LAWS AND REGULATIONS  
OF THE  
NOVA-SCOTIA BIBLE SOCIETY.

---

I. This Society shall be called The Bible Society of Nova-Scotia and its Dependencies: the object of which shall be the same as that of the British and Foreign Bible Society, viz: To encourage the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, without note or comment, and to furnish copies of the Scriptures *gratis* to the indigent, and at reduced prices to those requiring them.

II. The business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Secretary and Committee.

III. In order to give effect to the design of this Institution, benefactions and subscriptions shall be solicited, and books opened for receiving the names of benefactors and subscribers.

IV. Every person contributing annually One Pound, or at one time a donation of Ten Pounds, shall be considered a Member of this Society.

V. A general meeting of the Members of this Society shall be held every year, in the first week of March, before which shall be laid the accounts and proceedings of the preceding year.

VI. The whole of the subscriptions and donations, after deducting incidental expences, shall be remitted annually, in aid of the funds of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

VII. Every Member of this Society shall be entitled to purchase, under the direction of the Committee, Bibles and Testaments, at the reduced prices of the Society, which are as low as possible.

VIII. The Committee shall be authorised to meet, for the purpose of conducting the business of the Society, as often as may be necessary,

On a motion by the Speaker of the House of Assembly, seconded by T. Roach, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be given to the Vice-Presidents, for the continuance of their services to the Society.

On motion of Edward Mortimer, Esq. seconded by W. H. O. Haliburton, Esq. it was

**RESOLVED**, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be given to the Gentlemen who compose the Committee, for their unremitting attention to the business of the Society.

On a motion by the Hon. James Fraser, seconded by H. H. Cogswell, Esq. it was

**RESOLVED**, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be presented to the various Branch Societies throughout the Province, for their zealous exertions in support of this Institution ; and this Meeting assures them of its determination to afford them as liberal a supply of the Holy Scriptures as its means will admit.

# R E P O R T.

---

**T**HE lapse of a year since our last General Meeting, calls on the Committee of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, again to address its numerous supporters.

The Accounts, from time to time received from the Parent Society, continue to be of a most pleasing nature to all the true friends of Religion and of Mankind. By the unremitting exertions of the wise and good men who formed and have supported that Society, the light of Truth has been spread through almost every region of the world. The blessing of GOD has attended their virtuous labours. From the Palace to the Cottage, all have displayed an unexampled zeal in this noble and beneficent cause. The Rulers of the Earth have exhibited a princely munificence; and the humble villager has contributed his mite towards the advancement of the knowledge of Divine Truth, and towards the enlightening of men and of nations, in "the things which belong unto their peace."

In this Province, the Committee have thankfully to acknowledge, that the friends of this valuable Institution continue zealous and active. The depressed

state of the trade of the Province, for two or three years past; the great influx of distressed strangers, who were to be supported by public or private charities, and other causes, have impaired the means of the people, and put it out of their power to contribute, even to this laudable object, according to their wishes. With returning Prosperity, the Committee cherish the pleasing hope, that the Public will testify its approbation of the Bible Society, by still more liberal contributions.

There has been collected since the beginning of March 1818, the sum of L468 15 11, of which L413 1 4 have been remitted to the Parent Society; L26 16 have been paid by the Committee for printing, and a balance of L28 18 7 remains this day in the Treasurer's hands. The sums collected by the Society, from its commencement, amount altogether to L2 528 13 2½. Voluntary contributions to such an amount, in a Colony neither very populous nor very opulent, are sufficiently expressive of the sincere desire entertained by the public for the prosperity of this most respectable Society, and the accomplishment of its benevolent designs.

Since last March, your Committee have received from the Parent Society, 420 Bibles and 400 Testaments. These with the number on hand, at the time of the last Annual Meeting, form a total of 472 Bibles and 438 New Testaments. Of this number there have been distributed to various Societies and Individuals, 277 Bibles and 263 New Testaments; and there now remain in the hands of Mr. Black, the Depository, 195 Bibles and 170 New Testaments, nearly all in the Irish and Gaelic tongues.

The Committee cannot omit this opportunity of recommending to the friends of the Bible Society, perseverance in the good cause they have embraced. A connexion with such a Society cannot but be honorable



to any man. It includes persons of the first merit of every nation, whatever is dignified in rank, respectable in talents, or venerable in piety. Its objects are the Diffusion of Divine Truth, and the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom. It has sent, and is daily sending, the written oracles of GOD to "the uttermost parts of the Earth." Its beneficent operations are to be traced in almost every land, from Iceland to Terra del Fuego, and from the rising to the setting of the Sun,



# APPENDIX.

REPORT OF THE CUMBERLAND (BRANCH) SOCIETY,  
HELD ON THE FIRST WEDNESDAY OF JANUARY  
LAST.

**S**INCE the last Annual Meeting, several of the friends and supporters of the Cumberland Bible Society, have contributed in aid of its funds; but there is evidently a want of zeal in this good cause.

The sums collected during the past year, including the balance of last year's account, amount to 39*l.* 2*s.* 4*d.*: of this sum 38*l.* have been remitted to the Secretary of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, the Revd. Mr. ROBSON; leaving a balance of 1*l.* 2*s.* 4*d.* in the hands of your Secretary.

There remain in the hands of the Society's Depository, three Bibles and five New-Testaments.

A number of copies of the Reports of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, have been received, part of which are distributed, and a number are now ready for distribution. One cannot help being astonished at the great spread of the Word of God amongst people almost of every religion, language and clime, under Heaven.

With mingled emotions of pleasure and gratitude we should attribute all this to the Divine Dispenser of all good.

We behold Emperors, Kings, and Princes, engaged in this good work. On those occasions we may well say, "The rich and the poor meet together." They meet for one purpose; to spread the Sacred Scriptures of Divine Truth throughout the habitable Globe. Only read the Reports of the British and Foreign Bible Society, and you must exclaim, "It is the Lord's do-
