactory arrangement in reference to the financial difficulty. Said committee to report to the Synod at the evening sederunt.

The committee was then appointed as follows:—Dr. Proudfoot, convener, Dr. Laidlaw, Dr Thomson, Dr. Laing, Mr. W. T. McMullen and Mr. A. D. McDonald, ministers; and Messrs Dr. Fraser and T. W. Nisbet, elders.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned, the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

SEVENTH SEDERUNT.

St. Andrew's Church, London, the second day of May, one thousand, eight hundred and eighty-eight years, 7.30 p.m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, Rev. Dr. James, Moderator.

Devotional exercises were engaged in, Rev. R. Hamilton leading the Synod in prayer, after which the Synod was duly constituted. The minutes of former sederunt were read and sustained.

OVERTURE FROM PRESBYTERY OF CHATHAM.

The clerk read an overture from the Chatham Presbytery, asking the Synod to set apart a certain portion of the Synod meetings to conferences on Evangelical work, systematic benevolence, Presbyterial visitation, and kindred subjects.

On motion the overture was received. Mr. Gray was heard in its support.

After deliberation it was agreed that the fuller discussion of the overture be delayed until next meeting, but that a committee be appointed to arrange for a conference on Evangelical work, to be held during the next meeting of Synod, and Messrs John Gray, Robert Hamilton, John Ferguson, ministers; and Dr. T. M. Macintyre, elder, were appointed said committee to arrange as to time and the brethren who are to introduce the subject.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Mr. W. A. McKay, convener of the Committee on Temperance, presented the report.

The report was received, and it was agreed to consider the recommendations seriatim.

Before proceeding with the recommendations, the Synod engaged in devotional exercises, the Rev. John Ferguson leading the Synod in prayer.

After Mr. McKay and Mr. Wright had addressed the court the recommendations were considered seriatim and agreed to, as follows:—

- 1. That all the Presbyteries within the bounds of this Synod seek to impress upon the sessions the duty of yielding loyalty to the Supreme Court in this matter, and sending each year a report on temperance to its Presbytery.
- 2. That the General Assembly be encouraged to continue bearing testimony against the liquor traffic, and pointing out the proper ways to remove the evil.
- 3. That the General Assembly be requested to instruct its Committe on Temperance to prepare petitions to the Dominion Parliament, asking for general prohibition, to be signed by the Presbyterians of this Dominion; and that the Assembly take such steps in this matter as may be necessary to secure the co-operation of the other churches of the land.
- 4. That strong approval be expressed regarding the action of the Ontario Government in making provision for imparting scientific temperance instruction in the public schools, and that we exhort our people to see that such instruction is imparted in the schools in their respective districts.

5. That due prominence be given to the subject of temperance in all its bearings in the public teaching of the pulpit and Sabbath School, and above all that the power of the gospel be presented as the only effectual remedy for evil of every kind.

On motion of Mr. Tully, seconded by Mr. Sutherland, the report was received as a whole, and the thanks of the Synod given to the committee, and especially to the Convener, for the exceedingly interesting and gratifying report presented.

REFERENCE FROM THE STRATFORD PRESBYTERY.

The committee appointed on the reference from the Stratford Presbytery presented their report through Dr. Proudfoot, as tollows:—

The committee, after free exchange of views with the parties, were pleased to find a concilatory spirit manifested, and are happy to report that Mr. McPherson is willing as a compromise to accept the sum of \$1500.00 in final settlement of the matter; and express the hope that the congregation will be willing to accept of this proposal in the same spirit.

On motion of Dr. Laing, seconded by Mr. A. D. McDonald, the report was received and adopted The Synod tendered its thanks to the committee for their patient labors in this case. Drs. Proudfoot and Laidlaw were appointed to report the action of Synod to the congregation in Stratford, in concert with the representatives of the congregation who appeared at Synod, and assist in any further action that may be necessary.

VOTE OF THANKS.

It was moved by Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Hamilton, that the thanks of the Synod are due to the minister and officers of St. Andrews Church, London, for the use of their building and the arrangements made for the work of the Synod; to the committee in providing homes for the delegates; to the Christian people of the city, for their generous hospitality; and to the railways for reduced rates to the members of the Synod.

The motion was carried unanimously.



ADJOURNMENT.

The business of the Synod having been concluded, the Moderator, after an earnest and suitable address, declared the Synod adjourned to meet in Zion Church, Brantford, on the second Monday of April, 1889, at 7.30 p.m., and after the Synod engaged in prayer, pronounced the benediction.
