LAWS AND REGULATIONS OF THE NOVA-SCOTIA BIBLE SOCIETY.

1. This Society shall be called The Bible Society of Nova-Scotia and its Dependencies: the object of which shall be the same as that of the British and Foreign Bible Society, viz: To encourage the circulation of the Holy Scriptures, without note or comment, and to furnish copies of the Scriptures gratis to the indigent, and at reduced prices to those requiring them.

II. The business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Secre-

tary and Committee.

III. In order to give effect to the design of this Institution, benefactions and subscriptions shall be solicited, and books opened for receiving the names of benefactors and subscribers.

IV. Every person contributing annually One Pound, or at one time a donation of Ten Pounds, shall

be considered a Member of this Society.

V. A general meeting of the Members of this Society shall be held every year, in the first week of March, before which shall be laid the accounts and proceedings of the preceding year.

VI... The whole of the subscriptions and donations, after deducting incidental expences, shall be remitted annually, in aid of the funds of the British and Fo-

reign Bible Society.

VII. Every Member of this Society shall be entitled to purchase, under the direction of the Committee, Bibles and Testaments, at the reduced prices of the Society, which are as low as possible.

VIII. The Committee shall be authorised to meet, for the purpose of conducting the business of the So-

people, and put it out of their power to contribute, even to this laudable object, according to their wishes. With returning Prosperity, the Committee cherish the pleasing hope, that the Public will testify its approbation of the Bible Society, by still more liberal contri-

butious.

There has been collected since the beginning of March 1818, the sum of L468 15 11, of which L413 1 4 have been remitted to the Parent Society; L26 16 have been paid by the Committee for printing, and a balance of L28 18 7 remains this day in the Treasurer's hands. The sums collected by the Society, from its commencement, amount altogether to L2 528 13 2½. Voluntary contributions to such an amount, in a Colony neither very populous nor very opulent, are sufficiently expressive of the sincere desire entertained by the public for the prosperity of this most respectable Society, and the accomplishment of its benevolent designs.

Since last March, your Committee have received from the Parent Society, 420 Bibles and 400 Testaments. These with the number on hand, at the time of the last Annual Meeting, form a total of 472 Bibles and 433 New Testaments. Of this number there have been distributed to various Societies and Individuals, 277 Bibles and 263 New Testaments; and there now remain in the hands of Mr. Black, the Depositary, 195 Bibles and 170 New Testaments, nearly all in the Irish

The Committee cannot omit this opportunity of recommending to the friends of the Bible Society, perseverance in the good cause they have embraced. A -connexion with such a Society cannot but be honorable. to any man.
