FOUND GUILTY.
Verdict Against Frank Smith and William Broom
FOR MARY ATKINS' DEATH.
To be Sentenced To-Day—A Counter-fetor Recovers Five Years.

Toronto, Dec. 18.—For the death of Mary Atkins, Frank Smith and William Broom were found guilty by a jury on Saturday afternoon, and this morning the two men will be sentenced to five years in the penitentiary for their crime. It was on the 23rd of May last that the deed was committed, of which the two men were charged. Mary Atkins, an old woman of 70 years, was assaulted in Queen's Park about 3 o'clock in the morning, and on June 1st she died. It was alleged by the Crown, from the effects of the assault. The prisoners were charged with murder, but the jury found them guilty of manslaughter. FROM THE CAPITAL.
Fishing and Lumbering in the Hudson Bay District.
Terrific Gales—Patrons of Industry—United States Congress on the Argentinean Outrage—Newfoundland Finances.

Ottawa, Dec. 18.—In 1875 the Department of Marine and Fisheries of Canada decided to recognize the bravery of some of the United States' mariners. Accordingly four drafts for \$300 each and testimonials were sent to the Secretary of State at Washington, to be presented to four members of the crew of the bark Edith Ross, who rescued the crew of the Canadian schooner, of New Brunswick. It seems that the Washington authorities have not yet been able to locate the sailors, and a letter was received to-day at the Department of Marine and Fisheries from the Secretary of State returning the drafts and the testimonials. The money had been waiting all day for twenty years.

A British Columbia firm, Messrs. Short and Squibb, of Vancouver, propose to expend some of its capital and energy in the development of the resources of the Hudson Bay. A letter received to-day at the Fisheries Department states that the company desires to establish branches in various parts of the new North, and to go extensively into the fishing and lumbering business. To that end information concerning the country was solicited, which will be promptly supplied.

The mail steamer Scythian arrived in Halifax—Cronquist's Resuscitated—Halifax, N.S., Dec. 12.—The mail steamer Scythian, of the Dominion line, arrived here this afternoon at 8.20, after a twelve-day passage. There was a strong wind and tide, and as the steamer is more than 4,000 tons it was nearly six o'clock when she was docked. The Dominion Government wharves, hurried last winter, are not yet sufficiently rebuilt for use, and the mail boats dock at the Cunard wharves. Docking was only accomplished by the aid of a tug. The Scythian's arrival is a great relief to the passengers.






