TRANQUILLE CHOSEN AS SANITARIUM SITE WELL ADAPTED FOR PURPOSE Place Decided on as Regarded as an Almost Ideal One For Treatment of Consumptives

Tranquille or Fortune ranch, nine miles west of Kamloops, will be the scene of the first sanitarium instituted by the anti-tuberculosis society of the province.

The following report was rendered by the committee of the board of the anti-tuberculosis society, appointed to report upon a site for a sanitarium at a meeting held in Vancouver yesterday.

The first place visited was Lynas' ranch at North Bend. It contains one acre, about a quarter of a mile to the east of the Canadian Pacific railway station.

The general committee had many times thought of this location as a site for a consumptive hospital, and it was known to the committee by Mr. Horn, advised by Dr. Reddick, strongly approved of it for the same purpose.

Besides the above mentioned 275 acres, there are available lands of about 160 and 120 acres of ranch land, all crown granted.

There are two large buildings, with out-houses and other structures, on the property. A photograph of one of the buildings is attached hereto.

One hundred and seven dwellings totally or partially destroyed, a property loss of \$175,000 and over 250 people rendered homeless is the result of the disastrous fire which devastated a portion of the northern area of Victoria Tuesday afternoon.
