HOW IT IS CELEBRATED IN BOSTON, MASS.

Business of All kinds suspended. Ten Thousand in the Parade. The Central American Situation.

BY TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. Labor Day in Boston.

Boston, Sept. 1.—Today is Labor Day, and the labor organizations in and around Boston are celebrating in the same general manner as in previous years. The day is a legal holiday and all business including the edition of the evening paper is suspended. In the city the parade was the largest that has ever been seen on similar occasions, the divided Councils that prevailed in former years having united the forces in a grand procession in which 100,000 men participated.

There will be an interesting rivalry of processions on the Charles river under the management of the New England Labor Union and the latter part of the day will be devoted to picnic excursions to various resorts and other methods of pleasure seeking.

Central American Situation. New York, Sept. 1.—A Herald special from the city of San Salvador says: There are still grave doubts here as to the final treaty between Guatemala and Salvador being signed. President Estia has been approached by a number of the most influential residents of this city, who say they are not satisfied with proposed treaty and that Guatemala should pay for the pecuniary loss occasioned by Salvador by the war. Estia has promised to give the matter his earnest consideration.

That Frozen Harbor. The following is an extract from the St. John Telegraph of some years ago in regard to the freezing up of Halifax harbor:

We regret to learn by advice from Halifax that the harbor was frozen over on Sunday and Monday. The English mail steamer, which arrived here Sunday, was four hours in reaching the wharf, and broke her hawser in the attempt. Early yesterday morning a mail could be seen skating across from Dartmouth. Seven square rigged vessels were frozen in the harbor, and one and another will be frozen every where. The ferry had the greatest difficulty in crossing the harbor, occupying four hours in getting one and another mile.
