IMPERIAL CONNEXION.

THE permanent subjection of the Canadian Pruyinces to British rule has ceased to be the doctrine of any class of British Statesmen. The termination of Colonial dependence can only be delayed so long as, split up into hostile parties, and torn by internal dissensions, the people of Canada shall continue to weste their energies upon fraitics expedients and to neglect using the power, they inherently possess, of applying a herois remedy to their anitization for a common purpose will yet prove the salvation of Canada.

That common purpose is already openly named—already it warms the heart of the aspiring, cheers the timid, and assists in sinking into oblivion asperities of every kind, whether growing out of irrational political attachments, or differences of religion and race.
