The Annual Meeting of the Society.

THE FORTIETH ANNUAL MEETING of the MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in Brockville, on Monday, October 30th, 1865. The Hon. JAMES FERRIER, Member of the Legislative Council, in the Chair. The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer, and the Report having been read by the GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT of MISSIONS, the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:—

## Report.

---

ANOTHER yearly review of the operations of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada shows, that God's Word of light and love has been regularly preached, and the Sacraments administered, by a larger number of Pastors, and on a larger number of Missions; that the spiritual and social condition of the population is advanced; and that an important concomitant of such success last year, as during the seventy-four years of Methodist labour in Canada, was Providential direction to "regions beyond;" and while the "measure" of Methodism has reached other necessitous settlements and tribes, the Missionaries have often as pioneers had the joy and honour of addressing congregations, and for the first time, in the words of the Apostle of the Gentiles: "We are come as far as to you also in preaching the Gospel of Christ."

In presenting the Fortieth Annual Report of the Society, the Committee would with devoutness and promptitude ascribe all the praise to God, for the blessings of his truth, his grace, his presence, his leadings, and his power, and for the economy and agency the Society approves and sustains in its far-ranging field of christian effort. Past labourers met obstacles, opposition, and contumely. These prevented not their progress. But they were not saved by their own arm; for they ever acknowledged this fact to their Divine Master,—It was by "thy right hand, and thine arm, and the light of thy countenance."

The generous good-will of the Society's numerous adult and juvenile Subscribers, and the fidelity and services of the Ministers, Officers, and Collectors, of all the Branch Societies, are very gratifying, and to them are due the most cordial acknowledgments. They build a spiritual house to glorify the Redeemer of all men, and for them these words have adaptation:—"Now, therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious name . . . that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort: for all things come of thee, and of thine own have we given thee."

The Committee wish ever to exhibit a christian catholicity. One of the cardinal requirements of the Society expressed to its Agents is, Carry the Word of the Lord to the needy, without respect to profession, tongue, or colour; and the use of some ten different languages by its Agents enable them to make the catholicity practical; so that destitute adherents of all Churches in remote and rugged localities have the gratuitous services of the Society, and thousands regularly, not of the Methodist community, are benefited and grateful. Persons of oblique vision do not always perceive the unspeakable advantage of this settled Methodist procedure; but the yearly subscriptions of members of other Churches, appearing in the Society's Report, bespeak a nobler gratitude and brotherhood.

Whilst the Agents go forth with the Inspired Volume, the Committee are increasingly concerned that their orthodoxy should continue unimpeachable, and that they, with Agents of different evangelical Churches, should bear an experimental testimony to the saving energy of Revealed verities, and enforce a scriptural discipline, in a day of guilty free-thinking, and reckless latitudinarian zeal. The Word has come "in power," and many souls have been transformed "by the renewing of the Holy Ghost," and added to the Lord's people. It is very satisfactory, that on the Missions as on the Circuits there is a growing activity for the welfare of youth, and we gladly concur in the admirable report of Wesleyan Sabbath Schools presented to the last Conference, expressing pleasure, "that from every part of our widely extended work, are received cheering accounts of the increasing number, and greater efficiency of our Sabbath Schools."

There cannot be attention to the past progress of Methodist Missions in the Canadas without gratitude to God, and a fresh prompting to duty. For many years the Missions in Lower Canada were under the able direction, and supported by the funds, of the Wesleyan Missionary Society of Great Britain. They have been a savour of good in a peculiar population, and have yearly extended their influence; and to-day their number is large, and their utility more and more manifest. Of the work in Upper Canada, the testimony of the late Dr. Bangs—the first historian of Methodism on the American Continent—will be welcome. Having stated the year of commencement, 1791, he remarks, "From this time the work of God went on gradually in Canada, until it eventuated in one of the most glorious revivals we have on record in these modern days."

In many parts of the country untoward speculations, unsatisfactory commerce, and deficient harvests for several years, have damaged local Church, and kept down, Connexional and Missionary finances, and these, and the deplored sanguinary circumstances of a respected neighbouring nation, have, by the disconcerting frequency of removals from the Missions, seriously interfered with our statistics. These evils continuing so long, unusual demands have been made on the Society's funds. The vital and recuperative principles of the societies, however, have not been dormant, though much depressed; and it will give the subscribers pleasure to be informed, that while other religiously-destitute portions of Canada have been this year added to the Missions, several Missions have become Circuits, and explicitly acknowledge their obligations to the Society, and promise to sustain a fund which has long sustained them: a return which justice and love make proper.

Notwithstanding these vicissitudes, and occasional temporal reverses of the people, the Society's work is perpetuated. Still, it is affecting to know that faithful and esteemed men, and their self-denying wives, who have for years done the work well, decline in health, and from time to time retire from the Missions into the solitude and privations of an unwelcome superannuation. This year a valued labourer has reluctantly retired, who received his first appointment to the Indian work on hallowed and honoured Grape Island from the revered William Case. Of those who had thus ceased from their "loved employ," four have this year joyously departed to the world of rest and reward, the Revs. B. Hitchcock, J. Neelands, W. Dignam, and Robert Thompson. But our grief is intensified by the loss of another.

The Committee would with submission to the will of God bow in His severer dispensations, and now record with deepest regret the death of the Rev. W. L. THORNTON, M. A., appointed by the English Conference President of the Canada Conference, and as such was the Chairman of the Missionary Committee. Directed by his brethren, and favoured with the wisdom and guardianship of his Divine Master, he in about four months represented the British Conference at the American General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and what no other Wesleyan Minister ever did, presided in three Conferences—the Canada, the Eastern British American, and after a travel of ten or more thousand miles, then very ably discharged the onerous duties of the Home Presidency. High expectation of his coming to us was everywhere; and he came and won the respect and love of the Canadian Connexion;

and the universal testimony of our ministers and people is, that God's servant was distinguished for christian sanctity; for a zeal which was love; for an intellect which, in all positions, was mature; for a pulpit power which was evangelical, saving; for a Methodism which Wesley would have commended; for an official rule which was affectionate, impartial, yet commanding. We esteemed him for his eminent personal excellencies. We clave to him gratefully as the sent of the Parent Conference of Methodism. The mutual farewells heard at parting were heartfelt; and his sudden removal while joyously recounting the "mercies" of the Saviour, though causing in Canada a Connexional sorrow, adds to our assurance, that by the goodness of God, his radiant peace forever is, with the "wise" who have turned "many to righteousness."

The Committee now invite attention to some brief general statements relating to the several chief departments of the Society's operations, introductory to the official reports of the Missionaries, which were read and approved at the May District Meetings.

The Canada INDIAN Missions of the Society are an abiding, tangible proof of the early, and continuous commiseration and zeal of the friends of Methodism for the despised Red Tribes of the forest; and notwithstanding many draw-backs, are to-day among the most touching manifestations of Gospel grace in the country; and have from their origin supplied many white settlers with the only means available. The temperalities of the Aborigines on most Missions yet interfere with a steady residence in their villages, and the children's attendance at Schools the Society provides for them; but the reports of the Missionaries indicate progress religious and temporal. It is a cause of deep regret that a disreputable Church proselytism has this year made stealthy inroads on the peace and piety of some of these Missions, as if the Society's providential vocation were denied and begrudged. There is evidence, that could so simple a race be without such unapostolic disturbance, and the snares of selfish traders, and be left under the influence of Scriptural teachings, they as a race would permanently increase in numbers, piety, knowledge, and social happiness. To deny this, is to libel Christianity and its Missions.

The HUDSON'S BAY work is growingly important, and presents the most urgent claims on the pure, patient, and unselfish charity of the supporters of the Society. And after all that has been done and expended, on the Missions there, each forms but a limited nucleus in a Territory stretching from the Esquimaux coast opposite Greenland, to the Rocky

Mountains, by our fellow-missionaries. Our last advices were from the Cree and the Victoria on the coast. The important tribes mentioned in the Company general report has developed at Oxford House, a trustworthy and industrious man into the Cree. Mountains, bounded on the north by Artic ice fields, where thousands of our fellow-men exist without a knowledge of Christ. The Missions at last advices were generally in a satisfactory state. There is a large increase of Cree and of Stone Indians in the membership. The new Mission of Victoria on the Plains is very successful, and attempts to evangelize distant tribes more and more hopeful. The gentlemen of the Honourable Company generously facilitate our movements. A son of one of our Missionaries has devoted himself to the welfare of the Indians. The large Mission at Oxford House has for some time been in charge of an intelligent and trustworthy Native Agent. Some translations of Hymns and Catechisms into the Cree, in the syllabic character, which our Missionaries made, have just been printed in England under the direction of the Parent Missionary Committee, and the careful attentions of the Rev. Thomas Woolsey. There is an increase of religious enquiry among the Pagans, and of congregations, classes, leaders, scholars, and humble Native propagators of the truth; and were the funds adequate, as many more Missionaries might at once be sent from Canada, who would find fields, now for years, white unto harvest.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the liberal services of the esteemed Parent Committee; valuable grants of Scriptures from the British and Foreign Bible Society; very useful Presents from the Wesleyan Ladies' Missionary Committee; packages of Medicine from a generous Medical Society; and donations from other friends in England, all for our Indian Missions in Hudson's Bay and in Canada.

Whilst the Chairman and his brethren of the Bay District are encouraged, the Chairman and his brethren of the PACIFIC District can look upon a scriptural Christianity first established there by them as pioneers, and now can thank God when they count their churches, parsonages, congregations, converts, classes, schools, leaders, local preachers, teachers, stewards, trustees, and adherents. It required a benevolent faith to commence these Missions when other demands on the Society were so pressing; and the outlay has been heavy and incessant; but there is, as from other white Missions, a gradual monetary return, and it is hoped, that before long the present Missions will be self-supporting. New Missions, and a desirable progress in the Indian department there, will for a time interfere with the principle of independence of the Society's funds, until the maturer work is so prospered as to be able to support the new Domestic and Indian Missions there, as it does in Canada. The whites still make request for additional Missionaries, and gratifying it would be if



the Society had the means to send them, and a Peter Jones, a Magee, or a Chief Sawyer to the Indians of the Pacific.

The DOMESTIC Missions are in every part of the United Province, and it is a genuine patriotic benevolence which supports them, while the hallowed influence from them which permeates so wide an area, increasingly develops itself in the family, and the commercial, educational, ecclesiastical, municipal, and legislative institutions of Canada. General religious, and Wesleyan literature is disseminated. The frequent erection of churches, and minister's residences this year is remarkable: on one Mission three churches dedicated—the "Wesley," the "Stinson," and the "Thornton." The addition of new converts has been very general; whilst on many Missions reduction of the membership by delinquency and a change of residence, or country, has been too frequent. On some Missions, as at Walter's Falls, much manual labour has been imposed upon the preacher. On others travel and tarrying places are very little more inviting than they were fifty years ago, where the grader of roads has not penetrated: but welcomes there are warm. The first raised precious wheat for the family is carried on the settler's shoulders, or on ox, to the distant mill. On some Missions, supplementary to the prescribed journeys, successful tours of exploration are undertaken to new settlers, who, rumour says, are miles away in dreariness without the Gospel; and the embryos of new Missions compensate the tired explorers. It is gratifying, that among the Missionaries who thus endure hardship for Christ's sake, and boast not in things "made ready" to their hands, are several with well-earned degrees from the University of Victoria College. Patience has triumphed in the extension of the work, as at Templeton and Portland. And as will be seen on others, the Chairman's report of Owen's Sound supplies a very encouraging instance of progression in a Missionary District. The labourers weary not; for He whose presence they desire, is heard saying—saying to them, "Blessed are ye that sow beside all waters."

The FRENCH Missions, even with much too limited an Agency, maintain their claims on the solicitude of the Society, and on the liberality of their indefatigable patrons in Eastern Canada and elsewhere, by their dissemination of Biblical and Protestant truths, and the spiritual conversion of some associates of a long-deluded people, from a system which ignores the Bible, and defames what is evangelical; and though it is easier to subdue a Fijian to Christ than a dupe of any false religion, and allure him to Christ's Church, such good, already done by the French Missionaries, and other respected agencies, stimulates us to a more energetic

practical protest against the abominations of Antichrist, emboldened by the assurances of explicit revelation and prophecy: "Strong is the Lord God who judgeth her."

The brief past of our GERMAN Missions places before us good results, and the present promises better,—if new churches, congregations, conversions, discipline, and schools, be signs of success; and it may be expected that ere long German youths, regenerated themselves, and taught and called of God, will be prepared to go forth as evangelists to their kindred. This work on the Ottawa, among a people widely scattered, and disheartened by adverse providences, is affectingly interesting; and is made more so by the friendly reception our laborious Missionary meets with at their woodland homes. With the Germans born in Canada there is the common unbelief and sinfulness, and some others coming from their fatherland bring a rationalism, if not infidelity, subversive of faith and virtue. They have need of more instructors whose prayer to the Divine Teacher shall be, "Sanctify them through Thy truth."

These authentic statements and statistics impress on the mind two facts,—first, that by the favour of Providence the Society's disinterested enterprise has reached an ample extent; and second, that the yearly demands for more Missionaries and Funds of such an enterprise are large and ever increasing.

The just and forcible inference is, that for the maintenance of the existing Missions, without the Society's present excess of expenditure over income, there should be no diminution but increase in the subscriptions and donations; and then, for the required incessant increase of the Missions, there is indispensable an incessant increase of generous annual contributions. Success from God has thus made it the duty of the Society and its hearty supporters to advance in the name of the Lord. Eastern and Western Canada, Hudson's Bay, and the British Pacific, reiterate and multiply their appeals to the Society.

There is but one impetus sufficient for the accomplishment of this object,—the impetus of a faith which the Holy Spirit imparts—a simple, experimental faith in the Redeemer of all mankind—the faith that “works by love.” This irradiates the mind, abolishes selfishness, gives flow to sympathy, fervour to prayer, amplitude to purpose, and usefulness to active zeal,—and places the intellect, the powers, the wealth, the all of a man at God's disposal. And He who has promised a latter-day glory to the universal Church will not disappoint that faith.

Such a faith it was that invested with magnificence St. Paul's circuits of charity for the Gentiles; that gave to Luther's daring acts truth's sublimity; to Wesley's career apostolicity, expansion, and blessing; to the superb eloquence of Chalmers a resistless evangelical charm and utility; and to Christendom unprecedented Missionary munificence and triumphs. Such a faith inspired the founders of this Missionary Society; and by it, in the nineteenth century, and in every land, the admired Agents of all scriptural Missionary Churches and Associations are creating beauteous and imperishable Gospel memorials, to the glory of HIM who is “for *salvation* unto the ends of the earth.”

Unto Him who loveth the world, and hath purchased the Church with his own blood, be ascribed forever, the wisdom and the grace, the might and the dominion!

## INDIAN MISSIONS.

---

**NEW CREDIT.**—There is here much more than a scanty residue of the former piety of the people, and the report of the Missionary, the Rev. Thomas Lawson, will give pleasure,—certainly what he says of the educational help afforded by New England and the Friends. The modest study of our first Native translator, the devoted Peter Jones, is not there as at the old Credit Mission, but his Scriptures in Ojibway are better known and prized, and his translation of hymns still diffuses light and joy in the Native's house of prayer.

"This band has, during the year, put up a new fence around their beautiful Church, and also an excellent driving-shed. Their houses are kept comparatively clean, and I think they are a little more industrious. The congregations are generally good, and the Prayer and Class Meetings pretty well sustained. I have considerably improved the Mission property. Our Day School has been taught by an excellent teacher. The attendance has not been large on account of the Indians putting up another School House on the outside of the Reserve, which has drawn away, for convenience sake, the children residing in the section; but those who have attended regularly have made good improvement.

"We have a prosperous Society among the Delawares, where we have public service every Sabbath. The congregation is good. This people, like the old Indians of the New Credit, are pious, and attached to the Wesleyan Church. A Day School is sustained by a New England Society. The prosperity of the Society among this people is, to a considerable extent, the result of the devotion and constancy of Bro. Wm. Minture, an Indian Local Preacher and Class-Leader.

"I preach to the Onondagas every third Sabbath, where the congregation is tolerably good, and a thriving class. Every third Sabbath I have an appointment among the Mohawks. This people do not evince the abiding prosperity desirable. The Society of Friends have generously opened a Day School among them, which I hope will much aid us in the work of Christian civilization. A large number, comparatively, of the young have died this year, mostly young men, one of whom was the oldest son of our respected chief. We visited them, and most of them professed to enjoy a good hope through Jesus Christ."

**GRAND RIVER.**—The first answers to Methodist prayers for Indian conversion were vouchsafed here, and now, after forty years of labour and expenditure, the Rev. Peter German's report of stability and progress among a people whose former history was daring and sanguinary, is gratifying, and deepens the conviction, that the grace which has subdued the haughtiness of the Mohawk, can bow to Christ any pagan of the American wilds.

"We have had another good year on the Mission. We have continued all our Sabbath and week evening services, and our Sabbath and Day Schools, &c. A number of Indians have united with us in Church fellowship, and we enjoy in this society the blessing of peace. Our Indians are improving in their temporal condition. The females are industrious.

"Forty-five whites have united with the Wesleyan Church at the Salt-springs during the year. A great part of these are our Sabbath School scholars—young persons of much promise.

"We are in advance of last year in our Missionary money, and also in our Connexional Funds. We are much encouraged with reference to our work on this field of labour. The friends of Missions will meet thousands of the Native Tribes of Canada in heaven."

**MUNCEY.**—The deplored death of the Rev. James Musgrove, and the discontinuance of the Industrial Institution, have interfered with the uniformity of our operations, and publication of the report. The Rev. Francis Berry's statements renew hope, and show that the unbrotherly meddlesomeness of others is discreditable only to themselves. The glory of this important old Mission, though dim, is not departed.

"The year closes with the Divine blessing, without serious reverses, although the prospects at the beginning were gloomy. Proselytism has plied its greatest energies, and failed to influence any; and some who were led away by false representations last year are returning to our fold. We trust to the 'Good Shepherd.

"The unsettled state of the Mount Elgin Institution property has proved detrimental to our interests, and has been used by designing men to our injury. The resuscitation of this Institution is much to be desired, and if reorganized on a proper basis, would do much to benefit this and other bands of Indians.

"The great bane of the Indians here is indolence. Other sins obtain as a consequence. Intemperance is much checked by the temperance organizations established amongst the people. We hope and pray for better and more prosperous times."

**SNAKE ISLAND.**—With some increase of members, this Lake Simcoe Island of Natives is benefited by the stated ordinances and school, and the Rev. A. Drennan thus writes:—

"The Indians of Snake Island have been allowed to enjoy their means of grace unmolested by the agents of other bodies. There is one difficulty connected with the interests of their young, that is, their being settled on two Islands. If there could be any means employed to induce them to locate permanently on the Georgiana Island, it would be an advantage to them in every respect."

**RAMA.**—No report of this Mission having been sent last year, the destruction of the Indian Church and several houses by hurricane was otherwise given to the public. The Rev. R. Brooking and people deplore the effect of this calamity, the loss of crops, and the rudeness of lumberers near them. Still, the Indians are praiseworthy repairing the damage done as far as able, and the Mission maintains its importance and usefulness.

"Notwithstanding our difficulties, we are once more beginning to look up. Our Leaders and other members are evidently improving, and a number of very happy deaths have had a very beneficial effect. Within the last few months, some who were very deeply sunk in the vice of drunkenness, have been reclaimed, and testify even by their outward appearance, how great has been the change.

"We have to report a small decrease in membership, occasioned by deaths

and removals; but this will be more than counterbalanced by those who have signified their intention of joining us; but whom I have not returned this year. We have also organized a Temperance Society, which is working well.

"Our people are doing a great deal of public work, and the appearance of the Reserve is evidently improving. The Indians have a much greater breadth of land under cultivation than heretofore; indeed, they are evidently yielding to the conviction that farming must be resorted to, as hunting is every year becoming more precarious.

"With regard to our School operations, our success is greatly impeded by the irregularity of attendance on the part of the children, occasioned by their frequent absence from home, &c. I think, however, that the parents are beginning to see the evil of this, and we may hope for an improvement in this matter also; especially as they have erected a new School-house during the year.

"With regard to our little cause in Mara, we can only say that it remains much as last reported, and while we have no church of our own, we cannot expect much advance."

**SCHOOGOG.**—This is one of several bodies of worthy Indians too small for a resident Missionary, yet regularly supplied with the means of grace by Missionaries contiguous to them at the Society's expense, and on the principle of the Methodist discipline—Go to them who need you most. The Rev. C. Silvester writes thus touchingly,—

The Missionaries have, during the year, witnessed an improvement in the attendance on the means of grace. There are only about thirty-four adults and children composing this band of Indians, yet thirty of these have generally been at the Preaching of the Word. Their conduct has been devout, and the Missionaries believe that the constancy and regularity of the means have been blessed. For the first time after many years, we held, in the winter, a Missionary Meeting. To shew the love of these few poor Indians for the Missionary cause, every man, woman and child, even the smallest in its mother's arms gave something! Hence the noble sum of \$16 60 was realized. One, a youth has been received into membership. One sister has died. One couple have been married, and three children baptised.

**ALNWICK.**—No report received this year or last.

**RICE LAKE.**—This old name is prized for its connection with the evangelization of the Western Canada Indians forty years ago, and the Rev. T. Williams' facts are acceptable after no report last year.

"We look back through the year now closing, with devout gratitude to the Almighty Giver of all our mercies. In the blessing of health we have been greatly favoured, both the Missionary and people; that of the former being much improved; while there has been but one death among the people, and that one an aged person, dying in the Lord.

"Our congregations have been good during the whole year; that of the Sabbath morning being composed of a good proportion of white people living round us and among us; while the afternoon service, designed specially for the Indians, and consisting of free and familiar explications of Scripture, (and interpreted without cost to the Society) is equally well attended, and seems to be doing good.

"The Class Leaders report an increase in the attendance at their Class Meetings, with some increase in numbers. It is also thought that an improvement is discernable in the moral character and sobriety of the whole people. The Day and Sabbath Schools have had the usual attendance. I do not think that we can report improvement.

"If some means could be devised to furnish our Indian Sunday Schools with Libraries, the interest in these schools by the elder youth would be greatly increased, and no doubt much good done, as they have very little reading matter, upon which to bring into practice their ability to read. If our brethren of our city and town schools would think of us when they are disposing of their old and cast-off books, and donate us some, they would lay us under lasting obligations."

**MUD LAKE.**—Here our Missionaries of Lakefield have stated services, and with salutary effect on a grateful Indian people. The Rev. E. S. Koyle says,—

"During a few evening Meetings held with the Indians at Mud Lake there were a few conversions, and a pleasing manifestation of confidence in the person endeavouring to instruct them, also an anxious desire to learn."

**MORAVIAN INDIANS.**—The Rev. C. Vandusen, of the Wardsville Mission, has given them regular pastoral attention, and reports favourably.

"In the Indian part of our work we have no Pagans in the band. Nearly all who do not meet in class with us attend the Moravian Church. Our charge, therefore, remains without any material change from what it was last year, except that in addition to the ordinary means of grace attended to by the Indians, a Temperance Society has been organized in their midst, which exerts a restraining influence among the Indians generally."

**St. CLAIR.**—A Mission reporting 200 members, where the Rev. Thos. Hurlburt, for a protracted term, has eminently promoted the spiritual and temporal happiness of a noble Aboriginal people;—not without untiring effort, and we regret to say, ignoble and jealous interference from others. This year he sends a good report written by Mr. Blaker, his experienced Native assistant.

"I am happy to say that the opposition and division which have been met with on this Mission in years past, and still existed at the commencement of this year, have almost disappeared. Those of other denominations who have not formally united with us as members, attend and unite with us in all our meetings. During the year we have had our trials. Our people have had to endure affliction and suffering from the failure of their crops, and have been subjected to proselyting influences to draw them away; yet with few exceptions they have maintained their integrity, and cleaved to God and his cause. We have had gracious manifestations of the Divine presence to comfort and cheer us in our devotional exercises.

"At Kettle Point, our work among the small band there has been regularly attended to during the year, with preaching services every two weeks. The Indians of Bear Creek stand fast, and highly appreciate the means of grace. So, upon the whole, we may say that the Mission is in a healthy state, and promises well for the future."

**SAUGEEN AND SOUTHAMPTON.**—The Rev. W. M. Cooley sends these rather sombre particulars:—

"I am sorry to say, there has not been that spiritual advancement upon this Mission during the past year that we have desired to see: some of the whites have removed, and a number of the Indians have died, yet our aggregate number is a little in advance of last year.



"We have taken up a new appointment among the whites, where we have a very attentive congregation, and there are signs of good being done.

"Our connexional funds have fallen short of former years, but not for want of a disposition to give, but an utter inability to do so, and at the same time carry forward the work of finishing the church at Southampton. This is purely Mission ground."

**CAPE CROCKER AND COLPOY'S BAY.**—Sedulous regard to the welfare of the Indians here has resulted well; the joyous departure of official brethren repays past labourers, as do the blessings of the Cape Sabbath School.

"It is gratifying to know that our labour on this Mission has been owned of God. We have visited and held religious services in five different places. When the Indians were at home our congregations were large, sometimes more than could crowd into our church. Our Quarterly Meetings and special efforts were seasons of refreshing from the presence of the Lord. A few souls were brought to the knowledge of the truth and added unto the church. Two of our assistant Class-Leaders died during the year; they were good men, of exemplary piety; they left satisfactory evidence that they were gone to their great reward.

"Our Day School has been kept up a short time, about twenty children attending. We have had an interesting Sabbath School, when heads of families with their children would attend. Fifteen could read in the New Testament, and readily answer the questions put to them. We have a small increase of members. The Indians have given three times the amount to the Missionary Fund. We thank God and take courage."

**CHRISTIAN ISLANDS, BEAUSOLIEL ISLAND, AND FRENCH RIVER.**—This interesting Mission on the Huron waters continues healthful in charge of the Native Missionary, the Rev. Allen Salt, with the Day School conducted by Miss Adams, formerly of Hudson's Bay. His statements are never exaggerated, and we know his modesty has omitted the fact, that on the Mission pagans have been led to Christ by his simple and scriptural ministry.

"The usual means of grace have been kept up at Christian Island and the appointments at Beausoliel Island. It is encouraging to see the good attention paid by many of those "who sometimes were far off," to the reading and explanation of the Scriptures. There has been no case of drunkenness among our members. The Sabbath and Day Schools at Christian Island have been kept up regularly, with the exception of three weeks vacation in the latter, during the sugar-making season, on account of the absence of the children from their homes during the week. Average attendance at Day School, 15; average attendance at Sabbath School were 25.

"As Nashkodayong and French River the Indians were visited by your Missionary only twice during the season of navigation, consequently they have had no preaching or services of a Missionary since the Camp-meeting held last September at Parry Sound. I have heard that whenever the Leaders were at home the class and prayer meetings were kept. They depend altogether upon the Society for help, and their wish is a Teacher to reside with them. During the year four members have died; yet there is a small increase in the membership."

presence there is proof, that the Wesleyan Missionary Society has hope that its disinterestedness will be a blessing there in future, as in the past.

"This is a Mission of some years standing, and on which much labour and money have been expended; but deaths and removals have reduced it to a low state, and the few remaining are much scattered on either side of the St. Mary's River. There are some backsliders, and Romanism has its influence. We have a few faithful ones, and our meetings of late have been seasons of refreshing. The Church and Mission house have been much improved, grave yard fenced, &c.

"We have had some attendance at Sault Ste. Marie; but they all hold to other Churches, and there is not much prospect of forming a Methodist Society at present. Many of the new settlers have left during the past year, a few others are coming, and likely to come in: but it will not be much of a settlement for some years, unless minerals be discovered and worked. We feel our duty to be to labour on, humbly depending on the Divine blessing."

**BATCHEWANA BAY.**—As last year, no report received.

**MICHIPICOTON.**—No report.

**PIC AND NIPEGON.**—No report.

**WALPOLE ISLAND.**—This Canadian Isle lacks the lavish growth and beauty of an evangelized South Sea Island, but its souls are as precious, and its conversions as real; and it must be a pleasure to our Missionary, that after expending his years of vigour for the men of the wilderness, God aids him in still seeking the salvation and elevation of the Red man. These are the Rev. Thomas Hurlburt's facts:—

"This is one of the newest of our Missions, and was established for the benefit of the Potawatomes who are emigrants from the United States. Living in this low and unhealthy region, there is much sickness and mortality among them. During the past year we have had good congregations, and a steady increase in attendance and membership. This is a pure Missionary ground, as the people are very destitute, and are fast fading away. There is here a promising work of grace, seen in the lives and deaths of our members. Our new church is a great blessing to our cause, as during the past winter, for the first time, have we been able to worship God sheltered from the inclemency of the weather."

## HUDSON'S BAY MISSIONS.

---

**NORWAY HOUSE.**—This large and popular Mission, embracing the Fort and the Indian Station at Rossville, conscientiously reported by the Rev. Charles Stringfellow, is adding to its importance, and he is to be congratulated on his ability to conduct the services in Cree as in English; that the villagers are increasing by births and settlement of Indian strangers; and that many of his members know the power of religion, and advance in civilization;—preliminaries these, it is hoped, to his early selection of good men from his classes for Native agencies.

"I cannot report any accession of members during the year through what is termed a revival of the work of God. Such a thing would be cheering, and is a matter of daily prayer with us, but has not as yet been realized by us. But I am not called upon to report a decrease, for we have maintained our numbers as reported last year, notwithstanding three deaths and seven excluded. There have been thirty-one infant baptisms and six marriages celebrated during the past year.

"The three who have been called to pass away from earth, all died in faith, having received the promises, and their cases prove the success of Missions amongst the heathen.

"1. Charles Paul was a young lad of good moral character, one who loved the ordinances of religion, both public and private. In a long affliction, and in the midst of circumstances of great poverty, he manifested the grace of patience and spoke repeatedly of his confidence in Christ.

"2. Peggy Ayawasis, a widow, was brought up a heathen, and being skillful in the healing art by means of the herbs and plants of her country, was somewhat feared. She heard the Gospel, received it in the love thereof, and welcomed death.

"3. Peter Banks, our Interpreter and School Master, died of consumption. I visited him frequently in his sickness; when he assured me that he was happy in *death* as well as in *life*. I sorrow for the loss we have sustained, as he possessed many excellent qualities.

"Our Indian congregations have been uniformly good, and most attentive to the truth. I have myself conducted all the services during the year, (except about two weeks) both in Cree and English. The English services, both at the Fort and in the Church are not encouraging. At the Fort we have no suitable place for worship; and at the Church here, the distance from the Fort, bad weather in winter and summer, have the effect of thinning, and sometimes altogether stopping, our congregations. When circumstances permit, nearly all are present.

"Our Week-day School has been broken up for months, owing to the illness of our late School-Master. This has a bad effect. Had we a teacher from Canada, male or female, we could command an attendance of one hundred children. I have received a fresh supply of books, and must find some one to teach. Our Sabbath School has been regularly kept; it contains about eighty scholars.

"There is a great deal of building going on in the village. The population is rapidly increasing by births over deaths, and the settling of Indians from other places. Our new parsonage is receiving the roof, but it will be some time before it is completed.

"I am of opinion that the Mission is prospering in secular and spiritual matters. Many of the members are deeply pious and experienced in the things of God. There are still some who are connected with us of whom we stand in doubt. The year has been one of much and constant toil; the duties of this station are heavy and important. Beware! lightens labour. O for more of precious souls to be our crown of rejoicing in the day of the Lord Jesus!"

OXFORD HOUSE.—No report for the year received.

LAC-LA-PLUIE.—This post is willingly retained for its past usefulness and its facilities, and when means render it practicable, will be occupied by the Society.

EDMONTON HOUSE, ROCKY MOUNTAINS.—No report.

## MISSIONS ON THE PACIFIC.

The following reports were submitted by the Revs. Dr. Evans and A. Browning, of Victoria, E. White, of Nanaimo, and E. Robson, of New Westminster, to the Pacific District Meeting, and have been forwarded in time by the Chairman of the District; and they will be satisfactory so far as the present agency is concerned. The position gained in this new and remote enterprise is indicative of a Divine direction from its origin, and the claims of new settlers, gold-diggers, and Indians, make it a duty, without procrastination, to multiply the number of Gospel standard bearers.

VICTORIA.—“Consolidation of the work already in existence, rather than the extension of the area under cultivation, is the prominent characteristic of the year's labours.

“The God of Providence, by afflicting the Superintendent of the Mission, limited our labours to Victoria, just as we were entering upon a more enlarged sphere of ministerial usefulness. Our congregations have increased both in numbers and interest; the majority of attendants consisting of heads of families, with their respective connections. It has pleased the Spirit to own the Word spoken, to the quickening of believers, and the conversion of souls; among the latter being found members of our Sabbath School classes.

“The annual Missionary Meeting received unusual interest from the presence of His Excellency the Governor in the chair, who most cordially and happily entered into the business of the evening. The annual Tea Meeting in behalf of the Trust Fund was in every sense a marked success, and evidenced a growing interest in our institutions.

“Our Circuit receipts proper are much in excess of any former year, whilst the subscriptions to the Missionary Fund show that the proper appreciation of home work is followed by a desire to extend the blessings of redemption to the regions beyond. Our Sunday School, second to none in these colonies, is a most powerful auxiliary to our local Missionary Society, and the gratifying increase in our Missionary subscriptions may be traced to this source. The careful attention bestowed on our School, both by Superintendent and Teachers, is no less gratifying than the attendance and conduct of the scholars, and our hopes of the future of this school are founded on the promises of God. Thus we rejoice, cheerfully anticipating the extension of a work so mercifully owned by the Lord in its inception, progress, and conservation.”

NANAIMO.—“In closing our second year on this Mission we are happy in being able to report some progress.

“The regular congregations are considerably improved, and we have a small increase of members after filling vacancies occasioned by two deaths, and several removed and dropped.

“The Society has been greatly revived of late, and a few of those ‘with-out’ have been converted and enlisted on the ‘Lord's side.’

“There is an encouraging advance in our Circuit and Connexional receipts, and a corresponding reduction in our net deficiency. This will seem the more worthy of regard when we state, that over \$400 have been expended

in building a room for Sabbath School and Vestry, and in making other improvements on the Church and Parsonage; and during the same time the old debt is reduced to about half what it was a year ago. On the whole, our cause here is much stronger and more hopeful than at any previous period. As the Church of England located a Mission, and have a resident Missionary at Copax, we have discontinued our visits to that distant settlement for the present, and have visited the other end of the Mission, Salt Spring Island, &c, more frequently than formerly, where a new and promising appointment has recently been taken up.

"His Excellency, the Governor of the Colony, while on a visit to this district last fall called at the Indian Village and received an address from the Chiefs; Mr. Cosby acting as interpreter, and in his excellent reply, he said that they were the most cleanly and intelligent looking Natives he had seen in the Colony, and that it was quite clear to him that somebody had been taking an interest in their welfare."

"Our three Sabbath Schools (one among the Natives) have been well sustained. The School in town has seventy-three scholars and seventeen officers and teachers, and the average attendance is good. The Library is being largely augmented, and in other respects the School is progressing finely."

**NEW WESTMINSTER** :—"Though we are unable to report any increase in the aggregate number of members, or amount raised in aid of the regular funds of the Circuit; yet there is much in the state of our work upon this Mission calculated to call forth gratitude and inspire hope.

"God has been with us in the public services, and the more select means of grace. Several have united with us in Society; and some have we humbly hope been converted to God. The attendance upon the Prayer and Class Meetings has been very encouraging, and the Quarterly occasions have been seasons of deep religious influence and power.

"The removal from this vicinity of several of our most regular and esteemed members coupled with the fact that there has been very little addition to the Methodist population of the town during the year, has impressed us with the necessity of seeking the extension of our borders by labouring more earnestly than ever for the conversion of those amongst whom we dwell. For the accomplishment of this glorious end we are exerting ourselves, and looking to God for success.

"A Tract Distributing Association has been organized in connection with our Church, which supplies the inhabitants of the town, and the various steamers leaving the ports with religious tracts. A number of young men are engaged in this interesting work with good results.

"The Sabbath School has been sustained vigorously, and is as successful as could be expected, considering the very limited number of children available. Considerable repairs have been effected upon the interior of our Church, defrayed partly from the Trust Fund, but principally by special contributions for that purpose.

"Services have been held among road-makers and isolated settlers, which were gratefully appreciated. Though we have declined in our regular Circuit receipts, we have advanced in our contributions to the Superannuated Preachers and the Missionary Funds; to the latter our good Governor subscribing fifty dollars. Contributions are generally made to this Fund by members of other Churches than our own."

**FORT HOPE AND FORT YALE** :—"Yale has been visited as often as possible, but the closing of all inland navigation for the past four months has materially affected our visits and lessened our financial receipts from that quarter."

CARIBOO:—"The Mission to Cariboo extended over four months.

"The attendance on the sanctuary at William's Creek was steadily good, and the effusion of the Holy Ghost on its worshippers most generously wrought.

"This to our own members was an oasis in the desert; for with scarcely an exception they were sadly disappointed men. Severe affliction was in some cases added to extreme poverty; but there was joy amidst sorrow; for the preached Word, and the Sacrament, and the Class Meeting made even the valley of Bacca a well.

"In all the means of grace, many pious Presbyterians participated, finding Christ in each. On Lowhee Creek the miners received the Missionary with kindness, and attended his ministry; but the services were devoid of those influences so eminently resting on the worshippers in William's Creek Church. Preaching within the sound of the chink, chink of the gambling table may in the distance wear an air of religious romance; but the reality bears an aspect most repellant to true devotion. Three men were buried by the Missionary; two of whom were victims of accident; whilst, as Secretary of the hospital his influence for good was enlarged, and the field of practical benevolence extended.

"Hopes were entertained that this promising field would be continuously cultivated by Methodist agency, and a cabin with fittings, &c. awaited the coming man. Methodism sent him not; and in his absence, we gladly hailed the arrival of a Presbyterian Minister, whom may God bless and prosper."

INDIAN TRIBES.—Of the Natives within the range of the Nanaimo Mission the Rev. E. White thus writes, and not without hopefulness,—

"The work among the Nanaimo Indians has been earnestly prosecuted since our last report, and other tribes been visited occasionally. Our Teacher, Bro. Crosby, has discharged his duties with exemplary fidelity and zeal. He now speaks the native language readily, and preaches to them in their own tongue, and often interprets for me. This is quite an important point gained; for our Indian interpreters are not always reliable, and at best they are superficial.

"The Nanaimos have been more from home than usual of late, which has caused the School to be thinly attended during part of the year, and improvement of the children not so satisfactory as we could wish. There are 62 names on the School Register, but no one of these has attended regularly, and the average has been nearly the same as last year.

"Their wild and migratory habits, more than want of capacity, is the great hinderance to rapid progress. Attendance at Preaching and Sabbath School is pretty fair, and attention to the Word, while listened to, encouraging; but the Chiefs and old people, for the most part, still cling to their heathen superstitions and practices, which, with the baneful influence of the wicked white man is a formidable power for evil. We observe, however, some weakening of these opposing influences, and, in many respects, a change for the better."

## DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

Toronto District.—MONO.—Whilst thanking God for health, and expressing pain at moral delinquencies, the Rev. J. Goodwin says:—

"We are happy to state that there has been no reaction that was unfavorable to the interests of the Church; but while we have not had our hearts satisfied by seeing a large number of true conversions, still, by God's blessing,

we have often been cheered by the blessed sight of penitent sinners coming to Christ, and after providing for forty-two dropped, ten removals, two deaths, and one withdrawn, we are thankful to be able to return a small increase over last year.

"One new church has been solemnly dedicated to Almighty God, and a nice cause established in that locality. There is an increase of two flourishing Sabbath Schools which promise to prove a blessing to the neighbourhood in which they are started, and to the Church at large. Though the times have been pressing in monetary matters, yet all the funds but one are in advance of last year."

At ORANGEVILLE, with removals and suffering finances, the Rev. B. Sherlock has been cheered by "thirty" conversions and accessions to the Church. The Rev. W. Casson reports a diminished membership at LESLIEVILLE, and financial difficulty, yet some church obligations met, congregations sustained, Sabbath School efficient, and a few new members.

*Niagara District.*—DUNVILLE sends no report. From CAYUGA the Rev. J. L. Kerr says he has nothing of an unusual character to chronicle. His people are in harmony, souls have been saved and folded, and church debt extinguished. The Rev. R. E. Tupper finds it agreeable to write of POINT ABINO as having no loss of members, and an increase of hearers and gracious influences, among a people he praises for liberality this year. Noted by the Rev. R. Shaw, CAISTORVILLE has a rather checkered experience, and it is startling to hear of so large a reduction of members.

"During the past year we have been favoured with a gracious revival, which has resulted in the accession of several excellent members to our Church, yet the number returned shows a decrease of forty-three from last year. Feeling it our duty to return none but disciplinary members, for we have found inconsistent members to be the greatest hindrance to our spiritual and financial prosperity. Although the crops for the most part last year were a failure, yet our brethren have done nobly in paying the debt on the Parsonage and in supporting their Minister; and we are looking forward to the not far distant day when Caistorville Mission will be free from debt, and will take her place among the regular Circuits of our extensive work."

*Brantford District.*—LYNEDOCK, from the Rev. G. T. Richardson, furnishes several particulars.

"On this Mission we have eight Sabbath and one week night appointment. The work of God for four or five years past has been on the decline. We have taken a few new members into the Church this year, but have dropped several for non-attendance in class. In some places, however, there are signs of improvement; the congregations have steadily increased; two Sabbath Schools have been established, including a Bible Class for adults; a commodious and well arranged Parsonage is now building, which we hope to occupy soon after the close of the Conference. All the Connexional Funds are in advance of last year."

*London District.*—No report from STRATHROY. MOUNT BRIDGES is sparing of facts, but considering the worldly and "speculating tendency

of the masses of the population," the Rev. G. Kennedy says, "our congregations are very good;" and he has hope. Good at ARKONA elicits the gratitude of the Rev. J. Kennedy.

"On this Mission God has favoured us with his presence and power during the year that is past. Upwards of fifty have been led to seek an interest in the blood of Christ, and through faith in him have been made happy in a sense of his pardoning love. Others have been reclaimed, believers have been edified, and Wesleyan Methodism has taken a deeper and stronger hold. Our finances are not just so large as they were last year, but this is owing partly to the drought of last summer, (which here seemed to be greater than elsewhere) and partly to the erection of a parsonage, which cost about \$400, and which is paid, except about \$75. The building is not large, but is a good comfortable house. A lot, also, has been purchased in connection with the lot on which the church in the village stands."

From MCGILLIVRAY and NISSOURI no reports received.

*Chatham District.*—From the Rev. J. K. Williston, of NAPIER, comes little but what is cheerless—"a field of much sterility, congregations and classes small," finances "very low," in the Societies "great room for improvement." At WARDSVILLE the Rev. C. Vandusen can tell of souls saved, and after all reductions, an increase of members, and activity in church building and improvement. With the exception of meagre finances, the Rev. E. E. Stafford is encouraged at MOORETOWN by his congregations, conversions, additions, and the building of a church.

From the Rev. W. Irwin we, without difficulty, learn, that the right spirit is at WALLACEBURG.

"In reviewing his labours on this field during the past year, your Missionary has cause to be deeply grateful to God. Some souls have been saved, a growing interest in spiritual things manifests itself on the part of the people.

"Although this section of the country has been labouring under financial difficulty, owing to the American war, yet our people have increased in liberality. An amount of Church debt has been paid, the Missionary Fund has advanced from about \$75 to \$105, and your Missionary is also better paid the last year. Wesleyan Methodism has a great influence on the minds of the people. The majority of the population attends our places of worship."

Notwithstanding the "wealthiest" part of FLORENCE was made a new circuit, and crops were bad, the Rev. T. Robson states, that receipts equal former amounts, congregations are good, and the members are increased; and pastoral assiduities give him a growing satisfaction. At RIDGETOWN the Rev. W. Hawke has taken fifty on trial, though, as elsewhere this year, his increase is small; and the piety of nearly all the Societies is more exemplary. The Rev. R. Phelps in his retirement renders "good assistance," and the people are liberal in spirit and in conduct. Of ROMNEY the Rev. T. Culburt states, that his deserving people are discouraged by the unavoidable lessening of the Missionary grant, yet in their Missionary subscriptions there is some advance, and collections



are very fair. The Missionary resolves to labour on, though removals, deaths, and droppings have tried him. The Rev. J. Hough has needed wisdom from above in disputations, and consequent neglect of means, at WYOMING; but an outpouring of the Spirit has saved and tranquilized, as it always does, and his conclusion is, "The Mission, we believe, has greatly improved, as well as enlarged by the addition of two new appointments." This by "laborious effort and unceasing prayer." WARWICK, no report.

*Guelph District.*—Although the Rev. S. Bond's full report of ERIN is best for reference to the Missionary Committee, it contains facts which show, that he and his fellow-labourer have, in the midst of the toilsome, had tokens for good—ability to take the appointments regularly, respectful hearers, the power of the word, liberal efforts, and in a year of removals, and other drawbacks, additions to prevent decrease.

The Rev. N. Brown, of ROCKWOOD, is thankful for thirty received on trial; and yet the usual subtractions bring his aggregate something under last year's. He hopes for better days. BERLIN is thus reported by the Rev. W. Savage:—

"In presenting a report of the work of God on this interesting field of labour, I would humbly, yet thankfully, acknowledge the goodness of Almighty God towards his ministering servants. The work is very peculiar, on account of the interspersion of English and German settlements. Our appointments are few, but very scattered; about one-fourth of the membership reported last Conference have removed: three of our most distinguished members have been called to their reward, one (the mother of Wm. Ellis, Esq.) has been a member of the Wesleyan Church between 70 and 80 years; she died as she lived, an exemplary christian, beloved by all who knew her. Two new Societies have been formed or reorganized. Our increase, after deducting 53 for removals and deaths, is four. May the Great Head of the Church continue his blessing!"

At WELLESLEY fifty-nine new members, yet decrease, where services are good, the class-meeting "generally loved," efficient officers, and two new Sabbath Schools. The Rev. I. Crane hopes for better finances. At ELMA a Camp-meeting has been a blessing, another Sabbath School begun, and a church built, but according to the Rev. J. Sanderson's statement, removals and droppings have had a bad effect. The Rev. A. Milliken mentions with respect the co-operation of official brethren, favorable efforts for Connexional and Missionary funds, and the taking into the Church of 86 persons; but "removals and excisions" make the net increase small at WALLACE.

The proceedings on the new Mission of ARTHUR, detailed by the Rev. N. S. Burwash, will be read with interest: and they are not essentially

different from Methodist beginnings elsewhere. "Seed-time" has been granted; so will "harvest."

"Arthur Villare, containing a population of two hundred and fifty, is the head of the Mission, and the principal appointment. Our class here numbers twenty-two persons. We have preaching every Sabbath. The congregations are good. The services are held in the village school-room, for we have neither church nor parsonage. Our people begin to feel that an effort must be made to build a parsonage. The best time for securing building lots was allowed to pass away without improvement.

"At one of the appointments a church has been in the course of erection for a year and a half, and is still unfit for service, except during the summer months. Our people are too few, and too poor to complete it. At another place we have a small, but attentive congregation, a Sabbath school, and a class of nine persons, which is doing well. Another appointment, but two miles and a half from the village, with a very small congregation, will probably be discontinued as soon as a more needy place is found.

"The school-house is regularly filled at one of the new appointments, and a class of eleven persons has been formed. At the other, the school-house has been closed against religious service, by Romish influence; still, about thirty persons attentively listen to the word of God in a private dwelling. The erection of a Church is a subject of earnest conversation among the people.

"Tippling is carried on to an alarming extent among all classes. In the administration of discipline, it became necessary to cut off several persons on this account. A few others, thinking us too strict in this matter, have sought more liberty elsewhere. We have found it difficult to establish and maintain Prayer Meetings and Sabbath Schools. We are in advance in all the funds. There is, however, a large deficiency. We report an increase of eleven members. May the Divine Spirit descend upon this community."

*Goderich District.*—SEAFORTH is encouragingly reported by the Rev. Asahel Hurlburt.

"This, in its present form is a new Mission, composed of what was formerly part of Clinton Circuit, and more recently of Ainsleyville Mission. Seaforth is a growing Village, on the line of the Buffalo and Goderich R. R., containing, perhaps, six or seven hundred inhabitants. We have a new frame Church in the Village 36 x 40, with galleries. The first floor only is seated with good comfortable pews. Our congregation here numbers about two hundred. We have on the Mission a membership of ninety-one, much the same as last year. We cannot report any special prosperity. In the Village our prospects are rather encouraging than otherwise; a disposition to hear the word, and our congregations good. Our Societies are in peace. In the out appointments there is no great room for enlargement; though in the Village, with the Divine blessing we may hope for increase. There are two small churches on the Mission besides the one in Seaforth. The one has a congregation of about seventy-five or one hundred, and the other from twenty-five to forty."

The Rev. J. S. Howard's predecessor opened the way last year at MITCHELL, and he now with pleasure reports a new brick parsonage, two churches building, a liberal amount raised to meet deficiency in Missionary grant, and forty new members to console for an aggregate decrease of thirty. STRATFORD. Some decrease here, and a heavy church debt; yet improvement in church property, nearly all Connexional Funds advanced, and the Rev. H. Christopherson properly seeks relief from the

worst of the debt to hope for enlargement. **BAYFIELD.**—The Rev. W. R. Dyre makes this statement:—

"In presenting a statement of the work on this Mission, we would say that when we came to it last year, many were found in connexion with us who, by persistently neglecting to meet in Class, soon proved themselves unworthy a place in our Church, and whose names therefore we required to drop. The Circuit Register presents the following facts, viz.:—18 received on trial during the year, 19 removed, 3 withdrawn, 1 expelled, and 35 dropped—making a decrease of 38. But while we report a decrease in numbers, we have no cause for discouragement. Special attention to the quarterly visitation of the Classes has resulted in a marked improvement in the weekly attendance at Class Meeting.

"At one of our country appointments, a most spirited and successful commencement has been made in the erection of a frame Church, which is speedily approaching completion. The Word of God preached has, at almost every appointment, been attended by a steadily increasing congregations.

Protracted Meetings have been blessed in the conversion of a few, but we have been impressed more than ever with the necessity of making the stated means of grace our chief hope of success."

The Rev. T. Hadwin has just escaped decrease at **WAWANOSH**,—has "eleven regular Sabbath appointments, with twelve classes," a parsonage and four churches, and little debt. Gratitude is felt by the Rev. C. H. Ellsworth at **KINCARDINE**: "Souls have been saved. Methodist interest generally deepened, and congregations increased, as well as a lively Sabbath School interest maintained." The Rev. J. W. Whiting is thankful for "progress" at **TEESWATER**, for "large" and "orderly" congregations; improving funds; the appearance of a church-building spirit" among his people; more members; and best of all, the presence of the Lord.

**AINSLYVILLE.**—The Rev. T. Hanna thanks God that some "sheaves" have been gathered, and that some others "are walking in the fear of God;" and likewise that the parsonage property is restored, and an old church debt reduced. Though space is limited, the Rev. E. Cragg's Methodist report of **HOWICK** cannot be abridged.

"Perhaps no part of Canada has suffered more by emigration during the past year than the County of Huron, and as a natural consequence this Mission, along with many others, has felt its effects. But notwithstanding an unusual number of removals, we are able to report a net increase of eight. During the past Conference year the work of God has in most of the appointments steadily advanced, several backsliders have been reclaimed, and twenty-seven precious souls have professed to receive the blessing of justifying grace, all of whom are doing well. Although the monetary pressure has been most severely felt in this part of the country, yet both our Missionary and Circuit income are in the advance of last year. In other respects also there has been advancement. Our Church in Haydens has been entirely freed from an embarrassing debt, and at the village of Bluevale, where our cause is in a prosperous state, a very neat and commodious Church edifice has been commenced, and will be ready for use sometime in the month of July. The erection of this structure is in a great measure due to the zeal and liberality of

Mr. William Henry and Joseph Leach. We have also secured in different parts of the Mission three excellent sites upon which in due time we expect to build. We have also done what we could towards the establishment of Sabbath Schools, and the instruction of the rising generation. In the matter of pastoral visitation, we have not been idle, but have endeavoured prayerfully and diligently to attend to that duty. In review of the past, we are hopeful for the future, whilst in view of the increasing number of hearers at many of our appointments, 'and their devout and serious attention,' we cannot but anticipate that the coming year will be marked by evangelical aggression upon the dominion of sin and Satan, and of proportionate and lasting success."

The Rev. C. Bristol, B.A., is happy in reporting additional members and funds, and a fine spirit at the appointments, earnest for better houses of worship; and he says, "There are many less desirable fields of labour for the Wesleyan Missionary than the BLYTHE Mission." Limited church accommodation, the pressure of the times, and removals, prevent the Rev. E. W. Frazee from using a glowing pen; still, his indications of good are promising for LUCKNOW.

*Owen's Sound.*—The following letter from the Rev. G. Goodson, the Chairman, though rather anticipating the succeeding reports, is a valuable record of progression on a Missionary District.

"My period of sojourn and labour of three years in Owen Sound and its District is now terminating, and in its review I see much which calls for gratitude to Almighty God, the Father of all our mercies. In our town the past year has been one of severe affliction and financial embarrassment, and our members have had their share of the perplexity caused thereby. Many removals have been one consequence; nevertheless, the interests of our Church have been sustained, our numbers in society and the congregation are in advance of what they were three years ago, and the religious state of our members is far from discouraging. We have harmony and peace among us; and as an encouraging fact we may mention that our official board, at its last meeting, most heartily asked to have their relation changed from that of a Mission to that of a Circuit, resolving to put forth a noble effort to sustain the interests of the cause of God among themselves, without being dependent farther upon Mission funds. They feel their indebtedness to the Missionary Society for so long aiding them; and this gratitude will no doubt be evinced in their liberal support of that cause from which they have for upwards of twenty years received assistance.

"As it regards the District, we employ six more ministers than were employed on the same ground three years ago; two new Missions have been organized—Walter's Falls and Keppell—the last entirely a new ground—on which this year we have had two Missionaries, who report a membership of eighty-five, with all their funds in a promising condition.

"Five new churches have been built on the District—three of brick and two of frame—others are in course of erection, and all the Missions and Circuits have comfortable parsonages belonging to the church, with the exception of three—Owen Sound, Durham, and Thornbury. The increase of membership has been encouraging; and the advanced state and ascendant position of our Church in this section of our work, vindicates the propriety of an increased number of labourers, as well as inspires confidence in the Divine favor. Three years ago there was no Circuit in the District, it was all Missionary ground; the next year will have four Circuits, one Mission having taken a Circuit relation last year, and three are asking for that change this year, viz:—Owen Sound, Arran, and Hanover.

"The brethren laboring in the District have been men of God, devoted, un-murmuring, and consecrated to one work—that of seeking to save souls—and God has blessed them.

"I, in prospect, part with them, and the membership of this District generally, with regret; but as the period of my ministry and service on earth draw to a close, I rejoice in hope of meeting them in glory."

WALTER'S FALLS.—There is such a duty as the making of a spiritual "clearing," and this evidently has been the work of the Rev. J. C. Willmott, B. A.; but have not room for his very interesting facts. DURHAM.—We learn from the Rev. J. Baker that congregations improve, believers revive, penitents believe, numbers increase, Methodist influence extends, and a bright day dawns. Of ARRAN the Rev. I. B. Tallman and colleague report two revivals, earnest official brethren, seventy persons not of the Church blessed, and fifty made probationers. PAISLEY loses as some other Missions do, yet its numbers, funds, congregations, and higher hopes all increased, as testified, by the Rev. D. Connolly. At ARTEMESIA the Rev. G. Jacques has had, by much extra effort, an increase of members, and considering the settler's trying circumstances, tolerably good finances, a church was finishing, several new Sabbath Schools organized, and a most agreeable Quarter Board. On the HORN-ING'S MILLS Mission poor preaching-houses and finances are discomfoting; yet not deterring the Rev. W. J. Hewitt from saying, "We are able to report a slight increase of members, and are cheered by the erection of a church." HOLLAND AND SULLIVAN constitute a toilsome field for our Missionary, where Sabbath appointments cannot be frequent; but the Rev. W. Norton has had encouragement and success. Of the new ground, KEPPEL, the Rev. J. Greene speaks with satisfaction. Where Indian Missionaries went occasionally, are now seven classes, several week-day places, and Sabbath preaching in eleven localities. BRUCE MINES has drawn to it a sincere and liberal sympathy, and the Rev. J. Hutchinson's acknowledgments to God and his people will be gratifying.

"Oh! the depth both of the the wisdom and knowledge of God; how un-searchable are his judgments, and his ways past finding out." The desolating fire with which in July last this location was visited, (destroying two-thirds of the dwellings,) completely consumed our very neat and comfortable Parsonage, with all the effects it contained; drained our resources; for a time scattered our congregations; and led many of our members to egress to other parts of the world. But, notwithstanding this, the present state of things among us calls for our gratitude, and inspires our hope. Thus, numerically, after 30 removals, and 12 dropped, or withdrawn, by the 21 added, we stand 109. In finance, as might be expected, from the general and heavy loss, and from the multiplied appeals to benevolence, our contributions are less than they were last year; yet, let it be told to the honour of a generous people, they 'have done what they could,' and thus from their 'diminished store' have aided the direct and varied calls of our Connexion to the amount of more than \$700. In spirituals, although we have had to lament over the relapse of some

that 'did run well,' yet several have been brought to 'know the things which belong to their peace.' The society, in general, are walking in the joy of the Holy Ghost, and not a few 'leaving the first principles of the doctrine of Christ, and are going on to perfection.'

"To the principal Officer of the Missionary Society, for his warm-hearted appeal on our behalf, and to the many friends who, so promptly and liberally responded to that appeal, your Missionary desires thus, in some small measure, to give expression to the gratitude he feels; and he prays, that 'their righteousness may endure forever, and their horn be exalted with honour.'"

*Barrie District.*—The Rev. A. Drennan says of the Mission of HOLLAND LANDING:—"It is one that requires persevering labour. There are some encouraging features connected with it. During the year good has been done by the blessing of the Divine being in the conversion of some souls, and the improvement of church property." ORILLIA, CRAIGHURST AND PENETANGUISHENE, and COLLINGWOOD have not reported. The Rev. D. Hunt is tried with the worst of roads, and great distance of the appointments in NOTTAWASAGA AND ANGUS, but "forty souls have been gathered from the world," a parsonage built, and a church in an unfinished state for years, completed. At MUSKOKO the Rev. J. Neelands does well to hope, as we have no doubt he was glad, to send from his friendly people a thank-offering of fifteen dollars in Missionary subscriptions.

"During the year the great Head of the church has given us some cause of rejoicing on this remote field of labour. Through two protracted meetings which we held at what is called Sparrow Lake, twenty-eight were brought to a knowledge of the truth, and embraced Christ as a Saviour. Our visits were rendered agreeable by the hearty welcome we received, notwithstanding the people had not enough to make their families comfortable. Indeed, none do they desire half so much to see at their humble homes, as "he who publisheth salvation; that saith unto Zion, thy God reigneth." Financially, this is a day of small things; but before long the cause of God will be sustained liberally. Already there are a few blossoms decking the wilderness, and making glad the solitary place. May it 'blossom abundantly, and rejoice, even with joy and singing.'

*Whitby District.*—A report has not been received from either STOUFFVILLE or MANVERS. From the BEAVERTON report, sent by the Rev. E. S. Rupert, B.A., we take several particulars, showing that the patience and skill of the beaver are necessary: and where God is "in the services," success must follow.

"The past year has been very trying, in a monetary sense, to the small membership on the Mission; a part of this field of labour was given over to the Coboconk Mission last Conference. As I look at the results of the past year's toil, it seems as if but little had been done. During the year five have united with us; and the tone of piety has been raised in several instances, so that I have tokens of encouragement in this respect. But after all, the Mission, in regard to numbers, has suffered a decrease. During the year no less than eight members—*three of whom were office bearers*—have removed; and seven others I have felt it my duty to drop. In consequence of removals, two small societies have been broken up, and all prospects of success at these appointments have fled.

"As to the finances of the Mission, I may say that the Connexional Funds have been very well sustained considering the straitened circumstances of the members. I may here add, our church in Mara is free from debt, and the society cherish hopes of getting it furnished in the course of a year or two, with pulpit and pews.

"While I write thus, I may say that God has been with us in the services the past year, and I pray that He may pour the Holy Spirit upon this people, and greatly exceed our expectations."

*Cobourg District.*—No report from SEYMOUR last year, a paragraph or two from the Rev. J. Anderson now will be satisfactory.

"Seymour Mission still presents many hindrances to the efforts of its Wesleyan Missionary—want of Churches, Class Leaders, &c. But we are not without indications of a degree of success; we net a numerical increase of six during the past year, and twenty during our two years on the Mission. We have formed one new class. The class in Campbellford is now the largest on the Mission; twenty-six have been chiefly ingathered this year. Prospects are cheering, in view of the upward tendency of the class in the Village.

"But for the pressure of the times we would be building a church in it. We have three hundred dollars subscribed for it, but our brethren cannot supplement it with the needed amount till they sing the 'harvest home,' of which there is now so much promise. We have organized two Sabbath Schools, one of which is working cheerfully; the other is greatly in need of books, and is hindered by this want. We fall behind last year in our Connexional Funds, Collections, and Missionary contributions, owing to the scarcity of money and general pressure."

The success at HASTINGS a year ago, then stated by the Rev. D. A. Perrin, B.A., has been continuous by the blessing of God.

"During the year, the utterance of the dying Wesley was eminently realized, 'The best of all is, God is with us' Upwards of 'hirty souls were savingly converted to God, all of whom connected themselves with us in church fellowship, and prove to be useful members of society. An interest was awakened in behalf of the rising generation, and a Sabbath School was formed in the Village of Hastings. We have pleasure in stating its progress. The average attendance was fifty scholars, and the number of verses recited was 13,500. It is destined to be a nursery to the Church, and a lasting benefit to the community. The finances in connection with the erection of our church were lessened, and the trustees placed in comfortable circumstances. A good wheat harvest will assist much in enabling subscribers to meet their subscriptions. The trustees desire to tender their most sincere thanks to the Rev. Dr. Taylor, our excellent Secretary, the Rev. D. B. Madden, of Alnwick, and the Rev. S. Wilson, of Norwood, for the assistance they afforded to our Anniversary Services, and through whose instrumentality they were rendered a complete success."

*Peterborough District.*—Of LINDSAY the Rev. A. Edward says:—

"Spiritually, our condition is encouraging, as denoted by a regular attendance upon the public, social, and private means of grace. We have received upon trial seventy-four, from other circuits eleven, have lost by removal twenty-eight, by death four, withdrawal five, and by excision twenty-seven, leaving a nett gain of twenty-one. Financially, there is a large increase in the aggregate. With a married man and a single one, this Mission can get on very well without further Missionary grants, providing a little aid is forthcoming from the Contingent Fund for a year or two."

At LAKEFIELD AND WARSAW the Rev. E. L. Koyle has had about a hun-

dred conversions, yet removals and delinquencies make his year's increase only twenty-one. Funds nearly all in advance. Classes, prayer meetings, and Sabbath Schools, well attended. BOBCAYGEON AND SILVER LAKE tolerably satisfactory to the Rev. J. H. Stinson,—special services productive of converts and members, stimulating to untiring efforts. We have it reported from MINDEN, by the Rev. W. Short, that his Mission has experienced "much temporal adversity," and "raging of fires;" yet he has had some "spiritual prosperity," and accession of members,—who have "improved the Church property," and are projecting a church in Minden.

The Rev. W. Sheridan writes of FENELON FALLS:—

"We grieve to say that in many instances our hopes have not been realized. We warned, exhorted and waited, and yet at the last, had to drop about one-fifth of the entire membership. Hence, our *small nett increase* in members must not be taken as the measure for last year's progress. Besides an increase in members, we are thankful to be able to report, that our classes, with one exception, are in a better condition, and our congregations are larger than they ever before were. Immediately after last Conference we secured a site for a parsonage, and succeeded in carrying our building so far towards completion, as to be able to occupy it in November. The Mission has earned the credit of raising for all purposes, an average of nearly eight dollars per member, which is fully one hundred per cent in advance of any previous year."

The Rev. David Hardie seldom reports failure. At HAVELOCK he has a new appointment and class, and increase of members at all the appointments; three prosperous Sabbath Schools; and notwithstanding scarcity of crops and money, his "people have evinced a liberal spirit, and have raised for the Gospel this year more than the previous one. Our prospects are good." COBOCONK AND CARDEN reports enlarged boundaries in "destitute" settlements, and sixty persons profess to have recently obtained religion. In finances the Rev. P. Campbell says, "great drought" and "numerous fires" have "pressed heavily upon the people."

*Belleville District.*—Showers of grace at MARMORA, fifty persons received on trial—an increase, notwithstanding removals and unfaithfulness, congregations interested, and as the first Methodist preachers did, the Rev. J. A. Dowler looks and prays "for a general awakening and revival throughout this Mission." FLINTON AND AD-DINGTON ROAD loses forty-one members by removals consequent on damaged harvests, and suspension of the lumber trade, and the Rev. R. Robinson is concerned to have the continued assistance of the Missionary Society for the struggling settlers. MADOC.—The Rev. E. Harris closes his three years with thanks to God for delightful spiritual scenes; and though monetary matters are unsatisfactory, Sabbath School efforts are



invigorated, a church debt liquidated, after all losses his membership increased fifty-nine, and his commendable observance of original Society usages impossible to be without a blessing.

"The past year has been one of unusual interest and success. In conjunction with a devoted colleague, upwards of one hundred souls have been added to our Zion. Copies of the rules of our Societies have, in general, been placed in the hands of the new converts, and at present—so far as I can learn—they all seem to be running well. Some attention has also been given to the diffusion of our Catechisms amongst the youth of our care, with a view to counteract heterodoxical notions, and to prepare the mind more fully for the reception of those principles and truths, which, as we conceive, stand in immediate connection with Methodism and the Gospel."

On HASTINGS ROAD poor land, crops, and finances make the Missionary much a dependent on the Society's funds; yet the Rev. J. W. Sloan has larger congregations, some recent probationers in his classes, no reduction of his total membership, and a deeper religious experience to encourage his pastoral assiduities. The DENBIGH Mission takes in five townships, well interspersed with rivers and lakes, hills and valleys. The Rev. W. Sutton reports conversions, some increase of members, three small Sabbath Schools, attempts to obtain church property, and applications from members of other churches for the ordinances. The "dense forests cover most of the farms;" but he thinks his present field of labour "will soon constitute two or three Missions."

*Kingston District.*—The Mission on the St. Lawrence nearest the "Thousand Islands," GANANOQUE, is thus fully yet succinctly reported by the Rev. J. Roy:—

"Notwithstanding the very severe pressure felt here in money matters, this Mission reports a creditable increase in some of its contributions. The Missionary Funds are nearly seventeen per cent in advance of last year, and the funds for the maintenance of circuit interests are very large as compared with former years. The membership has increased in GANANOQUE its if to forty-three instead of five, its number three years ago. The Sabbath School, whose first anniversary we celebrated in April has increased from twenty-nine scholars to ninety-three. The spiritual state of the members has, latterly, exhibited less fluctuation than formerly, and the growing population of the Village affords an encouraging prospect of religious usefulness in years to come."

At BREWER'S MILLS the Rev. A. Campbell and co-labourer have advanced in congregations, number of members, knowledge of our economy, and in local, connexional, and Missionary funds. As in many other places, HARROWSMITH suffers from scarce crops and removals, in numbers and money; the parsonage, however, has had an outlay upon it, Missionary subscriptions are increased; and the Rev. W. H. Peake is mindful of God's goodness. The pressure of the times has been sorely felt at TAMWORTH, yet endured by a deserving people with much self-

sacrifice; "still," writes the Rev. R. Mark, "in the erection of three churches in some of the newest and poorest of our Canadian settlements—in the conversion of scores of souls, and the increase of our circuit funds, some three-fold, we feel we have not laboured in vain, and can say at the end of three year's service, we have done what we could." The Rev. R. Godfrey sends from FRONTENAC an example of the results of unwearied exertion, and of liberality in privation.

"Although we cannot report large accessions of members nor 'showers of blessings' throughout this Mission, yet we are thankful to the Great Head of the Church that our work here was never in a more satisfactory and prosperous state than at present. At three of our appointments, where other Methodist bodies existed, their appointments have been withdrawn, and your Missionary is the only one now administering the word of life to the people. Some of our preaching places, which, at the time of our last report we were struggling to maintain, have now good and steady congregations; and we doubt not that by the blessing of God on patient and earnest effort, our cause will ultimately triumph and prevail.

"The country is hilly and rocky, interspersed with beautiful lakes. The people are poor; many of them have actually suffered for want of food during the past year. Notwithstanding the poverty of the people, they have supplied your Missionary to the amount of one hundred dollars, which liberality is worthy of imitation by older and wealthier circuits."

*Brockville District.*—The Rev. J. Howe tells of a small increase "of members at WINCHESTER;" "Connexional funds are rather less;" "Mission receipts are full as good," and the people have liberally exerted themselves towards liquidating a debt on the Winchester church, and for parsonage improvements. *CORNWALL.*—Regretting past interruptions of the work, and referring to the devotedness of his predecessor, the Rev. J. Huggill is grateful for a harmonious society, for connexional funds comparatively well sustained, for a considerable reduction of church debt, for a flourishing Sabbath School and Bible Class, and growing respect to Methodism, where the power of the Gospel is needed with its truths. In the Rev. C. H. Field's report of *ROXBOROUGH* he honours the Holy Spirit; and an increase of stated means, for exhortation and prayer throughout the five townships, on week-days, would bring His outpourings.

This Mission, as stated in the report last year, is about forty miles in length, and extends into five different Townships, settled mostly by Scotch Presbyterians and Roman Catholics. Still, we are thankful to the Great Head of the Church for the favour vouchsafed to us in the eyes of the people, and that some little good has been accomplished through the preaching of His word. After dropping some members we are able to report a small increase and nearly all our congregations have been enlarged, and our finances are more than double last year, and last year in advance of any previous year.

"Services have been regularly held at six Sabbath appointments, and one week-night. One Sabbath appointment at the beginning of the year was dropped, and another taken up at Martintown, a respectable Village, twelve miles from Cornwall, where we have a large and attentive congregation. The Sons of Temperance kindly offered us the use of their Hall for preaching. Viewed from a human standpoint, it will be many days before Methodism

will be firmly established in these townships; but we know that under the out-pouring of the Holy Spirit a nation may be born in a day. May the mighty shower soon descend, that this wilderness of sin may blossom as the garden of the Lord."

*Perth District.*—Of the well known Mission of LANARK the Rev. S. Teeson states, that by removals and excoisions the membership has been decimated, but that on the south part it has been replenished; so that his conviction is, "financially, numerically, and spiritually, the Lord has given us success." The rocks of ROKEBY prevent not progress, evidence of which is thus given by the Rev. E. A. Shorey:—

"The different congregations during the year have been very good. The several funds have been well supported. The debt upon the new church in this neighborhood has been somewhat lessened; the Parsonage property has been improved. A church commenced in Bro. Wilson's time is now about to be completed, and a lot has been given in White's neighborhood, upon which, during the coming year, we intend to build a church.

"In the absence of Sabbath Schools, we have endeavoured to meet the wants of the youth by forming four Catechetical or Bible Classes, two of which are met by your Missionary on Sabbath, and the other two during the week. Our efforts in this direction have proved successful beyond our most sanguine expectations. The answers to the different questions in Catechisms No. 1 & 2 have been given with a readiness and precision that would do credit to older heads. We trust that the fruit of the seed thus sown will be seen in after years.

"In harmony with the spirit of Methodism, 'Go not only where you are wanted, but where you are wanted most,' we pushed our way into the Northern part of this Township, and took up an appointment distant from here 16 miles. To our astonishment we found a thickly settled neighbourhood, and the people almost destitute of preaching. They gladly received us, and seemed anxious to have a Methodist Preacher among them. To this end they have subscribed liberally."

We lack space for all that cheers from the Rev. W. Burns, of PACKENHAM AND ARNPRIOR,—“several Revival services” held successfully, the blessing of God upon the ordinary means, and on pastoral visitations, securing “a large addition to our membership, and an increase of spirituality among our people”—a church finished—a church being built—improvements making on another—subscriptions ready for still another, among their superintendent says, “a liberal people, who have the interests of old-fashioned Methodism at heart.” From NEWBOROUGH AND BEDFORD, on the Rideau Canal, the Rev. James Norris regrets to report a worthy people disheartened and discomforted by scarcity of crops among their lakes and stone ledges; and that removals, deaths, and delinquencies make his increase of members small, and disappointments the liberality of his willing friends limited; but it must have afforded him pleasure, as on many other Missions, with a faithful fellow helper, to be favoured with the “conversion of between thirty and forty souls.”

"Through the goodness of a kind Providence we report favourably with regard to the spiritual and financial state of the Mission. On our arrival at this field, we found but two appointments, and only about seventy-five hearers. Now we have five appointments, with about two hundred hearers. We found 32 members; we have now forty, after accounting for removals, &c. The distance travelled was about ten miles; we now travel about thirty-five. We found no Sabbath Schools; now we are able to report two in successful operation.

"This is a very laborious field. Your Missionary has had to cross lakes, ford rivers, climb rugged mountains, sometimes glad to get a bare floor for a bed, and often little or no feed for man or beast. But your Missionary would recommend this field to be vigorously worked, and feels certain, that an abundant harvest of souls will be the consequence. The Government has kindly presented us ten acres of land for church purposes, in the new and interesting Township of Portland."

**NORTH WAKEFIELD.**—After a season of spiritual increase, the Rev. G. J. Dingman mourns the declension of some persons; yet rejoices that others have pressed on to the great blessing of Christian perfection; that two new Sabbath Schools have been established; a church completed, and another placed without a debt. The **AYLWIN** Mission lies for sixty-five miles on the Gattineau, and the Rev. J. Gold has added "four new appointments;" congregations "highly encouraging;" seed germinating; members increased; a parsonage nearly finished; a toilsome field for one man. At **LONG ISLAND LOCKS** the Rev. A. Armstrong has "cause for gratitude," having to do with advance in numbers, piety, funds, appointments, and hearers, and he anticipates—for a day not far off—from the seed already sown, a "hundred-fold" harvest. At **OSGOODE**, the Rev. J. Slight's hope of better times is needed; for he writes of deficient connexional and local funds, reduction of numbers, loss of religion, delapidated parsonage, and his own sufferings: still, he has an expectation of effort among the "friends." **RUSSELL** is said by the Rev. J. B. Keough to be "somewhat improved" spiritually, the people are "kind and liberal;" funds are all in advance, and the parsonage property much bettered, "notwithstanding the loss of two appointments." The Protestant part of the population at **PLANTAGENET**, the Rev. R. N. Adams states, is "divided into four or five denominations." "Nevertheless Methodism is exerting a salutary and increasing influence upon the public mind and morals." "During the present year there has been an increased attendance on the preaching of the word, prejudices have been gradually passing away, and a larger amount than ever before has been raised for the support of the resident Missionary. At **GRENVILLE** conversions and faithfulness, but, for prevalent causes this year, funds reduced; though the Rev. G. H. Kenney intimates that the parsonage has had a useful outlay upon it of the people's money; and, we believe, of his own labour. At the "too long languishing Mission" of **LOCHABER**

the Rev. J. Hill speaks of an increase of piety, unity, and hearing, as of finances; and he very justly expects greater encouragement, while he has many Prayer and Society Meetings, and stately reads our Rules. Of the picturesque and laborious field of HARRINGTON, stretching through more than four townships, the Rev. R. Bell, thus, very properly for a Missionary, with cheerfulness writes:—

“Many of the people are settled but two, three, or four years here; but notwithstanding this, and the hardness of the times, progress is being made. In many places the original log huts are being transformed into more spacious and comfortable dwellings. I have no doubt but Harrington will, in a very few years, rank among our most interesting and encouraging fields of Missionary labour. The people are wholly dependent on Methodism for the Gospel.

“This year the Lord gave us a very gracious, though not very extensive revival, resulting in the increase of members, and the formation of one Class. As one of the first fruits of the revival, our people are now engaged in erecting a very neat little church, 21 x 25, which will be ready for service in July. This is the first of the kind on the Mission, the meetings being hitherto held in private houses. Financially, too, the Mission is considerably in advance of last year. Permit me to say, in conclusion, that the year just ended has been emphatically one of the happiest of my life. I shall remember and look back with pleasure to this the field of my first year’s labour in the great moral vineyard of my Lord; and pray that this kind and warm-hearted people may grow and flourish, and be increased a hundred fold. The same good brother who kept the Missionary’s horse last year, has had done the same this year.”

*Pembroke District.*—The Rev. R. M. Hammond writes very satisfactorily of WESTMEATH, a Mission which has not required unwearied labour with sterility and unthankfulness.

“This field, with the exception of one appointment, is truly Missionary in its character. It is only five years since it was disconnected from what is now the Pembroke Circuit, and embraces a great part of three townships.

“Though the times have been extremely hard during the past year, yet we are thankful to be able to say that, through the Divine blessing on our labours, progress has been made. In Front Westmeath, where Methodism on the Upper Ottawa was first planted a church has been erected. The building is of brick, 50 x 32 feet, with basement and gallery, and is a monument of the taste, as well as of the piety and liberality, of a small but spirited community. The opening services by the Rev. Dr. Taylor, Missionary Secretary, were seasons of great interest, and will not soon be forgotten. Here, too, we have a large and well conducted Sabbath School and Bible Class, and many of the young people give pleasing evidence of true piety.

“At the other appointments, where special services have been held, there has also been a number of hopeful conversions. Our congregations continue good. Our people are kind and liberal; and as the Mission will soon be supplied with churches at all the most important places, its future may be regarded as hopeful.”

*PORTAGE-DU-FORT.*—The work of God in progress—congregations good—classes well attended—increase of class-goers—funds growing—parsonage out of debt—church building—week-day as well as Sabbath appointments; the Rev. J. Kiernan says, “The Lord is in his little Zion.” The conversion of persons from twenty to seventy years of age at RENNÉBREW has repaid the efforts of the Rev. W. Creighton,—as do the

regularity of a new class, two Bible Classes, a new Sabbath School, and additional Missionary subscriptions. BRUDENELL gave the Rev. A. Doxsee the trouble of building a parsonage on his arrival, where seven townships awaited him, in which are a hundred Protestant families, who appreciate his hard labours. He knows what privations and toils are among a people not opulent, and yet says, "We look forward with confidence to the coming year for showers of blessings." The facts from the Rev. C. E. Perry of CALABOGIE, are Missionary indeed, as are others on this District, for all of which we wish we had room.

"The Mission includes settlements in the following Townships, viz: Bagot, Blythfield, Darling, Levant, Dalhousie, and Matawathan, causing a journey of over 200 miles to travel once round the Mission, which includes eight Sabbath and two week-day appointments. A church is in contemplation, and it is hoped will be erected in the course of the following year. In consequence of the failure of last year's crops, and the unfavourable season for the lumber business, on which the inhabitants of this part of the country mainly depend, less has been accomplished in support of this Mission, than the coming season, if favourable, would warrant in looking forward to. Three Sabbath Schools have been organized since last Conference, having two Libraries attached, comprising about 100 volumes. Two Bible Classes and three Temperance organizations are in full working order.

"We report eleven members, and matters in a train of hopeful progression, and pray that the blessed influences of the Holy Spirit may be abundantly poured down and shed abroad, that the good work of the Lord may prosper and be largely increased."

The Rev. J. V. Wilson has been favoured with "power from on high" at stated and special services of the EGANVILLE Mission. The people have suffered financially, but they have increased the Missionary's comforts. "Class Meeting and Prayer Meetings are punctually attended," and the Mission "healthy and prosperous." Though some members at ALICE have been dropped for neglect, it must have been delightful to the Rev. T. H. Walker to be visited by God "with a gracious revival, and a class of twenty-four organized;" and this in a "new settlement;" while he has had health and heart to extend the work's "boundaries on the north to the mouth of the Petewawa, within four miles of Point Alexander Mission," where he says, "we have an attentive congregation; and a few have been received on trial." ONSLOW exhibits, as able, zeal for church building, and the Rev. W. Sanderson pronounces his people's monetary efforts in these times noble. Missionary collections fifty per cent better; all better except his own income. Good congregations, one new appointment, and the membership more numerous. God is praised. POINT ALEXANDER Mission is too extended for complete organization; yet if it did nothing more than lodge the seeds of the Inspired Word in the minds of many of the thousands of Romish lumbermen, it would be an after-benefit in many parts of Eastern Canada. We can hardly

abridge the Rev. B. Rose's sterling narrative, from a District well-nigh Missionary in all its area, as much of the Ottawa District is.

"We have, as in the past, the whole Protestant community to ourselves; and, besides that, access to as many lumber shanties as we can visit during the winter. Of the thousands of Lower Canadians who are in them, mostly all Roman Catholics, I think about one-third are sufficiently acquainted with English to profit less or more by the religious exercises. These all receive our visits kindly, listen attentively, and many of them contribute cheerfully to support the work on the Mission. Very much cannot be expected, of course, from only an occasional visit, but all together contribute to bring them under influences, and make impressions on them, which in some cases at least, will not be readily forgotten.

"I have visited every Protestant family on the Mission, but three or four, and a large number of Roman Catholic families, reading the Scriptures, catechizing the children, conversing on personal religion with the adults, and praying with them wherever practicable. To accomplish this I have travelled along the Ottawa from Fort William to the foot of Temiscaming Lake,—a place never visited but once before—and up the Mattawin River to the head of Talon Lake, in all about 160 miles. During last summer there were two Sabbath Schools in operation with twenty-nine scholars, and this spring there is a Bible class with eight scholars at a new appointment. I have sold nearly two dozen of our Catechisms, and thirteen copies of the *S. S. Advocate*, two copies of the latter going into Roman Catholic families. Such are the difficulties of travelling that I have frequently to walk from eight to twelve miles in summer, and row a boat much farther, to make my appointments. There is no class organized yet, for our eight members are scattered 120 miles, but I hope very soon to be able to form a small one at a new appointment. I am happy to add, in conclusion, though my own salary is much lessened by the hard times, all our collections are in advance of last year."

*Montreal District.*—The Rev. G. N. A. F. T. Dixon says of St. JOHN'S,—“During the year we have been favoured with many indications of the presence and power of God.” Congregations, conversions, accession of members, the Sabbath School, and the people's liberality have gratified him. HEMMINGFORD is thus reported by the Rev. W. C. Henderson, after losing some of its best members:—

“The continued and heavy drain by removals, forms one of the most serious embarrassments in the prosecution of the work on this Mission. Notwithstanding, however, these discouragements, and the severe pressure of the times, the funds of the Mission and the connexional collections have been nobly sustained. Two hundred dollars have been paid towards liquidating the debt on the parsonage.

“If any testimony were needed to the liberality of the people of this Mission, it might be found in the fact, that with a membership of 168 persons, it has paid during the past year, in support of the various interests of the work, the sum of \$1009 85. Situated as we are, on the Province line, the intense excitements of our neighbours have been participated in by our people to a very large degree, and this has militated somewhat against the spiritual interests of the Church.”

At FRANKLIN the Rev. A. Andrews expresses a deep gratitude for forty persons received on trial, an increase of members, only a slight deficiency in the Missionaries' salaries, though the Committee's grant is much reduced,—the proper settlement of our Church property, and the

good done by "more attention to the children of our congregations, both in the Sabbath Schools and week-day classes." The number of members at ORMSTOWN is small and opposed, nevertheless, "the Mission furnishes evidence of both spiritual and financial improvement. A parsonage was to be erected, and the Rev. S. Huntingdon adds, "Your Missionary has succeeded in establishing several new appointments, which promise to become speedily scenes of a gracious revival." Such advance, as of old, of course provokes bigotry. The Rev. J. Kilgour "says he has nothing "remarkable" to record of CAVIGNALL; he states numbers are the "same as in the preceding year. Financially the Mission is somewhat in advance of last year, whilst all the other funds have been well sustained, notwithstanding some untoward circumstances." "From the attendance on public means, and the decided Methodistic spirit of our members, whose love for Class Meetings and Love-feast cannot be mistaken," he gathers encouragement. The Rev. Levi Vanderburg's report of St. ANDREW'S is a fair counterpart of many others this year—success and loss.

"In reviewing the year that has just closed, your Missionaries are thankful to be able to report that 'the Lord of Hosts has been with us, the God of Jacob has been our refuge.' Upwards of fifty have been received on trial through the year, part of these brought to the Lord through the ordinary means; yet owing to about 24 removals to other parts, five deaths, and about 18 dropped or expelled, we cannot report much of an increase.

"You will see by the returns this year, that though it has been a very hard year for getting money, owing to the failure of crops, the Mission has with the aid of the Missionary grant, paid its Missionaries with the exception of sixty dollars, and placed all the connexional funds in advance of last year."

WESLEYVILLE has had difficulties, and the Rev. J. Webster has no pleasure in reporting Classes "not in a good state," finances "in arrears," and of members a "decrease;" the only exception to progress on this very important District. The revival in former reports, we trust has not spent all its holy spirit. No report to hand from RAWDON.

*Quebec District.*—At THREE RIVERS, in charge of the Rev. S. G. Phillips, "steady improvement in all departments," two hundred dollars raised "in furnishing our church," funds, "much in advance," congregations "good," "members are living to God." Besides noticing some addition of members, reduction of church debts, and the liberality of the Hon. J. S. Sanborn, the Rev. E. Barrass thus writes of SHERBROOKE:—

"The appointment of a junior Minister to this Mission last year has been attended with good. Sabbath appointments have been regularly supplied at ten places, at two of which there are good churches. It is desirable, for many reasons, that there should be two services in each church every Sabbath; but to do this only every alternate Sabbath, has caused the Ministers to preach four times in one day. The population is increasing at our two principal appointments, and other denominations are making vigorous efforts.



"The mining interests have not been so beneficial as was anticipated. Trade has been seriously embarrassed, so that there have been some failures in business which have greatly affected our finances. We are thankful for the aid we have received from gentlemen not directly connected with our Church, and cannot help mentioning the Hon. A. T. Galt, who gave us \$50 towards our second Minister's salary. Col. Pomeroy has also given \$10 annually for three years."

"The EATON Mission," the Rev. S. E. Maudsley states, embraces a beautiful and fertile country near the confines of the United States." There is much enterprize in the population, and freedom in religious opinions. The Ladies' Aid Society is doing good to church and parsonage property. Though the Methodists hold a good position, the usages of Methodism are not popular with all persons, and the writer says, "A sojourn here furnishes a dozen arguments for, and adds a dozen beauties to, our system of itinerancy." At DUDSWELL AND BURY many wish the Mission to succeed, and though inclement weather interfered with special meetings, some persons were brought to God. Congregations and Sabbath Schools did well, and the Rev. W. Hicks says, arrangements are made for "the erection of a church in Bury, and a parsonage in Dudswell." LEEDS is thus reported by the Rev. E. Fessant:—

"The Lord has been with us to revive his work this year. Special services have been held since New Year's in St. Sylvester, resulting in the salvation of about forty souls, and since that time the work has been advancing gloriously, and now the classes are in a delightful state. Some have experienced the blessing of holiness, and others are panting for it. Some have been converted very recently at the ordinary prayer meetings. Although we have lost over fifty through removals and deaths the last three years, yet by the blessing of God we are able, with those on trial, to leave as many as we found. The Lord has been better than all our fears. Most of our Connexional and Circuit Funds are in advance of any former year. We have succeeded in removing a debt from our church in Leeds—over \$200—and Mission premises, and putting about \$80 worth of improvement on the church, during the three years, and shall leave the whole out of debt."

Of DANVILLE the Rev. J. S. Evans says, "At the principal places there has been an evident growth in grace." Difficulties he once reported have disappeared; there are eight classes but only three leaders: so that frequently on a Sabbath he meets three besides preaching three times. The Rev. J. Scott has had good tokens at NEW IRELAND, a new class of twenty, and additions at different appointments, and something done in church building; and perseverance and outlay among a people not wealthy, promise still better tokens. DURHAM does not escape a small decrease of members. The Rev. J. E. Richardson mentions a creditable effort in building a convenient parsonage at a cost of \$1,200, with little debt; and other financial doings, which are serviceable: and these in hard times. At ACTONVALE mining not having been sufficiently successful, many "members and friends" have been obliged to remove.

On other parts of the Mission facts have cheered the Rev. R. H. Smith,—one “new appointment,” some new members, and the people attached to Methodism. The PORT NEUF field of labour is said by the Rev. W. Adams to be eighty miles long. A church has been completed, and opened with good effect—souls were converted, another class of fifteen formed. In the absence of desirable class and Sabbath School statistics from GASPE, we insert the Rev. D. Jennings’s report of our most easterly Mission, which promises much future good.

“Notwithstanding many opposing influences the cause of the Wesleyan Church has made some progress during the last two years. The frame of a commodious parsonage has been erected, to be completed on the outside by the first of August next. The church at the north-west has been underpinned with stone, and the walls ceiled inside. The church at Jersey Cove has been finished outside. Much improvement has been made on the church property at St. George’s Cove, and repairs are about to be made on the church at Indian Cove.

“Our congregations have been good. Some of our members are walking in the fear of God, and in the comforts of the Holy Ghost. Since I have been on the Mission I have baptized about thirty children, and married fifteen couple. The Mission is a very extensive and important one. One of our aged members died in the Lord in May last; he had been for many years a sincere and earnest Christian.”

*Stanstead District.*—The tidings of COMPTON from the Rev. B. Cole are cheering in religious toil.

“In reviewing the past year, your Missionary would return thanks to Almighty God for many signal proofs of the power of the Gospel to save souls. At one of the out appointments, during a series of religious services, upwards of seventy persons were awakened, many of whom were converted to God. Thirty have joined our Church on trial; three additional classes have been organized, and leaders appointed. The work is still going on, and the old members have been very much advanced.

“Three of our members have died the past year; their end was peace. The collections, both Connexional and Circuit, are in advance of last year. We are still indebted to Col. Pomroy for the use of an excellent dwelling and garden without charge, and a prospect of soon securing the whole property to the Connexion.”

From HATLEY, formerly connected with Compton, the Rev. W. W. Ross must inform us of prosperity.

“This Mission has been blessed during the past year with considerable prosperity, both spiritual and financial. The membership has been doubled; the Missionary income more than doubled; the Connexional funds generally in advance of last year; between 100 and 200 dollars have been raised towards freeing the parsonage from debt. There are two Sabbath Schools on the Mission. There is a fair promise of our securing during the coming year another important appointment.”

The Rev. J. Salmon, B.A., complains of some indifference to doctrines and religion at COATICOKE AND BARNSTON, yet has “peace” and “a slight increase of Church members;” and he observes “increased attendance on the means of grace, and a deeper interest manifested on the part of the people in the maintenance of our institutions.” Concerning

GEORGEVILLE the Rev. J. Stewart writes,—“I took up five new appointments. We have seven in all. I conducted two special services which resulted in the conversion of twenty-nine souls, and the formation of two classes. After filling vacancies occasioned by removals, etc., we have an increase of twenty-three members.” The year has been one of “very great trial and little encouragement” at MAGOG; it is a satisfaction, therefore, that the Rev. J. P. Lewis had a “good” congregation, and a Sabbath School “well attended.” The Rev. W. Scales thankfully sends these particulars from EAST BOLTON:—

“By the liberality of the Trustees the debt on the church has been liquidated. The church and parsonage property have been much improved. And notwithstanding the untiring opposition of zealous errorists, we record to the praise of the God of Missions an increase of twenty-one members. We leave the Mission in a happy state, spiritually and financially. The appointment of an additional Minister to this Mission two years ago has proved to have been a wise step.”

KNOWLTON is pleasingly reported by the Rev. D. Sutherland. Liberal purposes have been frustrated,—still, the loss is exceeded by \$80; the membership is increased; church property advanced in value \$1500; “several new appointments” formed; the ground extended; a second Missionary required. SHEFFORD AND LAWRENCEVILLE.—The Rev. J. E. Sanderson, M.A., says, “Our members are generally meeting in class, but we have difficulty in securing working leaders. The official board works harmoniously.” A new church is commenced at Fulford, and he further says, “The new church in Waterloo was opened by the Superintendent of Missions. The cost, amounting in all to five thousand dollars, is paid, except about sixteen hundred.” According to the grateful testimony of the Rev. J. Davies there is a living spirituality and active Methodism at GRANBY.

“‘Praise God’ was the language of our worthy official brethren at our last Quarterly business Meeting, and is that of our hearts on reviewing the mercies of the closing year. For the conversion of sinners, and deepening the work of grace in the hearts of our members, we adore the God of love. Encouraging indications at most of our eight appointments led us to hold a month’s special services in our Village Church, when more than forty were awakened from the sleep of sin, and thirty professed to find pardon. During the year we have received twenty-seven on trial, and three have died. One result of our extra services is, that we have a promising Bible Class composed of twenty young persons.

“Our ordinary finances are in a satisfactory condition; besides which the following things have been added free from debt: an excellent Church Melodeon, presented by James Irwin, Esq., costing \$120; an electro-plate communion service and box, \$30; a neat, substantial horse-shed, 160 x 20, cost \$120; and the Rev. E. S. Ingalls and others are on the point of providing a bell for our Church. The ladies are exerting themselves to add to the Minister’s comfort by providing additional articles for the parsonage.

“Last year our Missionary income exceeded our grant by \$20; this year it does so by \$40, and next year we become a Circuit. Having resolved to

OF FRELIGHSBURG the Rev. G. Stenning observes, " We are glad to  
report, that on some parts of the Mission we have received indications of  
good. Some have been added to our ranks, and at one of the principal  
places the congregation has greatly increased. This field, like others, has  
its share of hostile influences, but doubtless will ultimately rank with  
some of the most important Circuits in the District." Scarcity of space  
must disagreeably debar us from inserting wholly the Rev. H. Fowler's  
report, as it has done with others. His FARNHAM congregations show  
" improvement ; Class and Prayer Meetings " are very well sustained ;"  
Sabbath Schools in a " prosperous state ;" membership not less ; state of  
finances " very good ;" attempts to pay off a heavy debt on church and  
parsonage liberal. SUTTON, on the Vermont line, has, the Rev. S. Jack-  
son states, " suffered no great financial decrease " by the giving Broome  
to another Mission. The congregations have " generally been good ;"  
and though by removals, deaths, and alteration of boundaries " there has  
been a decrease of eleven members," grace has been in operation, another  
class formed, and the Lord of the vineyard is importuned for greater in-  
crease of spiritual power.

These reluctantly-compressed facts from the Missions on the three ex-  
tensive and important Eastern Wesleyan Districts, exhibit an active  
spiritual and financial vitality ; and cordially akin in spirit and aim as  
they are to the Missions in the Western Districts, it is, to the praise  
of God, evident, that their combination in evangelical effort eminently  
conduces to the religion, elevation, and happiness of this popular Province  
of the British Empire.

---

## FRENCH MISSIONS.

---

These Missions not being yet so well known as the established Missions  
of the Society, for the information and satisfaction of their respected  
promoters, the reports are given at greater length : and they will be read  
with pleasure, and desire for extension.

CHAUDIERE.—The Rev. H. Beeson writes,—

" This Mission is formed out of the western suburbs of the city of Ottawa,  
and includes a varied population of French and Irish Roman Catholics, a  
large number of persons who make no profession of religion, and some Pro-

testants,—the latter appearing generally to value the public services of religion. We have preaching twice on the Sabbath, and a class-meeting in the Model School-house, and a cottage prayer meeting on a week evening. The congregation is a very attentive one, and the aggregate attendance is about seventy.

“The population of this portion of the city is rapidly increasing, owing chiefly to the development of the lumber trade. We have, promised, a lot of land for a church, and a subscription list is in circulation. There is only one church in the neighbourhood. The prospects of the Mission are good. The probability is that in a very short time it will be independent of the Missionary Fund”

**MONTREAL.**—The Rev. H. Mauny writes,—

“Notwithstanding the great opposition from the Roman Catholics, and also from some other sects, I can say, with the grace of God that our members remained firm, and have also supported with resignation many trials, as good disciples of Jesus Christ.

“Our Mission has had more mutations than the past year, as it is easy to see in my report that I have given in 1864; that 122 had attended our meetings; since that over 48 came. The total of persons having attended is 162, at the present date; after deductions made either by departure for the States, or members having retired. We have on our Class-book for May, 30; and I can say that those that have remained are entirely Protestant, many of them being members since our formation, 26th June, 1862.

“Before giving you some interesting facts, I will show you the order of our meetings, with the average of attendance.

“Sunday morning, Deréviere Street, at 9 to 10 o'clock A. M., 14 persons; Great St James' Church, at 3 o'clock P. M., 26 persons; Tuesday, at 7½ o'clock P. M., 16 persons; Friday, at 7½ o'clock P. M., 17 persons. Our Day School has been broken very often by priests, and also by the other Institutions.

“It is a great sorrow for me to see our children deprived of an institution entirely Methodist. I have been engaged ten years as professor and principal of a College, and I know the great privileges that we would have if we possessed one; but notwithstanding my efforts, I have not succeeded.

“Now our number is as follows:—30 in full connexion, 12 on trial, 25 children; total, 67. About 15 persons, Romans, or without churches, visit our meetings, but do not like to give their names; 8 families besides my congregation are visited, and I am happy to say the Gospel was spread this year with fruit; blessed be the Lord for his mercy! and glory be to Jesus; for I trust *He* was with us. My translation of our Articles of Faith, and the Formula of Sacraments, &c., has given always great benefit among the Canadians. I have distributed a great number of Tracts, French Christian Calendars, and New Testaments. My principal care has been to procure work for my people, and it was recognized that our members have not been suffering as many Protestants have in Montreal. Since our last Conference I have baptized five children and buried two women. I have visited every week the General Hospital. One day a man being very sick, had around his bed his children trying to persuade him to confess to the priests, “Oh no! said he, I am sure M. Mauny will be here to day,” and in a few minutes after I was there. I prayed with him, and after, I asked the friends to retire themselves for a few minutes, and I asked him if he had Jesus in his heart, etc., and if something would prevent him from receiving the Lord's Supper? His answer was very satisfactory. He confessed Jesus Christ, and showed me that he was repentant, and he was willing to receive the Communion. The day after I came to give him the Sacrament. A few days after he recovered, and since he has never seen any priest. A woman who was entirely given to the Virgin Mary asked me if I could explain to her what Mary was, and what power

QUEBEC.—The Rev. J. A. Dorion writes,—

"There is cause of thankfulness to the Head of the Church for his many blessings towards this Mission since the day of its foundation. I have been greatly encouraged during the past year in my ministry by the indication of some good. Considering the many influences which retard the spread of the knowledge of the Gospel of Christ among this people, and what we well know, seeing that the enemy of souls is ever busy to sow 'tares among the wheat,' notwithstanding all that—counting up for some removals—and two have forsaken me, having loved this present world—I am truly thankful to the Most High that I am not compelled to report a decrease this year in the membership of this Society. The congregation is always improving, both in number and in vital piety. I would say furthermore, it is very remarkable to see the progress that the Word of God is rapidly gaining in the minds of the people in general ; many who are for us now were against us a year ago.

"This is a sufficient guarantee that our labour has not been in vain in the Lord, and that he is willing to bless us according to our faith ; and if we are truly desirous to build up this people in the knowledge of the Gospel of the grace of God, the Lord says to us as he said unto Zerubbabel, 'Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord.' May God continue to bless his work in this part of his vineyard !"

MAGOG.—The Rev. T. Charbonell writes,—

"This year my labours have been blessed in a very remarkable manner, but owing to the constant emigration to the neighbouring republic, our success will not fully appear. Many of those whose minds have been partially brought under our influence, others who have been reading the Bible, and quite a number of our members, have crossed the line during the past year. But our object is not to make a show, but to honour the Master and elevate man. Our desire has been to some extent gratified.

"During the year no less than thirteen of our members have removed ; one has passed triumphantly home ; sixteen have joined the Church ; and seven more families have been induced to read the Bible, which is equal to a separation from the Roman Church. We have quite a number of new hearers. Two new appointments have been taken up. Thirteen Bibles have been distributed, and forty-two Wesleyan Catechisms, besides a number of tracts.

"We have now thirty-one members, nine of whom are on trial. The great drawback is, that our Missionary subscriptions are no more than they are ; but we feel it, and with God's help we trust our French brethren will soon do more and more for the good cause. We trust that our effort will be blessed with success. Our preaching places are the following :—Orford, Currier School House, Stanstead."

SOUTH ROXTON.—The Rev. A. La Clair writes,—

"As usual, the oppression from the priest and his adherents is of the most aggressive form and kind ; but Jesus is mighty to save, and glory be to his name he has saved a few on Roxton Mission this year. Of the forty-seven reported last year, some have removed to the States ; some have been persuaded to join the Baptist Church ; and some have been dropped. Our membership now numbers forty-nine, and probationers nine,—an increase over last year of eleven, besides quite a number who, I believe, are at the door of the kingdom.

"We had a good revival last winter, in which Brother A. Parent rendered very efficient service in the conversion of unbelievers, and in the establishment of the brethren in the faith of Jesus Christ. We have three Sabbath

Schools, one of them superintended by Brother T. Forcier, (the Day School Teacher) and one by myself. We have about fifty scholars. Our Day School (which is Missionary in its character) numbers forty-one scholars, and is a complete success. Our Missionary Collection was thirteen dollars and thirty-eight cents, and the Missionary Subscription amounts to eight dollars and eight cents.

"My congregations at Berea, Roxton Pond, Corinth, and St. Pie, are all on the increase, averaging about thirty. I have distributed during the year about two thousand pages of tracts, one hundred and fifty Biblical Calendars, furnished by Mr. J. A. Matthewson, of Montreal; also, a few Bibles and Testaments. I have also distributed a large number of copies of our Articles of Religion, and other portions of our Discipline, as translated by Rev. H. Mauny, of Montreal. I pray that the Lord may bless us with a fresh baptism."

ST. ARMAND.—The Rev. A. Parent writes,—

"I thank the Lord that I am not left without a token of his approbation, for a few souls have been made happy in God their Saviour.

"I am happy to say that there are about ten families who are desirous to receive the truth. I made several visits in St. Pie, and preached there with much success; it is a distance of about fifty-five miles from home. I also preached in Roxton, in union with Bro. La Claire, where there was much good done. Roxton is forty-five miles distant from home. I have also preached in Canaan a few times, a distance of thirty-five miles.

"I have not been able to preach three times each Sabbath on account of the distance from each appointment. There are on my Mission so many poor Canadians to whom I carry the Word of life, having no home of their own, consequently they are obliged to move away, and for the above reason I have to change my preaching places; consequently I lose their influence as Protestants and Christians.

"There are about thirteen Protestant families who have left my Mission since I was sent on it by the Conference. It is pleasing to me to see the rising generation inquiring after truth. May these few souls who have been converted be the beginning of a great moral revolution in Canada. May the Lord grant it for his mercy's sake.

## GERMAN MISSIONS.

The subjoined letters will corroborate, the general statements made in the introductory part of the Report, and deepen the conviction, that the German department is successful according to its means, and should, if possible, be extended.

HAMILTON.—The Rev. S. Kappeler says,—

"No facts having been sent for the Missionary Report of last year, your Missionary is required to compare the numbers at present with what they were two years ago. Compared with this return, the decrease in numbers is considerable, but the numbers in Society has not decreased during this year. Number in Society, June, 1864, 23; received by letter, 5; on trial, 12; removed during the year 13; dropped, 4; now reported as members, 23.

"The labours of the year have resulted in the marked conversion of souls, and others (owing to the unsettledness of the German speaking population) have, while under deep conviction for sin, removed away from the means of grace, it is hoped not to forget their responsibility. Your Missionary has occasionally visited Dundas and Waterdown, where a few met for worship on the week evenings

"The year has been one of unceasing toil, of mingled discouragement and encouragement. He is assured that those reported as members are earnestly endeavouring to save their souls. They have an enlightened attachment to the Wesleyan Church. There are evidences that the Lord is with us, in providing instruments for the accomplishment of the work to be done."

PRESTON.—The Rev. C. Freshman, D.D., says,—

"Without any preliminary remarks to this report, I feel happy, through the mercy of God, to be able to state that I was greatly encouraged during the past year on this our new field of labour. My faith, indeed, was strengthened in beholding the effects produced through the power of the Gospel. Not only were congregations gathered, and churches built, but, blessed be God, many were convinced of the error of their ways, accepted the truth as it is in Christ Jesus, and are now rejoicing in God their Saviour. On almost every appointment of our German Mission the Lord is at work, and tokens of his saving mercy are visible. A number of precious souls are awakened, and desire to obtain the pearl of great price; but yet there are still many halting between two opinions.

"During the past year three churches have been erected on this Mission; one in Preston, where we preach in both languages; another in Strasburgh, and a third in Paris. We have, beside these, a number of other preaching places, but for the want of more assistance we are unable to attend to them as regularly as we ought; and still there is room enough to open other appointments. I hope and pray that the Committee will be enabled to send at least one more labourer to this promising field. We have two Sabbath Schools: one in Preston, which has already proved a blessing, and the other in Strasburg. God has been pleased on many occasions, through the preaching of his word, to make sinners tremble, and shake the powers of darkness and infidelity. We are determined, by the Divine assistance, still to wrestle on against all opposition, by taking on the whole armour of God, and the shield of faith, wherewith we shall be able to quench the fiery darts of the wicked, and thus labour on for the glory of God and the good of mankind while here below."

EGANVILLE.—The Rev. C. Allum says of the work on the Ottawa,—

"At the close of another year we can say that we have not laboured in vain, nor spent our strength for nought. Souls have been converted to God, and though few in their number, we trust that the little cloud in view will increase and burst with blessings over our heads.

"We have enlarged our borders, taken up several new appointments. We have organized two classes, which give promise of genuine Christianity. We have organized two Sabbath Schools, which are making rapid progress. We have two Sermon readers, one Local Preacher, Bro. Anselm Schuster, (a converted Jew) whose piety and zeal for the salvation of Germans in particular have endeared him to this people, and rendered him a valuable labourer to your Missionary.

"We have commenced to build a church, but cannot complete it on account of the distress bordering on starvation, caused by the failure of last year's crops.

"While we thank God that He has thus signally owned our labours, Satan has been in our midst, to scatter, tear, and slay; but in the midst of persecution and opposition our little Society is steadfast, immovable, saying, Our mercies abound. O that God would bless this Mission more abundantly!"



## CONCLUSION.

The foregoing facts commend themselves to the attention of the friends of the Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and show the *necessity* for a renewed consideration of its claims, and vigorous *ADVANCE* in the path of duty, whether that duty require deeper sympathy for others, more fervent intercession, or abounding benevolence. The reports from every department,—the Indian, the Domestic, the French, and the German, indicate the present ministerial and monetary wants of the Society, and they cannot be justly evaded, unless its position and pledges, and the demands of the country, can be justly disregarded. Besides these Missions, the Society has recently commenced a Seaman's Mission. The spiritual exigencies of thousands of souls, and the very success of the Society, create the necessity for greater effort.

Were it not of paramount importance, it need not by us be yearly reiterated, that the supreme *reason* for Missionary advance is the declared will of God—"Go ye into all the world." Whatever of novelty this command may not now possess, it constantly adds, if that were possible, to its imperativeness; or, its binding requirements are more and more apparent to a Christian man, as the condition and number of religiously destitute men are more and more developed.

The  *motive*  which should impel to the deeds of an augmented zeal and generosity has lost none of its freshness, its beauty, or its force. "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart." Here are the germs of all moral requirements made upon redeemed men, whether they relate to the individual, the family, the community, the church, the world. And to him who loves God, the next commandment is, "Thou shalt love thy neighbour." These two simple precepts derive their irresistible force from the love of God in Christ, and unreservedly and unflinchingly observed, and God believed in for help, they can fill the earth's circumference with Christianity.

And there is *encouragement* to advance. The arena where the universal Church of God wields the weapons of truth is too vast for survey in a colonial report, or facts might be adduced to convince us, if conviction were necessary, that the contest though determined and continued, is on many a desert, prairie, and shore most favourable to the Gospel. The names of prominent Christian contenders will never perish; many a heathen phalanx has submitted; and already it may be said, and is in

Methodist Missionary success in Canada is not an uncertain matter of experiment,—desirable, but as yet prospective. The eye seeth it, and the heart is glad before the Lord. The Annual Reports from the first record the travels and the trials, the liberal gifts, and heavy outlays, and the conflicts, the triumphs, and the trophies of heroism.

The unwavering adherence of so many thousands of annual subscribers is thankfully appreciated; the bequests made are very valuable; the increased awakening of youthful minds to Missionary feeling and liberality promises much; the formation of Juvenile Missionary Associations is seasonable and useful; and the donations which ingenuity makes from the lady's sewing basket, the workshop, the field, the garden, and the barn-yard, help the cause. It is respectfully suggested, whether liberality could be made more systematic; subscriptions increased in amount as in number; the subscriptions obtained immediately after the Missionary Meetings, so that amounts collected as the result of the autumn Meetings may not be unremitted to the Treasurer till the following June; and that Juvenile Missionary Associations be everywhere recommended and assisted. Devise "liberal things." There are some means in the newest settlements, and alertness, system, and application would add to the offerings cast into the Lord's treasury.

It is gratifying specially to remark, that during the diminished harvests of several years, and much commercial depression, many subscribers have not diminished their subscriptions. Others, doubtless, would have done more but for adverse circumstances. This year valley and hill have been prolific, and men praise the Lord for his goodness. Will not thank-offerings multiply on the Missionary altar?

No sincere believer can have to do with CHRISTIAN MISSIONS without finding to his joy, that a blessing is in them for him. It would not be presumption to say, that Redemption has a glorious Missionary character. The Cross, the Bible, the Intercession of Christ, the effusions of the Spirit, the yearnings and words of Infinite Love are eminently Missionary. Here there is a height sanctified men cannot reach; but they can contemplate and aspire, and renew their purpose to glory in Him who permits men to be co-workers with him, and who will be satisfied when the whole world He redeemed is evangelized.

Wise it is to place vigour, and manliness, mind, and affections, and wealth and influence at God's service, and work "while it is day."

The period here for gathering the honours He confers, has many contingencies, and a startling brevity. The day of cessation from labour will come. Happy the friend of Missions, who, when he has said farewell to the scenes of benevolent activity and success, receives this testimony from the lips of Love,—“Well done, good and faithful servant.”

The Committee cannot better close their appeal than in the weighty words of the last Report of the Parent Wesleyan Missionary Society of Great Britain. “In thus reviewing the past, and preparing for the future, the question naturally arises in every thoughtful mind as to the character of the object which calls forth so much of liberality and claims so much of labour. Is it a chimera or a reality?—the day-dream of excited imagination, or a solemn and well-grounded hope? In strict logic, these questions resolve themselves into another concerning the truth of Christianity, which it would be an insult to the supporters of this Society to discuss. But if Christianity is not a mere wave on the restless ocean of human thought,—if Jesus of Nazareth is indeed Prophet, Priest, and King of Men, then the work of making him known, of asserting His claims, and building up his cause, is the highest, noblest, most incumbent duty of His people. Nor, if His Spirit lives in them, can they rest while he remains unknown and dishonoured. Nor, if His word may be trusted, can they labour in vain.”

Every Canadian reader will with conviction and delight concur in the concluding words of this extract:—“There shall be one flock and one Shepherd. The Prince of this world shall be cast out. “And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto ME.”

### ACCOUNT OF DR. TAYLOR'S VISIT TO MISSIONARY STATIONS.

---

*To the Committee of the Wesleyan Missionary Society, in Committee assembled.*

ESTEEMED BRETHREN,—

On receiving my appointment at the last Annual Meeting, I deeply felt in common with all the Members of the Committee, the over-burdened and exhausted state of the Treasury; and the painful fact, that many of our devoted Brethren, who occupy the out-posts of the field, were put upon an allowance not much more than one-half of what was necessary to meet their ordinary claims, and which the most rigid economy would justify. To remedy this serious state of things, it appeared to your Secretary that all available means ought to be used and pushed to their result, by all the officers and friends of the Society. So far as his own personal efforts were concerted, two departments, or modes of action, presented themselves. In the first place, to use every possible effort to increase the contributions to the Society; not so much those of that section of our patrons whose givings have been on the most princely scale, and whose praise is in all the churches—but of a somewhat numerous class still found among our membership and adherents, whose offerings are far below the gospel standard,—the claims of Christ's cause,—and the present pressing and urgent need of the Missionary Society of the Church of their choice and attachment. Could we equalize the contributions of the adherents of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in this Province, in proportion to their circumstances, and make them in any degree commensurate with their ability, we would not only have enough to meet all the present demands of the work, but sufficient funds in the Treasury to undertake a Foreign Mission, and enter one of those numer-

ous doors which everywhere are opening up in the regions beyond, and from which the Macedonian cry is constantly heard, "Come over and help us."

In the second place, the visitation of *all* the Missions appeared to your Secretary as all-important, not merely to learn their state, and rejoice in their prosperity, but to ascertain where the work might in any degree be so re-arranged and abridged as to curtail our expenses, and the cause at the same time not suffer. Also, to stimulate our more wealthy friends, who are members of the Church, on the Domestic Missions, to increased liberality in supporting their Ministers, that the grants to them might be reduced, and the Missions gradually prepared to assume the position of independent Circuits.

To the latter proposition I received many a hearty response, on putting before our friends the present exhausted state of the Treasury.

In pursuance of the first object, viz.: the increase of the funds, I devoted nearly the whole of the time from the first of December until the Conference; and so incessant were my labours, in responding to the invitations of my esteemed brethren, that I slept but one night at home during the whole of that period, and I missed but one appointment. This arose from an attack of neuralgia, brought on by constant excitement. When the regular series of Missionary Meetings terminated, I held Special Meetings on nearly forty Circuits; and the collections, with scarcely an exception, were most liberal and encouraging. I believe that a faithful presentation of the true position and pressing claims of our Missionary Society will not fail to elicit from our people, that generous support which will not only sustain it in the present emergency, but in all coming time.

In visiting the Missions, I considered that the Indian Stations had the first claim. In the early history of our evangelistic labours among those children of the forest, there was a marvellous exhibition of the power and spirituality of our beloved Methodism, and the broad seal and testimony of Jehovah to the true and apostolic character of our Missionary Ministry. Of hundreds of these savingly brought to Christ, a Torrey, Case, Evans, Jones, and others, could truly say, "For the seals of our apostleship are ye in the Lord." My first visit was to Walpole Island, the field of our veteran and well-tried Indian Missionary, Rev. T. Hurlburt, and the occasion the dedication of their new Mission Church to the worship of Almighty God. For the second time in my ministry I preached through an Interpreter, with some degree of comfort, and during the

public service, as well as at the Love-Feast and Sacrament, the presence of the Great Spirit was manifested, and we felt it good to be there. By a serious blunder on the part of a well-meaning but mistaken Brother, an element of weakness has been introduced, and still exists in our operations on that Island. He built the Parsonage in a Canadian Sierra Leone, an island in the middle of a marsh, whose waters are not only unfit to drink, but send up miasma during the autumn, sufficient to poison a whole community. On this account the Missionary is non-resident, which seriously interferes with that vigilant oversight and pastoral care which Indians specially require. I believe, however, that all that can be done under these circumstances is being done, by their true and faithful friend, the present Missionary. If the Parsonage were removed to the front of the island, or another built immediately opposite it on the mainland, it would doubtless be a great benefit, as the Missionary then could live among his people. Monday being New Year's-Day, I found myself in the novel position of occupying the seat of honour at the head of the table at a sumptuous Indian feast, prepared wholly by themselves. As the Indians and their wives came around the table, so neatly furnished and well arranged, we had a most striking proof of the benefits which Christianity has conferred on them, even in their physical and personal comforts. If to this we add, the still higher proof we had of the same glorious fact in the Love-Feast, and the Prayer Meeting, we may well exclaim with regard to this once degraded but interesting people, "For our Gospel came not unto you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Ghost, and in much assurance." And before the Editor of the *Westminster Review* sits down to write the next article to attempt to prove that Christian Missions have been a failure, I would like to take him to two or three of our Indian Mission Stations; and then let him visit two or three bands that are yet in paganism, and if he were not convinced of his folly and error, I would put him with Hymenaeus and Alexander, whom the Apostle delivered unto Satan, that they might learn not to blaspheme.

We had a successful and interesting Missionary Meeting at Sarnia, and though the agents of another Church have troubled us, and alienated a few of our people, the large majority are still firm adherents of our Church, and the work is on the whole prosperous. When we entered the old Council Room, which is used as a Church, we found it decorated with evergreens, worked into chaplets, wreaths, festoons, and mottoes, executed by the Indians with so much elegance and taste, that they would not be out of place in the Floral Hall of the Provincial Exhibition.

The small band at Rice Lake is rather diminishing than increasing, owing to circumstances which we cannot control, although the devoted Missionary is assiduous in his attention to their interests. On visiting some of our Indian Missions the painful fact forces itself upon our attention, viz. :—that when the old ones die others are not raised up to take their places; and the children in this respect are inferior to the fathers. Their migratory and roving habits, by which families, schools, and farming operations, are broken up and neglected, proves highly prejudicial and, in some cases, ruinous to the rising generation. In my addresses to them I directed special attention to this state of things, and used every argument and mode of appeal of which I was capable to make an impression; and sometimes the falling tear, the piercing glance, or the significant nod of the head, showed that they felt, at least for the time, the truth of the statements, and the necessity of reformation.

My visit to our old Mission in Alnwick was highly gratifying, and I trust productive of good to the interests of the cause. As the Indians there understand English nearly as well as the Whites, it was very pleasant to be able to preach to them without an interpreter; and as the little band is completely surrounded by our people on the adjacent Circuit, the sooner the Mission is blended with, and becomes a part of the Circuit, the better will it be for both, and the more satisfactory to the Missionary. The congregation on Sabbath was large, and the meeting on Monday well attended and interesting.

Our Mission at New Credit presents the very peculiar feature of embracing within its bounds remnants of three or four different tribes, who speak as many different languages; and, to be benefited, each band must be addressed in their own tongue directly, or through an Interpreter. The Missionary is laborious and devoted, and the Mission premises are comfortable, especially the church, which is a monument of the taste and liberality of our Indian brethren. The congregation was large and enthusiastic, among whom our good brother Herkimer was conspicuous, filled with all the fire and fervour of youth. A brass band, composed wholly of Indians, discoursed sweet music, and played some favourite airs in the yard at the close of the meeting.

My visit to Muncey was very pleasant; and though the congregation was rather small on Sabbath, it was fully made up on Monday afternoon in the large meeting on the opposite side of the river. In the Indian, as well as some other departments of the work, there is much need of the Spirit being poured from on high, that we may witness again those

glorious displays of Divine power which characterized the early history of the work of God among those children of the forest, through the instrumentality of our Church.

My next department of labour was the visitation of the Domestic and French Missions in Canada East, on which I will make but a few general remarks, as a detailed account would be altogether too lengthy for this Report. My visits in the Stanstead, Quebec, and part of the Montreal Districts, were arranged under the direction of the late lamented Chairman of the former, the Rev. R. A. Flanders, who, I presume, in accordance with his own mode of working, laid out for me six engagements a week, on six different fields of labour, through the hottest of the weather in July and August. Such was the anxiety of our beloved and now sainted brother, that I should know and get a favourable impression of the work in the townships, that he volunteered to become my travelling companion and cicerone over nearly the whole of his District, that he might fully explain the peculiar circumstances of each Mission, and the reasons why some of them that ought to have been self-sustaining some years ago are still incumbents on the Missionary Society.

Our departed friend was a large-hearted and noble man, a true and genial companion, a sincere and devout Christian, and a laborious and successful Minister of the Lord Jesus. And in the very prime of life, and to our limited knowledge, in the midst of his usefulness, while his eye was not yet dim, and his natural strength not abated, he heard the Master's summons to his glory and his crown.

Every traveller in the Eastern Townships cannot fail to be charmed with the beauty of the face of the country, as well as the picturesque and romantic scenery of many noted localities. From Clarenceville to St. Armand; from St. Armand through Frelighsburgh and Knowlton to East Bolton; from East Bolton, round the foot of the matchless Lake Memphremagog to Georgeville, and thence to Stanstead Plain, and Compton and Hatley, not to speak of the valley of the St. Francis, presents to the tourist a series of landscapes to which Canada West, even in its choicest spots, can furnish no parallel. The traveller will also be delighted to find that the country is so well settled, and that the settlements generally date back to a period when the greater part of Upper Canada was an unbroken forest. And when the traveller is a Methodist Preacher, he is still more delighted to learn that the Missionaries of his Church preached the Gospel at the principal points thirty, forty, and in a few instances, even fifty years ago. And when he sees the country so



well settled, and the inhabitants generally so comfortable in their circumstances, and learns further that the Methodist Church is not second to any other in its influence and the number of its adherents, how great will be his astonishment to find that but a small fraction of these Missions or Circuits are self-sustaining, and that the large majority of them are still pensioners as they were years ago on the Missionary Society.

For this state of things the following reasons are given and urged in extenuation of their position :—In the first place, our Members have been accustomed to depend on what may be termed, Foreign Aid, and expected the great Wesleyan Missionary Society in England to make up all deficiencies in the salaries of their Ministers ; and I was informed that an official member on one of our Missions said in the course of the past year,—“ Our Minister has a rich Society at his back, and if we do not pay his salary they will make it up.”

In the next place there has been a constant drain on our Church in the townships, by emigration to the West, and very few have come in to fill their places; and what has been a serious loss to them has been a gain to the Methodism of the great West, both in Canada and the United States.

All these points were freely and fully discussed with our leading members and friends at my visit to each Mission, and I am happy to state that the discussion in a majority of cases produced immediate results. When I gave them a full account of the present state and position of our Missionary Society, many expressed their willingness to the immediate adoption of a scale of annual reduction of the grants until the whole are relinquished, and the Missions become independent and self-sustaining Circuits. The work of retrenchment has been already inaugurated, and will be productive of most beneficial effects, both to our friends and the Society.

The next department to which I wish to direct the attention of the Committee, is our Mission work among our fellow-subjects, the French Canadians of Eastern Canada.

I saw all our Agents, and visited the principal localities where they have been labouring. I cannot report any great success or ground of encouragement. In the prosecution of our work in a field where the opposing force has every point guarded by an agency that knows no surrender, we need a peculiar class of labourers—“ For a great door, and effectual, is opened unto us, and there are many adversaries.”

I visited the Rev. Mr. Salmon, an Agent in another department of our Missionary field, viz. : the Seamen of the City of Quebec, and obtained from him the following statistics of his work, which extends also to the military, who are engaged in erecting the new fortifications at Point Levy :—He has four Sabbath appointments, and two or three during the week. Average congregation on board of ship, forty; and the aggregate hearers when the fleet is in, about one hundred. Some three or four in each congregation are professed followers of Christ, and the Missionary is well received. One regular Sabbath service with the soldiers, at which there is an average attendance of fifty, and the total number of adherents about one hundred. Brother Salmon thinks that an Institution will be erected for the benefit of the seamen, with a Library, Reading Room, and other privileges: and should he be appointed to take charge of it, it would relieve the Missionary Society of his support to a considerable extent, while it would not interfere with the proper discharge of his work as a Missionary.

I visited Gaspé, our most easterly post, and although the voyage was disagreeable, from the crowded and defective accommodations of the Government steamer, yet my visit was of the most delightful and memorable character. Those simple-minded and warm-hearted people are chiefly fishermen from the Channel Islands, whose vernacular is the French, and their social religious services are all conducted in that language. At the village of Gaspé Basin, there are a few highly respectable families from New Brunswick, who are members and adherents of our Church; but they came to the wrong place, as they expected to follow the lumbering business, where there is no suitable timber. Fishing is the great business of Gaspé, which now frequently fails, and then they are as poor and shiftless as fishermen generally are in all parts of the world. They received me with the utmost cordiality and christian affection; and with tearful eyes and throbbing breasts, manifested their deep and heartfelt sympathy with our cause. I preached, and held three public meetings, and the collections were equal to those of any part of my tour in the most favoured localities.

After visiting the remaining Missions in the Montreal District, from Cavignol to Shawbridge, I journeyed by Rail to the Upper Ottawa, to visit all the Missions on the Pembroke District. My visits were generally pleasant, the congregations large, and frequently composed of Roman Catholics as well as Protestants, representing the leading influence in the community. I invariably detained our own people at the close, and gave them a faithful stirring up on their duty, as well as some words of

spiritual encouragement. I was delighted to find that our Church stood so strong in the beautiful county town of Renfrew, which at no distant day will be a place of considerable importance. The Church is comfortable and beautifully located, and a parsonage is on the way, a fine, brick structure, and at the request of the ladies, I delivered a lecture at the Tea-Meeting to help on the project.

After this our comfort ended, so far as the country and our work are concerned, for in the fulness of our benevolence and evangelistic zeal, we have been distributing our labourers over a country, which will be worse twenty years from the present than it is now, for it is the most wretched and hopeless country inhabited by civilized man on which I ever gazed. I travelled twenty miles consecutively, without seeing arable land in one place sufficient to make a farm of two hundred acres.

To minister to those few souls who are scattered here and there among the ragged and rocky steeps of that wretched country, is a work of charity and mercy; but a majority of them belongs to a class among whom *even* Methodism cannot hope to win many trophies. Of other sections of our widely extended Mission field, an account will be given in the next Report,
