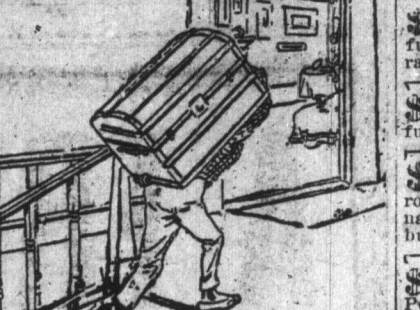

CANADA MAY EXTEND INTERMEDIATE TARIFF

London Cable States That Sir Wilfrid Will Take Trip to Paris and Italy.

OTTAWA, April 24.—(Special.)—In the Senate this afternoon Senator Loughheed read a despatch from London, that Sir Wilfrid Laurier would go to Paris and Italy after the colonial conference, and that the result of next week's discussions at the colonial conference would depend on what line the Canadian ministers take in their negotiations with France, Italy and possibly Austria.

Senator Loughheed said the cable indicated that the possibility of Canada extending the intermediate tariff to continental countries, probably to the disadvantage of Great Britain, was being discussed at the colonial conference. He asked to what extent Canada had discussed the matter with other countries.

Sir Richard Cartwright said he had received information as to what Sir Wilfrid had done with regard to these matters. There had been certain purporters with one or two countries, but they had no special reference to the conference. Italy was one of the countries, and there had been some informal communications with Germany.

Senator Loughheed asked if the attitude of Great Britain toward Canada would be important in event Canada extending the intermediate tariff to the countries mentioned.

Sir Richard said he expected Sir Wilfrid would discuss that with the British government. Personally he did not think that the extension of the intermediate tariff would materially affect the British preference.

GOVERNOR NOT TO BLAME. FOR INSANE IN THE JAIL

Mr. Vanzant Claims That Prisoners Are Removed After Surgeon's Report.

In reply to an article in The World on Tuesday morning complaining of the detention of lunatics in the Toronto Jail, Governor C. R. Vanzant informed The World that neither the sheriff nor the governor has any control whatever in the matter.

There is no delay on the part of the jail authorities, claims the governor. As soon as the order for removal is made by the inspector, the prisoner is immediately removed. In his report on prisons and jails, Dr. Bruce Smith refers to the number of insane persons committed to jails. There were 66 in the past year. "In several counties the local authorities have arranged for some suitable place of detention other than the jail. As the law now stands, no magistrate is justified in sending an insane person to jail, unless he has positive evidence that the insanity is of such a dangerous character as to render it absolutely necessary to place the affected one behind prison bars. The amendment to the law passed at the last session of the legislature has a tendency to prevent and discourage the use of jails for the insane.

BOURASSA SAME ALWAYS.

Replies to Laurier's Remarks That He Fears "Firebrands."

OTTAWA, April 24.—Henri Bourassa, M. P., of Labelle, said to-day: "In Sir Wilfrid Laurier's reference to Canadian firebrands referred to in the cable despatches from London, I notice that he speaks of Mr. Bourassa and others." I presume the latter reference is to Hon. Sydney Fisher's speech against preferential trade, in Montreal, on the morning of the British general elections last year, and to Sir Wilfrid's own speech, against the creation of an imperial council and the policy of imperial defence, delivered at the banquet of the Chamber of Commerce, in Montreal in 1904.

IRISH WILL COMPROMISE.

Secretary Birrell Will Introduce Irish Bill on May 7.

LONDON, April 24.—The spirit of compromise is having effect on the prospects of the Irish council bill, and to-day its supporters are more hopeful of reconciling the differences regarding the terms of the proposed measure. The outlook has so far improved that Mr. Birrell, chief secretary for Ireland, was able to announce in the House of Commons this afternoon that he hoped to be able to introduce the bill May 7.

NEW BUILDING FOR VARSITY.

Plans in Contemplation for Geological Museum.

One of the plans in contemplation by the board of governors of the Toronto University is the erection of a geological museum. It is stated that the southwest corner of Bloor-street and Avenue-road has been determined on as the site. A building of 50 x 100 feet will be erected in the first instance, but the plans will be of a nature to permit symmetrical expansion, and eventually there will be a fine frontage on Avenue-road. The university has a fine collection of paleontological specimens, while the Registrar's collection is of great value and importance. These exhibits are now accessible to the public in the School of Science Building, in Collegiate-street, and form a promising nucleus for the future museum. The cost of the new building will be provided from funds to be raised on loan under the act passed by the legislature, permitting the university to borrow on its own property.

MAIL DRIVER HELD UP.

Hits and Stuns Highwayman With Blow on Head.

PETERBORO, April 24.—This morning about 12.30 James Reid, who drives the mailman from the postoffice to the C. P.R. station there, was held up by an unknown man, who demanded the mail bags. Just as his assailant was reaching for his big pocket-knife to cut open over the head with the heavy lock of an empty mail bag, and the blood remaining on the canvas of the bag showed that the blow took effect. SUCCESSOR TO DR. RUSSELL. The statement that Dr. Russell, medical superintendent of Hamilton Insane Asylum, had resigned, was confirmed at the parliament building yesterday. No successor has yet been mentioned. It is rumored, however, from Waterford, that Dr. Snider of that place may be offered the position.

REFUSED TO FLY FLAG.

St. John School Trustees Turn Down St. George's Society.

ST. JOHN, N.B., April 24.—At the St. George's Society banquet last night, President Studey said he had asked the school board to fly the British flag over the school buildings and to give five minutes to a patriotic subject in the schools. The interior of Westminster Hall was appropriately decorated, but did not present so brilliant a scene as on the occasion of the entertainment to the officers of the French fleet, two years ago. Prior to luncheon a reception was held, after which a procession was formed to the banquet hall. Among the last to arrive were Sir Wilfrid and Lady Laurier. The prime minister and practically the whole of the cabinet and many other distinguished notabilities were present. The band played "The Maple Leaf Forever." After the usual loyal toasts, Premier Campbell-Bannerman proposed in appropriate terms the toast to "The Colonial Premiers," Balfour supporting.

IRISH WILL COMPROMISE.

Secretary Birrell Will Introduce Irish Bill on May 7.

LONDON, April 24.—The spirit of compromise is having effect on the prospects of the Irish council bill, and to-day its supporters are more hopeful of reconciling the differences regarding the terms of the proposed measure. The outlook has so far improved that Mr. Birrell, chief secretary for Ireland, was able to announce in the House of Commons this afternoon that he hoped to be able to introduce the bill May 7.

NEW BUILDING FOR VARSITY.

Plans in Contemplation for Geological Museum.

One of the plans in contemplation by the board of governors of the Toronto University is the erection of a geological museum. It is stated that the southwest corner of Bloor-street and Avenue-road has been determined on as the site. A building of 50 x 100 feet will be erected in the first instance, but the plans will be of a nature to permit symmetrical expansion, and eventually there will be a fine frontage on Avenue-road. The university has a fine collection of paleontological specimens, while the Registrar's collection is of great value and importance. These exhibits are now accessible to the public in the School of Science Building, in Collegiate-street, and form a promising nucleus for the future museum. The cost of the new building will be provided from funds to be raised on loan under the act passed by the legislature, permitting the university to borrow on its own property.

MAIL DRIVER HELD UP.

Hits and Stuns Highwayman With Blow on Head.

PETERBORO, April 24.—This morning about 12.30 James Reid, who drives the mailman from the postoffice to the C. P.R. station there, was held up by an unknown man, who demanded the mail bags. Just as his assailant was reaching for his big pocket-knife to cut open over the head with the heavy lock of an empty mail bag, and the blood remaining on the canvas of the bag showed that the blow took effect. SUCCESSOR TO DR. RUSSELL. The statement that Dr. Russell, medical superintendent of Hamilton Insane Asylum, had resigned, was confirmed at the parliament building yesterday. No successor has yet been mentioned. It is rumored, however, from Waterford, that Dr. Snider of that place may be offered the position.

REFUSED TO FLY FLAG.

St. John School Trustees Turn Down St. George's Society.

ST. JOHN, N.B., April 24.—At the St. George's Society banquet last night, President Studey said he had asked the school board to fly the British flag over the school buildings and to give five minutes to a patriotic subject in the schools. He said the board declined on the ground that they would have to do the same for other societies if they did it for one. This brought hisses from those at the table.

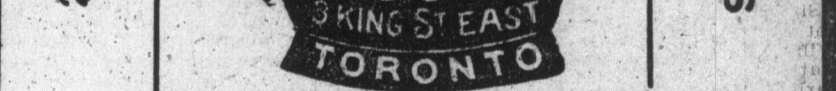

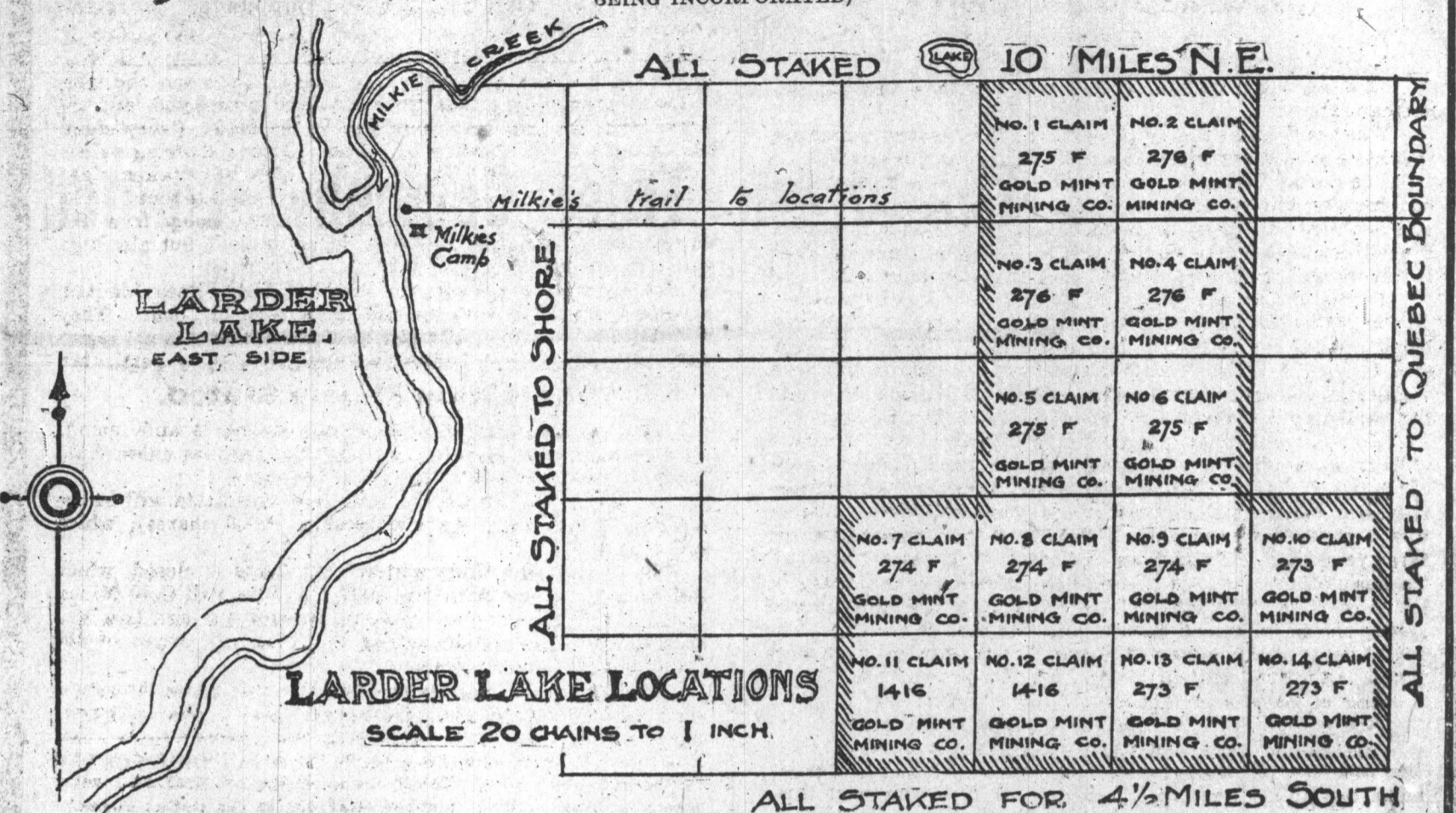

Wall Street Issues Turn Easier Towards the Close—Sao Paulo Weak in Domestic.

World Office, Wednesday Evening, April 24. The chief topic of discussion in the Toronto market was the continued money stringency and some brokers expressed the opinion that further calling of loans would cause funds to be brought back from New York for local use, but where these funds are to be used, it is thought that they are being held in case of further emergency. The expectation of little influence on the part of the Federal Reserve Board has, to all intents and purposes, ceased. The current transactions are mainly between either corporation or individual buyers who are purchasers or inside buyers on public liquidation. Holders are exercising considerable patience, and the market retains a steady position, chiefly on the returns. Earnings statements being picked up on the occasion presents a net increase of 8 1/2 provided a basis for bidding up the common stock, but it is scarcely effective in attracting new buyers. Sao Paulo March net showed a respectable increase, but this stock is still being liquidated, and the price fell away almost another point to-day. WANT TO GIVE PUBLIC SERVANTS MORE MONEY

Delegation Waits on Premier Whitney, Who Thinks People Will Favor Increase.

Premier Whitney had a new sensation yesterday when a deputation waited upon him to approve his action in raising his own and the salaries of his colleagues. It was a deputation of some weight, too, including Dr. Goldwin Smith, Rev. Father Minehan, Edward Halloran and others who represented an influential body of citizens.

Father Minehan introduced the deputation, several of whom spoke. He said that the public he represented desired good public service, and he realized that if good pay was not given the corporations would monopolize all the good servants.

Dr. Goldwin Smith said he had not liked to refuse to join the deputation, but he could hardly have supposed that any deputation was necessary. He had heard no objection to the increases of salaries, and did not see how there could be any. In fact, it could hardly be said to be an increase. It was little more than making up for the change during the last thirty years in prices and the purchasing power of money.

The salaries of ministers would still be below those of officers of commercial companies whose work was not so difficult or onerous. Ontario was not a parish. Its population was nearly as large as that of Denmark or Norway, and the business perhaps was not very much less heavy than theirs. "We must either pay fair salaries to the administrators of the state," said the speaker, "or confine the offices to the rich."

Premier Whitney was very glad to have such an expression of opinion. He had felt that there would be a certain amount of opposition to the increase, but considered that on the whole the people would approve.

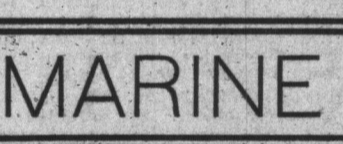
