**RESOLUTIONS** *unanimously adopted at the Annual Meeting of the Auxiliary Society for the District, held at Montreal, on Monday Evening, May 11th, 1846.* The Rev. M. RICHEY, A. M. in the Chair.

After the reading of the Report by the Rev. C. CHURCHILL, it was resolved,

Moved by the Rev. JAMES BROCK ; seconded by the Rev. JOHN TOMKINS :

1. That the Report now read be adopted and printed ; and that this Meeting gratefully rejoices in the success with which it has pleased Almighty God to crown the efforts of the Missionaries of this and other kindred Societies during the past year.

Moved by the Rev. M. LANG ; seconded by the Rev. W. SQUIRE :

2. That this Meeting, recognizing the great principle of the Christian Religion, that, unaided by the Holy Ghost, man's best efforts are powerless in extending the Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ in the world, is resolved to be more frequent and fervent in its supplications for the promised outpouring of the Spirit on Missionaries themselves, and on the fields of labour occupied by them.

Moved by the Rev. CHARLES CHURCHILL ; seconded by the Rev. J. BORLAND.

3. That this Meeting, conscious that however much may have already been done towards the conversion of the world, much more yet remains to be done ere "the uttermost parts of the earth can be given to the Son of God for his possessor ;" and encouraged by the numerous and pathetic calls for additional assistance which are continually arising from various parts of the Heathen world, solemnly pledges itself to more liberal contributions, and to renewed endeavours to promote its evangelization.

Moved by the Rev. J. BROCK ; seconded by the Rev. MALCOLM M'DONALD :

4. That the cordial thanks of this Meeting be presented to all the Collectors of the various Branch Societies in connection with this Auxiliary, for their self-denying and zealous efforts to promote, during the past year, the interests of the Parent Society.

Moved by the Rev. J. B. SELLEY ; seconded by the Rev. EDMUND S. INGALLS :

5. That the following Ministers and Lay Gentlemen be the Officers and Committee of this Auxiliary for the ensuing year. (See page 3.)

## R E P O R T .

---

It is utterly impossible for the Christian to look around on the varied and diversified events that are now transpiring in the world in which we live, without being convinced, that, however marked with extraordinary circumstances former times have been, they have never surpassed in interest or importance, the present aspect of affairs both in the Christian Church and the Heathen world. In the former, truth and error are at open issue. The conflict has long been carried on, but never so openly as now ; principalities and powers are shaken and convulsed not with the mailed heel of panoplied warriors, whose garments are rolled in blood, but with light breaking upon darkness seeking its dispersion—truth wrestling with error, trying for its exposure. There is occasionally a redoubling of efforts for conquest—a mighty struggle for ascendancy—this is met by a steadier aim, and a stronger grasp—for truth is mighty and must prevail ;—and no Evangelical Christian community can stand and gaze at the moral position of Germany and Switzerland at the present day, without feeling thankful to the great Head of the Church for the happy escape of thousands from spiritual thraldom and ecclesiastical despotism ; also the joy and elation of this fact is sobered and checked by dangers of an opposite character, seeking to entrap on the other hand, those thus set free. As the Committee of a Society for the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom, we thank God, and take courage from the consideration, that much real ground has been gained in the Churches of the Redeemer during the past year, and still we pray "*Thy Kingdom come.*"

But our immediate field of observation is the Heathen World; and here our object will be, to direct you, not to the field itself in all its fearful proportions of ignorance and Pagan superstition and darkness,—that would be beyond our limits—nor indeed to journalize all the efforts made so successfully by different evangelical denominations—nor indeed ungratefully to avoid mentioning them as co-workers, and brethren beloved in the Lord; but to interweave incidentally their successes with ours—while our main object and duty is to record the efforts and epitomize the labours of the PARENT WESLEYAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY during the past year.

At this their Annual Meeting, therefore, the Committee of the EASTERN CANADA DISTRICT AUXILIARY WESLEYAN MISSIONARY SOCIETY have great pleasure in presenting the following Report of the proceedings of that SOCIETY, which at no former period of its history presented claims of greater importance, or of deeper interest to Man than at the present time. It has pleased the great Head of the Church, amidst the efforts of kindred Societies already alluded to, and also in the midst of much opposition, to bless and crown the labours of his servants with eminent success.

The greatest embarrassment, indeed, which the Society labours under, arises from the success it has met with; the numerous openings, and the imperative calls for additional labourers in every department of the work, have never been exceeded in former years, and while the income of the Society has reached an amount unprecedented in former periods of its history, it is still manifestly inadequate to the great work in which it is engaged. Assured, nevertheless, that its annual appeals to the sympathy and liberality of the Christian public, will not be made in vain, your Committee meet you without fear, and will proceed without further delay, to lay before you a summary of the operations of the Society, in the different quarters of the Globe:

#### MISSIONS IN EUROPE.

These comprise IRELAND, GERMANY, FRANCE, SWITZERLAND and SPAIN.

IN IRELAND—The number of Mission Stations occupied is

nineteen; of Missionaries twenty-four; of Members on the Stations, exclusive of those returned by the Irish Conference, three thousand one hundred and forty-one; of scholars, four thousand five hundred. The Stations occupied are those of the most remote parts. The Schools, sixty-three in number, are under the superintendence of Rev. W. O. Croggon; and during the past year, the exertions of those employed have, amidst much opposition, been crowned with success.

IN GERMANY—Mr. Muller's labours have been continued, and his zealous exertions have met with an encouraging measure of satisfactory results. The present state of things in that interesting part of the European continent, will, undoubtedly, pave the way for future more enlarged operations and far greater results.

IN FRANCE—The Society's operations during the last few years have been greatly extended. There are now eleven Stations; twenty-four Missionaries; one thousand two hundred and sixty-nine members; one thousand four hundred and ninety-three Scholars.

The Mission in *Paris* includes the English and French department of the work; the English congregations have greatly increased, requiring enlarged accommodation; while in the *French* department, the state of things is healthful, and affords ground for hope as to the future. Individuals are not unfrequently brought to a saving knowledge of the truth; who, on their removal, prove instruments for good in other parts of the Continent. A pleasing instance has taken place during the year. A native of *Switzerland*, who had been converted to God under the ministry of our Missionaries, in the French Chapel, returned to his native land; from whence he recently wrote a long letter to one of his friends in *Paris*, in which letter he speaks of the religious wants of his neighbourhood, and of the desire he feels to devote himself to the Missionary work. "Considering all things," he remarks, "I believe I shall do well to remain here. Surely it would be wrong in me to abandon souls who have already manifested so great a desire to know the Lord. If the Wesleyan Society has no means of employing a

greater number of Missionaries, I will myself act as one, (God assisting me,) here in my own land, at the same time earning my bread by working at my calling."

IN SPAIN—The Rock of *Gibraltar* is our only Station, with one Missionary. The Society is subject to great fluctuations in numbers from the frequent changes among the military, which form a large proportion of our Congregation and Society.

The efforts of Romish Bishops and Priests are incessant, and untiring, to neutralize the influence exerted by our Missionary. They have taken their stand at a short distance from our School, to write down the names of the children as they returned home, that their parents might be visited, and threatened with the deprivation of all the rites of their Church; and in one instance, the confessor declared to the wife of one of our members, that unless her children were withdrawn, her offspring yet unborn should be accursed by the Church for their sake.

The whole of Europe presents thirty-two Stations occupied; fifty Missionaries; five thousand and eighty-two Members; six thousand three hundred and eleven Scholars.

#### MISSIONS IN ASIA.

CEYLON.—IN NORTH CEYLON we have four Stations; four Missionaries; two hundred and forty-eight Members; two hundred and forty-one Scholars.

IN SOUTH CEYLON—Eleven Stations; fourteen Missionaries; nine hundred and nine Members; two thousand six hundred and forty-eight Scholars.

Great dependence, as it regards future operations, is placed upon the tuition of the rising generation in our Sabbath and day Schools in our Eastern Missions, and towards these the Colonial Government has made some munificent grants as well as towards the erection and completion of two Chapels. The native preaching is better appreciated, and amidst a dense population, has a field white unto harvest, prepared for Missionary operations and future usefulness. Amongst the *Veddahs* a surprising and satisfactory work of grace—has, as the result

of the efforts of our Ministers resulted in the union of between one hundred and two hundred of them in Church Fellowship with us.

By the Missions on the Continent of INDIA, the Society is bearing a testimony against the monstrous idolatries of eighteen millions of the inhabitants of the *Madras* Presidency. Great and persevering opposition to the doctrines of Christianity has been awakened amongst the *Brahmins*, and others who are interested in the continuance of heathenism, which is a fact showing that the Missionaries are making an impression on the mind of the population ; and this is further confirmed by the progressive increase in the number of professing Christians, and in the eagerness with which the people at large avail themselves of the instruction afforded in the Mission Schools.

In these Missions, we have eight Stations ; eighteen Missionaries ; four hundred and two Members ; two thousand three hundred and twenty-nine Scholars.

In the AUSTRALIAN Missions, we include NEW SOUTH WALES, AUSTRALIA, FELIX, SOUTH and WESTERN AUSTRALIA. In these there are eleven Circuits ; twelve Missionaries ; one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six Members ; two thousand four hundred and fifty-eight Scholars.

The circumstances of these several Stations, as it regards the Members, are subject to the influence of a fluctuating population ; but independent of this, much encouragement has been experienced in the ordinary operations of the Ministry.

VAN DIEMAN'S LAND is a part of the Mission Field, which deserves a passing commendatory notice. The Mission is sustained with efficiency, and the last Report contains the following notice :—

“ Our cause throughout the Circuit, is in a healthy and prosperous state. Peace and unanimity prevail. Our Congregations in the Town, and in most of the country places, are enlarged ; and there is an improved state of feeling among our people. The commercial and agricultural distress which abounds to so alarming an extent has very seriously affected the Circuit-

income ; but we believe that our friends never exerted themselves, according to their ability, more than at present."

In **NEW ZEALAND**, there has been a larger extension of the work in the last few years, than in any other part of the wide field of enterprise, in which our Missionaries are engaged. A few years ago, one station only was occupied, with twenty-three Members at *Hokianga*, were all the fruits of the labours of several years. Now we have fourteen Stations ; seventeen Missionaries ; two thousand nine hundred and sixty Members ; four thousand eight hundred and seventy-four Scholars.

Here is the centre of our operations for the South Sea Mission. The Rev. W. Lawry being general Superintendent and Visitor of those Stations, and from his place the 'Triton' plies backwards and forward, carrying supplies, and conveying Missionaries to and from those Islands as required.

At present, collisions of an unfortunate character have taken place between the Government and the natives on the coast ; the position of the Missionaries has been very critical—but satisfactory evidence has been received, that our native Members have not interfered in the unhappy disputes—and we wait with anxiety to hear the general result.

A letter received from the Rev. Samuel Ironsides, communicates the gratifying information, that the greater number of our Christian natives, who were scattered at the time of the melancholy affair at *Wairau*, have been again collected, and placed under Missionary care. Three hundred of them are with the Society's Agent at *Queen-Charlotte Sound* ; one hundred are included in the Rev. J. Aldred's postoral charge, at *Nelson* ; another hundred are in the neighbourhood of *Wellington*, under the oversight of their former Missionary, the Rev. Samuel Ironsides ; and the remainder have emigrated to *Taranaki*, where it is expected they have generally attached themselves to our Religious Societies in that part of the country.

Several thousand copies of the Holy Scriptures, in the native language, have been munificently granted for distribution in *New Zealand*, by the British and French Bible Society.

The **FRIENDLY ISLANDS** comprise *Tonga, Haabai, Vavou,*

with *Keppel, Savage* and *Wallis' Islands* ; the three latter under the care of native Missionaries.

The efforts of Popery in the *South Seas* are now as matters of history well known. Our Missionaries here have deeply suffered, and still do suffer—but their confidence is on high, and notwithstanding much opposition from itinerating Romish Priests as well as from some residing on some of these Islands—their labours have not been in vain in the Lord. We have now six thousand six hundred and sixty-two Members, and four thousand seven hundred and fifty-seven Scholars.

FEEJEE is a young Station, but most successful. The most revolting scenes of cannibalism were witnessed here on the first arrival of our Missionaries—the most debasing forms of superstition prevailed, and no effort had been made for their advantage by the Christian world. This is peculiarly *Wesleyan* ground, as the Navigators' Islands belong to the London Missionary Society ; and here God has blessed us with one thousand Members at the last returns, and one thousand one hundred and forty-eight children under instruction.

This closes our Summary of the Asiatic Missions, which comprise fifty Stations ; eighty-five Missionaries ; fourteen thousand seven hundred and ninety-five Members ; and twenty thousand three hundred and sixty Scholars.

#### MISSIONS IN AFRICA.

In SOUTH AFRICA there are three Districts, viz: at the *Cape of Good Hope, Bechuana, and Caffraria*. These include forty Circuits ; thirty-seven Missionaries ; three thousand and ten Members ; seven thousand two hundred and seven Scholars. The reports from these Stations are satisfactory and encouraging.

In WESTERN AFRICA there are also three Districts, viz: *Sierra Leone, The Gambia, and Cape Coast*. It is not necessary to enlarge upon the state of the two former Missions. Their establishment is firm—their success has been abundant. The latter is a District of more recent date—but it is one daily rising in importance, and presenting advancing claims upon the watchful care of the Parent Committee, as well

as appealing powerfully to the prayerful sympathies of the friends of the Society. At *Ashunti* in the interior, and at *Cape Coast*, *Badagry*, and *Abokuta*, on the coast, the operations of our Missionaries, with some opposition, have been successful. A recent war between the natives of *Dahomi* and those of *Badagry*, has recently placed our Missionary there under painful circumstances—but under positions of imminent danger, the Lord has hitherto thrown around him and his family, the shield of Divine protection.

We have no Stations in the wide field of Missions, where so much heathen barbarity and cruel, murderous oppression, has now to be witnessed by the servants of the cross, as in WESTERN AFRICA, with the single exception of *Feejee*; yet in these Districts, we have a total of fifteen Stations; twenty Missionaries; four thousand two hundred and eighty-seven Members; seven thousand eight hundred and ninety Scholars.

#### MISSIONS IN THE WEST INDIES.

These Districts, five in number, viz: *Antigua*, *St. Vincents*, and *Demerara*, *Jamaica*, *Bahama*, and *Hayti*, are the oldest Stations of the Society; in numerical amount they have been the most successful of all our Missions, and are rapidly advancing to a position which will place them independent of assistance from the funds of the Society at home. They present a grand total of forty-nine Circuits; ninety Missionaries; fifty-seven thousand one hundred and fifty-three Members; seventeen thousand eight hundred and seventy-three Scholars. We next come to

#### MISSIONS IN BRITISH NORTH AMERICA.

Including *Canada East and West*, *Nova Scotia*, *Prince Edward Island*, and *Cape Breton*, *New Brunswick*, *Newfoundland*, and *The Hudson's Bay Territory*. These Districts include one hundred and five Circuits; ninety-seven Missionaries; eighteen thousand four hundred and thirty-three Members; ten thousand one hundred and eighty-two Scholars.

Your Committee feels that with one large portion of these, your feelings are fully identified, and if the limits of an Annual

Report would permit, they would feel pleasure in presenting to this Meeting, ample details of the prospects of the different Circuits in this and the Western District, but they will only make allusion to the success of the Indian Missions in the sister District, and to those in the *Hudson's Bay Territories*. A respectable Missionary of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the United States, bears his voluntary testimony to the fact, that the evangelizing influence of our Missions among these formerly savage tribes, is felt throughout the whole region from Lakes Ontario and Huron to the Mississippi. The antagonistic influence of Popery and Puseyism is severely felt—but our common cause maintains its ground, and is gradually advancing and increasing. As a proof of the interest the Indians themselves feel in our operations among them, they have desired that one hundred pounds out of their Government annuity, should be annually appropriated to aid in supporting their Manual Labour School. This request, our kind late Governor General, immediately complied with, and it is done. In the *Hudson's Bay Territory*, there are as the fruits of only a few years' efforts, one hundred and twenty-one Members in Society; an increase of twenty-six on the last year's Return.

Before closing this Report, Your Committee cannot but advert with feelings of sincere gratification to the late demonstration in favour of Christian Union, which has been witnessed in this Province. *Montreal* has taken a stand in this matter, which is creditable to the piety, and proof of the enterprise of her evangelical friends, and other sections of the Province have followed the same course, and others are on the point of organization. It is hailed as an omen of still greater success attending all evangelical efforts, for the spread of the truth and the salvation of men. May the present openings in the field of Christian Missions—the signs of the times so favorable for enlarged and extended effort—and the success attendant upon past efforts, be regarded by us all, as presenting claims which it shall be our delight, as well as duty, to advance; that the Redeemer's Kingdom may be set up in the ends of the earth—that His Glory may be revealed—so that all flesh may see it together. AMEN. Even so, Come Lord Jesus.

We are ourselves a part of the Mission field—as a District, we receive the return of our liberality back into our own bosoms from the Parent Society; let us therefore while we more fervently pray for the evangelization of the world, give practical evidence of our sincerity in our supplication by rendering continued and increased assistance to the Wesleyan Missionary Society; that the glad time may be hastened, when the Kingdoms of this world shall become the Kingdoms of our God and of His Christ. And He shall reign for ever and ever. AMEN.
