London, Feb. 24-The village of Petit Miraumont, south of the Ancre, in France, has been entered by British troops as a result of an advance southeast of Miraumont, says the official statement from the war office tonight. The British line south and southeast of Serre, north of the Ancre, has been pushed forward on a front of over a mile and a half.

The text of the statement reads:

"As a result of the unceasing pressure of our troops the enemy today vacated further important positions on both sides of the Ancre. We made considerable progress south and southeast of Miraumont, on a front of a mile, and entered the village of Petit Miraumont. We also advanced our line on a front of over one and one-half miles south and outheast of Serre.

"During the evening the enemy rushed one of our posts west of Lens. We recovered the post by an immediate counter-attack. "There has been considerable mutual artillery activity at inter-vals during the day and night on both banks of the Somme, southwest of Arras and south of Ypres."
