CHURCH SERVICES:

St. Mark's Church, Vesuvius—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3.30 p.m. On all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs—evening service 7.30 p.m. Choir practice, St. Mark's, every Saturday evening.

North End School—Service 11 a.m. the third Sunday in each month.

Beaver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Fullford—Morning service 10.30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every second month. Evening service the first Sunday of the month 7.30 p.m.

Home Sunday School—Children prepare Sunday School lessons in their own homes. Bible questions are given in *Parish and Home*. Instruction and examinations at their homes every two months.

Ladies' Church Guild—Meets once a month.

Salt Spring Island Parish and Home

MARCH, 1900.

✓ Freddie Crofton left for Ireland February the 6th.

✓ The Japs on Salt Spring Island are expecting to be called home to fight the Russians before long.

Mr. Palmer paid an official visit to the Island last month, and did some spraying at our local experimental station.

The concert at the public hall on the 14th ult. was a great success. About \$25 was netted towards paying for the seating of the hall. Of this amount \$5 was made by the sale of violets and other flowers from Mrs. E. F. Wilson's garden.

Weather Report for January.—Kuper Island: Maximum temperature, 55.5, on 12th; minimum, 24.3, on 28th; mean temperature, 41.2; mean ratio of bright sunshine, .245; maximum, .794, on 30th; days completely clouded, 12; frost on nine days; no snow; rainfall, 6.49 inches.

Joel Broadwell has opened a general store at the Post Office, and has a good stock of canned meats, fruits, etc., biscuits, candies, tobacco; also such staples as flour, rice and sugar. The store is neat, clean and nicely kept, and Joel is an obliging salesman.

The new steamboat, which Mr. Paterson is putting on in connection with the Victoria & Sidney Railway will commence running, we understand, the first week in April. It will call Monday up, Tuesday down at Fulford and Ganges Harbour, and again Wednesday up and Thursday down, visiting on those days the other islands on the route. On Fridays, it is the intention, we believe, to take the other side of the Island, via Burgoyne Bay and Vesuvius, and thence on to Nanaimo, returning by the same route on Saturday. The new boat is to carry the mails.

The poultry business is on the increase on Salt Spring Island. Several ranchers have between 200 and 300 hens; and several of late have invested in incubators. W. Akerman probably does the biggest business in ducks, geese and fowls. W. G. Scott raises a large number of turkeys; this spring he has 14 turkey hens. Mr. Purvis last year marketed about 600 chickens, nearly all hatched in his incubator. Mr. Edwards also has an incubator, and keeps some well-bred fowls and ducks. Mr. Ruckle is reported to have sold about 2,000 dozen eggs last season.

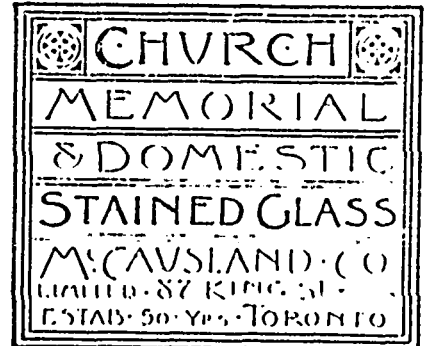
