MARKET FIRM-GAS LEADING-PACIFIC STRONG -INVESTORS CONFIDENT.

There seems no halt to the rise in securities, the general feeling remaining of the most optimistic character. As a matter of fact there is no acter. As a matter of fact there is no good reason for anything but higher prices. Money is easier and more of it is seeking fair investments than ever. Bonds yielding from 3½ to 3½ are being sold, the former being of the best kind, the latter of the good city order, small country towns being able to sell bonds to yield from 3½ to 4½. In the face of such facts, it is little wonder that good stocks command high prices. Wall Street continues firm, in fact strong. The local was in line with other markets, the general business being done at steady prices.

MARKET ACTIVE AND STRONG-LONDON SELLING 30,000 SHARES -GRANGERS LEADING - MAN-HATTAN A FEATURE.

New York, Jan. 10.

The market for Americans is somewhat heavy with indications of considerable liquidation.

what heavy with indications of considerable liquidation.

Speculation abroad generally is being curtailed by the recent unfortunate development from the Dreyfvs case and concequent fears in regard to France's political future.

Yesterday's market made a record in Scock Exchange annals. The total transactions of stock was over 1,100,000 shares. In bonds they extended to \$\$,500,000 and the number of issues dealt in was 179. Reducing the former record held during the reading boom from half shares to full shares. Yesterday's transactions were the largest in the history of the exchange. About 25 p.c. of the trading was in Atchison. There was no particular news to account for the advance, but the character of the buying was called excellent. Outside of Atchison the dealings were large in sugar and in Federal Steel.

The movement in the former seems to be due to Moore & Schley, Keene & Wormser, and the Room believes that it is based purely upon the extent of the short interest.

The Grangers were comparatively neglected although all advices from the West continue to indicate a remarkable state of prosperity. It is true that the grain movement fell off last week as compared with the previous week but although rates are low, they are being better maintained those for some lime.

An important Broadway House is credited with being very bullish on Southern Ry. pfd. and common. Of the latter, their purchases during the past few weeks are estimated at in the neighborhood of 50,000 shares.

London houses traded very heavily in the market this a.m. and have been sellers of the list with the exception of the Soo Ry., C. & O., and several others, where they were buyers, but on balance they have disposed of upwards of 30,000 shares. Their sales have been heaviest in Atchisons, Union Facific, London, and St. Paul, and this has had the effect of keeping those stocks down effect of keeping those stocks down in the face of the general strength elsewhere.

They should do better in the afternoon, with the cessation of the London selling, for they are too important a group to be allowed to rest in any upward move in the market. The most conspicuous features have been C. & O., Soo Ry., and

Dividend talk has attended the movements in C. & O. and Mop, and the buying of Soo Ry. seems to be entirely on the notion that the stock is now a 2 p.c., and possibly a 3 p.c. annual dividend payer.

Thus far the talk of a dividend on C. & O. and Mop. has not any more certainty than attends the usual board room gossip, although, Mop had earned nearly 3 p.c. in the ended year.
