Canon Macnab and Mrs. Macnab arrived home a day or two before Sunday, 23rd August. During Canon Macnab's absence the services were taken by Rev. T. Walker, Rev. Canon Tremayne, Rev. C. J. A. Batstone, and Rev. Canon Belt.

The school is to re-open on Monday, 14th September.

We hoped to have printed the prize list of last term in this number of the NOTES, but are obliged to put it off, as some points are still undecided. The addition to the school is well advanced and is expected to be ready for use about the time of re-opening. For the present it will contain only two rooms, a luncheon room and a class room, but is intended at a later date to be carried to the same height as the rest of the school building, which will give another class room.

The School Cadet Corps, having received their arms and accoutrements, and having received a first instalment of their uniforms, sent out a team to compete in the Ontario Rifle Association Annual Matches at Long Branch on 26th August. They obtained the second prize in the Cadet Corps Match with a score of 12 points less than the winning score, and 25 more than that of the third prize winners. The team was composed of Lieuts. Charles Flint, and Bryan Chadwick, and Cadets William Amsden, Guy DePencier, Herbert Lovell and Garrett Tyrrell. The last named had the highest score.

Bryan Chadwick obtained a prize in the Canada Company match, obtaining 42 points in a possible of 50; and Amsden, Flint, Lovell and Tyrrell won prizes in the Cadet list of the same match.

We note the above, not only as something of interest to the boys and their many friends, but also as shewing the value of the steadiness and good discipline which the boys of St. Alban's Cathedral School acquire in their training, beth indoors and out-of-doors.

The summer system of general instruction in the Sunday School has been now discontinued, and the regular classes will be reformed on Sunday, 6th September, when it is hoped most, if not all, of the teachers will be back in town and ready to resume their duties.
