CONNUBIAL PELICITY. A DIVORCE CASE IN THE ENGLISH COURTS.

The case of Satt verus Sast came before the Judicial Committee of the Privy Connoil, in England, a few days ago. It was in form of an appeal from the Appellant Court of Malta in a divorce suit brought by the Countess Generous against her imband, Count Glo, Francesco Sant, Baron "Casal, in which a "personal separation" was granted, and in which the Court appealed to her Majesty in Council. The result of the proceedings hefore the Judicial Committee was that their Lordships "humbly recommend to her Majesty that the judgment of the Court of Appeale of Malta of the 22ad of April, 1872, be affirmed, and that this appeal be dismissed with costs." The facts of the case, which have a painful interest, are thus set forth by the London Tenter: "The parties were married on the 3ts of Angust, 1830, and have had five children. They were both of high rank, the appellant being noble, and the lady of equal birth. They appear to have been in somewhat straitemed circumstances for their position in society.
