REPORT OF
LIEUT.-COL. J. M. DELAMERE, QUEEN'S OWN RIFLES OF CANADA
COMMANDING BISLEY TEAM, 1900.

TORONTO, 8TH SEPTEMBER, 1900

Lieut.-Col. the Hon. J. M. Gibson,
President Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

SIR:—As the Commanding Officer of the Canadian Bisley Team for the year 1900 I beg leave to report as follows:—

The members of the team had been notified by the Secretary of the D. R. A. to report in Montreal to the Adjutant, Major F. S. Mackay, at the Carslake Hotel, at 9 a.m. on the 21st June. All the members reported and I inspected them at the Armouries of the 65th Regiment at 11 a.m. same day, where I found all the uniforms complete with one exception, which through the kindness of Lieut.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, Superintendent of Militia Stores, was supplied, forwarding it to me at Rimouski by mail.

The team paraded again at 8 o'clock in the evening, and were escorted by the 65th Regiment, headed by their bands, to the dock, where the R. M. S. Lake Ontario was lying. I must here thank Lt.-Colonel Labelle and the officers of the 65th Regiment for their very hearty send off.

The team had excellent quarters on board ship, and I cannot say too much for the kind manner in which Captain Carey and the ship's company tried to make things as comfortable as possible for the team during the whole voyage across. All the members of the team spoke in the highest terms of their treatment while on board.

On arrival at Liverpool I telegraphed to the Caretaker of the Canadian Building at Bisley, asking if it was ready for occupation, but could get no reply, owing to the fact that the telegraph station was not yet open at Bisley and telegrams were not delivered at Bisley from Brookwood Station. On reaching London I again telegraphed with the same result, so I concluded that night in London and proceeded to Brookwood early next morning. My conclusion to do so proved correct, as had the team gone on direct to Brookwood we would have arrived late at night, with no arrangements for food, nor transport for men or luggage from the station to Bisley. The team that afternoon (July 3) got out to practice, although there was a very heavy hail storm, and the wind strong and gusty.

Practice was diligently continued until the matches commenced.

I might here say arrangements for practice should be made months before the team arrives, so that targets could be secured, and a great deal of delay prevented, as other teams want practice also and get there before our team and secure the ranges.

In regard to the team itself I must say their conduct from the time the ship sailed from Montreal until the Matches were over, was all that could be desired, and the greatest harmony prevailed, each one doing his utmost to bring credit to Canada and the Dominion Rifle Association.

In the Kolapore Match, I regret to say, the team only took third prize, a portrait of General Sir Redvers Buller, V.C., which I had placed in the Canadian Building.

The usual At Home was given on Thursday, 19th July, and was very successful, about 500 guests being present. During the afternoon Lord Strathcona presented the winners with the cup he so liberally presents each year to the team, and also the Canada Cup, Staff-Sergeant McVittie, of the 48th Highlanders, being the winner of the former, and Lieut. Smith, 59th Regiment, the latter. By the kind permission of the Officer Commanding, the excellent band of the 71st Highland Light Infantry, played selections during the At Home.

The team is also indebted to Mr. Colmer, C.M.G., of the High Commissioner's office, for very many acts of kindness, and also to Mr. James Johnston, who did all in his power to assist us.

I cannot conclude my report without expressing my entire satisfaction in the way my Adjutant, Major F. S. MacKay, 65th Regiment, performed his duties, and to his energies the success of the team is greatly due. I also wish to thank Major Boyce Thompson, Queen's Own Rifles, who acted as Quarter Master. He was of the greatest assistance to me from the moment we reached Liverpool until the matches were all completed.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association
1900.

The Council have the honour to present the 33rd Annual Report of the Association, and are glad to be able to congratulate the members upon the prosperity which has attended the work of the Association during the year.

His Excellency the Governor-General's continued interest in the welfare of the Association is a source of much satisfaction to the Council, while his gift of \$500 to the Prize List, together with a similar sum added by the Association, renders "The Governor-General's Match" a very attractive feature of the Annual Prize Meeting.

To the many valued trophies and cups held by the Association, there has been added "The Harold L. Borden Memorial Cup," the gift of the Honourable F. W. Borden, M.P., Minister of Militia and Defence, in memory of his only son, an officer of the 1st Battalion, Royal Canadian Dragoons, who was killed near Pretoria on the 16th July, 1900, while gallantly leading his men in repelling an attack by the Boers. In placing upon record their acceptance on behalf of the Riflemen of Canada of this memorial cup, the Council desire to give expression to their deep sympathy with Surgeon Lt.-Colonel the Honourable F. W. Borden, and members of his family, in their sad bereavement, and to ask them to receive the assurance that the members of the Dominion Rifle Association will always honour this memorial cup as a tribute to a brave Canadian soldier, who met his death while responding to the call of duty in the time of his country's need.

The thanks of the Association are due :

1. To the Government and members of the House of Commons for the annual grant of \$10,000, and also for the grant of \$1,500 towards the completion of the Pavilion at Rockliffe.
2. To the Minister of Militia and Defence, for the free issue of ammunition for the Annual Prize Meeting, which was much appreciated by competitors.
3. To James Buchanan, Esq., of Glasgow, Scotland, for a generous contribution of 100 guineas. This handsome donation formed the "Grand Aggregate" prize, which was this year known as "The Buchanan Grand Aggregate Match."
4. To the Hon. the Postmaster-General for the convenient postal arrangements provided during the Annual Matches.

5. To Ross & Co. (Limited) London, England, for the gift of a handsome prismatic Binocular Glass, which was awarded as the prize in the Extra Series Aggregate; also to the Webley & Scott Revolver and Arms Co., of Birmingham, England; to the Colt's Patent Fire Arms Co., of New Haven, U.S.A., for the contribution each of two handsome revolvers, and to Major L. G. Drummond, Scots Guards and late Military Secretary of His Excellency the Governor-General, for the gift of a Silver Cup. These contributions were much appreciated, and formed substantial additions to the prizes for revolver shooting.

7. To the Mayor and Corporation of the City of Ottawa for the supply of water on the Range during the Prize Meeting.

The Annual Matches were held on the Rockcliffe ranges, commencing on Monday, 27th August. While the attendance was slightly less than that of the former year, there being 377 as against 424 in 1899, the meeting in other respects was probably one of the most successful in the history of the Association. The weather throughout was fine; the ammunition used was very good; the scoring was high, and the absence of any complaints attested to the general satisfaction which prevailed.

Your Council, through the kindness of Colonel D. A. Macdonald, Chief Superintendent of Stores, were enabled to provide three kinds of ammunition for the use of competitors, and their action in this matter met with general approval. The following quantities of each kind of ammunition were used during the meeting:

The Council have pleasure in recording their appreciation of the manner in which the Executive Officer, Lt.-Colonel W. C. Macdonald, 48th Highlanders, and the Officers of the Range Staff performed their respective duties. To their exertions is due in no small degree the success which attended the meeting.

The Council were pleased to welcome Major General R. H. O'Grady-Haly, C.B., D.S.O., recently appointed to the command of the Canadian Militia, who

was a constant visitor at the Ranges during the meeting. The Major General Commanding evinced much interest in the matches, and became a Life Member of the Association.

The extension of the Electric Railway from the terminus at Rockcliffe to the Rifle Range rendered necessary the construction and equipment of three and three-quarter miles of road, (double track) which was built by the Ottawa Electric Railway Company in an unprecedentedly short time under the immediate direction of the Company's Superintendent, Captain J. E. Hutcheson, to whom the Dominion Rifle Association is greatly indebted for his energetic action in having the road available for traffic during the week of the Prize Meeting, proving, as it did, a great boon to competitors and all others visiting the Ranges. The Department of Militia and Defence supplied the rails and ties used in the construction of the road; the right of way, except in the case of about an eighth of an acre, purchased from the Parks Commission by the Dominion Rifle Association, being granted free by Thomas C. Keefer, Esq., C.M.G., The Messrs. Bronson, and the Municipal Council of the Township of Gloucester. To these donors the Council desires to express its grateful appreciation of their public spirited generosity. The Association are under many obligations to Lt.-Col. Tilton, Chairman of the Executive Committee, for the work done by him in connection with the extension of the electric railway to the Ranges, and desire to express their appreciation of his efforts in bringing this matter to a satisfactory conclusion, as well as their best thanks for his exertions at all times on behalf of the Association and its various interests.

The Reception given by the President of the Association and Mrs. Gibson was very largely attended and passed off most successfully. The guests were received in the Entrance Hall of the Pavilion and refreshments were served upstairs on the spacious verandahs of the building, while the band of the Governor General's Foot Guards, stationed on the lawn, played an excellent selection during the afternoon.

To the friends of the Association who have kindly made contributions towards the furnishing of the Rockcliffe Pavilion and Offices of the Association, the Council offers its best thanks.

The donations received to date include Marble Clock, from Major H. M. Pellatt, 2nd Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto; Clock for hall and office from Messrs. P. W. Ellis & Co., Toronto; Oak Writing Table from Lt.-Col. H. H. McLean, 62nd Fusiliers, St. John; Bronze Statue of "Victory" on Marble Pedestal, from R. A. Dickson, Esq., Montreal; Verandah Arm Chairs from Lt.-Col. Hon. E. G. Prior, M.P., Victoria, B.C.; Verandah Arm Chairs from Lt.-Col. A. M. Smith, 7th Fusiliers, London, Ont.; Two Camp Beds, complete, Lt.-Col. Jas. Mason, R. O., Toronto. Other donations in kind have been promised and contributions in money (now in the hands of the Secretary, but not yet expended) have been made by Lt.-Cols. H. McLaren, 13th Regt., G. E. Allan Jones, 8th Royal Rifles,

and J. B. McLean, D. Y. O. Hussars, Major Wicksteed, R.L., and John Christie, Esq., of Ottawa.

A large cooking range used on board the S.S. "Sardinian," on the voyage to Cape Town with the 2nd (special service) Battalion of the Royal Canadian Regiment was, on the return of the "Sardinian" to Montreal, transferred to the Militia Stores, and by the Department of Militia and Defence, after having been put in perfect order, placed in the Rockcliffe Building. Messrs. Prowse, of Montreal, who constructed the range especially for the contingent, had placed thereon a plate with the following inscription, "In Service. S.S. 'Sardinian.' First Contingent, Royal Canadian Regiment."

The Council have observed with much pleasure the erection on the Rockcliffe Range of a Regimental Bungalow, by the 43rd O. & C. Rifles. The building is neat in its structure and is admirably adapted for its purpose. It is hoped that the good example set by this energetic Regiment may be followed by other regiments and associations, whose representatives meet each year on the Range.

With regret the Council have to record the deaths during the year of three of the Life Members of the Association, Lt.-Colonel Cosby, 48th Highlanders, Toronto; the Hon. A. R. Dickey, Q. C., Amherst, N. S., formerly Minister of Militia and Defence, and F. Wolferston Thomas, Esq., of Montreal.

The Association has recently been incorporated by Act of the Dominion Parliament, a copy of which will be found in the Report,

In the opinion of your Council it has become necessary to modify the terms of competition under which the matches of the Association are fired, with a view of bringing them more in harmony with modern conditions as regards rifle shooting. With the introduction of the magazine rifle and smokeless powder, conditions have greatly changed.

Your Council suggest that next year, matches be introduced into the regular programme that will necessitate quick aiming without the use of those adventitious aids that are popular in prize competitions, but impossible in active service, and that if practicable, more general firing at disappearing targets and at irregular distances be arranged.

The present time is opportune for urging the encouragement and development of rifle practice throughout Canada. Your Council understand that the Depart-

ment of Militia and Defence have under consideration regulations looking to improvement in rifle training and musketry instruction.

The war in South Africa has shown the great power possessed by a few rifles in defence, when in the hands of marksmen, and the question for consideration is, how the great bulk of the men of the country who, in case of war or invasion, must take their place in the ranks of the Canadian army, can be made fairly good shots.

It is useless to disguise the fact that the present system of musketry training has not proved adequate to the needs of the Militia, and it is hoped that the changes now being considered will provide for better educating the soldier in a knowledge of his rifle, and the skill necessary to use it effectively.

Facility for practice must be afforded if proficiency is to be attained, and it is hoped that no time may be lost in providing throughout the Dominion local ranges, convenient of access for the greatest number to secure this result. Large Ranges are not necessary. A Range equipped with from four to six targets will generally be sufficient. While long ranges are desirable, where these are not practicable, a Range of from 500 to 500 yards will suffice, as the man who can shoot with accuracy at the shorter ranges will soon, for all practical purposes and without much difficulty, acquire proficiency at the longer Ranges.

It is desirable that the long range Magazine Rifles should be issued to all Militia Corps with the least possible delay. A number of Corps are still armed with the obsolete Snider, and not until the Lee-Enfield is in the hands of the whole force can we look for that interest and improvement in rifle shooting that is so necessary.

The present allowance of ammunition, 40 rounds per man, is entirely insufficient to teach a man how to shoot, and the quantity to be of any practical value should be at least 200 rounds for every man in the force, and should be expended under careful supervision.

The Government grants to Regimental and Local Associations, to assist in defraying the cost of marking and the incidental and necessary expenses of practice and matches should be increased, the sums now granted necessitating the additional expenditure of a comparatively large sum, which comes out of the pockets of the officers and men, who feel that they are already heavily taxed for the support of the force.

Under proper supervision, and subject to certain necessary restrictions, the establishment of Rifle Clubs should be encouraged. In doing so, however, care should be taken that they do not interfere with the efficiency of the Militia force.

The formation of Cadet Corps for general military training, and particularly for inculcating in the youth of this country military principles and the art of Rifle Shooting should be encouraged. A feature of Rifle Meetings throughout

the country might be matches for the special benefit of Cadets. They would thereby obtain the advantages to be derived from contact with skilled rifle shots. Many would eventually become not only efficient members of the Militia, but in the event of mobilization for defence would become valuable additions to the forces of the Dominion.

Much benefit to the cause of rifle shooting would undoubtedly accrue from the appointment of an Inspector of Rifle Training and the establishment of Regimental Musketry Instructors.

Your Council submit these suggestions to the earnest consideration not only of the riflemen of Canada, but of all who are really interested in seeing that this most necessary department of our military system is developed and administered in a manner calculated to permanently advance the cause of rifle shooting.

Much can be accomplished by united effort, and all who value their country's best interests, and recognize the part she must play in future as an integral portion of the British Empire, should aid in the good work of perfecting our military system and training, thus strengthening the hands not only of the military authorities, but of the various rifle associations and organizations throughout the country, who are promoting the cause of rifle shooting which is and must always be of paramount importance to the Dominion.

FINANCE.

The fees from affiliating Rifle Associations this year amounted to \$445.00 as against \$469.00 received in 1899, a decrease of \$24.00. The number affiliating this year being seven Provincial and nineteen Regimental and County Rifle Associations.

The receipts from members' fees to date amount to \$816.00, including the amount received from competitors with entrance fees to matches, against \$588.00 last year, showing an increase from this source of \$228.00. This increase was due to the new regulation, requiring all competitors to become full members.

Special Donations amount to \$1,151.00 as against \$1,220.00 contributed in 1899, a decrease of \$69.00.

Donations from Banking institutions in Canada amounted to \$725.00, the same as last year.

Entry fees to matches, including post entry fees and challenge shots, fines, &c., (less refunds) amounted to \$4,646.33, as against \$4,780.64 received last year, showing a decrease of \$134.31.

Cash Prizes, including the cost of a special gold medal, amounted to \$7,231.00 as against \$7,481.20 distributed in 1899, a decrease of \$250.20.

The expenditure on account of the Bisley Team of 1900 amounted to \$4,777.49 as against \$4,949.90 in 1899, a decrease of \$172.41. A detailed statement of the expenditure by Lt.-Colonel J. M. Delamere, Commanding the Team of 1900, will be found in the Appendix.

Receipts from ordinary sources for the year amounted to \$17,901.01. Add to this the sum of \$193.45 received for rent of the Bisley Building from Volunteer Corps in England, together with special advances from the Ontario Bank of \$5,775.40, showing a total of \$23,869.86 at credit side of the account.

The total expenditure amounts to \$24,411.41, which embraces the following special charges, viz., for Bisley Building account, \$267.28; new building, furnishing and work of a permanent character on Rockcliffe Ranges, \$1,045.12; Interest Account, \$41.26; repayment of balance of loan to Ontario Bank of \$2,000 on account of 1899, and the sum of \$3,635.42, for the purchase of railway ties supplied by the Ottawa Electric Railway Co., for extension of their line to the Rockcliffe Rifle Ranges. This latter sum is to be repaid to the Association by the Department of Militia and Defence.

This leaves a balance on the debit side of \$541.55.

A Statement of the Bisley Building Account will be found in the Appendix, showing an outlay during the year of \$267.28, made up of the usual annual charges for wages of Caretaker, Insurance, ground rent, local taxes and the cost of furnishing additional iron beds.

It will be observed by the Statement referred to that the balance due to the funds of the Association on Capital Account, and the annual charges for maintenance of the Bisley building since its completion in 1897 to date, amounts to the sum of \$4,033.65.

Certain minor repairs to the building, and painting, with a view to preserving the shingles on the roof, are necessary and arrangements are being made to have this work done.

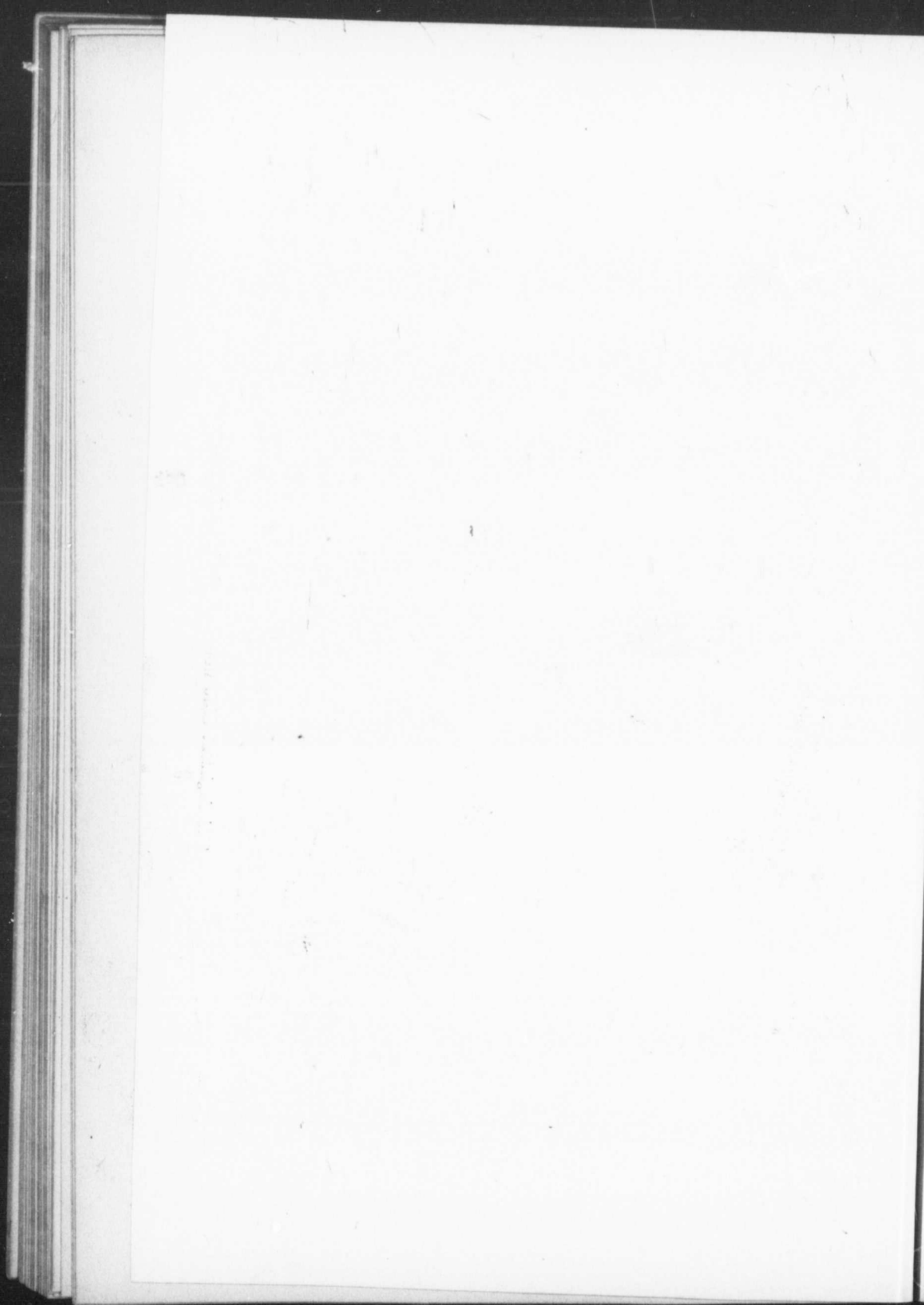

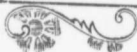

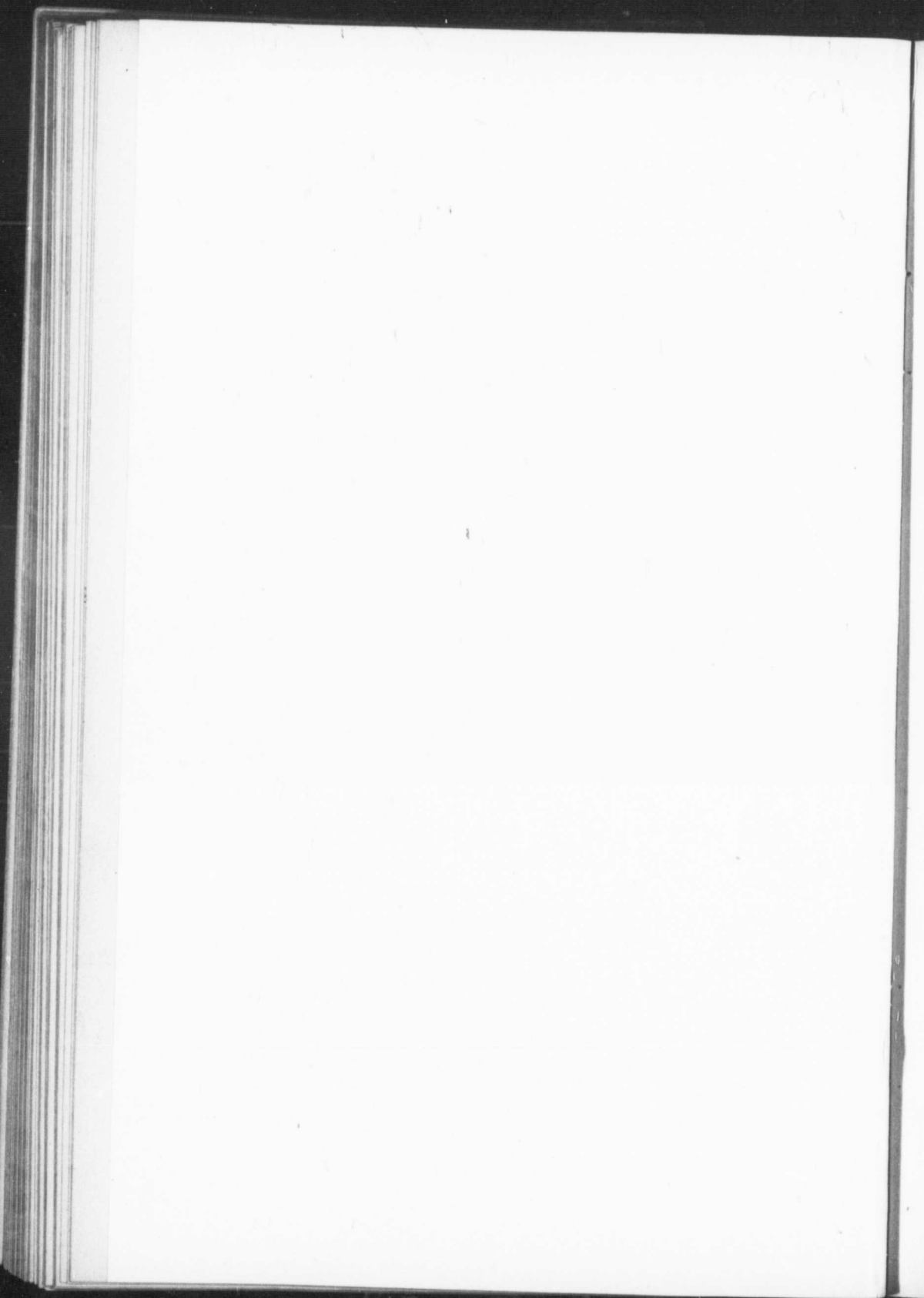

REPORT OF
LIEUT.-COL. J. M. DELAMERE, QUEEN'S OWN RIFLES OF CANADA
COMMANDING BISLEY TEAM, 1900.

TORONTO, 8TH SEPTEMBER, 1900

Lieut.-Col. the Hon. J. M. Gibson,
President Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

SIR:—As the Commanding Officer of the Canadian Bisley Team for the year 1900 I beg leave to report as follows:—

The members of the team had been notified by the Secretary of the D. R. A. to report in Montreal to the Adjutant, Major F. S. Mackay, at the Carslake Hotel, at 9 a.m. on the 21st June. All the members reported and I inspected them at the Armouries of the 65th Regiment at 11 a.m. same day, where I found all the uniforms complete with one exception, which through the kindness of Lieut.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, Superintendent of Militia Stores, was supplied, forwarding it to me at Rimouski by mail.

The team paraded again at 8 o'clock in the evening, and were escorted by the 65th Regiment, headed by their bands, to the dock, where the R. M. S. Lake Ontario was lying. I must here thank Lt.-Colonel Labelle and the officers of the 65th Regiment for their very hearty send off.

The team had excellent quarters on board ship, and I cannot say too much for the kind manner in which Captain Carey and the ship's company tried to make things as comfortable as possible for the team during the whole voyage across. All the members of the team spoke in the highest terms of their treatment while on board.

On arrival at Liverpool I telegraphed to the Caretaker of the Canadian Building at Bisley, asking if it was ready for occupation, but could get no reply, owing to the fact that the telegraph station was not yet open at Bisley and telegrams were not delivered at Bisley from Brookwood Station. On reaching London I again telegraphed with the same result, so I concluded that night in London and proceeded to Brookwood early next morning. My conclusion to do so proved correct, as had the team gone on direct to Brookwood we would have arrived late at night, with no arrangements for food, nor transport for men or luggage from the station to Bisley. The team that afternoon (July 3) got out to practice, although there was a very heavy hail storm, and the wind strong and gusty.

Practice was diligently continued until the matches commenced.

I might here say arrangements for practice should be made months before the team arrives, so that targets could be secured, and a great deal of delay prevented, as other teams want practice also and get there before our team and secure the ranges.

In regard to the team itself I must say their conduct from the time the ship sailed from Montreal until the Matches were over, was all that could be desired, and the greatest harmony prevailed, each one doing his utmost to bring credit to Canada and the Dominion Rifle Association.

In the Kolapore Match, I regret to say, the team only took third prize, a portrait of General Sir Redvers Buller, V.C., which I had placed in the Canadian Building.

The usual At Home was given on Thursday, 19th July, and was very successful, about 500 guests being present. During the afternoon Lord Strathcona presented the winners with the cup he so liberally presents each year to the team, and also the Canada Cup, Staff-Sergeant McVittie, of the 48th Highlanders, being the winner of the former, and Lieut. Smith, 59th Regiment, the latter. By the kind permission of the Officer Commanding, the excellent band of the 71st Highland Light Infantry, played selections during the At Home.

The team is also indebted to Mr. Colmer, C.M.G., of the High Commissioner's office, for very many acts of kindness, and also to Mr. James Johnston, who did all in his power to assist us.

I cannot conclude my report without expressing my entire satisfaction in the way my Adjutant, Major F. S. MacKay, 65th Regiment, performed his duties, and to his energies the success of the team is greatly due. I also wish to thank Major Boyce Thompson, Queen's Own Rifles, who acted as Quarter Master. He was of the greatest assistance to me from the moment we reached Liverpool until the matches were all completed.

The buildings at Bisley were found to be well taken care of, and the Dominion Rifle Association is to be congratulated on having such careful and trustworthy people in charge.

I enclose herewith detailed accounts of Receipts and Expenditures, Acquittance Roll, Prizes Won, divided and undivided, also Aggregate scores and scores of all the teams in the Kolapore Match.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association
1900.

The Council have the honour to present the 33rd Annual Report of the Association, and are glad to be able to congratulate the members upon the prosperity which has attended the work of the Association during the year.

His Excellency the Governor-General's continued interest in the welfare of the Association is a source of much satisfaction to the Council, while his gift of \$500 to the Prize List, together with a similar sum added by the Association, renders "The Governor-General's Match" a very attractive feature of the Annual Prize Meeting.

To the many valued trophies and cups held by the Association, there has been added "The Harold L. Borden Memorial Cup," the gift of the Honourable F. W. Borden, M.P., Minister of Militia and Defence, in memory of his only son, an officer of the 1st Battalion, Royal Canadian Dragoons, who was killed near Pretoria on the 16th July, 1900, while gallantly leading his men in repelling an attack by the Boers. In placing upon record their acceptance on behalf of the Riflemen of Canada of this memorial cup, the Council desire to give expression to their deep sympathy with Surgeon Lt.-Colonel the Honourable F. W. Borden, and members of his family, in their sad bereavement, and to ask them to receive the assurance that the members of the Dominion Rifle Association will always honour this memorial cup as a tribute to a brave Canadian soldier, who met his death while responding to the call of duty in the time of his country's need.

The thanks of the Association are due :

1. To the Government and members of the House of Commons for the annual grant of \$10,000, and also for the grant of \$1,500 towards the completion of the Pavilion at Rockliffe.
2. To the Minister of Militia and Defence, for the free issue of ammunition for the Annual Prize Meeting, which was much appreciated by competitors.
3. To James Buchanan, Esq., of Glasgow, Scotland, for a generous contribution of 100 guineas. This handsome donation formed the "Grand Aggregate" prize, which was this year known as "The Buchanan Grand Aggregate Match."
4. To the Hon. the Postmaster-General for the convenient postal arrangements provided during the Annual Matches.

5. To Ross & Co. (Limited) London, England, for the gift of a handsome prismatic Binocular Glass, which was awarded as the prize in the Extra Series Aggregate; also to the Webley & Scott Revolver and Arms Co., of Birmingham, England; to the Colt's Patent Fire Arms Co., of New Haven, U.S.A., for the contribution each of two handsome revolvers, and to Major L. G. Drummond, Scots Guards and late Military Secretary of His Excellency the Governor-General, for the gift of a Silver Cup. These contributions were much appreciated, and formed substantial additions to the prizes for revolver shooting.

7. To the Mayor and Corporation of the City of Ottawa for the supply of water on the Range during the Prize Meeting.

The Annual Matches were held on the Rockcliffe ranges, commencing on Monday, 27th August. While the attendance was slightly less than that of the former year, there being 377 as against 424 in 1899, the meeting in other respects was probably one of the most successful in the history of the Association. The weather throughout was fine; the ammunition used was very good; the scoring was high, and the absence of any complaints attested to the general satisfaction which prevailed.

Your Council, through the kindness of Colonel D. A. Macdonald, Chief Superintendent of Stores, were enabled to provide three kinds of ammunition for the use of competitors, and their action in this matter met with general approval. The following quantities of each kind of ammunition were used during the meeting:

The Council have pleasure in recording their appreciation of the manner in which the Executive Officer, Lt.-Colonel W. C. Macdonald, 48th Highlanders, and the Officers of the Range Staff performed their respective duties. To their exertions is due in no small degree the success which attended the meeting.

The Council were pleased to welcome Major General R. H. O'Grady-Haly, C.B., D.S.O., recently appointed to the command of the Canadian Militia, who

was a constant visitor at the Ranges during the meeting. The Major General Commanding evinced much interest in the matches, and became a Life Member of the Association.

The extension of the Electric Railway from the terminus at Rockcliffe to the Rifle Range rendered necessary the construction and equipment of three and three-quarter miles of road, (double track) which was built by the Ottawa Electric Railway Company in an unprecedentedly short time under the immediate direction of the Company's Superintendent, Captain J. E. Hutcheson, to whom the Dominion Rifle Association is greatly indebted for his energetic action in having the road available for traffic during the week of the Prize Meeting, proving, as it did, a great boon to competitors and all others visiting the Ranges. The Department of Militia and Defence supplied the rails and ties used in the construction of the road; the right of way, except in the case of about an eighth of an acre, purchased from the Parks Commission by the Dominion Rifle Association, being granted free by Thomas C. Keefer, Esq., C.M.G., The Messrs. Bronson, and the Municipal Council of the Township of Gloucester. To these donors the Council desires to express its grateful appreciation of their public spirited generosity. The Association are under many obligations to Lt.-Col. Tilton, Chairman of the Executive Committee, for the work done by him in connection with the extension of the electric railway to the Ranges, and desire to express their appreciation of his efforts in bringing this matter to a satisfactory conclusion, as well as their best thanks for his exertions at all times on behalf of the Association and its various interests.

The Reception given by the President of the Association and Mrs. Gibson was very largely attended and passed off most successfully. The guests were received in the Entrance Hall of the Pavilion and refreshments were served upstairs on the spacious verandahs of the building, while the band of the Governor General's Foot Guards, stationed on the lawn, played an excellent selection during the afternoon.

To the friends of the Association who have kindly made contributions towards the furnishing of the Rockcliffe Pavilion and Offices of the Association, the Council offers its best thanks.

The donations received to date include Marble Clock, from Major H. M. Pellatt, 2nd Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto; Clock for hall and office from Messrs. P. W. Ellis & Co., Toronto; Oak Writing Table from Lt.-Col. H. H. McLean, 62nd Fusiliers, St. John; Bronze Statue of "Victory" on Marble Pedestal, from R. A. Dickson, Esq., Montreal; Verandah Arm Chairs from Lt.-Col. Hon. E. G. Prior, M.P., Victoria, B.C.; Verandah Arm Chairs from Lt.-Col. A. M. Smith, 7th Fusiliers, London, Ont.; Two Camp Beds, complete, Lt.-Col. Jas. Mason, R. O., Toronto. Other donations in kind have been promised and contributions in money (now in the hands of the Secretary, but not yet expended) have been made by Lt.-Cols. H. McLaren, 13th Regt., G. E. Allan Jones, 8th Royal Rifles,

and J. B. McLean, D. Y. O. Hussars, Major Wicksteed, R.L., and John Christie, Esq., of Ottawa.

A large cooking range used on board the S.S. "Sardinian," on the voyage to Cape Town with the 2nd (special service) Battalion of the Royal Canadian Regiment was, on the return of the "Sardinian" to Montreal, transferred to the Militia Stores, and by the Department of Militia and Defence, after having been put in perfect order, placed in the Rockcliffe Building. Messrs. Prowse, of Montreal, who constructed the range especially for the contingent, had placed thereon a plate with the following inscription, "In Service. S.S. 'Sardinian.' First Contingent, Royal Canadian Regiment."

The Council have observed with much pleasure the erection on the Rockcliffe Range of a Regimental Bungalow, by the 43rd O. & C. Rifles. The building is neat in its structure and is admirably adapted for its purpose. It is hoped that the good example set by this energetic Regiment may be followed by other regiments and associations, whose representatives meet each year on the Range.

With regret the Council have to record the deaths during the year of three of the Life Members of the Association, Lt.-Colonel Cosby, 48th Highlanders, Toronto; the Hon. A. R. Dickey, Q. C., Amherst, N. S., formerly Minister of Militia and Defence, and F. Wolferston Thomas, Esq., of Montreal.

The Association has recently been incorporated by Act of the Dominion Parliament, a copy of which will be found in the Report,

The Council submit herewith :

1. The Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditure, duly audited.
2. The Report of Lt.-Colonel J. M. Delamere, Queen's Own Rifles of Canada, commanding the Bisley Team of 1900, with the financial and other statements accompanying the same.

In the opinion of your Council it has become necessary to modify the terms of competition under which the matches of the Association are fired, with a view of bringing them more in harmony with modern conditions as regards rifle shooting. With the introduction of the magazine rifle and smokeless powder, conditions have greatly changed.

Your Council suggest that next year, matches be introduced into the regular programme that will necessitate quick aiming without the use of those adventitious aids that are popular in prize competitions, but impossible in active service, and that if practicable, more general firing at disappearing targets and at irregular distances be arranged.

The present time is opportune for urging the encouragement and development of rifle practice throughout Canada. Your Council understand that the Depart-

ment of Militia and Defence have under consideration regulations looking to improvement in rifle training and musketry instruction.

The war in South Africa has shown the great power possessed by a few rifles in defence, when in the hands of marksmen, and the question for consideration is, how the great bulk of the men of the country who, in case of war or invasion, must take their place in the ranks of the Canadian army, can be made fairly good shots.

It is useless to disguise the fact that the present system of musketry training has not proved adequate to the needs of the Militia, and it is hoped that the changes now being considered will provide for better educating the soldier in a knowledge of his rifle, and the skill necessary to use it effectively.

Facility for practice must be afforded if proficiency is to be attained, and it is hoped that no time may be lost in providing throughout the Dominion local ranges, convenient of access for the greatest number to secure this result. Large Ranges are not necessary. A Range equipped with from four to six targets will generally be sufficient. While long ranges are desirable, where these are not practicable, a Range of from 500 to 500 yards will suffice, as the man who can shoot with accuracy at the shorter ranges will soon, for all practical purposes and without much difficulty, acquire proficiency at the longer Ranges.

It is desirable that the long range Magazine Rifles should be issued to all Militia Corps with the least possible delay. A number of Corps are still armed with the obsolete Snider, and not until the Lee-Enfield is in the hands of the whole force can we look for that interest and improvement in rifle shooting that is so necessary.

The present allowance of ammunition, 40 rounds per man, is entirely insufficient to teach a man how to shoot, and the quantity to be of any practical value should be at least 200 rounds for every man in the force, and should be expended under careful supervision.

The Government grants to Regimental and Local Associations, to assist in defraying the cost of marking and the incidental and necessary expenses of practice and matches should be increased, the sums now granted necessitating the additional expenditure of a comparatively large sum, which comes out of the pockets of the officers and men, who feel that they are already heavily taxed for the support of the force.

Under proper supervision, and subject to certain necessary restrictions, the establishment of Rifle Clubs should be encouraged. In doing so, however, care should be taken that they do not interfere with the efficiency of the Militia force.

The formation of Cadet Corps for general military training, and particularly for inculcating in the youth of this country military principles and the art of Rifle Shooting should be encouraged. A feature of Rifle Meetings throughout

the country might be matches for the special benefit of Cadets. They would thereby obtain the advantages to be derived from contact with skilled rifle shots. Many would eventually become not only efficient members of the Militia, but in the event of mobilization for defence would become valuable additions to the forces of the Dominion.

Much benefit to the cause of rifle shooting would undoubtedly accrue from the appointment of an Inspector of Rifle Training and the establishment of Regimental Musketry Instructors.

Your Council submit these suggestions to the earnest consideration not only of the riflemen of Canada, but of all who are really interested in seeing that this most necessary department of our military system is developed and administered in a manner calculated to permanently advance the cause of rifle shooting.

Much can be accomplished by united effort, and all who value their country's best interests, and recognize the part she must play in future as an integral portion of the British Empire, should aid in the good work of perfecting our military system and training, thus strengthening the hands not only of the military authorities, but of the various rifle associations and organizations throughout the country, who are promoting the cause of rifle shooting which is and must always be of paramount importance to the Dominion.

FINANCE.

The fees from affiliating Rifle Associations this year amounted to \$445.00 as against \$469.00 received in 1899, a decrease of \$24.00. The number affiliating this year being seven Provincial and nineteen Regimental and County Rifle Associations.

The receipts from members' fees to date amount to \$816.00, including the amount received from competitors with entrance fees to matches, against \$588.00 last year, showing an increase from this source of \$228.00. This increase was due to the new regulation, requiring all competitors to become full members.

Special Donations amount to \$1,151.00 as against \$1,220.00 contributed in 1899, a decrease of \$69.00.

Donations from Banking institutions in Canada amounted to \$725.00, the same as last year.

Entry fees to matches, including post entry fees and challenge shots, fines, &c., (less refunds) amounted to \$4,646.33, as against \$4,780.64 received last year, showing a decrease of \$134.31.

Cash Prizes, including the cost of a special gold medal, amounted to \$7,231.00 as against \$7,481.20 distributed in 1899, a decrease of \$250.20.

The expenditure on account of the Bisley Team of 1900 amounted to \$4,777.49 as against \$4,949.90 in 1899, a decrease of \$172.41. A detailed statement of the expenditure by Lt.-Colonel J. M. Delamere, Commanding the Team of 1900, will be found in the Appendix.

Receipts from ordinary sources for the year amounted to \$17,901.01. Add to this the sum of \$193.45 received for rent of the Bisley Building from Volunteer Corps in England, together with special advances from the Ontario Bank of \$5,775.40, showing a total of \$23,869.86 at credit side of the account.

The total expenditure amounts to \$24,411.41, which embraces the following special charges, viz., for Bisley Building account, \$267.28; new building, furnishing and work of a permanent character on Rockcliffe Ranges, \$1,045.12; Interest Account, \$41.26; repayment of balance of loan to Ontario Bank of \$2,000 on account of 1899, and the sum of \$3,635.42, for the purchase of railway ties supplied by the Ottawa Electric Railway Co., for extension of their line to the Rockcliffe Rifle Ranges. This latter sum is to be repaid to the Association by the Department of Militia and Defence.

This leaves a balance on the debit side of \$541.55.

A Statement of the Bisley Building Account will be found in the Appendix, showing an outlay during the year of \$267.28, made up of the usual annual charges for wages of Caretaker, Insurance, ground rent, local taxes and the cost of furnishing additional iron beds.

It will be observed by the Statement referred to that the balance due to the funds of the Association on Capital Account, and the annual charges for maintenance of the Bisley building since its completion in 1897 to date, amounts to the sum of \$4,033.65.

Certain minor repairs to the building, and painting, with a view to preserving the shingles on the roof, are necessary and arrangements are being made to have this work done.

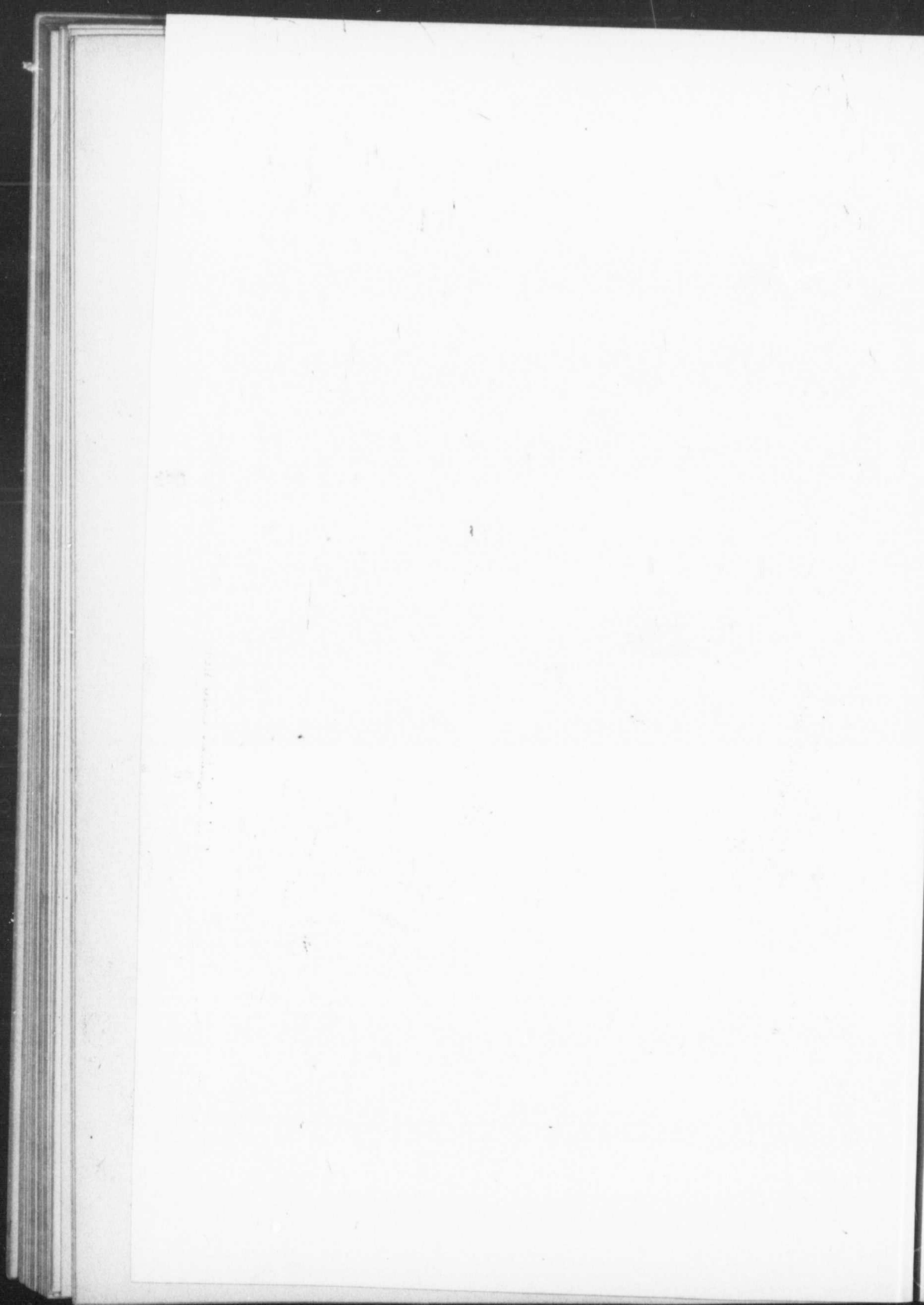

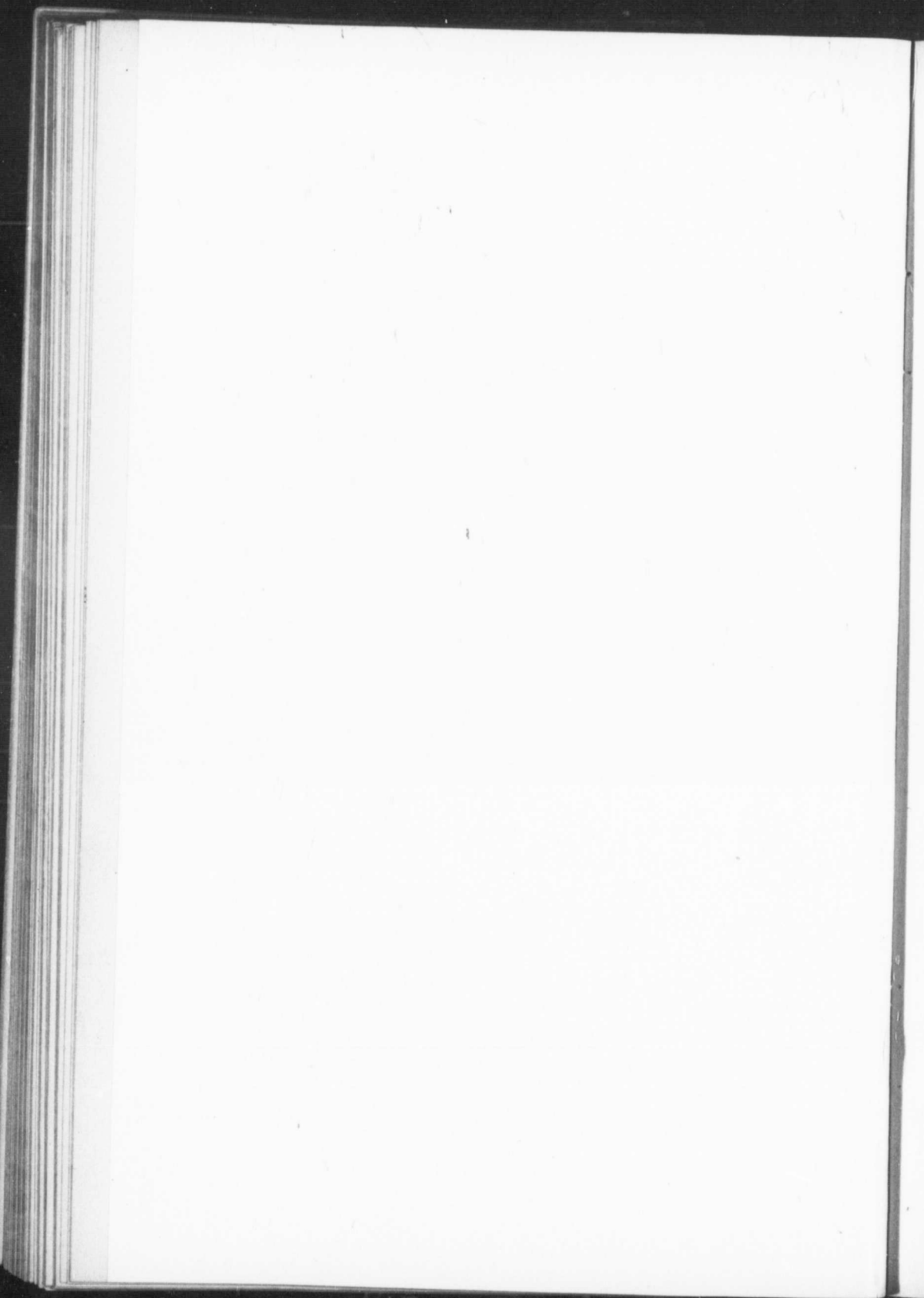

The Bisley Team for 1901 will be selected by the Executive Committee from those prize winners in the "Buchanan" Grand Aggregate Match, who are efficient members of the Active Militia, and their places on the list shall be determined by the total of their scores in the "Buchanan" Grand Aggregate Match. The Association reserves to itself the right to pass over, for cause, any of the winners of places in making up the team, and to cancel, amend, alter or add to, the Regulations under which previous teams have been sent to Bisley.

It is, however, to be understood that the sending of a team to England in 1901 is dependent upon the action taken by the National Rifle Association with regard to their matches of that year, and the state of the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association.

Annual General Meeting, held on Wednesday, the 21st February, 1900.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association, held in the Railway Committee Room of the House of Commons, on Wednesday, the 21st February, 1900, at 11 o'clock a.m.

Present : Lt.-Col. the Hon. E. G. Prior, P.C., M.P., one of the Vice-Presidents of the Association, in the chair; Colonel Foster, Q.M. General; Lt.-Colonels Tilton, F. C. Henshaw, G. R. Starke, J. M. Delamere, H. R. Smith, J. Bruce, F. Toller, A. H. Macdonald, W. H. Cotton, A.A.G.A.; J. Tucker, B. H. Vidal, D.O.C.; J. Peters, D.O.C., A.D.C.; D. T. Irwin, A.D.C.; D. A. Macdonald, W. P. Anderson; Majors W. C. Macdonald, W. M. Blaiklock, S. C. D. Roper, F. S. Mackay, N. F. MacNachtan, J. S. Thorn; Captains W. M. Andrews, A. T. Kirkpatrick, C. E. A. Patterson, and H. H. Gray; Messrs. E. B. Osler, M.P.; Major the Hon. Jas. Sutherland, M.P.; Wm. Gibson, M.P.; Mr. Wm. White, and the Secretary and Treasurer.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton spoke, regretting the absence of His Excellency the Governor General, and the President of the Association, and moved, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Delamere,

“That the chair be taken by Lt.-Colonel Hon. E. G. Prior, M.P., a Vice-President of the Association.”—Carried.

Colonel Prior, in taking the chair, said that he regretted exceedingly the absence from the meeting of His Excellency the Governor-General; the Minister of Militia and also of Lt.-Colonel Gibson, the President of the Association. Since the members of the D. R. A. had last met together, very momentous happenings had transpired throughout the British Empire. In the sending of the various Canadian contingents, Canada had been intimately associated in these events. That day they had heard tidings which must kindle grief as well as joy in the hearts of all patriotic citizens. Canadian blood had been spilled in defence of the Mother Country, and there were sad hearts at home. Nevertheless, he was sure he voiced the feelings and sentiments of all present, and of all Canada, when he said that there were thousands more who were ready and willing, and even anxious to go and serve in the places of those who had fallen.

He called upon the Secretary to read the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, when it was, on motion, resolved that the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, as printed in the Annual Report, be taken as read and confirmed.

Col. Prior moved, seconded by Mr. Wm. Gibson, M.P.

“That the Annual Report as printed, be received, accepted as read, and adopted.—Carried.

Lt.-Col. Henshaw rose to make some explanations with respect to the paragraph on page 38 of the Report of the Council, relating to his offer of \$500 for prizes in matches where moving targets would be introduced. His intention had been that the money he proposed to donate, should be devoted to the procuring of these targets. Major-General Hutton had made the suggestion in this particular, and he thought it was an excellent one. He understood the cost would be some \$2,000 or \$3,000. His primary object was the procuring of the targets. Col. Henshaw was assured that his wishes and intentions with respect to his donation would be carried out.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel John Bruce, seconded by Major W. C. Macdonald :

“ That the thanks of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association be tendered to His Excellency the Governor-General for his continued interest in the success of the Association, and for his contribution of \$500 to the Prize List for 1899.—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel F. C. Henshaw, seconded by Lt.-Col. Tucker, M.P.:

“ That the thanks of the Association be tendered to the Government and to Parliament for the annual grant of \$10,000 voted at the last Session.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel John Tilton, seconded by Major W. C. Macdonald:

“ That the Association desires to convey to Surg. Lt.-Col. Hon. F. W. Borden, M.P., Minister of Militia and Defence, its cordial thanks for his continued and gratifying interest in its work; also for his personal contribution of \$100 to the Prize List; for the grant of free ammunition for last year's competition, and especially for the financial aid which rendered possible the erection last year of the commodious building at the Rockcliffe Ranges.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel J. M. Delamere, seconded by Lt.-Colonel E. B. Ibbotson:

“ That the thanks of the Association be given to Major-General E. T. H. Hutton, C.B., A. D. C. to Her Majesty the Queen, for the practical interest he has displayed in the work of the Association, and also for his generous contribution to the Prize List for 1899.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Geo. R. Starke, seconded [by Lt.-Colonel Fred. Toller:

“ That the best thanks of the Association be given

(a) To Lt.-Colonel Fred. Massey, Chairman of the Council, and to Messrs. Ahearn & Soper, of Ottawa, for their contributions of \$100 each towards the Prize List.

(b) To Major Drummond, Scots' Guards, Governor-General's Secretary, and to the Colt's Repeating Arms Co., for the valuable prizes offered by them for competition in the Revolver Matches at the last Annual Meeting.

(c) To the Right Hon. Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, and to the Smokeless Powder Co., of London, for the prizes contributed by them to the Prize List of 1899.

(d) To Messrs. H. & A. Allan, of Montreal, for free pass to Liverpool and back for Mr. Jno. Deslauriers, the Steward of the Bisley Team.

(e) To Mr. Jno. Masson, of Toronto, for a handsome clock for the Bisley building.

(f) To the Hon. the Postmaster General, for the postal facilities upon the Range during the Prize Meeting at Rockcliffe.

(g) And also to the Right Hon. Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal and to the Canada Club, of London, England, for their generous contributions of silver cups for competition amongst the members of the Bisley Team."—Carried.

The Chairman read a letter from Lt.-Colonel Fred. Massey, of Montreal, expressing a desire to serve for another year on the Council of the Association, and also a telegram to Lt.-Colonel Starke, late Commanding the Victoria Rifles from Mr. Jno. A. Barry, of Montreal, as follows :

"Brother killed Sunday last in Africa. I have served seven years under you in the Vics. Would ask you to use your best influence with Minister of Militia to have me take his place. Am ready any time, and willing, if necessary, to pay all expenses."

The reading of the telegram elicited much applause.

Major the Hon. Jas. Sutherland, M.P., at the request of the Chairman, addressed the meeting.

He regretted, as others had done, the absence of the Governor-General, the President of the Association, and the Hon. the Minister of Militia, and of others whose presence was always a matter of much importance. In accepting a vote of thanks to the Minister of Militia, he felt that it had been adopted without mere formality. Everyone felt that Dr. Borden took a deep interest in his Department. On behalf of the Government he could say that it would still continue to take an active and substantial interest in the Association, and now was the opportune time to take advantage of the war fever and promote to the fullest degree the efficiency of the Militia, and for practical measures. Personally, the Speaker promised his most active support. All the Government wanted was good advice and the co-operation of the Association. They were willing to do everything in their power.

Hon. Mr. Sutherland's remarks were received with much applause.

Colonel Foster, Quartermaster-General and Chief Staff Officer, said that as he was merely acting for the General Officer commanding, he had not much to say. As an engineer he was more concerned with the study of the construction of defences from bullets, than of shooting. He was much astonished at the improvements and advances made in rifle shooting. He used to think that 2,000

yards was a very considerable and extended range, but now it was twice that distance. A range of 1,000 yards could no longer be considered as a first-class range, it should be extended to at least 1,500 yards. The fact that the country was at present deficient in ranges was not altogether the fault of the Militia Department. There were places such as Montreal and Quebec which were without ranges. It was the same state of affairs in England. With reference to the range at Montreal, the Minister of Militia was anxious to arrange it, but the expense of acquiring the necessary land and equipping the range was very great. This one range would cost as much as storehouses or armouries for one-half of the militia of Canada. He expressed regret that General Hutton's departure should have taken place just before the meeting of the Association, in the work of which he knew General Hutton took a deep interest.

Lt.-Colonel Peters, A.D.C. Acting D.O.C., Toronto, was then called on by the chair to address the meeting. He suggested that perhaps it was somewhat of presumption on his part to open his mouth at all, seeing it was his first attendance at the D.R.A. However, the Association were the people to address on rifle shooting. The rifle was after all the thing—marching, manual, etc., being only secondary considerations. The militia at present were practically useless. Of what avail were the 40 rounds of ammunition a year? The British service fired annually 100 rounds, and the Americans from 600 to 1,000 rounds. He referred as an example to his own experience in British Columbia, and the Rifle Association there. Out of 600 or 800 militia, there were 40 or 50 representatives at the meet. Take out the civilians and the old professional shots who came year after year, and perhaps twenty-five were men from the militia. Each year there might be about one young newcomer, who probably went away disgusted at N.C.O.'s and men wrangling over their scores, and such like unsoldierly behaviour. This was not right. How could such young men be encouraged to take part in Provincial matches? They can't travel, and it is left to the professional shots who are sure of making their expenses in prizes. Col. Peters favored the system of battalion matches, such as at Vancouver, where shots are classed and handicapped, thus giving all a chance; by this way two-thirds of the militia get good practice. What good was the \$75 granted to the Vancouver Association? This was a hard subject to advance, because the old professional shots would not listen to any proposals tending towards a change. When they had not listened to him he had spoken to the militia. They held a meeting and put in militia men. Thus there had been a general improvement. This was the way in which to make the interest more general. He protested against a system which tended only to make shots already sufficiently good for the purpose still more perfect, and neglected the majority.

Moved by Lt.-Col. H. R. Smith, seconded by Mr. E. B. Osler, M.P.:

“ That the Association deeply regrets to record the death of Lt.-Col. The Hon. G. A. Kirkpatrick, P.C., K.C.M.G., late Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, and President of the Association from 1884 to 1892. They feel that in his death

they have lost a valued colleague whose practical interest in the Militia of Canada has in no small degree contributed to its advancement and efficiency."—Carried by a standing vote.

Moved by Lt.-Col. H. R. Smith, seconded by Lt.-Col. Fred. C. Henshaw :

" That this Association desire to place on record its deep and heartfelt sympathy with the families of those who have died so gallantly in defence of the rights of the Empire, and earnestly prays that Almighty God will give to those who are bereaved strength and fortitude to bear their great sorrow."—Carried by a standing vote.

Lt.-Col. Tilton moved, seconded by Mr. Wm. Gibson, M.P.:

" That Clause 2 of the Constitution be amended by adding after the words 'current Association year,' the words, 'and shall have the privilege of taking part as a competitor in the Annual Matches,' and by striking out all the words in the said section after and including the words 'any person may become an Associate Member,' in the fifth line thereof."—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Tilton, seconded by Major W. C. Macdonald :

" That the thanks of the Association be tendered to the Auditors for their gratuitous services during the past year."—Carried.

9. That the selection of the officer to command and the Adjutant of the Bisley team be left in the hands of the President of the Association, the Chairman of Council, and the Chairman of the Executive Committee.
10. That the Executive Committee of Council are hereby empowered to make the necessary arrangements for the assembling of the Bisley team for 1900, to decide the date of embarkation, and to incur the expense of sending it.
11. That the Annual Prize Meeting of the Association do commence on Monday, the 27th August, 1900.
12. That the Executive Committee of Council are hereby authorized to prepare a Prize List, not exceeding \$7,000, and the rules and regulations under which the Prize Meeting of 1900 shall be conducted, and to issue the same not later than the 1st day of July, 1900.
13. That the Executive Committee of Council are hereby given the necessary authority to incur the expense of preparing the Range and Camp at Rockcliffe, and to make all the other arrangements to insure a successful carrying out of the Prize Meeting of 1900.
14. That the following sub-committee be appointed to fully consider the finances of the Association and report on the best means of putting them on a more solid basis, viz.: Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Anderson, Bruce and Macpherson, Majors Macdonald and J. J. Mason, and Captain Sutherland.
15. That Lt.-Colonel Tilton be requested to approach the Minister of Militia with the request that a plan of the Rockcliffe Ranges be made and a certain portion reserved for the uses of the Association; also that a portion be blocked out on which buildings could be erected by the different regiments who might be desirous of putting up such buildings, and that all plans be approved by the Department of Militia and Defence before being erected.
16. That the Chairman of the Executive Committee and the Secretary be authorized and instructed to take the necessary action to have the Association duly incorporated.

Present: Lt.-Col. Wm. White, C.M.G.; Lt.-Col. Tilton, Lt.-Col. Bruce, Maj. McRobbie, Pte. C. T. Burns, Major McNaughton, Capt. H. C. Blair, Major W. Henderson, Pte. T. Mitchell, Pte. D. McMartin, Capt. W. S. Russell, Capt. R. Dillon, Major G. Hayes, Capt. Woodside, Capt. King, Capt. Herring, Pte. W. Fowler, Pte. Bennett, Sergt. Drysdale, Major R. A. Helmer, Lt.-Colonel W. C. Macdonald, Capt. John Suckling, Capt. Harris, Surgt.-Lt. Bertram, Capt. Jas. Dover, Sergt. Ivens, Sergt. C. E. Cribb, Staff-Sergt. R. J. Taylor, Pte. Annand, Capt. Brown and Lt.-Colonel Hodgins, Secretary of the D.R.A., and others.

The chair was taken by Lt.-Colonel Tilton, who in opening the meeting and addressing the competitors, said that he thought the Executive might well extend its congratulations to the competitors on the favorable arrangements characterizing this year's matches. He expressed regret that the President, Lt.-Colonel Gibson, was unable to be present at the meeting, but he was expected here very shortly. He referred to the railway extension as one of the great boons to the meeting. He always knew that it must come, but he hardly thought that it would be an accomplished fact this year.

He congratulated the competitors on the success of the meeting, which was under changed conditions. The Association had recently become in-

incorporated, and the proceedings at the meetings were not mere recommendations, but had all the force of the regular annual meeting, except that officers could not be elected. He regretted that with all the impetus given to rifle shooting, the Association membership was only about 250. If the D. R. A. members exercised a little energy, the number might be enormously increased. He appealed to the competitors to do all in their power to awaken interest not only in the D. R. A. but in the local associations.

Surg. Major March, of the 8th Hussars, New Brunswick, proposed a vote of thanks to Lt.-Col. Tilton, for his energy in the interests of the Association and especially in the direction of securing railway communication to the Ranges.

Lt.-Col. Macdonald, of the 48th Highlanders, seconded the motion, and in doing so paid a tribute to Lt.-Col. Tilton's energetic work for the Association.

The motion was carried with a standing vote, and accompanied by three cheers for Lt.-Col. Tilton.

Lt.-Col. Tilton acknowledged the compliment, and in doing so briefly alluded to the history of the D. R. A. Speaking of the railway extension, he paid a compliment to Superintendent Hutcheson, and expressed appreciation of the manner in which the parks board and private citizens had aided in securing the right of way.

Lt.-Col. Bruce, of the Royal Grenadiers, spoke in reference to an increase in the membership of the Association, and suggested that ladies should be admitted to the D. R. A. and a match set apart for them.

Lt.-Col. Tilton said that Ottawa ladies were already considering the formation of a rifle club, and some had participated in practice. He had seen a lady lie down on the range the other day and make four inners. (Applause.) He would take pleasure, however, in bringing Col. Bruce's suggestion before the Executive.

Capt. Dillon thought that so long as the rural corps were without ranges the attendance at the D.R.A. matches would be small. He considered that every county, or if possible, every regiment should have a range.

Gunner Burns, of Halifax, said that the want of ranges was not the important point. What was necessary, he thought, was that an interest should be taken in the matches by commanding officers, who should do all in their power to encourage rifle shooting in their corps. If this were done the membership would be increased.

Qr.-Mr. Sergt. Black briefly expressed the need of rifle ranges. Complaint was also made that one of the ranges for the London Merchants' Cup had been increased to 800 yards, while many corps had no opportunity for practice at such a distance.

Capt. Curran, 12th Regiment, strongly expressed the opinion that the railway fares and personal expenses of the marksmen should be reduced.

Speaking of the range accommodation, Lt.-Col. Tilton said that the smaller provinces were not the only ones without ranges, but the matter was being remedied as quickly as possible.

Capt. Lordly expressed regret that the conditions of the competition for the London Merchants' Cup had been altered by the introduction of shooting at 800 and 900 yards, in view of the fact that the various provincial associations had not the necessary range accommodation. He expressed satisfaction at the great improvement made in the Time Table of the matches.

The meeting then adjourned.

NATIONAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA.

To the Riflemen of Canada :

GREETING : At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Rifle Association of America, held in New York on December 22nd, 1900, it was resolved : That the National Rifle Association of America hold an International rifle shooting competition in the month of September, 1901, on the range of the National Guard of the State of New Jersey, U.S.A., located at Sea Girt, and that the Centennial Trophy "Palma," emblematic of the World's Championship, the gift of the citizens of the United States, be again put up for competition, along with such other prizes as the committee of arrangements may decide, and that the Secretary be authorized to send invitations, in the name of the Association, to the riflemen of all countries where rifle shooting is prominent, to send a team to participate in the said tournament.

In conformity with the above resolution I have the honor to extend the invitation herewith, and state that it would afford the National Rifle Association of America, as well as the riflemen of the United States, great pleasure to welcome to this country a team of representative riflemen from Canada.

Visiting teams will be supplied without cost by the military authorities of the State of New Jersey with tentage, blankets and camp equipage.

The Sea Girt Rifle Range is located on the New Jersey coast, midway between New York and Philadelphia. Express trains from either place, which run with great frequency, make the journey in ninety minutes. The City of Buffalo, State of New York, U.S.A., where the Pan-American Exposition will be held, is only a twelve hour journey from Sea Girt. Visiting riflemen could therefore visit the Exposition either before or after the tournament.

MATCHES.

THE CENTENNIAL TROPHY PALMA MATCH—*Value of Trophy, \$1,500*—For the Championship of the World. The conditions are: Teams of eight men; fifteen shots each at 800, 900 and 1,000 yards.

THE HILTON TROPHY MATCH—*Value of Trophy, \$3,000*—The conditions are: Teams of twelve men; seven shots each at 200, 500 and 600 yards.

In addition to the above are matches for regimental, battalion and company teams with the rifle, and for troop and squadron teams with the carbine and revolver, as well as matches for club teams shooting with sporting rifles.

There will also be special prizes for the best average and high scores in the World's Championship Match.

RIFLES AND AMMUNITION.

All teams must shoot with the national military arm of the country which they represent, without any alteration of any kind.

The ammunition must be standard, in original packages, as issued by the Government for troops in the field.

Positions allowed are: at 200 yards, standing; 300 yards, kneeling or sitting; 500 and 600 yards, prone, with head toward the target; 800, 900 and 1,000 yards, any position.

TARGETS.

The targets to be used in the World's Championship Match and the dimensions and count on same are as follows:

THIRD CLASS TARGET—4 x 6 feet. 200 and 300 yards.

Bulls-eye, 8 in. in diameter, counts 5; centre, 20 in. in diameter, counts 4; inner, 32 in. in diameter, counts 3; outer, remainder of target, counts 2.

SECOND CLASS TARGET—6 feet square. 500 and 600 yards.

Bulls-eye, 22 in. in diameter, counts 5; centre, 36 in. in diameter, counts 4; inner, 48 in. in diameter, counts 3; outer, remainder of target, counts 2.

FIRST CLASS TARGET—12 x 6 feet. 800, 900 and 1,000 yards.

Bulls-eye, 3 feet in diameter, counts 5; center, 4½ feet in diameter, counts 4; inner, 6 feet in diameter, counts 3; outer, remainder of target, counts 2.

63-64 VICTORIA, CHAP. 99.

An Act to incorporate the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.*(Assented to 7th July, 1900.)*

WHEREAS the voluntary association now existing under the name of the Dominion Rifle Association has, by its petition, prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. Lieut.-Colonel the Honourable J. M. Gibson, Lieut.-Colonel Sam Hughes, the Honourable R. R. Dobell, Lieut.-Colonel Edwin B. Beer, Lieut.-Colonel C. J. Macdonald, Captain the Honourable Hugh John Macdonald, Lieut.-Colonel the Honourable E. G. Prior, Lieut.-Colonel J. A. Longworth, Lieut.-Colonel Fred Massey, Lieut.-Colonel John Tilton, Lieut.-Colonel W. E. Hodgins, and Lieut.-Colonel John Macpherson, members of the voluntary association mentioned in the preamble, together with such persons as become members of the association hereby incorporated, are incorporated under the name of "The Dominion of Canada Rifle Association," hereinafter called "the Association."

2. The officers and council of the said voluntary association at the time this Act is passed shall be the officers and council of the Association until the first general meeting of the Association or until their successors are elected, and the constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations of the said voluntary association at the time this Act is passed shall continue to be the constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations of the Association, so far as they are consistent with this Act, until repealed or amended in the manner prescribed by this Act.

3. All property, real and personal, now belonging to the said voluntary association is hereby transferred to and vested in the Association, its successors and assigns.

4. The head office of the Association shall be in the city of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario.

5. At the first general meeting of the Association, and at each annual general meeting, the Association shall elect a president of the Association, a vice-president for each province and a Council composed of members of the Association elected to represent each province, the number of such representatives to be fixed by by-law.

6. The Council may, in all things, administer the affairs of the Association, and may make any description of contract which the Association may, by law, enter into, and may make by-laws for the following purposes:—

- (a) To regulate the number of members of the council.
- (b) The number of members of the council to represent each province and the method of their election.
- (c) The appointment, duties and removal of all officers and servants of the Association and their remuneration.
- (d) The time and place of holding all meetings of the Association, council and committees and the quorum thereof and voting thereat,
- (e) The fees and membership of the Association.
- (f) To fill vacancies occurring in the council and committees.
- (g) The conduct in all other particulars of the affairs of the Association, and for carrying out its objects and powers.

Executive
Committee of
Council.

7. The Council may elect from among its members a committee to be called the Executive Committee, and the Council may, by resolution, delegate to the Executive Committee power to make by-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in Section 6 of this Act, which by-laws shall thereupon be of the same force and effect as if made by the Council.

Objects of
Association.

8. The objects and powers of the Association shall be—

- (a) To promote and encourage rifle shooting throughout Canada;
- (b) To establish, regulate, control and carry on annual prize competitions at or near the City of Ottawa;
- (c) To affiliate and unite with other associations and clubs having for their object the promotion of rifle shooting;
- (d) To acquire, hold and dispose of such real property as is necessary or desirable for the purposes of the Association;
- (e) To erect and furnish such buildings as are deemed necessary for its purposes and objects, and alienate, lease and dispose thereof;
- (f) To borrow money on mortgage of its real estate, or upon any other security, for such time and for such purposes as it sees fit;
- (g) To become a party to promissory notes and bills of exchange for the purposes or objects of the Association, as the council considers necessary or advisable.

By-laws.

9. Every by-law, rule or regulation made by the Council, or by the Executive Committee under its authority, shall have force until the next annual general meeting of the Association, and in default of confirmation thereat shall cease and become void; provided that any by-law, rule or regulation passed by the Council or the Executive Committee may be repealed or amended by the Association at any annual general meeting or any special general meeting called for the purpose.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING. 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00. and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and shall have the privilege of taking part as a competitor in the Annual Matches, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.
3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Report.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.
4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.
7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.
8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :—

Fourteen from Ontario, Ten from Quebec, Six from Nova Scotia, Six from New Brunswick, Four from Manitoba, Four from British Columbia, Four from Prince Edward Island, Two from each of the North West Territories, so soon as

Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations, one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the District Officers commanding districts, *being members of the Dominion Rifle Association*, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Secretary and a Treasurer at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either

from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the general Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof, the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Amended 1881 and 1882.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The Meetings of first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Council Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notice to the members must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any member of the Council. The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting. Finance Committee.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or, in his absence, by some one of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Expenditure of sums for current expenses.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association. Expenditure of a general nature.

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditure shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November. Annual Accounts.
