An Act to incorporate The Lacolle Academy.

(PRIVATE BILL.)

An Act to incorporate the "Lacolle Academy."

WHEREAS an Association hath been formed at the Village of Lacolle, Preamble. in the County of St. Johns, by divers persons residing in that Village and in the neighborhood thereof, under the name of the Lacolle Academy Association, having for its design to afford a course of instruc-5 tion to include the Greek, Latin, French and English languages, Writing, Arithmetic, Mathematics and such other branches of science and General Literature as it may be deemed proper from time to time to introduce; And whereas the persons hereinafter named being the office bearers of the said Association, and acting in behalf of the mem-10 bers thereof, have by their pctition to the Legislature, represented, that they have obtained a lease of a two story brick building, situated in the Village of Lacolle, for a term of years, in which the branches of learning and knowledge aforesaid may be taught, and have further. by their petition, represented that it would be beneficial to the interests 15 of the said Association, and would tend to the success and prosperity of their Seminary, if the members of the said Association were incorporated, and have prayed to be incorporated by the name of The Lacolle Academy; And whereas it is deemed expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petitioners: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice 20 and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. Alonzo Force, President, Wm. H. VanVliet, Secretary-Treasurer, Incorp'ration. Robert Douglas, S. N. Smith, William Gunn, Joseph Teskey, Roswell Canfield, Richard Foster, William Cockerline, Thomas Hodgson, 25 Edwin Scriver, Thomas Brisbin, Alonzo Smith, George Nichols and T. S. Haynes, M.D., the present directors of the said Association, with all such other persons as now are or hereafter may become members of the same, shall be and are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of The Lacolle Academy, and shall by that name Name and 30 have perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to alter, renew general or change such seal at pleasure, and shall by the same name at all times powers. hereafter have power to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy such lands and tenements as may be necessary for the actual use and occulimited. pation of the said Academy, not exceeding in annual value the sum of 35 two hundred pounds currency exclusive of the value of the necessary buildings for the use of the Academy and the ground on which they are or may be erected, and the same to sell alienate and dispose of and others in their stead to purchase, acquire and hold for the use and purposes aforesaid; And the said corporation may by the said name, Suits. 40 sue and be sued in all Courts of Law or other places whatsoever, in as large, ample and beneficial a manner as any other body, politic or corporate in this Province: And in all actions and suits at law which at any time may be brought against the said corporation, service of pro-Service of cess at the domicil of the President or of the Secretary of the said process. 45 corporation, shall be held to be a sufficient service for all legal pur-Proviso. poses; but the powers of the corporation shall extend only to the purposes and objects mentioned in the Preamble, to which only its property

and means shall be applied.

By-laws.

2. The said corporation shall have power to make By-laws, Rules. and Regulations not contrary to law or to the provisions of this Act, for the government and management of the said corporation, and of the officers, members, affairs and property thereof, and for the admission, demission and qualification of members thereof, and for all pur- 5 poses relating to the well being and interests of the said corporation, and the same to amend, alter or repeal from time to time as shall be deemed necessary or expedient.

Board of Directors.

3. The affairs of the said corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors, consisting not less than ten nor more than twenty mem- 10 bers, who shall be elected from time to time by the members of the corporation, in the manner prescribed by the By-laws of the said corporation, and who shall remain in office during such term as shall be fixed by the said By-laws: Provided always, that the present Directors shall remain in office until others shall be duly elected in their room 15 and stead.

Meetings.

Quorum.

4. The said Board of Directors shall have power to meet from time to time for the transaction of the affairs of the said corporation, and at any such meeting five Directors shall form a quorum competent for the transaction of business; and the said Directors shall from time to 20 time electione of their number to be President of the said corporation, and another one to be Secretary-Treasurer.

Transfer of property and liabilities of existing asso-

ciation.

5. All and every the estate and property, real and personal, of the said Association, and all property held in trust for it at the time of the passing of this Act, and all debts due to, or rights or claims possessed 25 by the said Association, shall be and the same are hereby transferred to and vested in the said coroporation, which shall be liable in like manner to and for all debts due by or claims upon the said Association.

Union of Academy School,

6. It shall and may be lawful for the said Directors of the said cor-Academy poration, and the School Commissioners for the Municipality of the School, Village of Lacolle, at any time to enter into any agreement with each 30 other, having for its object the union of one or more or all the Common Schools in the Municipality with the said Academy; And during the existence of such agreement the said School Commissioners shall ex-officio be Directors of the said corporation; and it shall and may be lawful for the said School Commissioners at any time to pay to 35 the Directors of the said corporation, such sums of money as the said Commissioners might pay the Teachers of such Common School or Schools, if the same had not been united with Academy.

Public Act.

7. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
