WE WANT DEEP WATER WHARVES. The great lack of the city of St. John at the present time is the lack of deep water wharves with warehouses and railway connexions. The only deep water wharves we now have that have railway connexions are the Sand Point wharf, which is only 180 feet long and is without, a warehouse, and the Intercolonial Railway wharf which has room for only two large vessels, only one of which can have the benefit of a warehouse. The Long wharf will be a third deep water wharf with railway and warehouse when it is dredged to the proper depth, but at present it only affords sixteen feet of water at low water, spring tides, which is not enough for even an ordinary freight steamer. The new Corporation pier and Pettengill's wharf may have railway connexion at some future day, but at present this desirable result seems to be distant owing to the opposition of the people of Sydney ward to a railway passing through some of their streets. But even if the Long wharf, the City wharf and the I. C. R. wharf were in the best possible position to accommodate ocean steamships there would still be a lack of what we most need, wharves for the intransit trade of Canada. This trade which amounts to from \$20,000,000 to \$30,000,000 a year needs to be conducted in the most economical manner, and in such a way that St. John can compete successfully for it with New York, Boston and Portland. So long as the tolls on the railway bridge for all freight are equal to the haulage of that freight a distance of 125 miles, the competition of St. John with New York and Boston becomes difficult or impossible, and the advantages of our favorable position are lost. Either, then, the bridge must be made free of tolls or we must have deep water wharves and warehouses on the West side in addition to a dry dock. 


