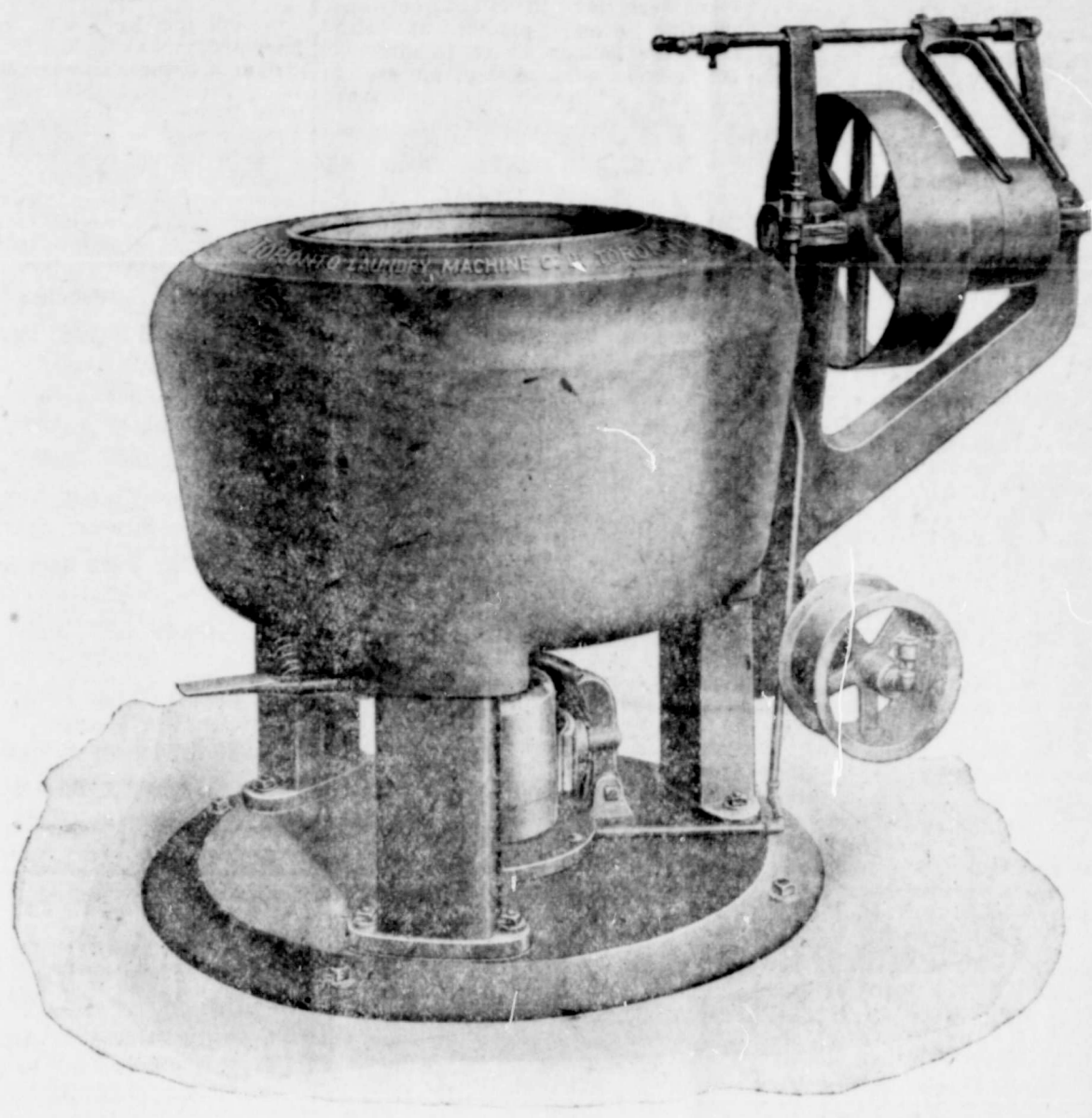

Death of Col. John F. Finerty

John F. Finerty, editor of The Chi-
cago Citizen, and one of the best
known Irishmen in America, died a
few days ago at his home in Chicago.
Mr. Finerty has been ill for several
months. He underwent an operation
some time ago and appeared to be
on the road to recovery. A few
weeks ago his condition was such
that another operation was found ne-
cessary. He suffered from cancer of
the stomach.

Mr. Finerty was born September
10, 1846, in Galway, Ireland. He
came to the United States in 1864,
and served in the Union Army. Short-
ly after the close of the war he went
to Chicago. He immediately took up
newspaper work, acting successively
as reporter, city editor and corres-
pondent. From 1876 to 1882 he acted
as correspondent for the Chicago
Times, in the Indian wars, where he
had many thrilling experiences. In
1883 he was elected to Congress,
where his oratorical gifts won him
fame.

Archbishop of Trinidad a Convert

Dr. Albert Knapp, a distinguished
member of the Dominican Order, who
has been appointed to the Archbish-
opric of Trinidad, in succession to the
late Archbishop Flood, O.P., is an
Englishman and was formerly a mem-
ber of the Church of England, for the
ministry of which he at first thought
to study.
