THE OPIUM QUESTION IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS.

BY TELEGRAM TO THE GAZETTE.

LONDON, April 11.—The Times referring to last night's vote on the opium question in the House of Commons think the government will do well to find opportunity to settle the question whether Parliament is in earnest on the opium question or has merely been subjected to a "spasm of cheap puritanism."

The Standard says the suppression of Indian opium traffic simply means an additional growth of Chinese opium and holds that the traffic is no more demoralizing than England's taking of alcohol and narcotics.

Dead on Navy Island.

Jacob Christopher, 77 years of age, a resident of King Street, Westside, was found dead by his grandson, Chas. Cr. Christopher, shortly after noon today in a fishing camp on Navy Island.

The old man had been out about eleven o'clock, and proceeded to Navy Island where his sons and several others were engaged in fishing. He was apparently in good health. At noon, he ascended to the upper portion of the island, but was not seen again, and shortly after he was discovered lying dead on the floor. The body was taken to his home, where Dr. White pronounced his death to be due to heart failure.

Jacob Christopher has lived on the island for many years where he was engaged during his life in the occupation of fishing. He leaves six children, six sons and three daughters.

Must Not be Forgotten.

Alex. Lynch was arrested this morning by Sergeants Haffley and Watson at the instance of John Gaffney and was held in the city gaol. Mr. Lynch was a handbookseller from Elliott's hotel, German street. The matter came up before the police magistrate, where it was explained by Lynch that he had purchased the articles in question from Gaffney, but had not paid for them. A settlement was had by his paying for the articles, which cost him \$20.

The authorities intend hereafter to rigidly enforce this law, and their action in this is so nothing more than justice to the merchants of St. John who pay taxes and support municipal institutions.

THE CENSUS.

How the Work is Proceeding in St. John.

As already announced in the Gazette the taking of Canada's third census was commenced in all parts of the Dominion on Monday last.

St. John was the first city where the census enumerators worked under chief census commissioners. Masters have made what is considered very fair progress with their work. Only two or three of them have ever been engaged in census work before and have any experience of the many trials and difficulties to be met with in it.

John Mullin, one of the enumerators for Wellington ward, retired in consequence of illness, and L. C. Anselmy has been appointed to fill his place.

All the rest of the eighteen who started out on Monday are still asking questions as persistently as ever, and are developing the necessary tact to obtain the required information without much trouble.

About the biggest difficulty in their way is the fact that so many people are prejudiced against them and refuse to answer questions because of the erroneous belief that the information is to be used for the purposes of assessing them for taxes.

The enumerators in the city get three cents for every name they take, and three cents for each death recorded as occurring within the year, ending April 30, 1891. They also get 20 cents for every industrial establishment that they enumerate in their district.

In the country districts the enumerators are paid at the same rate as those in the cities with an extra fee of 15 cents for every farm that they have entered on their schedules.

The amount of work done by the enumerators varies a great deal as it depends largely on their industry and upon the sort of a district they are working in. Some take only 60 or 70 names a day and others run as high as 100 or 120. Taken all together Mr. Masters think the enumerators have done pretty well for the first week, as nearly 6000 names have been entered upon the schedules for this city.

Mr. Masters think it will take six or seven weeks to complete the enumeration in St. John, and that it will be about two months before the census returns of the entire Dominion are made up.
