The Canadian government has voted \$20,000 a year for five years for the maintenance of a monthly service from Havre to Montreal.

A new steamship company—the Pan-American Steamship Company—was incorporated at Trenton, N. J., on Saturday last. It proposes to operate steamship lines all over the world, or, as the charter expresses it, between all parts of the world.

Indemnity Demands. Washington, Dec. 25.—Article VI of the agreement signed by the foreign ministers in Pekin recently, is a payment by China of "equitable indemnities" of a very sweeping character.

The indemnities to be paid to the Chinese government is in the nature of restitution of the expenses incurred in despatching and maintaining troops in China. It is feared that the indemnities to be demanded for the expense of the several military expeditions may be obtained from this table showing the strength of the allies.
