Members of Canadian Institute Addressed on the Ontario Corundum Belt by G. D. Mills.

HOW THE MINERAL IS WORKED.

How it Occurs and How it Differs in many Ways From Inferior Abrasives.

One of the most interesting addresses delivered before the members of the Canadian Institute so far this season was that on Saturday evening by Samuel D. Mills, mining engineer of this city, upon the corundum belt of Ontario.

This extensive region was known as the corundum belt but that did not infer that corundum was to be found in all parts of it indiscriminately, but merely as a belt because corundum might be searched for there with some probability of finding it.

The mineral oxide was described by the lecturer as the oxide of aluminum in its purest form. Its economic value arose from the fact that it possessed a hardness inferior only to that of the diamond and from its peculiar cleavage, which caused it to break into rhombohedral fragments, it was given a great number of cutting edges.

How the Mineral Occurs. Mr. Mills explained that corundum occurred in crystals varying in sizes from small bits up to four or five inches in diameter, enclosed in a matrix of felspar rock.

German banker of Caracas, to settle the claims against it. The news that the first shots have been fired in Venezuela has awakened the most pathetic of the critics to the gravity of the situation which is developing in that country, and the demands that the government present the official documents in the matter to parliament are now most insistent. The papers will be issued today, or Wednesday, at the latest.

Italy's active entrance upon the scene is not believed to simplify the situation. Special dispatches from Rome assert that Signor Riva, the Italian Minister at Venezuela, presented the Italian ultimatum at Caracas on Saturday. The time set for an answer to this ultimatum expired Sunday, and according to the Rome dispatches, Signor Riva has already embarked on the Italian cruiser Giovanni Bausan. Signor Riva's two daughters had a narrow escape from maltreatment from the populace.

The fact of the Italian cruiser Liguria being ordered to proceed for Venezuela. Italy will thus have four or five warships on the spot to co-operate with the British and German warships. Most of the morning papers contain the bombardment of the Italian ultimatum at Caracas on Saturday. The ultimatum demanded that the government should accept the demand for the payment of the demands for the return of the powers and retire to the interior of the country.

Realizing that a prolonged blockade of hostilities would endanger the interests and perhaps the lives of foreign residents of Venezuela, many newspapers are beginning to ask whether the government had not acted over hastily.

NEWS AT WASHINGTON.

Washington, Dec. 14.—Minister Bowen in a despatch received by the State Department, this afternoon, stated that he had been informed by President Castro that British and German warships were bombarding Puerto Cabello.

At 5 o'clock the Charlybids and the Whitea opened fire on the forts and custom house. The fort replied, but the soon ceased. No damage was done to the town. The United States consul went on board the two cruisers and was informed by their commanders that they had come to this port in search of the Venezuelan warships.

BLOCKADE DEMANDED.

Caracas, Dec. 14.—A note from the commanders of the allied Anglo-German fleet, which the Venezuelan government refused to receive yesterday at La Guayra, was sent today to United States Minister Bowen at Caracas, and forwarded by him to the proper government official here. The note is in the name of Great Britain and Germany; it requests all Venezuelan ships after the lapse of five days, to refrain from sailing from the port of La Guayra, until the present difficulties are over.

OTHER REVOLUTIONARY LEADERS LEFT MARACAYBO

Other revolutionary leaders left Maracaybo today for Caracas, on their way to Caracas. Hernandez is probably the most popular of the revolutionary leaders. President Castro has kept him imprisoned at Maracaybo for several years past.

The news of the shelling of the forts and custom house at Puerto Cabello (this afternoon by the British cruiser Charlybids and the German cruiser Whitea, reached Caracas at late hour to-night. It caused considerable excitement. In spite of the preventive measures taken by the government, the news of the shelling has spread there.

The statement that Italy, thru her legation, has demanded payment of her claims against Venezuela, has been confirmed. The arrival of the United States gunboat Marietta at La Guayra yesterday was due to a rumor that the United States Minister Bowen was in danger. There has been no ground for such a rumor, and the presence of the Marietta is not requested by Mr. Bowen.

The situation here continues to be critical and there is much excitement among the German residents of Caracas, many of whom have called at the American legation to seek protection. The people of Caracas are astonished that the government at Washington is making any effort in spite of the recent act of the allied fleet.

The ultimatum of Venezuela's allies continues. 2000 men from the interior having reached Caracas today. The boycotting of British and German goods continues. It is reported that ninety Germans living in the country have demanded the Venezuelan government against Germany.

The fact that the people of Venezuela should be ignorant of the shelling of the forts upon their country creates a deep and disturbing impression here. The Associated Press: "If there is to be war, let us know what the fight. If there is to be only an assault on our coast, where we cannot reach the allies, let us know what the assault is to be." "If there is to be a blockade, let us know what the blockade is to be."

The British legation here will be reopened to-night under the American flag, by the only British and German flag, which were boycotted, have closed their doors. The University of Caracas is also closed. Priests are preaching for war.

Leading German and British residents here, who accuse of leaving Caracas without any intimation of their intention to abandon the city. The note from the commanders of the allied Anglo-German fleet, which the Venezuelan government, thru Minister Bowen, concerning Venezuelan vessels leaving La Guayra, is supposed to herald the blockade.

ITALY'S CLAIMS.

Rome, Dec. 14.—Italy's claims against Venezuela for damages sustained by Italian subjects during the Venezuelan revolution of 1858 and 1859, have been agreed upon by a common commission of the United States and Italy. The commission has agreed upon a common scale of action for the payment of the claims.

As already announced, negotiations are still pending with Germany and Great Britain, direct negotiations with Prussia, Prussia has agreed upon an arrangement which will enable him to make a statement in reply to an interpellation.

WEALTH MEANS LONG LIFE.

English Statistics Suggest Agreeable Way of Living Long. London, Dec. 14.—During the present year 209 persons have died leaving estates valued at over £100,000 each, the average being £58,045.142. The average age of these persons was nearly 73 years, one-fourth of them were 80 or over, and six were over 90.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer reaped death duties amounting to £18,617,714. For the most part these estates have been slowly gained by people who made careful investments during their long lives. Little trace could be found of any fortunes which had been quickly acquired by speculation.

A further analysis shows that there were five estates of over £1,000,000, seventeen between £500,000 and £1,000,000, twenty-four over £300,000 to £500,000, thirty of over £200,000 to £300,000, forty-one of over £150,000 to £200,000, and eighty-nine of over £100,000 to £150,000.

The death last Monday of Col. Harry McCord, an American soldier, is another harvest for the Lord Chancellor.

OWEN SOUND CARRIES BYLAWS.

Wm Purchases the Electric Light and Gas Plants. Owen Sound, Dec. 13.—The bylaw for the town of Owen Sound to purchase the electric light and gas plants, also exemption of taxes and free water for ten years of a lined oil industry, were voted here to-night, and carried by the following figures: For the gas plant, \$76, against 23. HAS ANOTHER INVENTION.

Marconi About to Startle the World Again, It is Said. Halifax, N.S., Dec. 14.—The announcement is made in a semi-official way that Signor Marconi has another invention, which he expects will revolutionize the world. He will not formally announce it until the wireless experiments are completed, which he says, will be before the end of the year.
