15. Voted, Elder J. Manning fupply the first Baptist Church of Digby.

16. Voted, the Affociation next year be held at Onflow.

17. Voted, Elder T. S. Harding write the Circular Letter.

18. Voted, Elder T. Anfley write the Correfponding Letter,

19. Brethren E. Manning and T. Anfley are appointed Meffengers to the Lincoln Affociation.

20. Appointed Brother Edward Manning to preach the Introductory Sermon, in cafe of failure Brother J. Crandal.

21. Voted, that 600 Copies of the Minutes, Circular and Corresponding Letters, be printed.

27. Met at fix o'clock, and attended to the Ordination of Brother L. Hammond-Introductory Prayer by Brother T. S. Harding; and a Sermon preached by him alfo-the Charge was given by Elder D. Merrill. When the Hands of the Elders were laid on the Head of the Candidate, Brother J. Crandal poured out his Soul in Prayer to Cod. The Right Hand of Fellowship was given by Brother Edward Manning. The concluding Prayer was made by Elder Hale.
