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BY-LAWS.

No. 365—A BY-LAW

To raise by way of loan the sum of eight hundred dollars, for the purpose of purchasing a school site and erecting a school house in Union School Section Number Five, Raleigh and Tilbury East.

PASSED 28th April, 1881.

WHEREAS the Public School Trustees of Union School Section Number Five, in the Townships of Raleigh and Tilbury East have petitioned the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, to raise by way of loan the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars repayable by annual instalments during the term of five years, at the rate of six per cent. per annum, for the purpose of purchasing a site and erecting a school house thereon, required in and for the said school section.

And Whereas the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate for the payment of the debt and interest under the terms of this By-Law is the sum of One Hundred and Eighty-nine dollars 92c; And whereas the value of the whole real property rateable under this By-Law in the Townships of Raleigh and Tilbury East, respectively, is the aggregate sum of sixty-seven thousand one hundred and seventy-eight dollars, according to the last revised assessment rolls of the said Townships; And whereas the said school section has no existing debt; And whereas the said debt is created on the security of the special rate aforesaid, and on that security only; And whereas the Council are of opinion that the creation of the said debt is necessary and expedient. Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts Cap. 174 and Cap. 204, Revised Statutes of Ontario and the amendments thereto.

1st. That it may be lawful for the Reeve of the said Township of Raleigh to borrow the sum of eight hundred dollars on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, and may issue debentures of the Corporation to that amount, in sums of not less than one hundred dollars each, and payable within five years from the date thereof with interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, said debentures to be dated the Second day of May, A. D. 1881, and to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the Town of Chatham, and to have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest annually.

2nd. That for the purpose of paying the said sum of eight hundred dollars and to cover interest thereon, at the rate of six per cent. per annum, for the term of five years in equal annual payments a specific sum of one hundred and eighty-nine dollars 92c., shall be raised, levied and collected in addition to all other rates upon all the real property rateable under this By-Law, in each and every year during which the said debentures have to run.

3rd. That this By-Law shall take effect and come into force on the Second day of May, A. D. 1881, being the same day on which the said debentures are to be dated.

No. 366—A BY-LAW

To alter the existing limits of Union School Section Number Two and a half, so far as the same is situated in the Township of Raleigh. **PASSED 28th April, 1881.**

WHEREAS a majority of the ratepayers resident within the limits of that part of Union School Section number Two and a half, contained in the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh to detach certain lots from said Union School Section number Two and a half, and to attach the same to School Section number Eight in the said Township of Raleigh; And whereas it appears that the Trustees of the said School Sections have been duly notified of the proposed alterations to be made in the limits of the said School Sections, respectively, as required by Sec. 81, Cap. 204, R. S. O.; And whereas this Council are of opinion that the proposed alterations are expedient.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and virtue of the "Public Schools Act" Cap. 204, R. S. O. and amendments thereto.

1st. That the south east half of Lot number Twenty-three in the Twelfth Concession, and the north west half of Lot number Twenty-three in the Thirteenth Concession be, and the same are hereby detached from Union School Section number Two and a half, Harwich & Raleigh, and attached to School Section number Eight, Raleigh.

2nd. That this By-Law shall take effect and come into force on the First day of January A. D. 1882.

No. 367—A BY-LAW

To amend a By-Law numbered 363 and entitled a By-Law to appoint certain Municipal Officers for the year A. D. 1881, and to confirm the appointment of Watercourse Commissioners. **PASSED 28th April, 1881.**

WHEREAS certain Municipal Officers have declined to Act; And whereas it is necessary to appoint other persons in their place; And whereas it is necessary that the appointment of Watercourse Commissioners should be confirmed under the Corporate seal.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Municipal Act Cap. 174, Revised Statutes of Ontario and amendments thereto.

1st. That the appointment of the following persons as Watercourse Commissioners in each Rural Road Division is hereby confirmed, viz.: In the First Rural Road Division, William Irwin; in the Second Rural Road Division, Patrick T. Barry; in the Third Rural Road Division, William Drew; in the Fourth Rural Road Division, Michael Ritchie; in the Fifth Rural Road Division, Alexander Goulet.

2nd. That Thomas Johnson is hereby appointed Overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 3, in the place of Thomas McKellar.

3rd. That Charles McNeil is hereby appointed Overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 41, in place of John Foxton.

4th. That John Humber is hereby appointed Overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 74, in the place of Joseph Boyce.

5th. That Isaac Simpson is hereby appointed Overseer in Statute Labor Division No. 62, in place of A. Coatsworth.

6th. That Sherman Tye is hereby appointed Overseer in Division No. 33, in the place of Charles Henderson, deceased.

7th. That all By-Laws or parts thereof inconsistent with this By-Law be and the same are hereby repealed

No. 368—A BY-LAW

To appoint and confirm the appointment of certain Municipal Officers.

PASSED 27th July, 1881.

WHEREAS certain Municipal Officers have declined, or from other causes, been unable to act; And whereas it is necessary that others should be appointed in the place thereof, under the Corporate seal.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, under and by virtue of the Municipal Act, Cap. 174, R. S. O. and amendments thereto.

1st. That the appointment of Stephen McKeon as Overseer in Statute Labor Division number Twenty-seven, in place of John Dillon, deceased, be and the same is hereby confirmed.

2nd. That Alexander Scott be and is hereby appointed Overseer in Statute Labor Division number Twenty-three, in place of John Robbins.

3rd. That Daniel W. Crow be and is hereby appointed Poundkeeper in Rural Road Division number Two.

4th. That Samuel Chase be and is hereby appointed Poundkeeper in Rural Road Division number one in place of Henry Crump.

No. 369—A BY-LAW

To authorize the raising of certain sums of money hereinafter mentioned in the Township of Raleigh, to meet the current expenses of the year A. D. 1881.

PASSED 27th July, 1881.

WHEREAS by a By-Law of the Municipal Council of the County of Kent, passed in the June Session, in the said year 1881, and entitled a By-Law to raise the sum of \$—, to meet the current expenses of the said County of Kent for the current year; And whereas the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise the sum of \$2,617.05, as its portion for the said year 1881, to be paid to the Treasurer of the said County of Kent without any deduction on or before the Fourteenth day of December next; And whereas the apportionment of the Legislative Grant for schools for the said Township of Raleigh, for the year A. D. 1881, according to notification from the County Clerk is the sum of \$—; And whereas the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise an equal sum as in such case made and provided; And whereas it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh for the year A. D. 1881, viz.:

Miscellaneous account, \$506.66; salaries, \$821.60; charity, \$200; non-resident school rates, \$250; Govt. Drains for roads, \$934.65; Tilbury Govt. Drain on roads, \$11.42; do. for outlet, \$33.32; for roads on Finn Creek drain, \$26.52; Carter drain, \$800; Dyke drain, \$250; Kersey drain, \$155.83, in all \$4,000.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Municipal Act Cap. 174, R. S. O. and amendments thereto.

1st. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon all the rateable real and personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum or rate of one and sixteenths mills on every dollar thereof, for the aforesaid County purposes. The sum or rate of two and three tenths mills on every dollar thereof to meet the current expenses of the Township for the current year; the sum or rate of thirty-three one-hundredths of a mill on every dollar thereof for the aforesaid school purposes, except on the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools. The sum or rate of one dollar upon the owner or harbinger of every dog, and the sum or rate of two dollars upon the owner or harbinger of every bitch entered on the assessment roll for the current year.

2nd. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected according to the said rates shall exceed in any case the amount so required for the aforesaid purposes, respectively, the Treasurer of the Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the above mentioned purposes, respectively, in this By-Law. And if no such deficiency shall arise then all such excess (if any) shall be kept by the Treasurer and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township, under the direction and control of the Council thereof.

3rd. That the Clerk of this Corporation is hereby required to levy a special rate over and above all other rates against the estate, real and personal, of every School Section with the Municipality. The trustees of which shall furnish him on or before the 1st day of August in each year with a written statement, signed by the Secretary-Treasurer and certified by the seal thereof, of the amount of money required to be

raised for Public or Separate School purposes on each School Section, such a rate pro rata on all rateable property in such School Sections as will amount to the sum so required for the aforesaid school purposes, save and except Union Sections when the school house is beyond the limits of the municipality.

4th. That the Collector is hereby authorized and required to collect all rates levied on the collector's according to law, and to pay the same over to the Treasurer of this Corporation on or before the Fourteenth day of December next.

5th. That it shall be the duty of the collector to pay over all monies collected by him to the Treasurer of the Corporation within every two weeks, under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary, and to finally collect and pay over all monies collected by him and make a return to the Treasurer by the Fourteenth day of December next, according to law.

6th. That the collector shall be allowed the same fees as are now allowed to Bailiffs of the Division Court, for all property seized, appropriated, advertised and sold by him in virtue of his office.

No. 370—A BY-LAW

To provide for draining parts of the Township of Raleigh by the construction of the Dyke Drain, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$723.20, for completing the same.

Provisionally adopted 27th July, 1881.

WHEREAS a majority of the owners as shown by the last revised assessment roll to be resident on the property hereinafter set forth to be benefitted by the construction of the Dyke Drain, have petitioned the Council of the said Township, praying that a drain be constructed to drain the following Lots and parts of Lots, and that the same be assessed therefor, viz : Nw hf 7, Lots 8, 9, 10, 11, Con. 4 ; Se hf s 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, Con. 5 ; And whereas thereupon the said Council procured an examination to be made by A. McDonnell, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the locality proposed to be drained by the construction of said drain ; and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said A. McDonnell, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by the construction of said drain, stating as nearly as he can, the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such drainage works by every road and Lot and part of Lot ; the said assessment so made and the report of A. McDonnell, being as follows :—

"In accordance with instructions received from the Clerk of your Municipality, I surveyed the Dyke Drain in your Township, also made an estimate of the cost of constructing said drain, and an assessment on lands and roads benefitted thereby, and report thereon as follows :—I commenced said drain on south side of the allowance for road between 5th and 6th cons. of Raleigh, and at the line between lots 11 and 12, Con. 6, then followed the south side of said road allowance southwest to the Government Drain, on west side of 6th and 7th side road, a distance of one 86-100 miles, and I find the bottom of said Government Drain to be five feet and six inches below the surface of the land at the head of the proposed Drain. The road as at present constructed in part of the above described distance is very winding and should be straightened. The section stakes are placed in a direct line in the centre of the drain, and the drain should be constructed according to said stakes. The estimated cost for constructing a drain of six feet bottom, in the distance above described, with cutting as shown in the section of said drain—side slopes one to one—grading road the length of drain, clearing stumps and timber from the road at head of drain, constructing two culverts, one on the centre road and the other across the con. of the line across 8 and 9 (all other culverts on the line to be closed up) and filling up some four rods of the present ditch on the road above the proposed drain, to prevent the water of the Raleigh Plains Drain from following westward into the contemplated drain, including all incidental expenses is \$1154, which I assessed on lands and roads benefitted as per annexed schedule of assessment; said drain to be maintained at the joint expense of the lands and roads interested, in the proportion of, and according to said assessment. (Signed), A. McDONNELL, C. E."

And Whereas the said Council are of opinion that the drainage of the locality described is desirable.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Raleigh, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the Legislatures of Ontario, Cap. 174, R. S. O. and amendments thereto.

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said drain and the work connected therewith, be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, the sum of seven hundred and twenty-three 20-100 dollars, being four-fifths of the funds necessary for the work, and may issue debentures of the Corporation to that amount in sums of not less than one hundred

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dollars each, and payable within five years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum: That is to say in four equal annual instalments of one hundred and eighty 80-100 dollars each, such debentures to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the Town of Chatham, and to have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest.

2nd. That for the purpose of paying the sum of nine hundred and four dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefitted as aforesaid other than roads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for four years and three months at the rate of five per cent. per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned Lots and parts of Lots; and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each Lot or part of Lot respectively shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for five years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which the said debentures have to run.

4th. That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, assessed on the road allowance shall be paid by the Treasurer of this Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality.

5th. That the commissioner of R. R. Div. No. 2 be hereby appointed commissioner to let the contract for constructing the said drain and works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder, (not exceeding the estimate) but every such contractor, with one good and satisfactory surety shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of his contract, according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond, unless otherwise ordered by the Council; and it shall be the duty of the said commissioner to cause said drain and works connected therewith to be made and constructed in accordance with such plans and specifications, and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by the Engineer laying out the work; and for the due performance of these and all duties of commissioner, the said commissioner shall be entitled to receive a sum of fifteen dollars.

6th. That a copy of this By-law shall be served by the Clerk on each ratepayer in the annexed schedule, pursuant to 44 Vic., Cap. 24, Sec. 21, and may be cited and referred as the "Dyke Drain" By-Law.

That for the purpose of paying the sum of four thousand three hundred and fifty-seven dollars, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefited as aforesaid, other than reads belonging to the Municipality, and to cover interest thereon for five years at the rate of five per cent. per annum, the following special rates, over and above all other rates, shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied), upon the undermentioned Lots and parts of Lots and the Canada Southern Railway: and the amount of the said special rates and interest assessed as aforesaid against each Lot or part of Lot respectively shall be divided into five equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed and levied as aforesaid in each year for five years, after the final passing of this By-law, during which the said debentures have to run.

6th. That this By-law shall be published by serving a copy thereof upon each ratepayer, owner of property assessed on the annexed schedule, for three weeks previous to the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as the "Kersey Drain" By-Law.

No. 373—A BY-LAW

To provide for the deepening and repair of No. One Government Drain in the Township of Raleigh.
Passed 9th September, 1881.

WHEREAS Edward Lee and others have petitioned the Council of the said Township of Raleigh, praying that the Drain known as Government Drain number One be deepened and cleaned out to its original dimensions, as provided for by Cap. 33, sec. 30, Revised Statutes of Ontario.

And whereas thereupon the said Council procured an examination to be made by A. McDonnell, P. L. S., being a person competent for such purpose, of the said locality proposed to be drained by the construction of said drain; and has also procured plans and estimates of the work to be made by the said A. McDonnell, and an assessment to be made by him of the real property to be benefitted by the construction of said drain, stating as nearly as he can, the proportion of benefit which, in his opinion, will be derived in consequence of such drainage works by every road and Lot and portion of Lot; the said assessment so made and the report of the said A. McDonnell in respect thereof, and of the said drainage works, being as follows:—

"In accordance with instructions received from the Clerk of your Municipality, I made a survey and estimate of the required improvement on the north part of No. 1 Government Drain, in the Township of Raleigh, and report thereon as follows:—I find that part of No. 1 Government Drain from the mouth of the Carter Drain in Concession A, to the mouth of the Doyle Drain in Concession 7, a distance of twenty eight hundred feet, to be very much obstructed by the caving in of the banks, and the estimated cost of repairing said drain with a bottom width ten feet and cuttings as shown on the Section thereof is \$128.00. Again, from the north side of the Raleigh Plains drain to the Railway Crossing is obstructed in a similar manner to the first described part, and the estimated cost for repairing it with a bottom width of fourteen feet, with cuttings as shown in the Section thereof is \$202.00.

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3rd. That the Commissioner of R. R. Division No. 1 be hereby appointed Commissioner to let the contract for repairing the said drain and the works connected therewith, by public sale to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor with one good and satisfactory surety, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of his contract according to said plans and specifications, and within the time mentioned in such bond, unless otherwise ordered by the Council; and it shall be the duty of the said Commissioner to cause said drain and works connected therewith to be made and constructed in accordance with such plans and specifications, and to grant orders on the Treasurer to each contractor, less twenty per cent. of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted by the engineer laying out the work; and for the due performance of these and all duties of Commissioner, the said Commissioner shall be entitled to receive a sum of fifty dollars.

And be it enacted that the numbers and limits of Statute Labor Divisions, as described in By-law number 236 and amendments thereto, shall be the limits and numbers as herein set forth, and shall be read with and as forming part of this By-law.

2nd. That the following persons be and they are hereby appointed Poundkeepers, viz:—In the First Rural Road Division—Joseph Wilcox, Samuel Chase, Richard Brown, Farmer Bennett. In the Second Rural Road Division—Isaac Williams, Garrison Shadd, Samuel Woods, Daniel W. Crow and Edward Lee. In the Third Rural Road Division—Patrick Dooey, Patrick Hickey, Levi Marshall, Robert Slade, Jas. Gilhula. In the Fourth Rural Road Division—Duncan Ritchie, James M. Doyle, Andrew Pardo, Thomas Russell. In the Fifth Rural Road Division—Malcolm Toll (O), Jesse Millns (B), John O'Fee (B), John Irving (C).

3rd. That the following persons be and they are hereby appointed Fence-Viewers, viz:—In the First Rural Road Division—John Clarkson, Hezekiah A. Wilcox, John Chrysler. In the Second Rural Road Division—John W. Kersey, Patrick Rice, George Shreeves. In the Third Rural Road Division—James King, John Ree, John E. Bennett. In the Fourth Rural Road Division—Albert H. White, Silas West, Michael Toomey. In the Fifth Rural Road Division—George Goulet (O), William H. Taylor, John Sullivan.

4th. That Joseph Heatherington be and is hereby appointed Collector, upon conditions following, that is to say: That he shall enter into bonds himself, and other good and freshhold sureties to be approved by this Council, to the amount of sixteen thousand dollars. That he shall collect and pay over at least every two weeks to the Treasurer of this Municipality all the rates, taxes, duties and impositions whatsoever levied therein, in so far as the law will enable him so to do, on or before the Fourteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, all collections to be made and paid over in bankable funds of the Province of Ontario.

5th. That each of the said officers hereby appointed shall on or before the Twenty-seventh day of March next, after the passing of this By-law, make and subscribe the necessary declarations of office, and shall continue to hold such respective office as aforesaid until his or their successor has been duly appointed, and qualified or until otherwise relieved by the Council.

6th. That any person refusing or neglecting to make and subscribe the declarations of office within the time herein specified, and having been notified of the same shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one dollar nor more than ten dollars, to be recovered in the usual manner on complaint of the Clerk before any Justice of the Peace, having jurisdiction in the Municipality.

No. 389—A BY-LAW

To appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh, and to confirm the appointment of Commissioners to expend the sum.

WHEREAS the sum of one hundred and ninety 11-100 dollars is accruing from non-resident statute labor tax; And whereas an additional sum of fifteen hundred dollars will be required therewith, for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the Township of Raleigh for the current year; And whereas it is necessary to confirm the appointment of commissioners to expend the same.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the "Municipal Act" and amendments thereto.

1st. That the sum of one thousand six hundred and ninety 11-100 dollars, inclusive of the amount accruing from non-resident statute labor tax as aforesaid, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in the Township of Raleigh, in accordance with By-law number thirty-eight of the consolidated By-laws of 1865, and the above recited Act, that is to say:

That it shall be the duty of each commissioner to expend the amount so appropriated for the improvement of the roads and bridges in his Division, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to grant orders on the Treasurer of this Corporation to parties filling contracts thereon, less the amounts hereinunder specified as overdrawn in the respective Rural Road Divisions in the year 1881, stating on each order the nature of the work done and where it was performed, provided that the amount accruing from non-resident Statute Labor tax shall be expended in the Statute Labor Division where it was collected as reported by the Clerk to each commissioner.

3rd. That no commissioner shall be allowed to exceed the amount so appropriated to his Division, without first having obtained the consent of the Council and Treasurer notified of the same.

4th. That the appointment of the following persons as Commissioners in each of the Rural Road Divisions is hereby confirmed, that is to say: — In the First Rural Road Division—William Irwin. Second—Richard Tooley. Third—William Drew. Fourth—Stephen White. Fifth—Alexander Goulet.

5th. That it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to withhold the following sums as shown by the Auditors' Report to be overdrawn and charged to the respective Rural Road Divisions as follows:—From the First Rural Road Division, \$70.09. From the Second Rural Road Division, \$53.40. From the Third Rural Road Division, \$27.37. From the Fourth Rural Road Division, \$18.24. From the Fifth Rural Road Division, \$245.70.
