**LAWS AND REGULATIONS
OF THE
NOVA-SCOTIA BIBLE SOCIETY.**

I. This Society shall be called The Bible Society of Nova-Scotia and its Dependencies : the object of which shall be the same as that of the British and Foreign Bible Society, viz : To encourage the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, without note or comment, and to furnish copies of the Scriptures *gratis* to the indigent, and at reduced prices to those requiring them.

II. The business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Secretary and Committee.

III. In order to give effect to the design of this Institution, benefactions and subscriptions shall be solicited, and books opened for receiving the names of benefactors and subscribers.

IV. Every person contributing annually One Pound, or at one time a donation of Ten Pounds, shall be considered a Member of this Society.

V. A general meeting of the Members of this Society shall be held every year, in the first week of March, before which shall be laid the accounts and proceedings of the preceding year.

VI. The whole of the subscriptions and donations, after deducting incidental expences, shall be remitted annually, in aid of the funds of the British and Foreign Bible Society.

VII. Every Member of this Society shall be entitled to purchase, under the direction of the Committee, Bibles and Testaments, at the reduced prices of the Society, which are as low as possible.

VIII. The Committee shall be authorised to meet, for the purpose of conducting the business of the Society, as often as may be necessary,

The Report of the Committee having been read by the Revd. Dr. Gray, it was, on a motion by S. G. W. Archibald, Esq. seconded by John Allison, Esq.

RESOLVED unanimously, That the Report now read be received and adopted; and that it be printed under the direction of the Committee.

On a motion by the Hon. Judge Stewart, and seconded by W. A. Chipman, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be given to His Excellency the Right Hon. the Earl of DALHOUSIE, the President, for his continued patronage of the Society.

On a motion by the Speaker of the House of Assembly, seconded by T. Roach, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be given to the Vice-Presidents, for the continuance of their services to the Society.

On motion of Edward Mortimer, Esq. seconded by W. H. O. Haliburton, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be given to the Gentlemen who compose the Committee, for their unremitting attention to the business of the Society.

On a motion by the Hon. James Fraser, seconded by H. H. Cogswell, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the Thanks of this Meeting be presented to the various Branch Societies throughout the Province, for their zealous exertions in support of this Institution ; and this Meeting assures them of its determination to afford them as liberal a supply of the Holy Scriptures as its means will admit.

On a motion by the Honble. Chief Justice, seconded by Elisha Dewolf, Esq. it was

RESOLVED, unanimously, That the cordial thanks of this Meeting be given to His Excellency the President, for his obliging and condescending attention to the business of this day.

RE P O R T.

THE lapse of a year since our last General Meeting, calls on the Committee of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, again to address its numerous supporters.

The Accounts, from time to time received from the Parent Society, continue to be of a most pleasing nature to all the true friends of Religion and of Mankind. By the unremitting exertions of the wise and good men who formed and have supported that Society, the light of Truth has been spread through almost every region of the world. The blessing of GOD has attended their virtuous labours. From the Palace to the Cottage, all have displayed an unexampled zeal in this noble and beneficent cause. The Rulers of the Earth have exhibited a princely munificence; and the humble villager has contributed his mite towards the advancement of the knowledge of Divine Truth, and towards the enlightening of men and of nations, in "the things which belong unto their peace."

In this Province, the Committee have thankfully to acknowledge, that the friends of this valuable Institution continue zealous and active. The depressed

state of the trade of the Province, for two or three years past ; the great influx of distressed strangers, who were to be supported by public or private charities, and other causes, have impaired the means of the people, and put it out of their power to contribute, even to this laudable object, according to their wishes. With returning Prosperity, the Committee cherish the pleasing hope, that the Public will testify its approbation of the Bible Society, by still more liberal contributions.

There has been collected since the beginning of March 1818, the sum of £468 15 11, of which £413 1 4 have been remitted to the Parent Society ; £26 16 have been paid by the Committee for printing, and a balance of £28 18 7 remains this day in the Treasurer's hands. The sums collected by the Society, from its commencement, amount altogether to £2 528 13 2*½*. Voluntary contributions to such an amount, in a Colony neither very populous nor very opulent, are sufficiently expressive of the sincere desire entertained by the public for the prosperity of this most respectable Society, and the accomplishment of its benevolent designs.

Since last March, your Committee have received from the Parent Society, 420 Bibles and 400 Testaments. These with the number on hand, at the time of the last Annual Meeting, form a total of 472 Bibles and 433 New Testaments. Of this number there have been distributed to various Societies and Individuals, 277 Bibles and 263 New Testaments ; and there now remain in the hands of Mr. Black, the Depositary, 195 Bibles and 170 New Testaments, nearly all in the Irish and Gaelic tongues.

The Committee cannot omit this opportunity of recommending to the friends of the Bible Society, perseverance in the good cause they have embraced. A connexion with such a Society cannot but be honorable.

APPENDEX.

REPORT OF THE CUMBERLAND (BRANCH) SOCIETY,
HELD ON THE FIRST WEDNESDAY OF JANUARY
LAST.

SINCE the last Annual Meeting, several of the friends and supporters of the Cumberland Bible Society, have contributed in aid of its funds ; but there is evidently a want of zeal in this good cause.

The sums collected during the past year, including the balance of last year's account, amount to 39*l.* 2*s.* 4*d.* : of this sum 38*l.* have been remitted to the Secretary of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, the Revd. Mr. ROBSON ; leaving a balance of 1*l.* 2*s.* 4*d.* in the hands of your Secretary.

There remain in the hands of the Society's Depository, three Bibles and five New-Testaments.

A number of copies of the Reports of the Nova-Scotia Bible Society, have been received, part of which are distributed, and a number are now ready for distribution. One cannot help being astonished at the great spread of the Word of God amongst people almost of every religion, language and clime, under Heaven.
